NATIONALS NEWS

MARK REYNOLDS.

The Washington Nationals beat the Miami Marlins, 18-4, behind a career night from Mark Reynolds...He went 5-for-5 with a double, two home runs, 10 RBI and three runs scored...It was his 28th career multi-home run game, and third as a member of the Washington Nationals...The 10 RBI were a career high.

- Reynolds is the 15th player in Major League history to record 10 RBI in a game...He is the fourth player in Major League history to record a perfect day at the plate while collecting at least 10 RBI joining STL **Jim Bottomley** (9/16/24 vs. BRO), **Anthony Rendon** (4/30/17 vs. NYM) and CIN **Scooter Gennett** (6/6/17 vs. STL).
- His 10 RBI matched **Anthony Rendon** (4/30/2017 vs. NYM) for the most RBI in a single game in Nationals history (2005-pres.).
- Coupled with Trea Turner's eight RBI on Thursday and Reynolds' 10 RBI effort on Saturday, this marks the first time since 2012 that a team has had two 8+ RBI games in a season...The last team to do it was the 2012 Texas Rangers (**Nelson Cruz**: 5/25 vs. TOR, **Josh Hamilton**: 5/8 vs. BAL).
- According to *Stats, Inc.*, the last National League teammates to record at least eight RBI in games in a span of three days were **Willie Mays** (HOF, 1979) and **Orlando Cepeda** (HOF, 1999) for the 1961 Giants.

MARLIN SEASON

The Nationals enter today riding a 14-game winning streak over the Marlins...Washington's 14-game winning streak over Miami is the longest winning streak against a single opponent in Nationals history (2005-pres.)... This streak tops the 11-game win streak over Seattle from June 10, 2005 to Aug. 30, 2014.

- According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Washington's 14-game winning streak over Miami is the longest active winning streak by one team over another.
- The last MLB team to win 14 or more consecutive games vs. one opponent was the New York Mets, who won 14 straight games over the Cincinnati Reds from Sept. 7, 2014 to Sept. 7, 2016.

SERIES BUSINESS

The Nationals have scored 35 runs in the first three games of this four-game series...The 35 runs are already tied for third-most in team history (2005-pres.) for runs scored in a four-game series...The Nationals record for runs scored in a four-game series is 46, April 24-27, 2017 at Colorado.

TREA MAGNIFIQUE!

Washington's come-from-behind win on Thursday night was powered by **Trea Turner**, who went 3-for-5 with two home runs (including the go-ahead grand slam), eight RBI and three runs scored...His eight RBI were tied for the most by a leadoff hitter in Major League history and were tied for second-most in a game by any hitter in Nationals history (2005-pres.).

- Over his last 18 games, **Trea Turner** is 28-for-74 (.378) with one double, one triple, four homers, 12 RBI, six walks, two stolen bases and 17 runs scored...He has a .432 on-base percentage and a .581 slugging percentage during this stretch.
- Turner's 17 runs scored since June 19 are tied for third in the National League over this stretch.
- Turner has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games, posting multi-hit efforts in seven of the 10...He is hitting .422 (19-for-45) with three homers and 10 RBI during this stretch.
- According to FanGraphs.com, Turner leads all National League shortstops in WAR (3.2) and DEF rating (7.1).

DOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOOO

Closer **Sean Doolittle** leads National League relievers in strikeout-to-walk ratio (16.33) opp. OBP (.167) and WHIP (0.54)...He leads the National League with a 95.7 save% (22-for-23), while his 22 saves rank fourth in the National League.

- In 15 games dating to May 22 vs. San Diego, Doolittle has gone 2-0 while converting all 12 saves...During this stretch, he has allowed just one earned run in 16.2 IP (0.54 ERA)...He has struck out 17 batters and has not issued a walk...Opposing batters are hitting .127 (7-for-55) with one extra-base hit (HR).
- Doolittle has thrown at least 1.0 inning without issuing a walk in 29 straight appearances...That run is a Major League record, topping BOS **Koji Uehara's** 28-game run from Aug. 4, 2013 to April. 17, 2014.

SUMMER OF SOTO

Juan Soto leads all MLB rookies (min. 170 PA), in batting average (.308), on-base percentage (.420), and OPS (.967)...His .548 slugging percentage is second behind NYY **Gleyber Torres** (.555)...Though he was called up on May 20, he ranks among NL rookies in walks (3rd, 28), HR (T3rd, 8), doubles (T5th, 11) and RBI (T6th, 26).

- Since May 15 (the date of his "first" game due to the suspended game vs. NYY), he leads National League rookies in walks (1st, 28), home runs (T1st, 8), doubles (T2nd, 11), and RBI (1st, 26).
- Among all National League players (min. 170 PA), Soto ranks in on-base percentage (2nd, .420), OPS (5th, .967), batting average (8th, .308) and slugging percentage (9th, .548).

EXTRA! EXTRA!

Since June 15, **Anthony Rendon's** 17 extra-base hits are tied for second-most in MLB with STL Matt Carpenter behind HOU Alex Bregman (18)...On the season, Rendon is tied for 10th in the National League with 37 extra base hits...His 25 doubles rank fourth in the National League.

NATIONALS HISTORY

July 8 (3-7 on this date)

2007 - **Ryan Zimmerman** hit a two-run home run to trigger a six-run sixth inning uprising and the Nationals ended the season's first "half" with a 7-2 home win over the Brewers. **Tim Redding** allowed two runs in 6.0 innings to pocket his first big league win since Sept. 26, 2004.

OPPONENT

MIAMI MARLINS

Assistant hitting coach **Joe Dillon** made his MLB debut on May 18, 2005 with the Florida Marlins... In 2004, he was named the Florida Marlins Minor League Player of the Year...**Bryce Harper's** 24 home runs are the most he's hit against any opponent and are 11th-most all-time against the Florida/Miami Marlins.

THE SERIES

The Nationals have won 14 straight games over the Marlins dating to Aug. 9, 2017...Washington has outscored Miami 106-38 during the streak.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#57 - TANNER ROARK - RHP

Right-hander is one of MLB's top unheralded pitching performers...Is 53-45 with a 3.57 ERA in 128 career starts...He has eclipsed the 13-win mark in each of his seasons as a full-time starter (2014, 2016-pres.)...Since 2014, he ranks fifth among MLB starting pitchers in hard-hit rate (25.8%), according to FanGraphs.com...Has tossed 7.0 innings in 49 of his 128 starts, going 27-11 with a 1.75 ERA in those 49 starts...Helped Team USA bring home the Gold Medal in the 2017 World Baseball Classic...Is stellar with the glove, having committed just two errors in 124 games (608.0 IP) since the start of 2015 - a .983 fielding percentage.

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Is 5-8 with a 3.99 ERA in 22 games (16 starts) against the Marlins...Has allowed exactly one earned run in four of his last seven starts and two earned runs or fewer in six of the last seven...Faced the Marlins on May 26 at Marlins Park...Did not receive the win despite allowing just one earned run on four hits in 7.0 innings of work.

LAST START: Surrendered a career-high nine earned runs, but battled through 7.0 innings pitched on July 3 against Boston...It was his longest outing since May 26 at Miami.

2018 NOTES

- His 10 quality starts are tied for sixth in the National League.
 - Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in six of his 16 starts...His seven starts of at least 7.0 IP are tied for fifth-most in the National League.
 - Has received 25 total runs of support in his last 11 starts combined (3.34 runs of support per game)...His 3.92 runs support average this season is sixth lowest in the National League...10 of the 25 runs came in just one start on June 6 vs. TBR.
 - Allowed one earned run on seven hits in 6.0 innings of work on June 28 at Philadelphia...Struck out five batters and issued three walks...Was the fewest earned runs allowed in a start since May 26 at Miami.
 - He tossed 6.0 IP, giving up three runs on six hits while walking two and striking out five on June 12 at New York (AL)...He completed at least 6.0 IP for the 11th straight start dating to April 13.
 - In his 12th start of the season, June 6 vs. Tampa Bay, he collected a career-high two RBI with a single in the bottom of the first inning.
 - Appeared out of the bullpen in the final game of the series against Atlanta on June 3.
 - Matched a season-high nine strikeouts on May 5 vs. PHI, but was saddled with the loss.
 - Struck out a season-high nine batters in 5.0 innings pitched on April 8 vs. New York.
 - Opened the season with 7.0 strong innings on April 2 at ATL...Allowed one earned run on four hits while striking out six and walking one as Washington topped Atlanta, 8-1...Right-handed batters went 0-for-6 with one strikeout against him.
- ### 2017 NOTES
- Was one of the top pitchers in the National League in the season's second half...In 12 starts post-All-Star break, he went 7-5 with a 3.90 ERA in 14 games (13 starts)...He struck out 86 batters in 80.2 IP and held opposing batters to a .223 AVG.
 - After the break, he ranked among NL pitchers (min. 13 GS) in opp. AVG (6th, .223), opp. OBP (7th, .292), hits per 9.0 IP (6th, 7.59), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9th, 9.60).
 - He recorded 42 strikeouts against just eight walks in his last six starts.
 - His 10.51 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ranked sixth and his 5.25 SO/BB ranked ninth in the National League from Aug. 27 through the end of the season.
 - Improved from 7.4 strikeouts per 9.0 IP in 2016 to 8.2 strikeouts per 9.0 IP in 2017.
 - Went 6-6 with a 5.27 ERA in 18 games (17 starts) prior to the All-Star break.
 - Threw a season-high 7.2 IP on June 5 at OAK. (7.2 IP, 5 H, 4 ER, BB, 4 SO).
 - Recorded two 10+ strikeout games (11, 7/22 at ARI and 10, 9/1 at MIL) after entering the season with just two for his career.
