**2014 RECAP:** The Padres finished the 2014 campaign 77-85, slotting them in third place in the National League West Division, 17.0 games back of first place Los Angeles and 11.0 games out of the National League Wild Card...the 77 wins were the most by a Padres squad since the 2010 team finished the season 90-72.

- The Padres were 33-43 vs. the NL West, 18-14 vs. the NL Central, 17-17 vs. the NL East and 9-11 vs. the American League during Interleague play.
- The Friars posted their third consecutive winning record during the second half and their fifth in the last six seasons after they went 36-31 (.537) after the All-Star Break...since the 2006 season, the Padres have posted a winning record after the All-Star Game seven times in the last nine seasons.

**PACKING PETCO:** During the 2014 season, the Padres posted a home attendance of 2,195,373, Petco Park's highest total since the 2008 season, when they had 2,427,535 fans come through the gate in downtown San Diego.

- With this attendance total, the Friars tallied seven home sellouts this season, their highest total since recording 16 sellouts during the 2007 season.

**PETCO PADRES:** The Padres finished the 2014 season 48-33 at home, a **new franchise record for wins in a single season at Petco Park**...overall, the only clubs in franchise history to win more games in the city of San Diego in a single season were the 1998 (54-27) and 1978 (50-31) squads.

- The Friars' .593 winning percentage at home ranked tied for sixth-best in Major League Baseball and fourth-best in the NL, finishing behind LAA, PIT, STL, WSH and BAL.
- During the second half (since July 18), **the Padres posted a 9-0-1 record in series at home, the best post-ASB series record at home in franchise history**, surpassing the 8-2-1 the Friars posted in the second half of the 1988 season.
- Overall, the Padres were 24-8 (.750) at home after the All-Star Break, tied with Baltimore for the best home record in baseball during that time...the .750 winning percentage at home after the break was **the best second-half home winning percentage in franchise history, ahead of the 2012 season, during which the Padres posted a 25-12 (.676) record at home in the second half.**
- The Padres pitching staff pitched to a 2.56 ERA (213 ER, 748.0 IP) and limited the opposition to a .219 batting average at Petco Park, the best home ERA and tied for the best opponents batting average in Major League Baseball (also, Seattle)...**since 1969, among Major League teams to have played a full 81-game home schedule, the Padres 2.56 ERA at Petco Park is tied for the sixth-lowest mark in baseball and the fifth-lowest in the National League (see chart).**
- Since the start of the 1914 season, **only five National League teams have had a lower home opponents batting average than the 2014 Padres: 1981 Houston Astros (.208...strike year), 1965 Los Angeles Dodgers (.209), 1917 New York Giants (.211), 1975 Los Angeles Dodgers (.213) and 1988 New York Mets (.216).**
- The Padres were 28-1 (.966) in games where they score four-or-more runs at home, the best record in Major League Baseball in this scenario...**since the start of the 1901 season, the Padres .966 winning percentage when scoring four-or-more runs at home was the seventh-best record in the Major Leagues and the best since the 1942 Brooklyn Dodgers also went 50-1 (.980) in these games.**

**PADRES PITCHING PROWESS:** As a team, the Padres combined to pitch to a 3.27 ERA (523 ER, 1,438.2 IP) with 1,284 strikeouts against 462 walks while limiting the opposition to a .241 average...the Friars' team ERA was the fourth-best in Major League Baseball and second-best in the National League while their .241 opponents average ranked tied for sixth-best in the Majors and tied for second-best in the National League.

- In terms of team history, the Friars' 3.27 team ERA was the second-best in franchise history, behind only the 1971 club that posted a 3.22 ERA (515 ER, 1,438.0 IP) in 161 games...the .241 opponents batting average was also the second-best mark in franchise history, trailing only the 2010 pitching staff that limited the opposition to a .240 average.
- The 2014 Padres' 1,284 strikeouts were the second-most by any pitching staff in franchise history, trailing only the 2010 club that whiffed 1,295 batters...additionally, the 2014 squad's 462 walks allowed were the eighth-fewest allowed in franchise history and the fifth-fewest issued in a 162-game season.
- **The Padres pitching staff limited the opposition to 3.56 runs per game, the lowest average in franchise history (see chart).**

**BULL(Y)PEN:** The Padres bullpen pitched to a 21-15 record with 41 saves in 49 opportunities to go along with a 2.73 ERA (148 ER, 487.1 IP) with 481 strikeouts against 155 walks while limiting the opposition to a .223 batting average...Friars relievers ranked second in the Majors and led the National League in ERA (Seattle, 2.59), tied for third in the Majors and second in the National League in opponents batting average (SF .217; SEA .219; OAK .223), ninth in the Majors and fourth in the National League in strikeouts and first in the Major Leagues in save percentage (83.7).

- The Padres bullpen's 2.73 ERA was the best mark in franchise history while their .223 opponents average was the third-best (1996, .212; 2010, .220), their 155 walks were tied for the fourth-fewest and their 481 strikeouts were the fifth-most.
- The club's 83.7 save percentage in 2014 was the second-best mark in franchise history, trailing only the 1989 club that posted a 87.9 save percentage (52 saves in 60 attempts).

**MORE LIKE 'TYSON BOSS':** Tyson Ross set career-highs in starts (31), innings (195.2), strikeouts (416) and ERA (2.81) in his first full season as a starter with the Padres...was 13-14 with a 2.81 ERA (61 ER, 195.2 IP) with 195 strikeouts in 31 starts...his ERA ranked 11th in the National League while his strikeouts ranked eighth.

- The 27-year-old right-hander put up the 11th-best ERA and opponents batting average (.230) in Padres franchise history while his strikeout total was seventh-best...his 8.97 strikeouts per nine innings ranked eighth in the National League.
- Ross was selected to represent the Padres for the 85th annual Major League Baseball All-Star Game in Minneapolis on July 15...it was his first career trip to the All-Star Game in what is his fifth Major League season...the right-hander was the 10th starting pitcher in club history to be named an All-Star, the 12th time overall a Padres starting pitcher has been selected to the team, joining Jake Peavy (2005 and 2007), Chris Young (2007), Andy Ashby (1999), Kevin Brown (1998), Andy Benes (1993), LaMarr Hoyt (1985), Dave Dravecky (1983), Gaylord Perry (1979) and Randy Jones (1975-76)...did not appear in the game as he made his last start on the Sunday before the All-Star Break.
- Turned-in 14 consecutive quality starts from June 21 - September 1, the longest quality start streak in Padres franchise history...the streak surpassed the previous record of 11 games done by six players, most recently by Andrew Cashner from August 14, 2013 - April 6, 2014.
- His 14 consecutive quality starts was the fifth-longest streak in Major League Baseball in 2014 and the second-longest in the National League, behind only Clayton Kershaw, who tossed 17 straight from June 13 - September 14.
- During the streak, Ross was 7-6 with a 1.93 ERA (20 ER, 93.1 IP) with 94 strikeouts against 26 walks while limiting the opposition to a .210 (69-for-329) average.
- In addition to the quality starts, Ross has allowed six-or-fewer hits in each of those starts...**dating back to the 1914 season, the only Major League pitcher with a longer streak of quality starts allowing six-or-fewer hits was Mike Scott-HOU, who went 17 games from May 21 - August 8, 1986.**

**BIG-TIME BACKSTOP:** Rene Rivera posted career-highs in almost every category in 2014, including games played (103), at-bats (294), runs (27), hits (74), doubles (18), home runs (11), RBI (44), walks (27), batting average (.252), on-base percentage (.319) and slugging percentage (.432).

- He threw out 29 attempted base-stealers, the highest total in Major League Baseball...since data started being kept in 1974, no Padres catcher had ever led the Majors in catcher caught stealing...his 29 runners caught stealing are the most by a Padres catcher since Ben Davis tossed out 34 in 2001.
- Guided the Padres pitching staff to a 3.10 ERA when he was behind the plate, the best catcher's ERA in franchise history, surpassing the 3.14 mark by Yorvit Torrealba during the 2010 season...his cERA was also tied for the best in Major League Baseball with Washington's Wilson Ramos.
- Behind the plate, according to the Baseball-Reference's Defensive Wins Above Replacement statistic, Rivera posted a 1.6 dWAR in 2014, **the fourth-best defensive season by a catcher in Padres franchise history**...Benito Santiago posted a 2.6 dWAR for the Friars in 1988 and a 1.7 dWAR in 1989 while Terry Kennedy put up a 2.1 dWAR in 1985...using this same metric, Rivera was tied for the fourth-best defensive catcher in Major League Baseball in 2014, behind only Salvador Perez-KC (2.1), Russell Martin-PIT (2.0) and Jonathan Lucroy-MIL (2.0).
- Overall, made 85 starts behind the plate for the Padres, 26 in Tyson Ross starts, 19 with Andrew Cashner, 20 with Ian Kennedy, 10 with Eric Stults, four with Odri-samer Despaigne, three with Robbie Erlin, two with Jesse Hahn and one with Donn Roach.

**SO YOU'RE TELLING ME THERE'S A CHANCE:** The Padres posted a 60-1 record (.984) when leading after the sixth inning...since 1920, the only Major League team to have posted a better record when leading after six innings was the 1946 New York Yankees, who posted a 73-0 record when taking a lead into the seventh inning.

- The Friars record this season when leading after six innings was by far the best mark in franchise history, surpassing the 67-5 (.931) record they posted in 1989 and the 67-6 (.918) record they posted during the 1996 season.
- In addition to their league-best record when leading after six innings, the Padres posted a 61-2 record (.968) when leading after seven innings, the best mark in the National League and second-best in Major League Baseball, trailing only Kansas City, who was 72-1 (.986) when leading after seven innings...**the .968 winning percentage when leading after seven was the best mark in franchise history.**
- When leading after eight innings, the Friars posted a 63-1 record (.984), the second-best mark in the National League behind only Atlanta (72-1, .986) and the third-best in the Majors, also behind Kansas City (79-1, .988)... **the Padres .984 winning percentage when leading after eight was the fourth-best mark in franchise history**, trailing the 1998 season (85-0, 1.000), the 1997 season (60-0, 1.000) and the 2010 season (77-1, .987).

**WALK-IT OFF:** As a team, the Padres tallied 11 walk-off wins in 2014, tied with the Miami Marlins for the most in Major League Baseball...the Friars had nine different players log a walk-off plate appearance in 2014, tied for the third-highest total in franchise history, trailing only the 1986 (11) and 1979 (10) seasons (also: 1983 and 1977).

- The 11 walk-off wins were tied for the third-most in franchise history, behind only the 1986 (15) and 1979 (13) seasons...since Petco Park opened in 2004, the 11 game-ending wins, are tied with 2010 and 2006 for the most in ballpark history.
- Since the start of 2005, the Padres have logged 87 walk-off wins, the most in Major League Baseball, ahead of Cincinnati who has 85 such wins in that time.
- Will Venable logged a pair of walk-off singles in 2014 and now has six walk-off plate appearances in his career, trailing only Tony Gwynn (8), Kurt Bevacqua (8), Bip Roberts (7) and Gene Richards (7) for the all-time franchise lead...his six are tied with Nate Colbert, Terry Kennedy, Nick Hundley and Carmelo Martinez.

**PINCH-ME:** The Padres belted 11 pinch-hit home runs during the 2014 season, a new franchise record...the 11 pinch-hit homers surpass the 10 hit by the 1995 club.

- The Friars 11 home runs in the pinch were the most in Major League Baseball, ahead of Toronto who had nine...the next-closest National League club was the Arizona Diamondbacks with seven...the last club to hit as many or more pinch-hit home runs in a single season was the D-Backs during the 2007 season when they hit 12.
- In addition to the home runs, the Padres boasted 61 pinch-hits in 2014, tied with Pittsburgh and Colorado for the highest total in the Major Leagues...61 pinch-hits were tied for the sixth-highest total in franchise history.
- The 11 homers in the pinch came from eight different players, matching the franchise record from the 1995 season.
- Prior to this season, the last Major League team with eight-or-more players with a pinch-hit home run was the 2012 Rockies, who also had eight...the Major League record for number of different players with a pinch hit home run in a single season remains nine, done by the 2001 Giants and 2006 Reds.
- **Corey Spangenberg** hit each of his first two career home runs as a pinch-hitter (September 2, September 6), including a walk-off job for his first career long ball on September 2 vs. ARI...Spangenberg was the first Padres player in team history to have his first two career home runs come as a pinch-hitter and the first to have his first two career pinch hits be home runs (*ELIAS & STATS Inc.*).
- With Spangenberg's walk-off pinch-hit home run on September 2, he became the first player in Padres franchise history to hit a walk-off home run within his first two career games...only three active Major League players have hit walk-off home runs within their first two career games: Miguel Cabrera-FLA in his first career game on June 20, 2003 vs. TB and Drew Stubbs-CIN on August 20, 2009 vs. SF in his second career game.
- Each of the last two Major League players to hit a pinch-hit, walk-off home run for their first career homer have been members of the Padres: Paul McNulty on September 6, 2006 and Cory Spangenberg on September 2, 2014.

**TELLING YOUR FOUR-TUNE:** Overall, in 65 games when scoring four-or-more runs in 2014, the Padres posted a 53-12 record (.815), the eighth-best mark in Major League Baseball and the fourth-best in the National League.

- When scoring three-or-more runs, the Friars were 63-25 (.716), the 11th-best record in Major League Baseball and fifth-best in the National League.
- When scoring two-or-more runs, the Padres were 74-40 (.649), the 10th-best record in Major League Baseball and fifth-best in the National League.

**SPREADING THE LOVE:** The Padres had 22 different players hit a home run during the 2014 season, tied with the Arizona Diamondbacks for the highest total in Major League Baseball...this total is tied for the third-most in franchise history, trailing only the 2013 and 2008 seasons when 23 different players went deep for the Padres.

**STRAIGHT CASH, HOMIE:** Andrew Cashner posted a 5-7 record (.417) with a 2.55 ERA (35 ER, 123.1 IP) with 93 strikeouts against 29 walks while limiting the opposition to a .235 batting average in 19 starts in 2014...became the first starting pitcher in Padres franchise history and the first Major League starter since Joe Magrane-STL in 1988 to post an ERA of 2.55-or-better while having a winning percentage of .417-or-lower.

- Has an active streak of allowing two-or-fewer earned runs in 18 consecutive starts at home since June 11, 2013, a franchise record...during this stretch, owns a 6-6 record with a 1.45 ERA (20 ER, 124.1 IP) with 91 strikeouts against 23 walks while limiting the opposition to a .197 batting average...his ERA at home in that time is the lowest mark in the Majors among pitchers with at least 120.0 IP.
- **Since August 19, 2013, Cashner has pitched to a 2.09 ERA (39 ER, 168.0 IP), the second-best ERA in Major League Baseball in that time, trailing only Clayton Kershaw-LAD (1.81) (min 125.0 IP).**
- Threw his first of two complete-game shutouts on April 11 vs. DET, allowing one hit with a career-high 11 strikeouts against one walk...became just the sixth pitcher in Padres history to record a complete-game shutout within the team's first ten games of the season and the first since Brian Lawrence during the 2002 season...having also thrown a complete-game, one-hit shutout on September 16, 2013 at PIT, Cashner was the first Major League pitcher since Toronto's Dave Stieb in 1988-89 to record two one-hit, complete-game shutouts in a span of five starts (*STATS, Inc.*).
- In his outing on September 15 vs. PHI, he threw his second complete game shutout of the season and the third of his career...with the start being the 49th start of Cashner's career, he is one of four active pitchers to have thrown three-or-more complete game shutouts within his first 50 career starts, joining Derek Holland-TEX (4), Jaime Garcia-STL and J.A. Happ-PHI/HOU.
- Having allowed just two hits in his CG SHO on September 15 and one hit in each of his prior two shutouts, Cashner became the sixth Major League pitcher since 1969 to throw three-or-more complete game shutouts with two-or-fewer hits allowed within his first 50 career starts and the first since Orel Hershiser threw six from July 14, 1984 - July 23, 1985.
- Cashner was named National League Player of the Week for the week of September 15 after he pitched to a 2-0 record with a 1.06 ERA (2 ER, 17.0 IP) with 14 strikeouts against two walks while limiting the opposition to a .109 batting average (6-for-55) over two starts.
- At the plate, Cashner his **first career triple in the bottom of the fifth inning on September 20 vs. SF, the first by a Major League pitcher in 2014**...it was the first triple by a Padres pitcher since Anthony Bass hit on May 4, 2012 against MIA.

**#GYORKSTORE THE FIRST OF ITS KIND:** Jedd Gyorko finished the season with a team-high 51 RBI, ahead of Yasmani Grandal who finished the season with 49 runs driven in...having also led the Friars in RBI during his rookie season in 2013, Gyorko became the first second baseman since RBI became an official stat in 1920 to lead his team in RBI during each of his first two Major League seasons.

- Prior to Gyorko the last two seasons, the last Major League player, regardless of position to lead his team in RBI during each of his first two Big League seasons was Albert Pujols from 2001-03, who led the Cardinals in RBI in each of his first three MLB seasons.
- **Gyorko became the fourth National League player since 1920 to record 50-or-more RBI in each of his first two Major League seasons (partial or full) while playing second base (56 in 2013, 51 in 2014), joining the gentlemen listed in the chart.**

**MR. 200:** Ian Kennedy was one of 11 Major League pitchers and one of five National Leaguers in 2014 to log 200.0-or-more innings pitched and strike out 200-or-more batters...Kennedy joined Stephen Strasburg-WSH (215.0 IP, 242 K), Zack Greinke-LAD (202.1 IP, 207 K), Johnny Cueto-CIN (243.2 IP, 242 K) and Madison Bumgarner-SF (217.1 IP, 219 K) as the only NL pitchers to accomplish this feat.

- Kennedy is the 68th pitcher in Padres franchise history to reach the 200.0 IP plateau and the first since Eric Stults threw 203.0 innings in 2013...the last Padres right-handed pitcher to reach 200.0 IP was Jon Garland in 2010, who pitched exactly 200.0 innings...prior to Kennedy, the last Padres right-handed pitcher to throw more than 200.0 innings in a single season was Jake Peavy in 2007 who threw 223.1 innings for the Friars.
- His 207 strikeouts on the season ranked tied with Zack Greinke-LAD for 11th-most in the Majors and fifth-most in the National League.
- Kennedy's feat was the **sixth time a Padres pitcher has struck out 200 batters in a season, joining Kevin Brown in 1998 (257), Jake Peavy in 2005-07 (216, 215 and 240, respectively) and Clay Kirby in 1971 (215)**...his 207 punch-outs were a new career-high, surpassing the 198 he had in 2011.



The Padres 2014 pitching staff posted the second-best ERA (3.27) and second-most strikeouts (1284) in franchise history.

#### 2014 Summary

- Acquired by the Padres on July 18 in a six-player trade that sent RHP Huston Street to the Los Angeles Angels.
- Selected from Double-A San Antonio on September 2 and made his Major League debut the following day against Arizona, allowing one run over 0.2 innings...did not allow a run and allowed just two hits over his final nine appearances of the season, limiting the opposition to a .083 (2-for-24) batting average over that time.
- Held the opposition hitless in eight of his 10 appearances, including a stretch of seven consecutive games (6.1 IP) from September 5 to September 23...the seven-game hitless streak was tied for the second-longest such streak in franchise history by a rookie, trailing only the nine game streak by Josh Spence from July 24 - August 10, 2011.
- In 38 minor league games between Arkansas (LAA) and San Antonio, posted a 0-1 record with a 1.25 ERA (6 ER, 43.1 IP) to go along with 61 strikeouts against 13 walks while also holding the opposition to a .181/.274/.209 (32-for-177) line.

#### 2014 Summary

- Made his first four Major League stints during the 2014 season...was recalled from Double-A San Antonio for the first time on June 3 and made his Major League debut that evening against Pittsburgh, taking the loss after he allowed four runs on six hits with five strikeouts against two walks in 3.2 innings and was optioned back to San Antonio the following day.
- Recalled for the second time on June 14 and made six starts before being optioned to Triple-A El Paso on July 11...was recalled the third time on July 25 and made five starts before being optioned to Double-A on August 19... recalled for the final time on August 30 and remained with the club for the remainder of the season as a reliever.
- During the month of June, Hahn put together a 4-1 record with a 1.95 ERA (6 ER, 27.2 IP) while holding the opposition to a .190 average over five starts...his four wins in June are tied for the most wins in a single month by a Padres rookie pitcher, the eighth time this has been accomplished and the first time since Kevin Walker in August of 2000...his .190 opponents average was the second-lowest opponents average of any qualifying Padres rookie pitcher in any month in franchise history, behind only the .188 mark put up by Eric Nolte in August of 1987... his ERA was the 10th-lowest by any rookie pitcher in any month in franchise history (min 25.0 IP) and the lowest since Justin Germano posted a 1.08 ERA (3 ER, 25.0 IP) in May 2007.
- In his start on June 30 vs. CIN, struck out a career-high nine hitters in just 5.0 innings of work, including a stretch of seven consecutive outs recorded via strikeout...Hahn was the first Padres pitcher since Jake Peavy on August 27, 2007 to record seven consecutive outs via strikeout and the first Padres rookie pitcher to accomplish this feat since data started being kept during the 1974 season.
- Recorded 36 strikeouts through his first five career games (June 3 - June 30), the most by any Padres pitcher to start a career...per STATS, Inc, his 36 strikeouts through five career games were tied for the eighth-most by a National League pitcher through his first five career games since the start of the 1914 season, behind only Stephen Strasburg's 48 in 2010, Kerry Wood's 45 in 1998, Mark Prior's 43 in 2002, Jose DeLeon's 43 in 1983, Hideo Nomo's 40 in 1995, Gary Nolan's 39 in 1967 and Burt Hooton's 38 in 1971-72.
- During the month of July, Hahn held the opposition to a .172/.263/.230 (15-for-87) line, the lowest opponents batting average and lowest opponents slugging percentage in franchise history during the month of July...his opponents average and slugging percentage where the lowest numbers in franchise history by a rookie starting pitcher.

- Won each of his first four starts on the road, becoming the first pitcher in Padres franchise history to open his career with such a streak... Hahn is one of six active pitchers to win each of his first four starts on the road.

- Posted a 13-13 record with a 3.63 ERA (81 ER, 201.0 IP) with 207 strikeouts against 70 walks while limiting the opposition to a .250 average over 33 starts.

- Set career-highs in starts (31), innings (195.2), strikeouts (416) and ERA (2.81) in his first full season as a starter with the Padres.
- Was 13-14 with a 2.81 ERA (61 ER, 195.2 IP) with 195 strikeouts in 31 starts...his ERA ranked 11th in the National League while his strikeouts ranked eighth.

- Turned in 15 games in 2014 of six-or-more innings pitched and two-or-fewer earned runs, tied for the third-most in Major League Baseball, trailing only Adam Wainwright-STL (17) and Clayton Kershaw-LAD (17)...furthermore, Ross had 10 games of seven-or-more innings pitched and two-or-fewer earned runs allowed, tied for the sixth-highest total in the National League.
- In 15 starts at Petco Park, posted an 8-5 record with a 1.88 ERA (21 ER, 100.2 IP) with 106 strikeouts against 31 walks while limiting the opposition to a .199 average...his home ERA was the fourth-best mark in Major League Baseball.

#### Season Highlights

El Paso kicked off their inaugural season in West Texas during the 2014 season, posting a 72-72 record, but ultimately falling 9.0 games shy of qualifying for postseason play...Southwest University Park opened it's doors to the Chihuahuas on April 28 as the club went on to record 48-of-67 sellouts and registered 548,435 guests during the season, a feat that broke El Paso's Minor League single-season attendance record.
