WINTER WONDERLAND: The last time the Cardinals played a home game in temperatures of 42 degrees or below in one of their first eight games of the season was April 6, 1979 vs. Philadelphia in which the first pitch was 40 degrees... the coldest temperature of recorded home games in one of their first eight was April 16, 1961 vs. Cincinnati in which it was 38 degrees at first pitch (*Baseball-Reference*)...Umpire Mike Winters is assigned home plate today.

YOUNG GUN: Jordan Hicks has thrown four straight scoreless appearances (4.1 IP) to begin his MLB. At 21-years and 204-days, he holds the second longest scoreless appearance streak for a Cardinals pitcher that age or younger, trailing only teammate Alex Reyes, who ran off five straight (9.1) to begin his career in 2016. The Major League record (since 1908) is held by Victor Cruz of the Toronto Blue Jays with 13 straight (21.1 IP) in 1978.

TAKE YOUR BASE: Matt Carpenter has reached base safely in all seven games to begin 2018...his multi-walk game Thursday night was the 100th of his career, 11th-most in Cardinals history and five behind Keith Hernandez (10th, 105 games)...his 99 multi-walk games since his first full season in 2012 are ranked 6th in all of MLB...D-Backs Paul Goldschmidt ranks 3rd on that list with 123 such games.

BACKSTOP BREAKOUT: Yadier Molina's three home runs are the most ever by a Cardinals catcher in the team's first seven games...Lou Brock hit a club record six round-trippers in the team's first seven games to begin 1967.

STILL TO COME: The only Cardinals player yet to see action after the first seven games this season is catcher Francisco Peña, who joins Minnesota RHP Tyler Kinley, Cincinnati LHP Cody Reed, and Kansas City LHP Eric Skoglund as the only active players yet to appear who began the season on an Opening Day roster (*Elias*).

SILVER SLUGGER PRESENTATIONS: Outfielder Marcell Ozuna and pitcher Adam Wainwright will be presented their 2017 Louisville Silver Slugger Awards pregame on Monday...both are the first of their careers...current Cardinals with Silver Slugger Awards include Matt Carpenter (2B, 2013), Yadier Molina (C, 2013) and Willie McGee (1985, OF).

IT'S GOOD TO BE DEJONG AGAIN: Shortstop Paul DeJong as hit 28 career home run since his since his ML debut (May 28, 2017 at COL)...only Minnesota's Brian Dozier (31) has more among MLB middle infielders since...DeJong's 28 homers in his first 115 MLB games also ties him with Albert Pujols for most by a Cardinal in his first 115 career games.

BLAST OFF: Dexter Fowler hit his 24th career lead-off home run Tuesday night, ranking 8th among active players...Tue. night's first-pitch blast was the 3rd of his career coming on the game's initial pitch...his first career home run also came on the game's first pitch on April 8, 2009 at Arizona (Doug Davis)...he also did so on June 22, 2014 at Tampa Bay.

CENTURY MEN: Dexter Fowler and Marcell Ozuna hit their first home runs of the season Tuesday night and Matt Carpenter drilled his first homer last Saturday, giving him 98 for his career...Carpenter (98), Jedd Gyorko (99), Fowler (97) and Ozuna (97) are all approaching 100 career round-trippers.

TODAY IN CARDINALS HISTORY

April 7, 2013: Third baseman Matt Carpenter (3-for-5, 3 RBI) records two hits and drives in a pair of runs during a nine-run 4th inning in a 14-3 win over the Giants at AT&T Park, the same day San Francisco receives their 2012 World Series Championship Rings. The nine runs scored off Matt Cain in the fourth were the most against any Giants pitcher in a single inning since 1902.

ARIZONA CONNECTIONS

Cardinals pitcher Dominic Leone pitched parts of two seasons (2015-16) with Arizona...originally traded by Seattle with catcher Wellington Castillo and infielder Jack Reinheimer to Arizona for pitcher Vidal Nuno and outfielder Mark Trumbo (June 3, 2015).

Cardinals assistant hitting coach Bill Mueller played parts of two seasons (1995-96) for the Phoenix Firebirds (AAA) as a member of the San Francisco Giants organization.

Cardinals assistant coach Willie McGee rehabbed for four games with the Phoenix Firebirds (AAA) as a member of the San Francisco Giants organization in 1991.

Cardinals President of Operations John Moze-liak attended the University of Arizona before graduating from the University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Senior Special Assistant to the General Manager Bob Gebhard worked for the Diamondbacks as Vice President & Special Assistant to the GM for 12 seasons (2005-16).

Diamondbacks infielder Daniel Descalso played parts of five seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2010-14)...appeared in 44 postseason games and was a member of the 2011 World Champion Cardinals...originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2007 MLB Draft.

Diamondbacks outfielder David Peralta was originally signed by the Cardinals as a non-drafted free agent pitcher (September 26, 2004)...pitched three minor league seasons (2005-07)...underwent pair of left-shoulder surgeries...released in May 2009.

Diamondbacks pitcher Fernando Salas pitched parts of four seasons with St. Louis (2010-13)...was a member of the 2011 World Series Champions...converted a team-leading 24 saves for St. Louis in 2011...originally purchased by St. Louis from Triple-A Saltillo Saraperos of the Mexican League (April 5, 2007).

Diamondbacks Vice President, Player Development Mike Bell is the younger brother of former Cardinals Bench Coach David Bell...Mike also played in eight games for the Triple-A Memphis Redbirds in 2005.

Cardinals Hall of Fame Manager Tony La Russa served as the Diamondbacks Chief Baseball Analyst for four seasons (2014-17).

Diamondbacks First Base Coach Dave McKay served in the same position for the Cardinals (1996-2011) under La Russa.

Diamondbacks Pitching Strategist Dan Haren was drafted by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2001 MLB draft...pitched two seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2003-04)...later traded by the Cardinals with catcher Daric Barton and pitcher Kiko Calero to Oakland for pitcher Mark Mulder (December 18, 2004).

Diamondbacks Pro Scout Pete Vuckovich pitched three seasons in St. Louis (1978-80)...later traded by the Cardinals with pitcher Rolie Fingers and catcher Ted Simmons to the Brewers for pitchers Lary Sorensen and Dave LaPoint and outfielders David Green and Sixto Lezcano (December 12, 1980).

Diamondbacks Player & Media Relations Intern Sydney Sloas served as the Cardinals 2017 Spring Training Intern at Jupiter, Fla.

2018 SPRING TRAINING

- Was 1-2 with a 3.32 ERA (19.0 IP) and 14 strikeouts in five Grapefruit League starts.
- Opposing hitters batted .260 (19-73).

CAREER

- Earned 2015 Major League All-Star selection (Manager's selection) for the NL.
- Of his 113 career starts, 70 have been at least 6.0 innings (64 quality).
- His .592 winning percentage (45-31) over the past six seasons (2013-2018) ranks 14th among National League pitchers.
- Is a lifetime 24-12 with a 3.61 ERA in 57 starts (34 quality starts) at Busch Stadium...his .667 home win pct. ranks T10th in the NL since 2013.

2017

- Matched single-season career-high (2015) with 30 starts (165.2 IP) while reaching double-digit wins (12) for the second time in his career. Also established a career best 158 strikeouts, 2nd-most on the club.
- Was one of six N.L. pitchers to record at least two scoreless starts of at least 8.0 innings: 9/10 vs. PIT (8.0 IP) & 7/18 at NYM (9.0 IP). Carlos Martinez led with three.
- Recorded career-best 1.20 ERA (30.0 IP/4 ER) and .200 opponent average against (22-110) in the first innings of starts (T1st among qualified NL starting pitchers with Colorado's Tyler Anderson)...recorded a 4.64 ERA afterwards (135.2 IP/70 ER).
- Had more success at home, ranking T7th among National League pitchers in wins (8) and 14th in ERA (3.41).
- Pitched at least 6.0 frames in 18 outings with 15 quality starts (STL was 12-6): 11-3, 2.61 ERA (113.2 IP) 102 strikeouts.
- Allowed only 17 homers, ranking 3rd-fewest among National League pitchers with 0.92 HR/9 IP.
- His career-high 48.6 ground ball percentage ranked 9th among National League pitchers. Induced 18 ground ball double plays and ranked 7th in the N.L. in GDP/9.0 (0.98).
- Sported the 9th-lowest ERA (1.95) in team wins (12-0, 15 starts) among N.L. starting pitchers, but had the 7th-highest ERA (6.87) in losses (0-9, 15 starts).
- Limited the opposition to a .248 average (34-for-137) with RISP, 16th-lowest in the N.L.
- Was one of 12 qualifying N.L. pitchers to record a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage (33 total chances).
