TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 28, 2008: On the season's last day in Game 1 of a doubleheader at Fenway Park, Mike Mussina records his 20th win, becoming the oldest pitcher in MLB history to win 20 games for the first time.

Sept. 28, 1968: Mickey Mantle plays his final career game, starting for the Yankees at Boston's Fenway Park. Hitting third, he bats in the top of the first and pops out to Red Sox shortstop Rico Petrocelli before being replaced in the field at 1B by Andy Kosco.

Sept. 28, 1951: In Game 1 of a doubleheader vs. Boston at Yankee Stadium, Allie Reynolds tosses his second no-hitter of the season (also at CLE on 7/12), as the Yankees defeat the Red Sox, 8-0.

Sept. 28, 1923: In a 24-4 win at Fenway Park, the Yankees collect 30 hits (8 doubles, 2HR), setting a single-game franchise record that still stands today. Babe Ruth highlights the offense by going 5-for-6 with 2 doubles, 1HR, 1BB, 4R and 3RBI.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 29, 1987: Don Mattingly hits his sixth grand slam of the season in a 6-0 win vs. Boston (off Bruce Hurst), setting a Major League record (since tied in 2006 by Travis Hafner).

Sept. 29, 1975: Former Yankees manager Casey Stengel passes away. Stengel managed the club for 12 seasons (1949-60), winning seven World Series titles.

Sept. 29, 1928: The Yankees and Tigers combine for a then-record 45 hits, with Detroit earning a 19-10 victory at Navin Field. Each of the nine Tigers batters finished with at least two hits.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin their final regular season series of the season tonight at Boston (3G, Fri.-Sun.)...are 3-1 on their final road trip of the season.

- ▶ Are 7-3 in their last 10G after going 1-4 in their previous 5G...are 23-15 in their last 38G and 30-19 in 49G since 8/6.
- ▶ At 98-61 (.616), have the Majors' third-best record and third-most wins behind Boston (107-52, .673) and Houston (100-58, .633)...marks their highest win total since going 103-59 in 2009...need to go 2-1 or better in their final 3G to record their 20th 100-win season in franchise history.
- ▶ Are a season-high-tying 37G over .500 (second time, also 97-60 at the end of play on Tuesday)...prior to 2018, had not been 37G over .500 since finishing the 2009 season with a 103-59 record (44G over .500).
- ▶ Have clinched their 54th postseason berth in franchise history (116 seasons, 46.6%)...have qualified for the playoffs in 20-of-24 seasons since 1995 (missed in 2008, '13-14, '16)...are going to consecutive postseasons for the first time since 2009-12.
- ▶ Lead Oakland (96-63) by 2.0G for the first AL Wild Card spot...will clinch home field in the AL Wild Card Game with either a win or Oakland loss (if the Yankees and Oakland finish with the same record, the Yankees will host based on the intradivision record tiebreaker).
- ▶ Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road...are 12-10 so far (7-6 on the road, 5-4 at home).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees earned a win in their four-game series at Tampa Bay by beating the Rays, 12-1, on Thursday afternoon...LHP CC Sabathia allowed 1H over 5.0 scoreless innings (OBB, 5K, 2HP) before being ejected in the sixth inning...LF Giancarlo Stanton (2-for-3, 3R, 2BB) hit a pair of solo HRs to give the Yankees an MLB-record-tying 24 multi-HR games in 2018...CF Brett Gardner (2-for-4, 1 double, 1 triple, 1RBI, 1BB, 1SB) tied a season high with 3R...1B Luke Voit (3-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) had his second consecutive three-hit game...DH Miguel Andujar (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) logged his 52nd multi-hit game.

- ▶ Tied both their second-highest run total and margin of victory this season (14-1 win on 4/23 vs. Minnesota).
- ▶ Marked their second two-hitter of the series (also Monday) and fifth of the season.

MOVING DAY: On Thurs. at Tampa Bay, LHP CC Sabathia allowed 1H over 5.0 scoreless innings (OBB, 5K, 2HP) to earn his 246th career win, tying Joe McGinnity for 50th on the all-time wins list...marked his 538th career start, tying Red Ruffing for 32nd all-time...with his 129th win in pinstripes, broke a tie with Jack Chesbro (128) for 11th on the Yankees' franchise list.

- ▶ Marked his fourth scoreless start this season, his second with 1H allowed (6.0IP, 1H on 8/12 vs. Texas)...prior to 2018, had not produced a scoreless start with 1H since 9/2/10 vs. Oakland (8.0IP, 1H, 0R).
- ▶ Since 1908, is the eighth pitcher (and first Yankee), age-38 or older, to record multiple scoreless starts of at least 5.0IP with 1H-or-fewer in a single season, joining Nolan Ryan (3x in 1986, 3x in 1990, 2x in 1991), Randy Johnson (2007), Greg Maddux (2006), Tom Glavine (2004), Mike Cuellar (1975), Sal Maglie (1956) and Cy Young (1908).

CUTCH CITY: OF Andrew McCutchen's next game will be the 1,500th of his career...will be one of 14 active outfielders to reach the milestone.

WILD THINGS: The Yankees have clinched their seventh AL Wild Card berth (1995, '97, 2007, '10, '15, '17-18)...is their third appearance in the AL Wild Card Game (lost in 2015, won in 2017), matching Pittsburgh (1-2 in NLWCG from 2013-15) for the most appearances by a team in the Wild Card Game.

- ▶ Will join the Pirates as the only teams to play in consecutive Wild Card Games (Colorado can also join this group).
- ▶ The Yankees (2x) and Pirates (3x: 2013-15) are the only teams to host multiple Wild Card Games...home teams are 5-7 all-time in the Wild Card Game (AL 3-3, NL 2-4).

JUDGE'S ORDERS: For the second consecutive season, RF Aaron Judge had the most popular jersey in Major League Baseball...the ranking is based on sales of Majestic jerseys from MLBShop.com since Opening Day 2018.

BRONX BOMBERS, INDEED: Yankees batters hit 4HR on Thurs. at Tampa Bay, their 15th game this season with at least 4HR (next-most: Oakland-11)...have hit a franchise-record 260HR this season...is tied with the 2005 Texas Rangers for the second-highest total in Major League history, behind the 1997 Seattle Mariners (264HR)...need 4HR over their final 3G to tie the record...are on pace to hit 265HR.

- ▶ Have homered in 29-of-33G since 8/24 (58HR total).
- ▶ Have scored 28R in the last 3G, tied for their second-highest-scoring three-game span of the season (29R from 4/23-25 vs. Minnesota).

MULTI-TASKING: With Giancarlo Stanton's 2HR game on Thursday, the Yankees tied a Major League record with their 24th multi-HR game of 2018...are the third team to do it, joining the 1961 Yankees and 1966 Braves.

- ▶ Stanton is one of 10 different Yankees to record a multi-HR game...Aaron Judge, who led the AL with seven multi-HR games in 2017, does not have one.

TO BE THE BEST...: Among the five AL playoff teams, the Yankees have the best record against the other AL postseason qualifiers, having gone 20-16 this season (5-2 vs. Cleveland, 5-2 vs. Houston, 3-3 vs. Oakland, 7-9 vs. Boston)...see chart at right.

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit his 36th and 37th HRs of the season on Thurs. at Tampa Bay, his fourth multi-HR game of the season...his 37HR are fifth-most by a player in his first season as a Yankee, trailing Babe Ruth (54HR in 1920), Jason Giambi (41HR in 2002), Mark Teixeira (39HR in 2009) and Roger Maris (39HR in 1960).

LUUUUUUUUUKE: 1B Luke Voit collected his second straight three-hit game on Thurs. at Tampa Bay...has multiple RBI in five of his last 9G, batting .429/.474/.943 (15-for-35) with 10R, 3 doubles, 5HR, 13RBI and 3BB since 9/19.

- ▶ Since joining the Yankees on 8/2, is hitting .331/.403/.661 (41-for-124) with 26R, 5 doubles, 12HR, 30RBI and 14BB in 37G...since 8/24, his 12HR (in 30G) are tied with Milwaukee's Christian Yelich for the Major League lead.

MULTI-HIT MIGGY: 3B Miguel Andujar went 2-for-4 with 1HR and 3RBI on Thurs. at Tampa Bay, his 52nd multi-hit game of the season...are tied with Ben Chapman (1930) for fourth-most by a Yankees rookie since 1913, behind Joe DiMaggio (66 in 1936), Earle Combs (65 in 1925) and Tresh (54 in 1962)...are third-most by an AL rookie over the last 15 seasons (since 2004), behind Mike Trout (56 in 2012) and Delmon Young (55 in 2007).

- ▶ Has 27HR this season, third-most by a Yankees rookie (Judge-52 in 2017, DiMaggio-29 in 1936).
- ▶ Has hit 14 of his 27HR when behind in the count, four more than any other Major League player this season.
- ▶ Is the eighth Yankees rookie to record 90RBI in a season, the third since 1963 (Judge-114 in 2017, Matsui-106 in 2003).
- ▶ His 72XBH (43 doubles, 2 triples, 2HR) are third-most by a Yankees rookie behind Joe DiMaggio (88 in 1936) and Aaron Judge (79 in 2017)...are third-most by an MLB rookie in the last 12 seasons (since 2007), behind Judge (79 in 2017) and José Abreu (73 in 2014).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 16 of their last 19 starts, going 8-4 with a 2.65 ERA (95.0IP, 88H, 32R/28ER, 24BB, 91K, 7HR) over the span...is the Majors' second-lowest rotation ERA since 9/7, trailing only the Mets (2.55).

- ▶ LHP J.A. Happ has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 straight starts vs. Boston (since 5/15/15), tied with Gaylord Perry (9/9/72-9/11/74) for the longest such streak vs. Boston since 1923.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 7-9 vs. the Red Sox in 2018. . . will play the 17th of 19 games tonight (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston) . . . are 21-17 in 38G vs. Boston since 9/27/16. . . **SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17). . . have lost just four of 18 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span. . . **AT FENWAY PARK:** Are 1-6 at Fenway Park in 2018. . . went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017. . . are just 8-18 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 31-31 there since the start of 2012. . . have won 8-of-14 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-5-1). . . are 498-482-4 (.508) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP J.A. HAPP (16-6, 3.57 ERA)

LHP J.A. Happ will make his 11th start as a Yankee and 31st start of the season in tonight's series opener at Boston...the 35-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...did not record a decision on Sunday vs. Baltimore, allowing only 1ER in 5.0IP (5H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...has posted a 0.78 ERA (23.0IP, 3R/2ER) in his last four starts...the Yankees are 8-2 in his starts...is 6-0 with a 2.34 ERA (57.2IP, 15ER) in 10 starts with the Yankees...was the first Yankees pitcher since Bob Turley in 1955 to *both start and win each of his first five appearances as a Yankee* according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...missed nine team games on 10-day D.L. from 8/2 (retro to 7/30)-8/9 with hand, foot and mouth disease...is tied for eighth in the Majors with 16 wins, the second-highest total of his career (20-4 in 2016)...was acquired from the Toronto Blue Jays in exchange for INF Brandon Drury and OF Billy McKinney on 7/26/18...his first name is pronounced "JAY"...according to STATS, LLC, is the fourth pitcher to make starts for both the Yankees and Blue Jays in the same season, and the first since David Cone in 1995...is one of seven pitchers to record double digit wins in each of the past five seasons...finished sixth in 2016 AL Cy Young Award voting after going 20-4 with Toronto and tying for the second-most wins in the Majors...the Yankees are his sixth Major League team, also the Phillies (2007-10), Astros (2010-12), Blue Jays (2012-14, '16-18), Mariners (2015) and Pirates (2015)...was originally selected by Philadelphia in the third round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft out of Northwestern (Ill.) University.

LAST START: Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 6-3 defeat on Sunday vs. Baltimore, allowing only 1ER in 5.0IP (5H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...extended his unbeaten streak to 11 consecutive starts...allowed his only run on a solo HR to Tim Beckham in the second...left the game with a 3-1 lead.

WINNING WAYS: Is undefeated over his last 11 starts (since 7/22), going 6-0 with a 2.30 ERA (62.2IP, 16ER) over that span...marks his longest such streak since going undefeated in 12 straight starts from 6/11-8/17/16...won five consecutive starts from 7/29-8/25, his longest stretch since also winning five straight from 7/24-8/17/16...was the second Yankees starter this season to win five consecutive games (also Luis Severino from 6/16-7/7).

IN PINSTRIPE: Is 6-0 with a 2.34 ERA (57.2IP, 47H, 16R/15ER, 14BB, 56K, 9HR, 5HP, 3WP, 1BK) in 10 starts as a Yankee...is tied for seventh in the Majors in wins since he joined the team on 7/29...opponents are hitting .221 (47-for-213), incl. .135 (5-for-37) with RISP...earned the win in his Yankees debut on 7/29 vs. Kansas City (6.0IP, 1ER).

- ✦ **Won his first five starts as a Yankee**, the first Yankees pitcher since Bob Turley in 1955 to *both start and win each of his first five appearances as a Yankee* according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...was the first Yankee to win his first five *starts* with the club since Rob Gardner, who had relief appearances mixed in among his first five Yankees starts stretching from 1970-72...is the first Yankee to go *undefeated* in his first 10 starts with the club since Joe Cowley (8-0 in 12 starts from 7/16/84-4/23/85).
- ✦ Is the first pitcher to win his first six decisions as a Yankee since Dellin Betances started his career 9-0 from 2011-15.

VS. BOSTON: Is 7-4 with a 2.82 ERA (111.2IP, 35ER) in 20 career games (19 starts) vs. the Red Sox...marks his second-lowest ERA vs. an AL opponent (2.81 ERA in 3GS vs. Toronto)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his last 11 starts vs. Boston (since 5/15/15), going 4-1 with a 1.62 ERA (66.2IP, 12ER) in that span...**is one of only two pitchers in the last 96 seasons (since 1923) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in 11 consecutive starts vs. the Red Sox** (also Gaylord Perry-11GS from 9/9/72-9/11/74)...is the third-longest such streak vs. the Red Sox since earned runs became an official statistic in the AL in 1913, behind the Yankees' Bob Shawkey (14GS from 6/29/1921-4/15/1924) and Cleveland's Gaylord Perry streak.

- ✦ Made three starts against Boston earlier this season, going 0-1 with a 0.54 ERA (16.2IP, 1ER)...did not record a decision on 4/24 at Rogers Centre despite allowing only 1ER in 7.0IP (4H, 10K)...took the loss on 7/12 at Fenway after allowing 5R/0ER in 3.2IP (5H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP)...did not record a decision in 3-2 win vs. Boston on 9/18 (6.0IP, 4H, 1R/0ER, 3BB, 6K, 1BK).
- ✦ Is 4-2 with a 2.91 ERA (46.1IP, 15ER) in nine career appearances (eight starts) at Fenway Park.

BEAST OF THE EAST: Since the start of 2017, is 9-7 with a 2.23 ERA (129.0IP, 32ER) in 23 starts vs. AL East clubs...is the second-lowest ERA vs. the AL East in that span (min. 10 starts), trailing only Chris Sale (2.17)...has held opponents to a .206 BA (99-for-480) in that span.

- Is the fourth Yankees manager to lead the team to a postseason berth in his rookie managerial season, joining Ralph Houk in 1961 (won World Series), Yogi Berra in 1964 (lost World Series) and Dick Howser in 1980 (lost ALCS).
- Was ejected in the sixth inning of Thursday's win at Tampa Bay by HP Umpire Vic Carapazza (after CC Sabathia was ejected for Jesús Sucre HP)...was his fourth career managerial ejection (also 5/22 at Texas, 7/14 at Cleveland and 8/31 vs. Detroit—all for arguing balls and strikes).
- Has led the club to a postseason birth in his first season as Manager.
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner...Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

- Leads all rookies with a 166H, 43 doubles, 90RBI, 72XBH and 52 multi-hit games, is tied for first with 27HR and ranks second with a .296 BA and 80R.
