NATIONALS NEWS

OH, WHAT A NIGHT

The Washington Nationals topped the Miami Marlins, 14-12, in dramatic, come-from-behind fashion on Thursday night...Trailing 9-0 heading to the bottom of the fourth inning, the Nationals plated 14 unanswered runs to pull away from the Marlins.

- Washington's nine-run deficit overcome was the largest in Nationals history (2005-pres.) and matched the largest in franchise (MON/WSH) history.

MARLIN SEASON

The Nationals enter tonight riding a 12-game winning streak over the Marlins...Washington's 12-game winning streak over Miami is the longest winning streak against a single opponent in Nationals history (2005-pres.)...This streak tops the 11-game win streak over Seattle from June 10, 2005 to Aug. 30, 2014.

- According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Washington's 12-game winning streak over Miami is tied for the longest active winning streak by one team over another...The Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim are in the midst of a 12-game winning streak over Philadelphia (6/10/03 - pres.) and the Los Angeles Dodgers have won 12 straight over the New York Mets (5/28/16 - pres.).
- The last MLB team to win 13 or more consecutive games vs. one opponent was the St. Louis Cardinals, who won 13 straight games over the Reds from 9/14/17 to 6/9/18, according to *Elias*.

TREA MAGNIFIQUE!

Washington's come-from-behind win on Thursday night was powered by **Trea Turner**, who went 3-for-5 with two home runs (including the go-ahead grand slam), eight RBI and three runs scored...His eight RBI were tied for the most by a leadoff hitter in Major League history and were tied for second-most in a game by any hitter in Nationals history (2005-pres.).

- Over his last 16 games, **Trea Turner** is 25-for-65 (.379) with one double, one triple, four homers, 12 RBI, five walks, two stolen bases and 14 runs scored...He has a .431 on-base percentage and a .606 slugging percentage during this stretch.
- According to FanGraphs.com, Turner leads all National League shortstops in WAR (3.2) and DEF rating (7.0).

SUMMER OF SOTO

Juan Soto leads all Major League rookies (min. 165 PA), in batting average (.312), on-base percentage (.424), slugging percentage (.558), and OPS (.982)...Though he was called up on May 20, he ranks among National League rookies in walks (3rd, 27), home runs (T3rd, 8), doubles (T5th, 10) and RBI (T6th, 24).

- Since May 15 (the date of his "first" game due to the suspended game vs. NYY), he leads National League rookies in walks (1st, 27), home runs (T1st, 8), doubles (T2nd, 10), and RBI (T2nd, 24).
- Among all National League players (min. 165 PA), Soto ranks in on-base percentage (2nd, .424), OPS (3rd, .982), batting average (6th, .312) and slugging percentage (7th, .558)

DOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOO

Closer **Sean Doolittle** leads National League relievers in strikeout-to-walk ratio (16.00) opp. OBP (.171) and WHIP (0.55)...He leads the National League with a 95.7 save% (22-for-23), while his 22 saves rank fourth in the National League.

- He has converted 12 straight saves dating to May 22 vs. San Diego...During this stretch, he has allowed just one earned run in 15.2 IP (0.57 ERA)...He has struck out 16 batters and has not issued a walk...Opposing batters are hitting .135 (7-for-52) with one extra-base hit (HR).

EXTRA! EXTRA!

Since June 15, **Anthony Rendon's** 16 extra-base hits are tied for second-most in MLB with COL **Nolan Arenado** and HOU **Alex Bregman**...STL **Matt Carpenter** leads with 17...On the season, Rendon's 36 extra-base hits rank just out of the top 10 (11th) in the National League...His 24 doubles rank fourth in the National League.

HARPER'S HOMERS

Bryce Harper clubbed his 21st home run of the season on July 2, a solo shot in the eighth inning...Harper's 21 home runs rank second behind only COL **Nolan Arenado** (22) for the most in the National League.

- Harper's 35 extra-base hits rank 12th in the NL and are tied for second among NL outfielders behind ATL **Nick Markakis** (37).

FIVE FINGER DISCOUNTS

The Nationals rank second in the National League with 64 stolen bases...They rank behind the Milwaukee Brewers (68).

- Michael A. Taylor** is tied for the MLB lead with 23 stolen bases with ATL **Ender Inciarte**, while **Trea Turner** (22) is tied for third with SEA **Dee Gordon** (22).

NATIONALS HISTORY

July 6 (6-7 on this date)

2006 - **Ryan Zimmerman's** RBI single with two outs in the 11th inning lifted the Nationals to past Florida, 8-7. The walk-off hit was Zimmerman's third in the Nationals' previous eight home games. He became the first rookie to post three walk-off hits in a single month since Ruben Sierra did so for Texas in 1986.

IN THE COMMUNITY

July 7: Neighborhood Day

Once again, the Nationals will dedicate a day to recognize and thank their neighbors in Ward 6. The team will provide hundreds of residents with tickets to area residents to watch the Nationals take on Miami. A variety of residents will also be recognized for their contributions to the community during the pregame ceremonies, including the ceremonial first pitch.

OPPONENT

MIAMI MARLINS

Assistant hitting coach **Joe Dillon** made his MLB debut on May 18, 2005 with the Florida Marlins... In 2004, he was named the Florida Marlins Minor League Player of the Year...**Bryce Harper's** 24 home runs are the most he's hit against any opponent and are 11th-most all-time against the Florida/Miami Marlins.

THE SERIES

The Nationals have won 12 straight games over the Marlins dating to Aug. 9, 2017...Washington has outscored Miami 85-32 during the streak.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#47 - GIO GONZALEZ - LHP

Electric left-hander is in his seventh season with Washington...In seven years with the Nationals, is 85-59 with a 3.51 ERA in 203 starts...Ranks second on Washington's all-time (2005-pres.) wins list with 85...Is Washington's most prolific left-handed pitcher, leading Nationals southpaws in nearly every pitching category...Leads Nationals (2005-pres.) lefties in wins (85), innings pitched (1,198.1), and strikeouts (1,175), among other categories...Has made 30-or-more starts seven of the last eight seasons.

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Faces the Miami Marlins for the first time this season...Is 10-3 with a 1.85 ERA in 16 career starts against Miami...His career 1.85 ERA ranks fourth among all active pitchers (min. 15 GS) against a single opponent...Has pitched to a 0.95 ERA (4 ER/38.0 IP) while going 4-0 in his last six starts against the Marlins.

LAST START: Allowed three earned runs on three hits in 5.0 innings of work on July 1 at Philadelphia...Did not factor into the decision.

2018 NOTES

- Ranks 6th among National League left-handed pitchers with a 3.77 ERA.
- Also ranks among NL lefties in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (4th, 8.54), opp. SLG (5th, .394), opp. OPS (8th, .720), opp. AVG (9th, .247), opp. OBP (10th, .327) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (11th, 2.00).
- Has held opposing batters to a .145 average with RISP (10-for-69), fourth-best in MLB and third-best in the NL (1st, **Max Scherzer** - .115 and 2nd, **Jacob deGrom** - .139).
- Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in 11 of his 17 starts this season...His 11 such starts are tied for sixth among National League starting pitchers.
- He pitched to a 1.81 ERA (9 ER/44.2 IP) in seven starts from April 29 through June 2, going 4-0 along the way...He recorded 43 strikeouts and a .200 opp. AVG.
- Struck out a season-high nine batters in 7.0 innings pitched in Washington's 5-3 win over Atlanta on June 2.
- Tossed a season-high 7.2 innings on May 28 at Baltimore...Did not allow a run while allowing six hits and striking out three.
- Allowed two earned runs on six hits in 5.0 innings of work on May 15 vs. New York...Struck out five batters...Allowed his first home run since April 12 vs. Colorado...The game was eventually suspended due to rain.
- In his sixth start, tossed a season-high on 7.0 innings and struck out a season-high eight batters en route to his third win of the season on April 29 vs. Arizona.
- Earned his 11th career win at Citi Field vs. NYM on April 17...Allowed two earned runs on eight hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 5.1 IP.
- Allowed two earned runs on five hits with three walks and seven strikeouts in 5.0 innings on April 12 vs. COL.
- Opened the season with 6.0 strong innings as Washington completed the sweep of the Cincinnati Reds, 6-5...Allowed one earned run on five hits with one walk and seven strikeouts.

CAREER NOTES

- His 85 wins are tied for fifth among left-handed pitchers since 2012...Ranks fifth among MLB LHP in that span with a .236 opp. AVG.
- His 21 wins in 2012 are tied with **Clayton Kershaw** (21 in 2014) for the most in a single season by a lefty since 2012.
- Since 2012, is 75-6 with a 2.96 ERA in 103 starts when receiving more than two runs of offensive support...Is 86-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 109 starts when getting four or more runs of offensive support in his career.
- Since 2014, has allowed just six home runs in 679 AB vs. LHB, the fewest among left-handed starting pitchers (min. 600 AB vs. LHB).
- Since the start of the 2017 season, ranks 15th in Major League Baseball (5th among lefties) with a 3.21 ERA...Is 21-14 with a 3.21 ERA in 49 starts over this stretch.
