**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers lost their fifth straight game on Friday night as they dropped an 8-6 decision to the New York Yankees. James McCann had a pair of hits, including his first home run of the season, and drove in three runs, while Jeimer Candelario also added a solo home run, his first of the year. Miguel Cabrera, Nicholas Castellanos, José Iglesias and Victor Martinez each contributed two hits in the loss. Mike Fiers started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing six runs, five earned, on eight hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.2 innings. The Tigers continue their series against the Yankees this afternoon. Following this weekend's series against New York (AL), the 10-game homestand continues with three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22).

**V-MART'S DOUBLE DOUBLE:** Victor Martinez had a pair of doubles with a run scored and a RBI in last night's game. It marked his 35th career game with two-or-more doubles and his first since August 25, 2016 at Minnesota. After going 0x8 in the first two games of the season, Martinez has reached base safely in nine consecutive games and is hitting .333 (10x30) with two runs scored, four doubles and six RBI over the nine games.

**DOWN, BUT NOT OUT:** The Tigers have made a habit of staging late-inning comebacks this season, and continued that last night, scoring five runs over the game's final three innings. The Tigers have scored 26 of their 49 runs this season in the seventh inning-or-later, which is the third most in the Majors, trailing only the Toronto Blue Jays (31) and Los Angeles Angels (30).

**MIGGY MOVING UP THE MLB ALL-TIME RBI LIST:** Miguel Cabrera enters today's game with 1,622 RBI in his Major League career. He is one RBI away from tying Chipper Jones (1,623) for 31st in MLB history (see chart below).

**IGGY VS. THE YANKEES:** José Iglesias went 2x4 with a double and a RBI in last night's game. Iglesias has performed well in his career against the Yankees and enters today's game batting .364 (40x110) with 12 runs scored, five doubles, two home runs and 12 RBI in 36 games vs. New York (AL). Over his last 11 games with at least one at-bat vs. the Yankees, Iglesias is batting .474 (18x38) with five runs scored, four doubles, one home run and seven RBI.

**TIGERS TIDBITS:** Nicholas Castellanos had two hits in last night's game to record his sixth multi-hit game of the season, which ranks tied for fourth in the American League...Drew VerHagen retired both batters he faced out of the bullpen last night. After not recording an out in his first outing of the season on March 30, VerHagen has not allowed a hit in his last five appearances, throwing 7.2 scoreless innings.

**TIGERS AND YANKEES:** The Tigers and Yankees opened their seven-game season series last night with New York (AL) picking up an 8-6 win. The two teams split six games last season, but the Yankees won two-of-three games at Comerica Park. Detroit has not won a season series against the Yankees since 2011 and have not won a home series against New York since 2014.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** The Tigers are 0-1 on their 10-game homestand, which includes three games vs. New York (AL) (0-1), three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22). Detroit has posted a 1-5 record at Comerica Park this season.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters today's game with a 4-9 (.308) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,072-1,048 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**REPLAY RUNDOWN:** The Tigers enter today's game a perfect 5-for-5 in replay challenges this season. Among teams that have challenged three-or-more plays this season, the Tigers are one of only four clubs to have a 100% success rate, joining Chicago (AL), Kansas City and San Francisco.

**ABOUT FRANCISCO:** Liriano will make his third start of the season this afternoon vs. New York (AL).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Liriano turned in his second consecutive quality start to begin the season on Monday at Cleveland, but took the loss after giving up two runs on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

**VS. NEW YORK (AL):** Liriano has made 12 appearances, including 10 starts, in his career against the Yankees and has posted a 4-4 record with a 3.34 ERA (59.1IP/22ER) and 60 strikeouts. Among active pitchers with at least 10 career starts against New York (AL), Liriano's 3.34 ERA ranks ninth. Liriano picked up the win in his only start against the Yankees last season on June 2, giving up two runs on four hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Liriano is making his 17th career appearance and 14th career start at Comerica Park tonight. In his previous 16 outings in Detroit, Liriano has a 5-7 record with a 5.37 ERA (70.1IP/42ER) and 71 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL EAST:** Liriano has pitched in 54 games, including 47 starts, against teams from the American League East, and has compiled a 13-21 record with a 4.69 ERA (255.1IP/133ER) and 255 strikeouts. In 12 outings, including nine starts, vs. AL East teams last season, Liriano went 3-4 with a 5.14 ERA (42.0IP/24ER) and 49 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN APRIL:** Liriano has made 50 career appearances, including 42 starts, during the month of April and has an 11-22 record with a 4.96 ERA (237.2IP/131ER) and 220 strikeouts. In five April starts last season, Liriano went 2-2 with a 3.97 ERA (22.2IP/10ER) and 25 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Liriano has limited lefthanded batters to a .220 (303x1377) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .247 (1166x4713). In 38 appearances last season, lefties hit .247 (23x93) against Liriano, while righties batted .289 (82x284).

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS:** Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano has 1,649 strikeouts in his Major League career, ranking him seventh among Dominican-born pitchers. He is 15 strikeouts away from tying Pedro Astacio (1,664) for sixth.

**DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK:** Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

**TOSSING A NO-NO:** Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).

**ABOUT MATTHEW:** Boyd will make his third start of the season tomorrow afternoon in the series finale vs. New York (AL).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Boyd did not factor into the decision in his last start on Tuesday at Cleveland, throwing 7.0 strong innings and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and four strikeouts. Boyd is the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher to throw 6.0-or-more innings and allow one run-or-less in his first two starts of the season since Kenny Rogers in 2007.

**VS. NEW YORK (AL)/AT COMERICA PARK:** Boyd has faced the Yankees twice in his career and has a 0-2 record with a 9.35 ERA (8.2IP/9ER) and five strikeouts. His only start against the Yankees last season came on August 22, and he took the loss, giving up seven runs, five earned, on six hits with three walks and two strikeouts in 2.1 innings. Boyd has made 29 career appearances, including 27 starts, at Comerica Park and has compiled a 7-9 record with a 4.28 ERA (153.2IP/73ER) and 111 strikeouts. In 13 appearances, including 12 starts, at home last season, Boyd was 3-4 with a 4.52 ERA (71.2IP/36ER) and 53 strikeouts.

**PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF:** After finishing the 2017 season on a strong note, Boyd has turned in impressive outings in each of his first two starts this season. Over his last six starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 2.09 ERA (38.2IP/9ER) and 26 strikeouts.
