LEADING OFF: Angels open a six-game home stand against the Dodgers (July 6-8) & Mariners (July 10-12) and then head up to Dodger Stadium (July 13-15) before reaching the All-Star Break...
PLEASE NOTE TOMORROW'S 4:15 PM START FOR THE FOX NATIONAL BROADCAST (Clubhouse opens at 12:45 pm) and **SUNDAY'S 5:08 PM FIRST PITCH FOR ESPN'S SUNDAY NIGHT BASEBALL** (Clubhouse opens at 1:30 pm)...**15 of next 18 games are at home (Halos are 10-4 in last 14 games at the Big A)**...Angels went 3-7 on the four-city, 10-game trip to Kansas City (makeup; 0-1), Boston (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) & Seattle (1-2)...**Halos have dropped seven of 10 and nine of 12 overall...At 44-44, Club in jeopardy of falling below .500 for first time since initial game of season (0-1 on March 29th)**...LAA is in fourth place, a season-high 13.5 games back (2nd time) of pace in A.L. West (12.0 games behind second Wild Card spot)...**Angels are 31-41 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA is 6-16 when a left-hander starts (38-28 vs. RHS).**

THE HEAT IS ON: With record heat expected this weekend, did you know the hottest home temperature at first pitch in club history is 106 degrees? **Occurred twice (9/4/88 vs. Boston, day game & 9/3/07 vs. Oakland, night game).**

ALBERT & AROD: Albert's double Wednesday at Seattle (4th inn) marked his 1,275th career extra-base hit, tying **Alex Rodriguez** for sixth-most all-time...Next up is **Willie Mays** at 1,323 (5th).

HOT KOLE: A look at **Kole Calhoun** in the 16 games since his return from the D.L. and 16 games prior...
Last 16 G: .288 (15/52); 10 R, 3 2B, 4 HR, 9 RBI (.328 OBP/.577 SLG)
Previous 16 G: .093 (4/43); 2 R, 1 2B (.204 OBP/.116 SLG)

SCIOSCIA 3K: June 30th marked the 3,000th career game for **Mike Scioscia** as manager of the Angels...He's the 21st manager to reach the plateau and sixth to have at least 3,000 games with one team (**Connie Mack, John McGraw, Bobby Cox, Walter Alston and Tommy Lasorda**).

HALL PASS: On July 29th, **Vladimir Guerrero** will become the first player in Angels' history inducted into the Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...He played six seasons with the Angels (2004-09) batting .319 (1034/3237) with 194 doubles, 173 HRs and 616 RBI in 846 games. His .319 average is the highest mark in franchise history (min. 250 PA)...**Named 2004 A.L. MVP after batting .337, with 39 HRs and 126 RBI with a league-leading 124 runs and a franchise record 366 total bases.**

OHTANI UPDATE: **Shohei Ohtani** (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7th. **On June 28th, an MRI revealed improvements to the UCL in the elbow. On Tuesday, he was reinstated from the 10-day DL (missed 21 games) in a return to the team as a designated hitter. In approximately three weeks (from 6/28), he will be re-assessed to see if he can pitch this season.**

FROM THE START: Halo starters have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 48 of last 60 games...**Starters have fashioned a 3.33 ERA (327.1 IP – 121 ER) since May 1, third in A.L. in span (4th in MLB).**

MAKE WAR: Trout's 6.6 WAR this season (Wins Above Replacement) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is **Jose Ramirez** (CLE) at 5.7...**On pace for a 12.2 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)**...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his **60.7 career WAR** is tops in MLB history thru 1,013 games.

SHELVED: Angels have 13 players currently on the disabled list...**The average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 31 games...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...50 players have appeared for Angels this season, most in MLB (club record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers have played for LAA (12 starters), most in team history thru 88 games (LAA used a club-record 31 pitchers last season).**

ALWAYS ON: Since his call-up in 2012, **Mike Trout** has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...**His 77 walks are most in Angels' history through 88 games.**

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP **Mike Trout** ranks in **Top 4 in MLB in several offensive categories**, including HRs (T2nd; 24), runs (2nd; 67), times on base (1st; 176), total bases (4th; 190), walks (1st; 77), IBB (1st; 14), OBP (1st; .454), SLG (3rd; .625), OPS (2nd; 1.079) & OPS+ (1st; 198.0)...**Trout has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (12).**

GLOVE STORY: LAA has gone errorless in 56 of 88 games...**Club has 40 errors thru 88 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .987 fielding pct...Catchers own a 47.2 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...Mike Trout and Charlie Blackmon are only CF's in MLB with 1.000 fielding pct.**

PITCHING POINTS: LAA pitchers have 40 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 88 affairs (LAA ranks 4th in A.L. with 793 Ks)...**302 walks are third-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has logged 325.2 IP, second in A.L. to TB...15 blown saves are third-most in A.L...Halos have allowed 117 HRs, third-most in MLB (2nd in A.L.)**

HOT HALOS: In 15 outings since June 1, **Cam Bedrosian** has allowed one earned run (15 IP; 0.60 ERA) with five walks and 15 Ks...**Andrelton Simmons** has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 overall games batting (.354; 17/48)...**Rookie David Fletcher** has hit safely in six of seven and in nine of his first 12 MLB starts (4 multi-hit games)...**Luis Valbuena** has three home runs and nine RBI his last nine starts...**Martin Maldonado** has 12 RBI his last 14 games...**Tyler Skaggs** went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP – 3 ER) in June (5 GS)...**His 0.84 ERA led all MLB starters last month...Has allowed two earned runs or less in 13 of his 16 starts...His 2.64 ERA ranks eighth in A.L...Andrew Heaney** matched a career best with 10 Ks Tuesday night (2nd time).

A BIT ON ALBERT: **Albert Pujols** is 36 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – **Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez.**

NOT A FAN: **Andrelton Simmons** has struck out just seven times since May 1 (212 PA)...He went 90 PA without fanning (May 18-June 22)...He leads MLB in PA per SO with 21.13 (317 PA/15 K) while teammate **Ian Kinsler** ranks third in MLB in PA per SO (10.60)...**Simmons also leads MLB batting .340 (33/97) with two strikes.**

TRIPLE THREATS at 1K: June 21st marked the 1,000th career game for **Trout**...He joined **Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez** as only players in MLB history with at least a **.300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases** at the 1K milestone.

ALBERT ALERT: **Albert Pujols** is 27th all-time with 3,049 hits...**Rod Carew** is 26th at 3,053...His 3,000th hit came May 4th at **Seattle** to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (**Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez**)...**AP is seventh all-time with 1,964 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig** is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

DODGERS: Clubs split 2017 season series 2-2...Angels have won six of last nine games vs. LAD...**Since 2005, Angels are 40-29 vs. LAD (23-12 at Angel Stadium)**...All-time, Halos are 36-21 at home, 27-30 on road and 63-51 overall against LAD...**Under Mike Scioscia, LAA is 58-42 vs. LAD...Angels' active roster is a collective 3 for 28 (.107) with 10 strikeouts vs. Maeda...In his career vs. LAD, Albert Pujols is batting .314 (115/366) with 30 2Bs, 18 HRs, 68 RBI and 56 BB in 97 games.**

MARINERS ON DECK: Angels have dropped five of last six to M's (all on road)...Mariners lead 2018 series 6-3 (all at SAFECO)...**Angels are 6-3 in last nine home games vs. Seattle...LAA is 101-79 over M's since 2009...A. Simmons is batting .379 (11/29) vs. M's this season.**

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

July 6

(1983) **Fred Lynn** connects for a grand slam off **Atlee Hammaker** in the third inning of the Mid-Summer Classic at Comiskey Park... Lynn was named as the game's MVP as the American League won 13-3...The HR remains the only grand slam in All-Star history.

July 7

(2014) The Angels win over the Toronto pushes the Halos all-time record to the .500 mark (4,272-4,272-3) as a franchise for the first time since opening its debut campaign 1-1 in 1961; (2006) **John Lackey** surrenders a lead-off double to **Mark Kotsay** in Oakland and then retires the next 27 batters for a one-hit shutout, the 21st one-hitter in club history; (2011) Angels selected the contract of 19 year-old **Mike Trout**. **Trout** immediately became the youngest player in MLB (19 years, 335 days).

Earned first win as a starter last Friday at Baltimore after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings

- IN THE ROTATION:** Making sixth appearance (fourth start) of the season for Angels; fifth appearance (third start) of the season at home...First 38 big league outings came in relief before making first start on June 19 vs. Arizona...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on June 15 for third stint of season with Angels.
- LAST TIME OUT:** Earned first win as a starter in last start on Friday at Baltimore after working 5.1 scoreless innings and allowing five hits and one walk with five strikeouts...Has set a new career high in innings pitched in each of last three appearances for Angels.
- RISP:** With runners in scoring position this season, opponents are batting .167 (2/12).
- WITH THE BEES:** In 10 games (nine starts) this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-2 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP – 13 ER)...Recorded 38 strikeouts with 16 walks...Did not allow a run in last 10.2 innings pitched for Salt Lake before being called up by Angels on June 15...The first batter he has faced of each inning with Salt Lake batted .091 (3/33).
- PREVIOUS HALOS STINTS:** Made Angels debut on April 8 vs. A's (1 IP, 2 H, 1 ER)...Made one appearance for LAA during second stint with team on May 17 vs. Tampa bay (1.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 SO).
- DOMINICAN NATIVE:** Is a native of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic...Is one of five Dominican pitcher to start a game for the Angels and the first since **Ervin Santana** in 2012; the other three are **Bartolo Colon**, **Ramon Ortiz** and **Hector Carrasco**.
- STARTER #11:** With his first start on June 19, became 11th different starting pitcher for Angels this season...LAA has now used 12 different starters, which is tied with A's for second most in the Majors (behind Tampa Bay – 13).
- VS. DODGERS:** In two career games (both in relief) against the Dodgers, is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3 IP – 0 ER); both outings came last season for Cubs at Dodger Stadium
- AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In four games (two starts) at Angel Stadium, is 0-0 with a 5.40 ERA (11.2 IP – 7 ER)...As a starter, is 0-0 with a 4.00 ERA (9 IP – 4 ER).
- 2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Made 11 appearances for Angels in Spring Training and went 1-0 with one save, a 4.09 ERA (11 IP – 5 ER) and 17 strikeouts.
- 2017 WITH THE CUBS:** Appeared in 25 games for Cubs last season and went 1-0 with a 5.24 ERA (34.1 IP – 20 ER) and 37 strikeouts.
- MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE:** Pitched parts of last two seasons with Cubs, appearing in 36 total games and going 1-0 with a 4.98 ERA (43.1 IP – 24 ER) and 52 strikeouts...Made Major League debut on Aug. 19, 2016 vs. Colorado.
- MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2013 (Southern League), 2014 (Florida State League) and 2015 (Midwest League).
- CAREER NOTES:** Originally signed by Cubs as an international free agent...Acquired by Angels from Cubs for cash considerations or a player to be named later on Oct. 9, 2017.
