WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost last night to the O's, 12-1, and have a 2-3 record on this 10-day, 10-game road trip to KC (2-1), BAL (0-2), and TB (3 G)...team has dropped 3 in a row after winning 1st 2 G after the break, but have won 5 of 9 and gone 18-16 (.529) since 6/9, 6th-best in A.L. in that stretch...club has a 6-7 record in July and has dropped 10 of 16, 11 of 18, and 15 of 26...Texas has won 19 of 36 and 32 of 60...club has 40-38 (.513) record beginning 4/20, 5th-best in A.L./T10th in MLB.

• At 45-48 (.484), Rangers are 9th in the A.L. in winning percentage...club reached .500 mark with Saturday's win for 1st time since 6/28 (39-39), but have not had a winning mark since 6/27 (39-38)...Texas has had a winning record on just 3 occasions in the last 55 days...club was 55-38/55-39 thru 93/94 G in '16.

• Club has been season-high 3 G above .500 twice, last on 5/21 (24-21), and was a 2017 high 7 games under .500 (13-20) on 5/8...season best 10-G win streak 5/9-19 was 4th-longest in franchise history...Rangers are 6-3-2 in their last 11 overall series after a series win over the weekend in KC.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers are in 3rd place in the A.L. West, a season-high 17.5 games back in the division...previous high had been 17.0 GB both 7/4-5, as current deficit is team's greatest at any point since the end of the 2014 season (-31.0 GB)...held at least a share of 2nd place for 10 straight days (incl. AS break) until Monday's loss...days in each position in 2017 (alone or tied): 1st-0 days, 2nd-36, 3rd-27, 4th-31, 5th-13...Saturday was just 4th time in past 31 days to gain ground in the West...still just 3.5 GB of a wild card spot in the A.L.

VS. BALTIMORE: Rangers are 0-2 vs. Orioles to begin 2017, last A.L. team that Texas had yet to face in 2017...club is 4-5 vs. O's since start of '16 and Rangers have a 10-6 advantage since 2015...Texas has gone 11-17 since 7/10/13, but leads 23-20 since start of 2011...club is 4-5 at Camden Yards since 2015, 4-11 at this park since 7/10/13...both series in '17 take place this month, also 7/28-30 in Arlington...O's have leads in all-time series (253-204-1), in BAL (129-102-1), and at Camden Yards (62-56-1).

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have dropped 3 of 5, 4 of 7, 7 of 10, 8 of 12, and 10 of last 16 away games since a season-best 6-G road win streak from 5/28-6/13...club is still 12-10 in road contests since 5/28...prior to this 12-10 span, the club had won just 6 of its previous 17 away contests...the Rangers' .417 (20-28) road winning percentage is 11th in the A.L...only other time since 2004 that Texas has had fewer than 21 road wins after 48 G was 2007 (18-30), although club was 21-28 after 49 G in 2014...team had a winning road record at this point in each of past 2 years (2015-16).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Texas is opening the 2nd 'half' on the road for a 4th straight season, also on road post-break for 7th time in 8 years, and 11th time in 13 years beginning 2005...this 10-G road trip would be the longest right after the AS break for Texas since 2006 (11 G), and this will be 3rd straight year with a 9+ G trip following the break.

A TOUGH ONE: Texas lost by 11 runs last night, matching largest margin in a loss this season (also 13-2 loss on 6/14 at HOU)...it was the 3rd time to allow 12+ runs this season, all since 6/14 (other 15 R on 6/26 at CLE)...the Rangers' 4 HR allowed last night were most since permitting season-high 5 HR on 6/6 vs. NYM.

REHAB UPDATES: RHP A.J. Griffin, who began an injury rehab assignment with the AZL Rangers on Friday (3.0 SHO IP, 2 SO at AZL A's), is slated to start for Round Rock (AAA) tonight vs. New Orleans at 7:05 p.m. CT...Griffin is 1st eligible to be activated on 7/26.

CHOO OFF THE TOP: Shin-Soo Choo hit his 3rd leadoff HR of the season last night, the 5th by a Ranger, and the 23rd of his career...he has hit 12 of his 23 leadoff HR with Texas, the 2nd-highest total in club history to only Ian Kinsler (29)...each of Choo's 23 leadoff HR have come since 2012, the 3rd-highest total in MLB in that span to only Charlie Blackmon (26) and Kinsler (24)...Choo had gone homerless in 16 straight since last long ball on 6/25 at NYY.

• Choo's blast was the 100th leadoff HR in MLB in 2017, and the 8th at Camden Yards, tying Minute Maid Park and Tropicana Field for most leadoff HR hosted in majors this season.

UNO: Choo hit the 2nd pitch of last night's game for a HR, and it would be the Rangers' only run in the contest...the Rangers have been involved in 3 of the 4 times in MLB this season in which a team's lone run in a game was a leadoff HR (2 for, one against)...Choo also did the honors in a 3-1 loss on 5/27 at TOR, and Texas won 5-1 on 6/11 at WAS despite Brian Goodwin's leadoff HR off Austin Bibens-Dirkx...other ML instance was by Ian Kinsler in DET's 8-1 loss on 4/20 at TB.

• Last night was the MLB-high 8th time for a solo HR to account for the Rangers' lone run in a game (6-MIN/TOR)...it was the 14th time for HR to account for all TEX runs in a game (2-12 in those contests).

WHO'S THE MAN?: Adrian Beltre enters tonight with a 53-game errorless streak at 3rd base dating back to 8/29/16, tying the longest error-free span of his career (also July 3-Sept. 5, 2006)...in a remarkable twist, the 53-game run also matches the longest errorless streak by a 3B in Texas history, done previously by both Buddy Bell (6/13-8/19/79) and Hank Blalock (9/25/04-5/25/05)...both the personal and team marks could be surpassed tonight...among players with 150+ starts at 3B since the start of last season, Beltre's .980 (10 E/497 TC) fielding pct. ranks 1st (Arenado is at .978).

BELTRE CHASING 3000: Adrian Beltre enters the final 2 games of this series with 2982 career hits, just 3 shy of matching HOFer Sam Rice (2985) and 18 short of becoming 31st player in MLB history to reach 3000 hits...Beltre is currently tied with Barry Bonds for 16th place all-time with 601 doubles, just 2 shy of matching Cal Ripken Jr. (603).

PEREZ'S WINNING WAYS: Martin Perez enters tonight having gone 3-0 in his last 4 starts after a 2-6 mark in his 1st 14 G in 2017...he is 2-0, 3.86 (8 ER/18.2 IP) in last 3 GS to drop season ERA from 4.72 to 4.55, his lowest since 5/29 (4.19)...he has quality starts in 2 of those 3 outings.

GDP'S: Texas pitchers have induced 7 GDP's in the 2nd 'half' to bring season total to an MLB-leading 92 this season (90-COL/MIL)...fielders have 103 total double plays in '17, most in A.L. and T2nd in MLB (104-COL, 103-TEX/SD).

SHORTS: Last night was 2nd time to allow 6 R in 1st frame in '17 (also 6/21 vs. TOR - Ross start)...Gausman (.323) and Perez (.314) have highest opp. avg. among A.L. qualifiers...Rangers have not used a manager's challenge since 7/4 vs. BOS...TEX has errors in 4 of last 8 G (4-0 with no E's, 0-4 when committing E in that span)...batters have single-digit K's in 8 straight, 2nd-longest streak in '17 (11 G, 4/16-26).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#33 Martin Perez, LHP
(5-6, 4.55)

TONIGHT: The 26-year-old left-hander is slated to make his 18th start of the season - and career start no. 99 - in the 3rd game of this series against Baltimore...marks 2nd straight road outing, as he won the 2nd 'half' opener on Fri. at KC, and will be just his 7th road start in '17...is 3-0 in his last 4 starts after going 2-6 in his 1st 14 games this season...is 2-0, 3.86 (8 ER/18.2 IP) in last 3 GS to drop season ERA from 4.72 to 4.55, lowest since 5/29 (4.19)...has quality starts in 2 of those 3 outings, and fell one out shy of QS in the other, this after no QS in 4 straight...has a 5.52 ERA (27 ER/44.0 IP) last 8 GS since 5/24 to raise season ERA from 3.71...was on DL from 6/24-7/3 with right thumb fracture/laceration...his 4.45 run support average is 10th-lowest in A.L...his 6 losses are T3rd-most on staff (Cashner/Darvish-8)...pitched for Team Venezuela in the 2017 World Baseball Classic won by the United States...made a team-best 33 starts in 2016, only member of Texas rotation to not miss a start last season...matched a career high w/ 10 wins and pitched a career-high 198.2 innings...signed a 4-year contract on 11/7/13 through 2017 with club options for 2018, 2019, and 2020... Texas is 7-10 in his 17 starts.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Is averaging a career-high 6.16 SO/9, but his 3.51 BB/9 figure would be 2nd-highest of his career (3.55 in 2012) and his highest in any full season...opponent batting avg. (.314) is 2nd-highest among A.L. starters (Gausman is 1st-.323), the opp. avg. and WHIP (1.64) would be career highs... ranks 2nd in A.L. with 17 GDP (TOR's Marcus Stroman-21).

LAST START: Earned win in Rangers' 5-3 victory in 2nd 'half' opener on Fri. at KC (7.0 IP, 8 H, 3 R-ER, 1 BB, 1 SO, 1 HR, 89 pitches/54 strikes), making the start on 10 days' rest (incl. AS break)...trailing 3-0 after 5 inn., Perez got support in the form of a 3-R HR (Beltre in the 6th) and 2-R pinch HR (Napoli in the 7th), as Texas went from being no-hit for the 1st 5.1 innings (vs. Jason Hammel) to winning the game on 2 swings...Alcides Escobar hit a 2-R HR off the LF foul pole in the 2nd, and KC added a run in the 5th...Perez's 1st road win for since 9/6/16 at SEA.

VS. BALTIMORE: Has gone 2-1, 4.01 (11 ER/24.2 IP) in 4 G/GS career vs. BAL with 3 quality starts...took ND in lone start last year vs. O's on 4/15/16 in Arlington despite exiting with a 5-3 lead in the 7th inning (6.0 IP, 3 R-2 ER), as Tom Wilhelmson allowed 5 R-ER in 0.2 IP in an 11-5 Texas loss...whiffed Davis/Trumbo/Hardy consecutive to end a bases-loaded threat in 1st inning of that outing...on 8/29/15 in Arlington, retired 1st 14 BF before 4th-inning single by Adam Jones...earned win in only career start at Camden Yards on 7/9/13 (6.0 IP, 4 R-2 ER), an 8-4 TEX victory.

ON THE ROAD: Has gone 1-2 with a 4.09 ERA (15 ER/33.0 IP) in 6 G/GS away from Arlington, quality starts in 3 of 6, incl. 1st road win of '17 in last start on Fri. at KC...since going 7-0 in a span of 8 road starts from 8/5/13 - 4/23/14, Perez has gone 3-16, 5.31 (101 ER/171.1 IP) in his last 30 away starts, averaged just 3.41 RS/9...has allowed 2 HR on road and one in last 5 starts...opp. batting .323/.379/.478/.856 on road compared to .309/.379/.478/.856 at home...has made 11 of his 17 starts in Arlington...each of his 1st 4 wins came in Arlington.

RUN SUPPORT: Has averaged 4.45 runs of support per 9 inn. (47 RS/95.0 IP), 10th-lowest in A.L...has received 5+ runs of support in 5 of last 9 outings...has netted 2-or-fewer runs of support in 10 of 17 starts, including 6 in a row spanning 4-G losing skid...has won 5 of 7 G in '17 when receiving 3+ runs of support.

2017: Opp. batting .314/.375/.462/.836...his 119 hits allowed are T7th-most among A.L. starters, while 1.64 WHIP ranks 3rd-highest in A.L. (BAL's Kevin Gausman-1.79; BAL's Wade Miley-1.80)...averaging 17.2 pitches per inning, which would be 2nd-highest figure of his career (17.4 in 2012)...opp. batting average on balls in play (.356) is 3rd-highest in A.L. (Gausman-.373; Daniel Norris-.363)...has recorded 8 outs this season in the 7th-and-later...Robinson Chirinos has caught 12 starts (4-5, 4.86, 36 ER/66.2 IP), and Jonathan Lucroy has caught him 5 times (1-1, 3.81, 12 ER/28.1 IP)...opp. batting .247 (23-93) w/ RISP, with at least one hit w/ RISP in 8 straight starts...opp. leading off an inning are batting .351 (34-97) w/ 9 XBH (4 HR, 5 2B) and 5 BB, including a .353 avg/1.118 OPS by 1st batter of the game with 2 leadoff HR allowed...opp. average by time through order, 1st PA: .288 (40-139); 2nd PA: .299 (40-134); 3rd PA: .363 (37-102); 4th PA: 2-4...HR by Kole Calhoun on 4/30 vs. LAA was his 1st HR to a LHB at Globe Life Park since 5/10/14 vs. BOS (David Ortiz)...went 0-4 over 6 starts from 4/14-5/11, dropping 4 consecutive starts 4/19-5/6...1st Ranger w/ 4+ losses at end of April since Jason Jennings (5) in 2008.

DISABLED LIST: On DL 6/23-7/2 with a fracture/laceration at the tip of his right thumb...did not require a rehab assignment...sustained injury when he caught his thumb in the hinge section of a hotel room door on evening of 6/22 in NYC.

NOT THE NORM: Has produced a groundball percentage (number of fair groundballs hit -- hits, outs and errors) of 46.7% this season (147 GB/78 FB), but has induced 52.4% ground balls (44 GB/19 FB) over last 4 starts...he entered 2017 with a career GB% of 53.1%...additionally, has permitted left-handed batters to hit at a .321 (26-81) clip, this after holding LHB to a .228 (93-408) career mark entering '17...held LHB to .176 avg. (24-136) in '16, lowest in A.L. and 4th-lowest in MLB...lefties are just 4-for-24 in last 4 outings.
