RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers had their three-game winning streak snapped last night as they dropped the series opener at Cleveland, 2-0. Francisco Liriano started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing two runs on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Offensively, the Tigers were able to generate just two hits against Indians starter Corey Kluber as Nicholas Castellanos and Victor Martinez each had a single. The Tigers continue their four-game series against the Indians tonight. Following the series vs. Cleveland, the Tigers return home for a 10-game homestand, which includes three games vs. New York (AL) (April 13-15), three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22).

START ME UP: Francisco Liriano turned in his second consecutive quality start to begin the season last night, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing two runs on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts. With his performance last night, Tigers starting pitchers have combined for a 3.16 ERA (51.1IP/18ER), which ranks fifth in the American League.

WHAT A RELIEF: Detroit's bullpen threw 2.0 scoreless innings in last night's game. Since allowing five runs in the fifth inning of the second game of the doubleheader on April 1 vs. Pittsburgh, Tigers relievers have combined to allow just two runs in the last 23.2 innings, posting a 0.76 ERA.

RUN AT YOUR OWN RISK: James McCann threw out Bradley Zimmer attempting to steal second base in the seventh inning of last night's game. McCann now has five catcher caught stealings this season, which is tied with Oakland's Jonathan Lucroy for the Major League lead. Since the start of the 2015 season, McCann has 72 catcher caught stealings, which is second-most among all Major League catchers, trailing only Lucroy, who has 85 catcher caught stealings in that time span.

MIGGY MOVING UP THE MLB ALL-TIME RBI LIST: Miguel Cabrera drove in a run in Sunday's game at Chicago (AL) and now has 1,622 RBI in his Major League career. He is one RBI away from tying Chipper Jones (1,623) for 31st in MLB history.

CABRERA, CASTELLANOS VS. TOMLIN: Miguel Cabrera and Nicholas Castellanos have posted impressive numbers in their careers against tonight's Indians starter, Josh Tomlin. Cabrera is hitting .370 (10x27) with one double, two home runs and seven RBI, while Castellanos is batting .345 (10x29) with three doubles, one home run and five RBI.

TIGERS AND INDIANS: The Tigers opened their 19-game season series against the Indians with a 2-0 loss last night. Detroit went 6-13 against the Indians last season, including a 3-6 record at Progressive Field. The Tigers have struggled at Progressive Field in recent seasons, going 5-14 since the start of the 2016 season.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 3-1 on their first road trip of the season after sweeping three games against the White Sox and losing the opener to the Indians last night. Detroit went 30-51 (.370) away from Comerica Park last season.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with an 4-5 (.444) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,072-1,044 (.507) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers successfully challenged a call in the seventh inning of last night's game and are now a perfect 4-for-4 in replay challenges this season. Among teams that have challenged three-or-more plays this season, the Tigers are one of only three clubs to have a 100% success rate, joining Chicago (AL) and San Francisco.

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his second start of the season tonight at Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd was the tough-luck loser in his season debut last Tuesday vs. Kansas City, throwing 6.0 innings and allowing just one run on four hits with one strikeout.

VS. CLEVELAND: Boyd has appeared in five games, including four as a starter, against the Indians, and has a 1-2 record with a 1.91 ERA (28.1IP/6ER) and 19 strikeouts. He made four starts vs. Cleveland last season and went 1-2 with a 2.28 ERA (23.2IP/6ER) and 17 strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Boyd has pitched in 29 games, including 27 as a starter, on the road in his career, and has compiled a 6-12 with a 6.18 ERA (135.1IP/93ER) and 118 strikeouts. In 13 road starts last season, Boyd went 3-7 with a 6.11 ERA (63.1IP/43ER) and 57 strikeouts.

AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Boyd will be making his third career start at Progressive Field tonight. In his previous two starts in Cleveland, Boyd has a 1-1 record with a 1.64 ERA (11.0IP/2ER) and eight strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Boyd has made 35 career appearances, including 34 starts, against teams from the AL Central and has posted a 9-13 record with a 4.67 ERA (185.0IP/96ER) and 141 strikeouts. In 18 starts vs. AL Central teams last season, Boyd went 5-7 with a 4.24 ERA (102.0IP/48ER) and 80 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .271 (61x225) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .285 (268x939) clip. In 26 outings, including 25 starts, last season, lefties hit .282 (24x85) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters batted .292 (133x455).

NEAR NO-NO: Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

STRONG FINISH TO 2017: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann received a no decision in his last start on Thursday at Chicago (AL), allowing six runs on nine hits with one walk and three strikeouts in 4.1 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND/AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Zimmermann has faced the Indians five times in his career and has a 0-4 record with a 10.88 ERA (22.1IP/27ER) and 18 strikeouts. He made three starts vs. Cleveland last season and went 0-3 with a 9.22 ERA (13.2IP/14ER) and nine strikeouts. In two career starts at Progressive Field, Zimmermann is 0-1 with a 12.38 ERA (8.0IP/11ER) and eight strikeouts.
