TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 14, 2004: One day after Mike Mussina earns his 200th career win, Kevin Brown claims his 200th victory in a 5-1 win over the Devil Rays. The two become the first pair of teammates all-time to reach the 200-win milestone in the same season.

April 14, 1955: Elston Howard becomes the first African American player in Yankees history, making his Major League debut in an 8-4 loss at Boston (1-for-1, 1RBI).

April 14, 1910: The Yankees and Red Sox play to a 4-4 tie in their season opener at Hilltop Park.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 15, 1976: The Yankees play their first game in remodeled Yankee Stadium, defeating Minnesota, 11-4. The Twins' Dan Ford gets the first hit, a two-run HR in the first inning.

April 15, 1958: Yogi Berra breaks a scoreless deadlock at Boston's Fenway Park with a two-run, seventh-inning homer, marking his fourth consecutive Opening Day with a home run. When it was mentioned to Carmen that her husband hit four straight Opening Day homers, she said, "What a man."

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 2-2 on their six-game road trip after winning Friday's opener in Detroit and going 1-2 in Boston...following this series, will return to the Bronx for a season-high-tying 10-game homestand, which will include visits from Miami (2G), Toronto (4G) and Minnesota (4G).

- ▶ Have a .500 record for the fifth time this season (2-2, 4-4, 5-5, 6-6, 7-7)...are 2-2 when entering a game at .500.
- ▶ Are 5-5 thus far on a stretch of 16-of-22G at home (4/3-26): 3-3 at home, 2-2 on the road.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Tigers at Comerica Park on Friday, 8-6...**LHP Jordan Montgomery** (6.0IP, 5H, 3ER, 0BB, 4K, 1HR) earned his first win of the season...**CF Aaron Hicks** (2-for-3, 2R, 3RBI, 2BB) became the fifth Yankee in 2018 with a 2HR game, hitting an inside-the-park HR in the second and another HR in the sixth...was the first ITPHR by a Yankee since 2011...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-4, 2R, 1 double, 1 triple) picked up his first two XBHs of the season...**2B Ronald Torreyes** (3-for-4, 1R) tied a season high in hits...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB, 1SB) extended his hitting streak to 11 games...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP) struck out all 3BF to convert his second save.

BATS BOTH WAYS, HOMERS BOTH WAYS: On Fri. at Detroit, **OF Aaron Hicks** hit a two-run inside-the-park home run off Mike Fiers in the second inning and a solo HR off Fiers in the sixth...finished the night 2-for-3 with 2BB.

▶ Was the first inside-the-park home run by a Yankee since Curtis Granderson on 8/21/11 at Minnesota off Jose Mijares...it had been 1,022 games since Granderson's homer, the Yankees' second-longest drought with no inside-the-park HRs in team history (1,523 games from 8/30/99-5/14/09).

▶ Is the first Yankee to hit both an inside-the-park home run and a home run over the fence in the same game since Hank Bauer on 5/30/56-G2 vs. Washington at Yankee Stadium...Bauer homered off Camilo Pascual leading off the first inning and hit a two-run inside-the-park home run off Tex Clevenger in the eighth.

▶ Marked his fourth career multi-homer game: 6/9/17 vs. Baltimore, 4/13/17 vs. Tampa Bay*, 5/13/13 vs. Chicago-AL (* - homered from both sides of the plate).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Five different Yankees have hit 2HR in a game this season, with **OF Aaron Hicks** on Friday joining **C Gary Sánchez** on Wed. at Boston; **SS Didi Gregorius** on 4/3 vs. Tampa Bay; **1B Tyler Austin** on 3/31 at Toronto; **OF Giancarlo Stanton** on 3/29 at Toronto (all 2HR games)...**RF Aaron Judge**, who tied a Major League rookie record with seven multi-HR games in 2017, has not yet posted a multi-HR game in 2018.

▶ This marks the first time in Yankees history (and seventh time in Major League history) that a team has had five individual multi-HR games in the first 14 games of a season...the earliest the Yankees previously had five multi-HR games was in 2017, when Brett Gardner and Aaron Judge both hit 2HR in the Yankees' 25th game, each of their second games with 2HR to go with Hicks' one 2HR game.

▶ The Yankees are the first team in Major League history to have five different players record a multi-HR game in the first 14 games of a season.

▶ Ten of the Yankees' 18HR this season have been hit as part of a multi-HR game.

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 61-39 (.610) against the AL Central since the start of 2015, the highest winning percentage by an AL team against any AL division in that span...are 1-0 vs. the AL Central this season...are 19-8-3 in 30 series over the stretch (min. 2G).

▶ Are 8-3 at Comerica Park since 2015.

SAVED BY THE BELL: The Yankees notched just their second save of the season on Friday (both by Aroldis Chapman)...is their fewest through 14 games since 2007, when they Mariano Rivera recorded the Yankees' first save in the 22nd game.

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge extended his hitting streak to 11G on Fri. at Detroit, going 1-for-4 with 1R, 1RBI, 1BB and 1SB...is the second-longest hitting streak of his career (14G from 9/17/17-3/29/18)...is the longest hitting streak by a Yankee in 2018 and tied for the second-longest active streak in the Majors this season (Marcell Ozuna, 12G)...is batting .390/.528/.659 (16-for-41) with 11BB and 13K during the streak.

▶ His 59HR (through 196G) are **tyied for the all-time MLB record for HRs through 200 career games**, set by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.

▶ Is batting .338 (25-for-74) with 7HR in his last 22 road games (since 8/22/17) after hitting just .218 (58-for-266) with 14HR in his first 75 career road contests.

▶ Is tied for the AL lead with 12BB (also Boston's Andrew Benintendi)...leads the AL with 31 times on base.

▶ Has scored at least 1R in six straight games and in 9-of-10 contests...is tied for fourth in the AL with 13R.

GRAND-IOSE: OF Giancarlo Stanton played his 1,000th career game on Fri. at Detroit, becoming the fourth player from the 2007 First-Year Player Draft to reach the 1,000-game milestone, joining OF Jason Heyward, C Matt Wieters and 1B Freddie Freeman.

▶ Has 270HR were the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

CATCHING UP: C Gary Sánchez is 5-for-14 (.357) with 4R, 3 doubles, 2HR and 7RBI over the last 3G...was just 2-for-36 (.056) with 2R, 1 double, 1HR and 3RBI in his first 9G this season.

▶ Has 56HR through 189 career games, tied for fourth-most by a player in his first 200 games (see chart).

SS Didi Gregorius has reached base safely in 12-of-14 games played this season, batting .311/.433/.689.

▶ Leads the AL with 10XBH and 13RBI...is second in the AL in slugging average and OPS (1.122).

▶ Is tied for third in the AL with 11BB in 55PA in 2018 (18.3%)...drew walks in just 4.4% of his PAs over his first three years with the Yankees...did not draw his 11th walk last season until his 70th game of the year (7/19/17).

▶ His 1.0 WAR is second among MLB batters to Oakland's Matt Chapman (1.3) - FanGraphs.

BIG TOE: INF Ronald Torreyes went 3-for-4 with 1RBI on Fri. at Detroit, his second three-hit game of the season (also 4/8 vs. Baltimore)...is more three-hit games this season than 2017 MLB hits leader Charlie Blackmon (1) and the same number as 2017 AL hits leader José Altuve (2).

▶ His 10 games as a Yankee with at least 3H from the No. 9 spot in the order are the second-most such games in the Majors since the start of 2016, behind Detroit's José Iglesias (13); no other player has more than five...all other Yankees No. 9 hitters in this span have 10 three-hit games.

LUCKY NUMBER 7: The Yankees are 7-7...they have scored 77 runs and allowed 77 runs.

ALL THAT'S LEFT: Starting today, the Yankees are scheduled to face left-handed starting pitchers in each of the next four games...are 3-1 against left-handed starters this season after going 24-23 against southpaws in 2017.

▶ Would mark their most consecutive games against a left-handed starter since 4/21-25/16, when they went 3-2 in five straight games against Oakland's Rich Hill, Tampa Bay's Matt Moore, Blake Snell and Drew Smyly and Texas' Cesar Ramos.

▶ **Yankees batters** are slashing .273/.343/.463 vs. left-handed pitchers in 2018...their .806 OPS vs. southpaws ranks fifth in the Majors.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS CESSA (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

RHP Luis Cessa is scheduled to make his first start of 2018 and his third appearance of the year today at Detroit...the 25-year-old last pitched on Tuesday at Boston, tossing a perfect eighth inning (1.0IP, 1K)...will be making his first start since 8/14/17 vs. the Mets (ND, 4.1IP, 5H, 2ER, 1BB, 5K)...went 0-3 with a 4.75 ERA (36.0IP, 19ER) in 10 games (five starts) over four stints with the Yankees in 2017 (5/1, 6/15-7/8, 7/18-30 and 8/14-10/1)...was acquired by the Yankees from Detroit along with RHP Chad Green in exchange for LHP Justin Wilson on 12/9/15...was acquired by Detroit from the Mets along with RHP Michael Fulmer in exchange for OF Yoenis Céspedes on 7/31/15...began his professional career as an infielder in 2009 before being converted to a pitcher during the 2011 season.

2018: Started the season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre but did not make an appearance for the RailRiders before being recalled on 4/7...made his season debut that day in the Yankees' win vs. Baltimore, closing out the game with a perfect ninth (1.0IP, 2K)...made his second appearance of the season on Tuesday at Boston, tossing a perfect eighth inning (1.0IP, 1K).

SPRING TRAINING: In four spring training starts with the Yankees, went 2-0 with a 6.75 ERA (9.1IP, 7ER) and 10K.

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-7 with a 4.54 ERA (73.1IP, 37ER) in 14 career starts...earned wins in each of his first two career starts (8/20/16 at Los Angeles-AL and 8/26/16 vs. Baltimore) but is winnless in his last 12 starts (since 8/31/16)...only two Yankees pitchers since 2002 have had longer streaks of starts without a win (Luis Severino, 13 straight from 10/3/15-4/7/17; Phil Hughes, 13 straight from 7/8-9/25/13)...owns a 2.93 run support average over this streak, receiving one-or-zero runs of support in seven of those 12 starts and 2R-or-fewer nine times.

OUT OF THE PEN: Is 2-0 with a 4.11 ERA (35.0IP, 16ER) in 15 career relief appearances...has been perfect in two relief appearances this season (2.0IP, 3K).

VS. DETROIT: Has made one career appearance against the Tigers, making his Major League debut on 4/8/16 at Detroit...allowed 1ER in 2.0 innings of relief (2H, 2K, 1HR)...spent part of 2015 in Detroit's minor league system after being acquired from the Mets along with RHP Michael Fulmer in exchange for OF Yoenis Céspedes on 7/31/15.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Is 2-4 with a 4.08 ERA (46.1IP, 21ER) in 12 career appearances (seven starts) on the road...is 1-4 with a 4.33 ERA (35.1IP, 17ER) in seven career road starts.

2017: Went 0-3 with a 4.75 ERA (36.0IP, 19ER) in 10 games (five starts) over four stints with the Yankees (5/1, 6/15-7/8, 7/18-30 and 8/14-10/1)...was 0-3 with a 5.82 ERA (21.2IP, 14ER) in five starts and posted a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP, 5ER) without recording a decision in his five relief appearances...was placed on the 10-day disabled list on 8/15 with a ribcage injury and transferred to the 60-day D.L. on 9/1...was reinstated on 11/3...missed the team's final 45 games of the season.

✦ In 14 games (13 starts) with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, went 4-6 with a 3.45 ERA (78.1IP, 30ER) with 67K.

EL LANZADOR: The Córdoba-born Cessa is one of five Mexico-born pitchers to start a game in Yankees history...leads Mexico-born Yankees in starts and ranks second in innings pitched to Alfredo Aceves (145.1IP)...Jaime García (8GS), Esteban Loaiza (6GS), Alfredo Aceves (5GS) and Alfonso Pulido (3GS) have also made starts in pinstripes.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER AT DETROIT: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (2-1, 3.50 ERA)

RHP Luis Severino will make his fourth start of the season on Sunday at Detroit...the 24-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...made his first career Opening Day start, yielding 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings in a win on 3/29 at Toronto...at 24 years, 37 days, was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days) on 4/12/32 at Philadelphia-AL...was 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1IP, 5ER) in three starts this spring...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

LAST START: Suffered his first loss of the season in Tuesday's 14-1 defeat at Boston (5.0IP, 8H, 5ER, 3BB, 6K, 0HR)...was just his third career start of 5ER-or-more while allowing 0HR (last: 8/9/16 at BOS)...gave up a run-scoring single to Ramirez in the first, but stranded the bases loaded to end the inning...Benintendi tripled in two runs in the second, while Ramirez singled home another run...the Red Sox added an additional run in the fifth on a Ramirez sacrifice fly.

#12 TYLER WADE—INF/OF **Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/2G**

- Was 0-for-1 in Friday's win at Detroit, entering game at 2B in the eighth...is hitless in last 16AB...**on road trip** is 0-for-12 in 4G/2GS at 2B...was 0-for-2 in Tuesday's loss at Boston, pinch-hitting for Walker in the seventh and remaining in the game at 2B...moved to CF in the eighth, his first career appearance at the position...missed two games (Saturday and Sunday) with the flu.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster...at age 23y, 126d, became the youngest player on the Yankees' Opening Day roster and the youngest position player to make a Yankees O.D. roster since Melky Cabrera in 2007 (age 22y, 234d)...batted .286 (14-for-49) in 22 spring games.
- Made his Major League debut with the Yankees in 2017, batting .155 (9-for-58) in 30 games...appeared on the Yankees' AL Wild Card Game roster, but did not play.
- Spent most of the season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, batting .310/.382/.460 (105-for-339) with 68R, 22 doubles, 4 triples, 7HR, 31RBI and 265B (in 31 chances), appearing at 2B, SS, 3B, LF, CF and RF...won the IL's batting title and was named to the IL Postseason All-Star Team.
