## NATIONALS NEWS

### LAST STAND

The Washington Nationals dropped the first game of this four-game weekend series, 5-4, in 12 innings on Thursday night...**Max Scherzer** struck out 13 batters, including his 285th strikeout of the season, topping his previous career-high and Nationals record (2005-pres.) of 284 in 2016...**Anthony Rendon** clubbed his 22nd home run, a two-run shot in the sixth inning off **Jason Vargas**.

- The Nationals will welcome the New York Mets for three more games this weekend before capping the 2018 home slate with a three-game series against the Miami Marlins beginning Monday.
- The Nationals have won eight of their last 12 games since sweeping the Sept. 8th doubleheader against the Chicago Cubs.

### HE'S STREAKING

**Anthony Rendon** has reached base safely in a career-high 28 straight games dating to Aug. 21...It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and is tied for the fourth-longest streak in the National League this season with **Cesar Hernandez** (4/22-5/25)...**Christian Yelich** is third on the list with a 30-game streak from Aug. 11 to Sept. 15...During the streak, Rendon is hitting .345 with a .427 on-base percentage and a .602 slugging.

- Rendon enters Friday having posted multi-RBI efforts in five straight games, the longest such streak in MLB this season and tied for the longest since **Rougned Odor** put together a six-game streak from Aug. 30-Sept. 5, 2016...Rendon is 11-for-21 (.524) with a double, three homers, 11 RBI, three walks and five runs scored during this stretch.
- On the season, Rendon ranks in the NL in doubles (T2nd, 40), average (6th, .304), slugging percentage (9th, .522), extra-base hits (T10th, 63) and OPS (11th, .891).
- Since 2016, his 119 doubles rank second in the National League behind **Nick Markakis** (120) and are fourth in all of Major League Baseball behind **Jose Ramirez** (138), **Mookie Betts** (130) and Markakis.

### EVERYDAY TREA

**Trea Turner** has played in each of Washington's 153 games this season, making 149 starts and four appearances off the bench...The only player in Nationals history (2005-pres.) to appear in all 162 games in a season was **Ryan Zimmerman**, who started all 162 games in 2007.

- If Turner starts each of the nine games left on the schedule, he will tie **Alfonso Soriano** (158 in 2006) for second on the list behind Zimmerman's 162 starts in 2007.
- Turner enters Thursday riding a 20-game on-base streak dating to Aug. 29...It is the second-longest streak of his career behind a 21-game run from Aug. 10 to Sept. 2, 2016.
- With one more stolen base, Turner will tie **Ian Desmond** (122) for the most stolen bases as a National (2005-pres.).

### CHASING 100-100-100

**Bryce Harper** enters Friday with 97 runs scored, 97 RBI and 124 walks in 2018...He is looking to become the sixth player since 2014 to record at least 100 runs, RBI and walks in a season...He would join **Joey Votto** (2017), **Aaron Judge** (2017), **Mike Trout** (2016), **Paul Goldschmidt** (2015) and **Jose Bautista** (2015, 2014).

- On the season, he ranks in the National League in homers (T2nd, 34), OBP (5th, .393), RBI (6th, 97) and OPS (10th, .891).
- His 124 walks lead MLB and are one short of his career-high (124 in 2015).

### JUAN SOTO THINGS

**Juan Soto** is on pace to have one of the best seasons for a teenager in Major League Baseball history...See boxes to the right and additional note sheets about Soto's 2018 season.

### BEST OF THE BEST

Since the All-Star break, Washington's offense ranks in the National League in on-base percentage (1st, .347), batting average (1st, .263), doubles (1st, 110), OPS (T1st, .782), stolen bases (1st, 44), runs (2nd, 301), walks (2nd, 237) and slugging percentage (3rd, .435).

- Washington's second-half surge has placed them among the top five NL offenses in 2018 in on-base percentage (2nd, .332), runs (4th, 718), home runs (5th, 181), SLG (5th, .419) and OPS (5th, .747).

## NATIONALS HISTORY

### September 21 (4-5 on this date)

2010 – The Nationals plated seven runs in the eighth inning—all with two outs—to surge past the Astros, 8-4. In the victory, **Tyler Clippard** posted his 10th relief win and became the first relief pitcher in D.C.-baseball history to record 100 strikeouts in a single season.

## DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

**Anthony Rendon** hits the 100th home run of his career. He now has 22 on the season and has been on-base in 28 straight games. **Trea Turner** also comes in and the Nationals trail the Mets, 3-2.

## #41 - JOE ROSS - RHP

Tall, athletic right-handed pitcher with smooth mechanics and a downhill delivery that deceives hitters, especially righties...Uses a power sinking two-seam fastball and a sharp slider to get batters out...Commands the strike zone, having issued just 70 walks and posting a 3.29 strikeout-to-walk ratio during his first three big league seasons...Displays composure and mound presence beyond his years...Burst on the Major League scene in 2015 after being acquired as part of a three-team deal, that also yielded infielder **Trea Turner** in December of 2014

**AGAINST THE METS:** Is 2-2 with a 4.29 ERA in six career starts against the Mets...This marks his first start against the Mets this season.

**LAST START:** Made his first official Major League start of the 2018 season...He started on Sept. 7 vs. Chicago, but it was cut short due to rain...He threw 1.2 innings (24 pitches)...He threw 5.0 IP of two-run ball, giving up four hits and walking two...He did not factor into the decision in Washington's 4-3 loss to the Chicago Cubs.

### 2018 NOTES

- Made six rehab starts, going 2-1 with a 2.39 ERA between the Gulf Coast League, Single-A Potomac, Double-A Harrisburg and Triple-A Syracuse.
- Had his third season in Washington cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" ligament-replacement surgery in July.
- Made his final start of the season on July 9 vs. ATL...In previous four starts, was 2-1 with a 2.36 ERA (7 ER/26.2 IP), 22 strikeouts and eight walks.
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on June 8 vs. BAL.
- Matched a career-high with 8.0 innings on May 23 vs. SEA (8.0 IP, 5 H, ER, 6 SO).
- Opened the season by receiving 62 runs of support, the most in MLB history through a pitcher's first four starts of the season, per *Elias*...His 10.14 average run support would have been first in MLB, if qualified.
- Opened the season with Triple-A Syracuse, but was recalled on April 19...Was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on May 1 before being recalled on May 23.

### 2016 NOTES

- Began the season in Washington's rotation before being placed on the disabled list on July 3...Missed 66 games with right shoulder inflammation.
- Posted a 2.79 ERA (3 ER/9.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts against just three walks in three games after reinstatement on Sept. 18.
- Posted a 19.2 scoreless innings streak from April 10 to April 30, the longest of any Washington pitcher and 13th-longest in the NL in 2016.
- Struck out 28 batters against just four walks (7.0 strikeout-to-walk ratio) over his five starts prior to his DL stint.
- Surrendered a home run to Nick Castellanos on May 10 vs. DET, the first home run he had allowed in 160 at bats, a streak that dated to August, 2015...He entered that game as the only qualified (3.09 batters faced/ team game) starting pitcher in MLB to not allow a home run to that point in 2016, and, via the *Elias Sports Bureau*, his 160 at-bat streak was the third longest in MLB at that time behind only CIN's **Blake Wood** (174 at-bats) and BOS's RHP Carson Smith (172 at-bats).
- Made his first Postseason appearance, starting Game 4 of the NLDS at Los Angeles.

### 2015 NOTES

- In his first season in Washington's system, started at Double-A Harrisburg before having his contract selected on June 6 and made his MLB debut that day vs. CHI (5.0 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 4 SO).
- Solidified his spot in the rotation with his next two starts, June 13 at MIL (8.0 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 2 ER, BB, 8 SO) and June 19 vs. PIT (7.1 IP, 6 H, R, ER, BB, 11 SO)...With that 11 strikeout effort, Ross became just the third rookie to strike out at least 10 batters in a game in Nationals history joining **Stephen Strasburg** (14 - 6/8/10; 10 - 6/18/10) and **John Lannan** (11 - 4/7/08).
- Allowed three or fewer earned runs in his first seven career starts, tying **Michah Bowie** (7 GS, 5/20-6/22/2007) for the second-longest such streak by a starting pitcher to begin a career in Nationals history (2005-present).
- Ranked among National League rookie starting pitchers (min. 13 GS) in opp. OBP (2nd, .280), WHIP (3rd, 1.11), fewest walks (4th, 21), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5th, 3.29) and strikeouts per nine innings (8th, 8.10).
- Set a Nationals record (2005-present) by starting his career facing 51 consecutive batters before issuing his first walk (June 13 at MIL, **Adam Lind**)
- Prior to **Yasiel Puig's** home run on August 11 at LAD, Ross faced 100 right-handed batters before surrendering an extra base hit.

According to FanGraphs.com's offensive metric Weighted Runs Created Plus (wRC+), **Juan Soto** is in the process of putting together the most productive offensive season by a teenager in Major League history...At 147 wRC+, he ranks first ahead of **Mel Ott** (140 in 1928), **Tony Conigliaro** (138 in 1964) and **Bryce Harper** (121 in 2012), among others (min. 400 PA).

- Also according to FanGraphs.com, his Win Probability Added of 3.18 is the best mark among teenagers in Major League history ahead of **Bryce Harper** in 2012 (1.87) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** in 1989 (1.22).

### NEXT MILESTONES

With a career-high and Nationals-record 290 strikeouts in hand, **Max Scherzer** could reach a few more milestones in his final two starts.

- 300 — Would become the 17th pitcher since 1900 (35x) and the fifth pitcher since 2000 (6x) to record a 300+ strikeout season
- 313 — **Walter Johnson's** D.C. baseball record for single-season strikeouts set in 1910

### MOVIN' ON UP

As the 2018 season progressed, so too did **Max Scherzer's** place on both the all-time and active strikeout lists...He began the season 66th all-time and seventh among active pitchers with 2,149 strikeouts...As of Sept. 21, he ranks 43rd all-time and fifth among active pitchers with 2,439 strikeouts.

### 10 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

**Max Scherzer's** penchant for 10+ strikeout games is on display yet again in 2018... He has recorded 17 games of at least 10 strikeouts in 2018, the most in Major League Baseball and the most over any National League pitcher by six games (**Jacob deGrom**, 10).

### KEEPING IT 1,000x2

**Max Scherzer** recorded his 1,000th strikeout with Washington on July 2 vs. BOS., becoming the 11th pitcher in MLB history to collect at least 1,000 strikeouts with two different clubs...The list, according to *Elias*: **Jim Bunning** (DET/PHI), **Roger Clemens** (BOS/NYY), **Randy Johnson** (ARI/SEA), **Mark Langston** (ANA/SEA), **Greg Maddux** (CHI/ATL), **Mike Mussina** (BAL/NYY), **Nolan Ryan** (CAL/HOU), **CC Sabathia** (CLE/NYY), **Luis Tiant** (BOS/CLE) and **Cy Young** (BOS/CLE)

### HARDWARE

**Max Scherzer** was named National League Pitcher of the Month in both April and May joining **Chris Sale** as the only players to take home the award twice this season.

- In April, he went 5-1 with a 1.62 ERA (7 ER/39.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts and just nine walks...In three starts from April 9-20, he allowed just seven hits in 71 at-bats, yielding an opponent slash line of .099/.169/.183...He struck out 30 batters and issued just four walks during this stretch of games...On April 9 against Atlanta, he tossed his ninth career complete game (fifth career shut-out) to end Washington's five-game losing streak
- In May, he went 4-0 with a 2.21 ERA (10 ER/40.2 IP) and 63 strikeouts against just 10 walks...He led the NL in strikeouts (63) and SO/9.0 IP (13.9)...He also ranked in the top three in the NL in opp. OBP (2nd, .238), WHIP (2nd, 0.89), SO/BB (3rd, 6.30), opp. AVG (3rd, .176), and H/9.0 IP (3rd, 5.75).

### NOTES OF NOTE

Some of **Max Scherzer's** other notable accomplishments this season include:

- Recorded an MLB best nine-game winning streak from April 9 to June 5.
- In the month of April, he was called upon to help snap five-game (4/9 vs. ATL), three-game (4/14 vs. COL) and four-game (4/25 at SFG) losing streaks...He earned the victory in each start, pitching to a 1.64 ERA (4 ER/22.0 IP) with 31 strikeouts against just three walks.
- Did not earn the win, but struck out a season-high 15 batters on May 6 vs. Philadelphia...It was his fifth career 15+ strikeout game...He became the first pitcher in Major League history (since 1913) to strike out at least 15 batters in no more than 6.1 IP according to Baseball-Reference.com.
- He tossed 20.0 consecutive scoreless innings from Aug. 7 to Aug. 23...It is the longest streak by a Nationals pitcher in 2018.
