**TAXI SQUAD**—Today the Rays added LH **Anthony Banda** to the taxi squad, and he will be active tomorrow...of the four prospects the Rays acquired for OF **Steven Souza Jr.**, Banda will be the first to join the Rays active roster (he also made 8 apps (4 starts) for the D-backs last season)...according to *Baseball America*, in the three-team trade the Rays received the D-backs No. 2 (Banda), No. 13 (RH **Sam McWilliams**) and No. 29 (LH **Colin Poche**) prospects and the Yankees No. 12 prospect (2B **Nick Solak**)...McWilliams and Poche were announced as the players to be named on May 1...Banda ranks 2nd in the International League with 44 SO and Solak is batting .311 in Double-A...in 12 apps at Double-A, Poche—who was promoted to Triple-A Durham today—totaled 16 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 32 SO...McWilliams has a 2.63 ERA in 6 starts in Class-A Advanced.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have lost three consecutive games, are 2-5 in their last 7 games and 3-6 in their last 9 games on the heels of an 8-game winning streak...this is their first 3-game losing streak since April 11-15 at CWS, vs. PHI (4)...over this 3-game slide, the Rays have totaled 33 baserunners and 21 hits but only 3 runs, and they are batting .143 (3-for-21) with RISP...the 2 runs scored in the 8th inning on Wed vs. ATL snapped the Rays scoreless streak at 17 innings...they have scored in only two of their last 27 innings at the plate, since the 1st inning on Sun vs. TOR...in their last 9 games, the Rays are batting .179 (12-for-67) with RISP—compared to .374 (34-for-91) with RISP during the 8-game winning streak...the Rays are 1-2 in their last 3 series after winning the previous four.

✦ The Rays have been held to 2 runs or fewer in three straight games for second time this season (March 30–April 1)...they haven't done this in four consecutive games since Aug 4-9, 2017 (5).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN**—This is the third of four consecutive 3-city road trips to start the season—the first time in franchise history the Rays have ever had four consecutive three-city trips...this 11-game jaunt to Baltimore (4 games), Kansas City (3 games) and Anaheim (4 games) will be the Rays first trip of 11 games or more since September 2016, when they went 5-6 visiting NYY (1-3), TOR (1-2) and BAL (2-2)...the Rays welcomed new hitting coach **Chad Mottola** at the onset of that trip...the last time the Rays covered had a road trip to three different time zones was June 2008, when they went 3-6 in Boston (0-3), Texas (2-1) and Anaheim (1-2)—including the famous **James Shields-Coco Crisp** brawl at Fenway Park.

**CLOSE SHAVES**—The Rays are 5-12 (.294) in 1-run games this season...six of their last 9 games have been decided by a 1-run margin, and they are 1-5 in the 1-run games over that span...the loss on Wed vs. ATL was their first by more than 1 run since April 17 vs. TEX (lost 7-2)—in between, they played 16 games, going 11-5 and all 5 losses were by 1 run...the Rays have played a majors-most 17 games decided by 1 run, the most by any team within their first 34 games of the season since 2014 (Pirates 18, Giants 17, Reds 17) and most by an AL team since the 2005 White Sox (17).

✦ 50.0 pct. of the Rays games this season have been decided by 1 run, compared to 29.2 pct. of games in the majors (322 of 1,102).  
✦ The Rays are the first team in the majors with at least 12 one-run losses within their first 34 games of the season since the 1994 Phillies (12) and the first AL team since the 1989 Blue Jays (12)...they are one of 12 teams since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) with at least 12 one-run losses within their first 34 games of the season.  
✦ The .294 winning pct. in 1-run games is 5th-lowest in the majors.  
✦ Since 2016, the Rays are 39-63 (.382) in 1-run games, 2nd-worst winning pct. in the majors over that span to the Twins (.381).

**POWER OUTAGE**—The Rays have hit 1 HR in their last 4 games and 3 HR in their last 7 games...this comes on the heels of home runs in eight consecutive games from April 21-30, totaling 19 HR over that span, including multiple homers in 6 games and 3 HR or more in 4 games.

✦ Only 34.0 pct. of the Rays runs this season have scored via the home run, compared to a club-record 48.0 pct. last year.

**RAYS vs. ORIOLES**—Tonight is the third of 19 games between the two clubs this season, and the Rays are 2-0 thus far...the Rays have won five consecutive games over the Orioles dating back to last Sep 29...it's their longest winning streak against the O's since May 17–June 8, 2013 (5), and only twice in franchise history have they won at least six straight over Baltimore: April 30–Sep 24, 2008 (12) and April 7–Aug 9, 1999 (6)...they are

9-2 in their last 11 games against the Orioles...last season the Rays went 11-8 against the Orioles, their first season series win over them since 2013 (13-6)...they hit 29 HR, tied for their most ever against Baltimore (2006)—but only 7 of those 29 HR were hit by players still currently with the club.

**LET'S PLAY TWO**—The traditional, single-admission doubleheader tomorrow at BAL will be the 27th doubleheader in franchise history and eighth traditional doubleheader...the Rays are 4-12-10 in their previous 26 doubleheaders and 1-2-4 in their previous seven traditional doubleheaders...most recently, the Rays hosted the Athletics in a scheduled traditional doubleheader last June 10, winning Game 1, 6-5, on an **Evan Longoria** walk-off single, and losing Game 2, 7-2...they haven't played a doubleheader on the road since a split doubleheader on June 25, 2016 at BAL, and they were swept by the Orioles, 5-0 and 8-6.

**SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN**—Today the Rays begin a stretch of 24 games in 24 days, with a doubleheader tomorrow and an off-day on May 21...tonight's game also begins a stretch of 40 games in 41 days...their next 7 games are against teams currently below .500...the Rays are 10-4 against teams under .500 this season and 5-15 against teams .500 or better.

**ROAMING BUFFALO**—On Wed vs. ATL, **Wilson Ramos** singled in the 8th inning to extend his hitting streak to 16 games, the longest active in the majors...it is the 2nd-longest streak of his career, behind April 24–May 19, 2015 (19, with the Nationals)...it's the longest streak by a Ray since **James Loney** (16) from June 19–July 5, 2013 and is 3 games shy of tying the franchise record, held by **Jason Bartlett** (19) in 2009...the streak is the longest in club history among catchers...Wed vs. ATL marked the fourth time and second consecutive game he kept his streak alive with a hit in his final at-bat of the game.

✦ Since returning from a torn right ACL last June, Ramos has hit .324/.350/.730 (12-for-37) in 11 games against the Orioles and has 4 HR and 14 RBI in 6 games at Oriole Park at Camden Yards.

**MINOR MATTERS**—Last night, 1B/LH **Brendan McKay** did not allow a run in 6 IP, the longest outing of his career...he extended his scoreless streak to 12.2 IP, allowing 1 hit over this span...his single allowed in the 3rd inning last night snapped his hitless streak at 8.2 IP...McKay, 22, was the fourth overall selection in the 2017 June Draft and was the Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Month for April...he is 2-0 with a 1.09 ERA (24.2-IP, 3-ER) and 40/2 SO/BB ratio in 6 starts for Class-A Bowling Green, and is batting .262/.483/.344 (16-for-61) with 1 HR and 16 RBI.

**RAYS ON THE TUBE**—An all-new episode of "Inside the Rays" will premiere on FOX Sports Sun tomorrow following the conclusion of the Rays-Orioles doubleheader...titled "The Prospects," this episode focuses specifically on four of the most highly touted positional players in the minor league system: INF **Willy Adames**, INF **Christian Arroyo**, 1B/OF **Jake Bauers** and OF **Justin Williams**.

**THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY**—On May 11, 2002, **Randy Winn** hit a 3-run, walk-off homer in the 9th inning off Orioles closer **Jorge Julio**, giving the Devil Rays a 6-4 win and snapping a 15-game losing streak...it remains the longest losing streak in franchise history...it was the longest losing streak of all-time to end with a walk-off home run.

## TONIGHT'S STARTER: RH JAKE FARIA (3-1, 4.15 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Sat vs. TOR, won a third consecutive decision for the first time since June 7–July 6, 2017 (4)...his only run allowed came on a solo homer by **Teoscar Hernández** in the 4th inning, snapping his scoreless streak at 11 IP...was the second time this season his only run allowed came via solo home run (April 18 vs. TEX, **Shin-Soo Choo**)...only allowed 1 hit in his first 5 IP, then allowed 2 hits to 3 BF in the 6th inning and was replaced...his line: W, 5.1 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 73 pit, 46 str.

**WHEN HE'S ON**—Has yielded 1 run or fewer in consecutive starts, four of his last 5 starts and five of his 7 starts so far this season, pitching to a 1.26 ERA (28.2-IP, 4-ER) in those 5 starts...his 5 starts of 1 run or fewer are tied for 2nd in the majors behind **STL Carlos Martínez** (6) and tied for most in the AL with **HOU Gerrit Cole**, **OAK Sean Manaea**, **BOS Chris Sale**, **TB Blake Snell** and **HOU Justin Verlander**.

- + While Faria and Snell have combined to allow 1 run or fewer 10 times in 15 starts, the rest of the Rays rotation has done this six times in 19 starts.
- + He has yielded 1 run or fewer in 11 of his 21 career starts.
- + Has yielded *more than 3 runs* only four times in his 21 career starts.
- + Twice this year, has allowed 1 run or fewer and not gotten the win...only four AL pitchers have done that more frequently: **DET Matthew Boyd** (3), **KC Ian Kennedy** (3), **CWS Reynaldo Lopez** (3) and **BOS Chris Sale** (3).

**THE WIN COLUMN**—Is 3-0 with a 2.17 ERA (29-IP, 7-ER) and 28 SO over his last 5 starts, dating back to April 13 vs. PHI, after allowing a career-high 7 runs on April 7 at BOS...with a win tonight, he would tie the longest winning streak of his career (4, spanning the first 6 starts of his career from June 7–July 6, 2017).

**vs. BALTIMORE**—Is 1-0 with a 4.78 ERA (26.1-IP, 14-ER) in 5 apps (4 starts) in his career against the Orioles...is 0-0 with a 5.54 ERA (13-IP, 8-ER) in 3 apps (2 starts) at Oriole Park at Camden Yards...on April 25 at BAL, got no decision but yielded an RBI double to **Adam Jones** in the 1st inning, 2-run double to **Jace Peterson** in the 2nd inning and solo homer to **Chance Sisco**, his last batter faced, in the 5th inning.

**HOME vs. ROAD**—He is 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA (14-IP, 12-ER) on the road this season and 3-3 with a 4.65 ERA (60-IP, 31-ER) on the road in his career...in comparison, he has allowed 1 run (or fewer) in all 4 starts at home this season, going 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA (20.2-IP, 4-ER), which ranks 4th in the AL...for his career, is 5-2 with a 2.64 ERA (61.1-IP, 18-ER) in 11 apps (10 starts) at home...in his 10 starts there, he has yielded 3 runs or fewer nine times and 1 run (or fewer) seven times.

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS**—Last season he was named the club's Outstanding Rookie by the Tampa Bay Chapter of the BBWAA...min. 75 IP, he led AL rookies with a 3.43 ERA, .225 opp avg., .387 opp SLG, 8.72 SO/9 IP ratio and 1.18 WHIP...ranked 4th among AL rookies with 84 SO, and ranked 2nd to **NY Yankees Jordan Montgomery** (91) after his June 7 recall...achieved this despite spending 25 games on the disabled list from Aug 17–Sep 14.

**REDEFINING QUALITY**—He was the first pitcher to begin his career with 7 consecutive quality starts since **NY Yankees Masahiro Tanaka** (16) in 2014, and one of only nine pitchers since 1913 to begin his career in this fashion...he became the fifth pitcher since 1913 to go 6 IP or more, allow 1 run or fewer and earn the win in his first 3 apps, joining **STL Andy Rincon** (1980), **CIN Wayne Simpson** (1970), **STL Stu Miller** (1952) and **DET Alex Main** (1914)...he also became the second pitcher since 1913 with at least 35 SO and 5 BB or fewer in his first 5 starts, with no relief apps in between, joining **SEA Félix Hernández** in 2005...was the second Ray to win his first 4 decisions, all as a starter, joining **James Shields** in 2006.

**LUCKY DUCK**—While playing scout ball in 2010, he was turned away by an overbooked hotel...to apologize, the hotel provided a gift bag with treats and a rubber duck...the duck found its way to his equipment bag, where it was forgotten...after a strong first season as a professional, he was frustrated by a poor 2012 campaign...the next spring began poorly as well, until Jake realized a new equipment bag had separated him from the duck...when his father shipped Jake's car, he placed the duck inside...an outstanding 2013 campaign followed and the duck has traveled with him to the ballpark ever since.

## TOMORROW'S GAME 1 STARTER: RH CHRIS ARCHER (2-2, 5.32 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Sun vs. TOR, lowered his season ERA from 6.05 to 5.32...his only run allowed was a 1-out, RBI single by **Aledmys Díaz** in the 5th inning...went 7 IP, his longest start since Aug 27, 2017 at STL (7 IP) and longest start at home since July 22, 2017 vs. TEX (7 IP)...received no-decision following the game-tying solo homer by **Carlos Gómez**, and avoided the third loss of his career when going 7 IP or more and yielding 1 run or fewer...his line: ND, 7 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 0 BB, 6 SO, 97 pit, 64 str.

- + Did not allow a walk for the first time since Sep 2, 2017 at CWS, and for the first time in a non-injury shortened start since Aug 17, 2017

at TOR...did not allow a homer for the second consecutive start, after allowing at least 1 HR in his first 6 starts this season.

**vs. BALTIMORE**—Is 6-8 with a 4.92 ERA (100.2-IP, 55-ER) in 18 apps (17 starts) against the Orioles...min. 5 starts, his ERA is his 3rd-highest against any opponent behind the Indians (5.87) and Red Sox (5.49)...is 2-5 with a 6.70 ERA (41.2-IP, 31-ER) in 8 apps (7 starts) at Camden Yards...last faced them on April 26 at BAL and got the win, the first Ray to win when allowing 11 hits or more since **James Shields** on April 27, 2012 at TEX.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
