#### Twins vs. Royals

Today's matinee is the second rubber game in as many series with the Twins this year, with KC prevailing on May 30 to take that set in "The K"...all told, Kansas City trails the all-time work by a 379-397 margin, including a 176-209 deficit in the Twin Cities, but a possesses a slim 39-37 advantage since the move to Target Field...these clubs still have 13 meetings on the 2018 docket after today.

**ROYALS FLEX SELVES OUT OF SKID**--Kansas City brought its season-high 10-game losing streak to a halt with a 9-4 win over the Twins in the middle game of this series...the nine-run, 15-hit attack was the biggest offensive performance for KC since an 11-8 win at home over Minnesota, when the Royals employed 16 hits...as for last night, every member of the starting lineup had at least one hit, while five of the knocks went for extra bases, a first since a June 2 win in Oakland...Adalberto Mondesi set a career best with four RBI, three coming across on his second homer of the year to highlight a four-run second inning...the Royals then added a single tally in the sixth and three more in the ninth, the big blow a two-run homer by Alex Gordon...reliever Brian Flynn was the mound hero for Kansas City, entering in the fourth after Ian Kennedy was forced from the game after 3.0 innings...Flynn tossed 4.0 shutout frames allowing just a hit and two walks while fanning three...Jason Hammel made his first regular season relief appearance since 2014 with Oakland and was touched for a pair of ninth inning runs, his second inning of work...the triumph was KC's first since the calendar turned to July and the fourth in the last 26 affairs.

**A RUBBER GAME**--Today is Kansas City's first rubber game since June 24 in Houston, when the Astros prevailed to take that series...this is the 11th rubber game of the season, with the Royals just 2-8 to this point...KC lost its first six rubber games of the year before breaking that drought on May 23 at St. Louis followed by an 11-8 triumph over the Twins on May 30...a win this afternoon would snap a 12-series drought in which the Royals have gone 0-11 with a split of a two-game visit to Milwaukee...KC's last series victory was when it took two of three from these Twins to end the month of May.

**GORDO STILL BEING TESTED**--Despite being the most prolific outfielder in assists since moving from third base to the outfield just past the midway point in 2010, Alex Gordon continues to get opportunities to nab runners and he added Logan Morrison to the list last night in the second inning...it was Gordo's eighth outfield assist this year, good for third in the American League and the 90th since moving to the outfield, two more than Colorado's Gerardo Parra since 2010.

**ANOTHER "WHITTING" STREAK**--Whit Merrifield upped his current hitting streak to 12 in a row with doubles in each of his first two at bats last night...he is now hitting .460 (23-for-50) in this streak, with seven of those contests featuring multi-hit efforts, highlighted by his first career five-hit game on Sunday vs. Boston.

**SALVY AND KT GOING TO DC**--Catcher Salvador Perez and Assistant Athletic Trainer Kyle Turner will represent the Royals at the 89th Midsummer Classic, which is set for next Tuesday night at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C...Perez, 28, becomes the second player in franchise history to be named an All-Star as many as six times (2013-18), joining George Brett, who was a 13-time All-Star (1976-88)...Salvy, who was selected by his peers in the American League is one of five players to be named to each All-Star Game since 2013, joining Paul Goldschmidt (Arizona), Chris Sale (Chicago White Sox, Boston), Max Scherzer (Detroit, Washington) and Mike Trout (LA Angels)...Turner is in his ninth season as the Royals' Assistant Athletic Trainer and this will be his first All-Star Game...from 2013-17, the Royals had more All-Star Game representatives than any other club, thanks to the back-to-back World Series appearances in 2014-15...KC had 20 All-Star players in that stretch, while the manager and coaching staff served in both 2015 in Cincinnati and 2016 in San Diego.

**BURCH SMITH** is making his first start of the season (25th appearance) and eighth of his career (35th appearance)...it's his third outing (1st start) vs. Minnesota...he was acquired via trade from the Mets, who selected him from Tampa Bay in the 2017 Rule 5 Draft...he was originally selected by San Diego in the 14th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oklahoma...with his start this afternoon, he joins fellow Rule 5 selection from last December, Brad Keller, to make up 40% of the current starting rotation.

**BACK TO FAMILIAR ROLE**--Burch is making his first start in the Majors since Sept. 27, 2013 at San Francisco (with San Diego), 1,748 days ago...he takes the place of Jason Hammel, who has been moved to a relief role after making 18 starts...Smith has made 24 relief appearances this season, including his Royals debut on Opening Day...over parts of five seasons in the minors, he started in 58 of his 61 appearances, going 20-14 with a 3.45 ERA (109 ER in 284.2 IP) with 302 strikeouts (9.5 K/9) and 80 walks (2.5 BB/9).

**A ROYAL START**--Smith is the 229th different pitcher (165th right hander) to start a game in the Royals' 50-year history...he joins Trevor Oaks (April 28 vs. White Sox), Brad Keller (May 30 vs. Minnesota) and Heath Fillmyer (Sunday vs. Boston) as those to make their first start with the Royals in 2018...the Royals used just seven different starters through their first 88 games--only Houston (5) had fewer in the American League--but Smith joins Fillmyer as the second to make his Royals rotation debut in the last four games...his only career win was on Sept. 15, 2013 in Atlanta, where he had 7.0 shutout innings with a career-high 10 strikeouts.

**WHAT A RELIEF**--Smith has made his first 24 appearances this season in relief, posting a 5.40 ERA (23 ER in 38.1 IP), while leading Royals relievers with 39 strikeouts (9.2 K/9)...he's been much improved over his last five appearances, in which he's recorded 10.0 scoreless innings, allowing just six hits and two walks (1 intentional), with nine strikeouts...it's the second-longest scoreless streak by a Royals reliever in 2018, trailing only Brad Keller, who had 10.2 consecutive scoreless innings from May 1-23 before joining the starting rotation on May 30...Burch held Boston--the league's top-scoring offense--scoreless over 4.0 innings on two hits in his last appearance on Friday, a 10-5 Royals loss, in which he matched a season high with 50 pitches (also: April 17 at Toronto, Game 1).

**VS. TWINS**--Burch has allowed seven runs over 3.0 innings in two relief outings vs. Minnesota, including three runs in 2.0 innings in the Royals' 8-5 loss on May 28...two days later he had a five-run lead in the sixth and allowed four runs on two hits and two walks, but the Royals still won, 11-8, to clinch the series win.

**ON THE ROAD**--Smith has a 3.68 ERA (6 ER in 14.2 IP) in 10 road appearances this season, including 7.1 scoreless innings over his last six outings, in which he's held opponents to an .087 average (2-for-23) with eight strikeouts (9.8 K/9)...he last allowed a run in a road park on May 8 at Baltimore's Camden Yards.

**HIS JOURNEY**--After being Drafted in 2011, Smith rose through San Diego's system, from rookie ball that year to the big leagues two years later, when he became the Padres' first 2011 draftee to reach the Majors...he made 10 appearances (7 starts) with San Diego in 2013, including his first Major League win on Sept. 15 in Atlanta, when he held the Braves to three hits over 7.0 scoreless innings, with a career-high 10 strikeouts...he started the following season at Triple-A El Paso, where his season ended after just two starts due to a right forearm strain...he was named a "Rising Star" in the Arizona Fall League later in 2014, before he was acquired by Tampa Bay that offseason as part of a three-way trade with Washington that included former Royals prospect, Wil Myers...Burch was forced to undergo Tommy John surgery the following April, which kept him out of action for all of 2015-16...he made his debut in the Rays' organization in 2017--three years after he last pitched--and posted a 2.40 ERA (15 ER in 56.1 IP) in 13 outings (12 starts) across three levels, including a 1.65 ERA (3 ER in 16.1 IP) in three starts with Triple-A Durham...he pitched again in the Arizona Fall League last fall, posting a 3.98 ERA (9 ER in 20.1 IP) and .176 opponents' average (12-for-68) in six starts.

**This & That**

**KENNEDY BACK ON THE SHELF**--Starting pitcher Ian Kennedy was only able to make it through 3.0 innings last night before the pain in his left oblique flared up again and forced him from the contest after allowing two runs on five hits with a walk and three K's...he had been activated from the 10-day disabled list prior to last night's game, while right-handed reliever Jason Adam was optioned to Omaha (AAA)...Adam is now returning to the big league club for today's game as Kennedy is returning to the D.L. with the oblique injury.

**RUN STREAK HALTED IN A BIG WAY**--Kansas City's nine-run outburst here last night snapped a streak of 30 consecutive games in which the club was held to five or fewer runs, the longest streak in the American League in one season since the 1972 Texas Rangers went 33 in a row from July 2 (game #2) - August 4...last night was just the fifth win in the last 33 games, with the Royals averaging only 2.3 runs per contest in the 32 leading up to the nine-run explosion...KC also tied its third highest hit total with 15 last night, with all nine members of the starting lineup contributing with at least one knock, while six of the starters had two hits apiece.

**ROAD WORK TO THE BREAK**--Today closes out the first leg of this six-game journey that takes the Royals and the rest of baseball to the four-day break for the All-Star Game that will be played next Tuesday night in Washington...after this matinee in Minnesota, Kansas City will head to Chicago and take tomorrow off before opening a three-game set at Guaranteed Rate Field...while going just 1-15 in the last 16 home games, the Royals are 5-14 in the last 19 away from home.

**DUPER DUPED BY NEW YORK**--In his first test since June 27 in Milwaukee, replay guru Bill Duplissee requested a review of Rosell Herrera's dive back into first base in the sixth inning here on Monday night...despite what appeared to be a proper challenge, the folks in NYC stuck with the call on the field, thus Duper fell for the fifth time in 24 tries this year (19-for-24)...his now 79.2% success rate is still on top in Major League Baseball, with the Yankees next at 73.9% (17-for-23)...Dupe has made good on 67% of his challenges in his career (118-for-175), which ranks among the best, including a Major League best 71.7% success rate over the last three seasons (71-for-99).

**DOZIER COMPLETES HIS PERSONAL CYCLE**--It took 56 games and 183 Major League at bats, but Hunter Dozier finally filled up each extra-base hit column with his first big league triple in the ninth inning last night off of Addison Reed...he already possesses eight doubles and four home runs.

**RISPY SUCCESS**--The Royals had their most efficient game of the year with runners in scoring position last night, going 5-for-9...RISP hitting has been an issue for the majority of the season, with last night the sixth game of at least five hits with runners in scoring position, one shy of a 6-for-17 affair in Cleveland on May 11, with the Royals prevailing 10-9...on the campaign, Kansas City has hit .220 with runners in scoring position, which is 29th among the 30 clubs.

**BACK IN THE CENTRAL**--This stop in Minneapolis resumes a stretch in which the Royals are playing 15 of 18 games against foes from within the A.L. Central, the only interruption the three-game sweep by the BoSox over the weekend...KC is now 1-1 through the first two games of this stretch of 12 in a row within the Central, with today remaining here, three over the upcoming weekend in Chicago and then a post-break homestand that features visits from the Twins and Detroit Tigers...by winning last night, the Royals are 13-18 this year within the Central...KC spent the entire month of June and first day of July playing only the Western Division when competing against the American League, while the interleague slate called for two vs. Cincinnati and two against Milwaukee...things didn't go well against the American League West, with the Royals going 4-19 during a 23-game stretch in June and finishing with a 7-26 mark on the year and KC has already completed play against the Western Division...the Royals are just 3-15 vs. the East to this point, winning once in Boston, once in Baltimore and once at home against the Yankees, while being swept in Toronto (0-3) and at home by the Red Sox (0-3) and Tampa Bay (0-3)...the Royals are 3-6 against the National League, with the NL Central the focus this season.

**WHERE'S WHIT???**--Kansas City utility man extraordinaire Whit Merrifield has been back at second base in each of the last four games...now in his third big league season, Merrifield's name is likely to be somewhere near the top of the batting order when healthy, but where he'll play on a given day could be virtually anywhere on the diamond...since the first of June, he has started at second base (19 games), in center field (8 times), right field (3 times), at first base (twice) and as the DH (twice)...on the year, he's played four different defensive positions, including his normal location of second base (59 games), center field (13 games), first base (5 games) and right field (8 games)...he has played left field and third base in previous seasons, while also DH'ing five times this year.

**MATIAS TO PLAY IN FUTURES GAME**--Kansas City's minor league home run sensation, Seuly Matias, was announced Friday as a member of the World Team for the 2018 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game, which will be played at 4:00 p.m. (EDT) next Sunday at Nationals Park in Washington...Matias, 19, hit his minor league-leading 26th home run for Lexington (A) on Sunday, three more than Jabari Blash of the Salt Lake Bees in the PCL...the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game, which is now in its 20th year, features the top Minor League prospects competing in a nine-inning contest as part of All-Star Sunday...the U.S. Team leads the all-time series, 12-7...Major League Baseball, in conjunction with MLB.com, Baseball America and the 30 Major League Clubs, selected the 25 players currently on each team...each Major League organization is represented and players from all full-season Minor Leagues were eligible to be selected.

**ROYALS AND TIGERS IN OMAHA IN '19**--Commissioner Rob Manfred was in Omaha on June 21 to announce that the Royals and Detroit Tigers will play a regular season game in TD Ameritrade Park next June 13 to celebrate the start of the 2019 College World Series...the announcement made in conjunction with the NCAA, was attended by Royals General Manager Dayton Moore, his counterpart with the Tigers, Al Avila, Omaha Mayor Jean Stothert, the President/CEO of the Omaha Storm Chasers Gary Green and was emceed by ESPN's Karl Ravech...the game will be the completion of a three-game home series for the Royals where the June 11-12 games will be played in Kauffman Stadium before taking the finale to Omaha...ESPN will televise the prime-time contest nationally.

**KC'S TOP SKIPPER**--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost recorded his 1,100th career win on May 18 vs. the Yankees and has since upped that career total to 1,112, which is good for seventh on the all-time list among active skippers, while Detroit's Ron Gardenhire is next in the eighth spot with 1,108 career wins...Ned has a 655-697 regular season record at the helm for the Royals, blowing past Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...Yost is the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and is sixth among active managers in games (2,311)...his postseason winning pct. of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).

## 2018 Royals Home Runs
