NATIONALS NEWS

WALK IT (OFF) LIKE I TALK IT

The Washington Nationals topped the Miami Marlins, 3-2, in walk-off fashion on Friday night...Tied at 2-2 in the bottom of the ninth inning, pinch hitter **Mark Reynolds** deposited a 3-1 offering from **Kyle Barraclough** into Miami's bullpen to give the Nationals the victory.

- It was Reynolds' second career walk-off home run and first since July 26, 2016 vs. Arizona as a member of the Colorado Rockies.
- It was Washington's first walk-off home run of the season and third pichi-hit, walk-off home run in Nationals history (**Michael A. Taylor**, 9/4/15 vs. ATL and **Clint Robinson**, 5/9/16 vs. DET).

MARLIN SEASON

The Nationals enter tonight riding a 13-game winning streak over the Marlins...Washington's 13-game winning streak over Miami is the longest winning streak against a single opponent in Nationals history (2005-pres.)...This streak tops the 11-game win streak over Seattle from June 10, 2005 to Aug. 30, 2014.

- According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Washington's 13-game winning streak over Miami is the longest active winning streak by one team over another.
- The last MLB team to win 13 or more consecutive games vs. one opponent was the St. Louis Cardinals, who won 13 straight games over the Reds from Sept. 14, 2017 to June 9, 2018, according to *Elias*.
- The last MLB team to win 14 or more consecutive games vs. one opponent was the New York Mets, who won 14 straight games over the Cincinnati Reds from Sept. 7, 2014 to Sept. 7, 2016.

TREA MAGNIFIQUE!

Washington's come-from-behind win on Thursday night was powered by **Trea Turner**, who went 3-for-5 with two home runs (including the go-ahead grand slam), eight RBI and three runs scored...His eight RBI were tied for the most by a leadoff hitter in Major League history and were tied for second-most in a game by any hitter in Nationals history (2005-pres.).

- Over his last 17 games, **Trea Turner** is 27-for-70 (.386) with one double, one triple, four homers, 12 RBI, five walks, two stolen bases and 14 runs scored...He has a .434 on-base percentage and a .600 slugging percentage during this stretch.
- Turner has hit safely in eight of his last nine games, posting multi-hit efforts in seven of the nine...He is hitting .439 (18-for-41) with three homers and 10 RBI during this stretch.
- According to FanGraphs.com, Turner leads all National League shortstops in WAR (3.2) and DEF rating (7.1).

DOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOO

Closer **Sean Doolittle** leads National League relievers in strikeout-to-walk ratio (16.33) opp. OBP (.167) and WHIP (0.54)...He leads the National League with a 95.7 save% (22-for-23), while his 22 saves rank fourth in the National League.

- In 15 games dating to May 22 vs. San Diego, Doolittle has gone 2-0 while converting all 12 saves...During this stretch, he has allowed just one earned run in 16.2 IP (0.54 ERA)...He has struck out 17 batters and has not issued a walk...Opposing batters are hitting .127 (7-for-55) with one extra-base hit (HR).
- Doolittle has thrown at least 1.0 inning without issuing a walk in 29 straight appearances...That run is a Major League record, topping BOS Koji Uehara's 28-game run from Aug. 4, 2013 to April. 17, 2014.

SUMMER OF SOTO

Juan Soto leads all MLB rookies (min. 165 PA), in batting average (.305), on-base percentage (.420), and OPS (.966)...His .546 slugging percentage is second behind NYY **Gleyber Torres** (.555)...Though he was called up on May 20, he ranks among NL rookies in walks (3rd, 28), HR (T3rd, 8), doubles (T5th, 10) and RBI (7th, 24).

- Since May 15 (the date of his "first" game due to the suspended game vs. NYY), he leads National League rookies in walks (1st, 28), home runs (T1st, 8), doubles (T2nd, 10), and RBI (T2nd, 24).
- Among all National League players (min. 165 PA), Soto ranks in on-base percentage (2nd, .420), OPS (4th, .966), batting average (9th, .305) and slugging percentage (9th, .546).

EXTRA! EXTRA!

Since June 15, **Anthony Rendon's** 16 extra-base hits are tied for second-most in MLB with COL **Nolan Arenado** and HOU **Alex Bregman**...STL **Matt Carpenter** leads with 17...On the season, Rendon's 36 extra-base hits rank just out of the top 10 (11th) in the National League...His 24 doubles rank fourth in the National League.

HARPER'S HOMERS

Bryce Harper clubbed his 21st home run of the season on July 2, a solo shot in the eighth inning...Harper's 21 home runs rank second behind only COL **Nolan Arenado** (22) for the most in the National League.

- Harper's 35 extra-base hits rank tied for 12th in the NL and are tied for second among NL outfielders behind ATL **Nick Markakis** (37).

NATIONALS HISTORY

July 7 (5-7 on this date)

2017 – The Washington Nationals staged a furious comeback, scoring three in the bottom of the ninth to tie the Atlanta Braves, 4-4, and plating the game-winner in the bottom of the 10th on a walk-off single by **Daniel Murphy**. Washington received contributions from nearly every player in the lineup, getting key hits from all corners during the rally -- including the first hit of **Adrian Sanchez's** Major League career, a clean single to center field to open the 10th and set up Murphy's heroics.

IN THE COMMUNITY

July 7: Neighborhood Day

Once again, the Nationals will dedicate a day to recognize and thank their neighbors in Ward 6. The team will provide hundreds of residents with tickets to area residents to watch the Nationals take on Miami. A variety of residents will also be recognized for their contributions to the community during the pregame ceremonies, including the ceremonial first pitch.

OPPONENT

MIAMI MARLINS

Assistant hitting coach **Joe Dillon** made his MLB debut on May 18, 2005 with the Florida Marlins... In 2004, he was named the Florida Marlins Minor League Player of the Year...**Bryce Harper's** 24 home runs are the most he's hit against any opponent and are 11th-most all-time against the Florida/Miami Marlins.

THE SERIES

The Nationals have won 13 straight games over the Marlins dating to Aug. 9, 2017...Washington has outscored Miami 88-33 during the streak.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#31 - MAX SCHERZER - RHP

Polished veteran right-hander, three-time Cy Young Award Winner and five-time consecutive All-Star signed a historic seven-year contract with Washington on Jan. 21, 2015...Joined the Nationals after seven Major League seasons with the Detroit Tigers (2010-14) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2008-09)...Is one of just 10 pitchers in Major League history to take home the Cy Young Award three or more times.

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Faces the Marlins for the 16th time and second time this season...Is 8-3 with a 3.39 ERA in 15 previous starts.

LAST START: Allowed three earned runs on four hits in 6.0 innings of work, but was saddled with the loss as the Nationals fell to the Red Sox, 4-3...Recorded his 1,000th strikeout as a member of the Nationals, becoming the 11th pitcher in MLB history to collect at least 1,000 strikeouts with two different clubs...The list, according to *Elías*: **Jim Bunning** (DET/PHI), **Roger Clemens** (BOS/NYY), **Randy Johnson** (ARI/SEA), **Mark Langston** (ANA/SEA), **Greg Maddux** (CHI/ATL), **Mike Mussina** (BAL/NYY), **Nolan Ryan** (CAL/HOU), **CC Sabathia** (CLE/NYY), **Luis Tiant** (BOS/CLE) and **Cy Young** (BOS/CLE)

2018 NOTES

- Ranks among National League pitchers in strikeouts (1st, 174), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (1st, 12.98), WHIP (1st, 0.87), opp. AVG (1st, .173), opp. OBP (1st, .238), hits per 9.0 IP (1st, 5.59), opp. OPS (.550), strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 5.80), ERA (2nd, 2.16), wins (T3rd, 10), and opp. SLG (3rd, .312)...Leads all Major League pitchers in Wins Above Replacement according to FanGraphs.com (4.6).
- His 12.98 strikeouts per 9.0 IP would be the fourth-best single-season mark in MLB history behind H.O.F. **Randy Johnson** (13.41 in 2001), H.O.F. **Pedro Martinez** (13.20 in 1999) and BOS **Chris Sale** (12.98 in 2018).
- Is in the midst of a four-game losing streak, his longest single-season losing streak of his career.
- Recorded a nine-game winning streak from (4/9-6/5) which tied the second-longest streak of his career (13 G; 4/6-7/3/13 and 9 G; 8/20/16-4/7/17)...It is the longest winning streak in Major League Baseball in 2018.
- Struck out at least 10 batters in three consecutive starts from May 6-19, tied for the the third-longest streak of his career (6 G; 5/26-6/21/17).
- Did not earn the win, but struck out a season-high 15 batters on May 6 vs. PHI...It was his fifth career 15+ strikeout game...He became the first pitcher in Major League history (since 1913) to strike out at least 15 batters in no more than 6.1 IP according to Baseball-Reference.com.
- Was named National League Pitcher of the Month for April (5-0, 1.62 ERA, 57 SO, 9 BB, .165 opp. AVG) and May (4-0, 2.21 ERA, 63 SO, 10 BB).
- Was named National League Player of the Week for the week of April 9 through 15 (2-0, 1.13 ERA, 21 SO, BB, 3 H).

CAREER NOTES

- His 74 games of 10+ strikeouts are tied for eighth-most in MLB history (since 1913) and most among active pitchers...He is tied with **Bob Gibson** (H.O.F., 1981) and **Sam McDowell**. **Steve Carlton** (H.O.F., 1994) is next on the list with 84 10+ strikeout games.
- His 39 games of 10+ strikeouts and one earned run or fewer allowed are tied for eighth-most in MLB history (since 1913) and most among active pitchers...**Walter Johnson** (H.O.F., 1936) is next on the list with 40 games.
- His 20 games of 10+ strikeouts and zero earned runs allowed are tied for eighth-most in MLB history (since 1913) and second-most among active pitchers (Kershaw - 23)...**Tom Seaver** (H.O.F., 1992) is next on the list with 21 games.
- Scherzer's five career games with 15 or more strikeouts are the most among active players and tied for seventh-most all-time .
- Leads all active starters and ranks second in MLB history with a career 10.36 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (**Randy Johnson** - 10.61).
- His career .197 opp. AVG vs. right-handed batters is fourth-best all-time and second among starting pitchers (**J.R. Richard** - .186).
- Is the only pitcher in MLB with an active streak of six-plus seasons with at least 200 strikeouts.
- Since joining the Nationals in 2015, has taken a no-hitter into the sixth inning in 11 of 116 starts (9.4%), per MASN in-game reporter, Dan Kolko.
- Since 2015, has posted a 0.92 WHIP, behind only **Clayton Kershaw** (0.88) for the best over this stretch.
