**ROSTER MOVE**—Today the Rays designated RH **Ryan Weber** for assignment and selected OF **Johnny Field** from Triple-A Durham...Field, who will wear No. 10, will be making his major league debut...he was one of the club's final cuts this spring, after the Rays traded for INF/OF **Rob Refsnyder**—his college teammate at the University of Arizona—from the Indians...Weber's only app was on Tues at CWS and he became the third player born in St. Petersburg to play for the Rays, joining RH **Doug Waechter** (2003-06) and 1B **Casey Kotchman** (2011).

**HOME SWEET DOME**—Today is the first game of a 3-team, 9-game home-stand against the Phillies, Rangers and Twins...the Rays went 2-6 on their road trip to New York, Boston and Chicago, with an average first-pitch temperature of 44°F including 4 games at 40°F or lower...today's game snaps a club-record streak of nine consecutive day games.

- + This series continues a stretch of three straight against teams that finished last season below .500...15 of the 19 series from April 9–June 13 are against opponents that finished last season below .500.
- + Today and tomorrow, from the time gates open until game time, Hall of Famer **Steve Carlton** will sign autographs at Gate 1 to benefit the Ted Williams Museum Scholarship Fund...for a \$30 donation, fans can get an autograph and take a photo with the Phillies four-time NL Cy Young Award winner.

**RAY MATTER**—Wednesday's game at CWS was the sixth time the Rays held a lead and lost, and it was the third time they led in the 8th inning or later and lost (led 2-0 in the 8th and lost 3-2 in 12 innings on April 5 at BOS; led 7-1 in the 8th and lost 8-7 on Sun at BOS; led 1-0 in the 8th and lost 2-1 on Wed at CWS)...the Rays have held a lead in 9 of 12 games but are 3-9 (.250), tied with the Marlins for the 2nd-lowest winning pct. in the majors (Reds, .167)...the 6 losses after holding a lead are the most in the majors, ahead of the Royals (5), Marlins (5), Nationals (4), Cardinals (4) and Reds (4).

- + The Rays are 2-5 (.286) when scoring first, lowest winning pct. in the AL when doing so and 2nd-lowest in the majors to Cincinnati (.250)...last season, the Rays went 52-30 (.634) when scoring first.
- + The Rays are 0-5 when yielding 3 runs or fewer this season, the only winless team in the majors when doing so...in comparison, the other 29 teams are a combined 131-35 (.789) when allowing 3 runs or fewer...last year, the Rays went 53-16 (.768) in these games.
- + The Rays are 9-8 all-time on Friday the 13th; 4-3 at home and 5-5 on the road...they lost their last one, May 13, 2016 vs. OAK, 7-6, on a 2-run, 2-out, 9th-inning homer by **Danny Valencia** off **Steve Geltz**.

**RAYS vs. PHILLIES**—The Rays haven't played the Phillies since July 20-22, 2015 and haven't hosted them since June 23-25, 2009...they are 15-9 all-time against the Phillies (6-3 at home)...in total, they have won six of the eight regular season series between the clubs...the Rays also played the Phillies in their only World Series appearance, losing 4-1 in 2008.

- + Only three uniformed personnel from when the Rays played the Phillies in the 2008 World Series remain with the club in some capacity...**Rocco Baldelli**, who homered in the decisive Game 5 loss, is now the major league field coordinator...assistant pitching coach **Brian Anderson** is now the TV color analyst on FOX Sports Sun...bullpen catcher **Scott Cursi** is now part of the clubhouse staff.

**COMMON BOND**—Five former Rays players have gone on to manage major league teams and three of those were hired this past offseason...among them are Rays Manager **Kevin Cash** (played for Rays in 2005) and Phillies skipper **Gabe Kapler** (2009-10)...the others are former White Sox/Marlins Manager **Ozzie Guillén** (2000), Mets skipper **Mickey Callaway** (1999, 2001) and Nationals Manager **Dave Martinez** (1998-2000).

**INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE**—Tonight is the Rays first of 20 interleague games this season...they went 11-9 in interleague play last season and have only one losing interleague record in 10 seasons of the "Rays" era (7-11 in 2010)...they are 110-80 (.579) since 2008—tied for 4th-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (.646), Rangers (.600) and Yankees (.595)—and 184-184 all-time...the AL is 7-7 (.500) in interleague play this season, and have won each of the last 14 season series.

**CLOSE SHAVES**—Eight of the Rays 12 games this season have been decided in one-run fashion (2-6)...the 8 one-run games are the most in the majors, ahead of the Indians (7)...the Rays are the first team to play 8 one-

run games within their first 12 games of the season since 2012, when the Pirates (4-4) and Diamondbacks (3-5) both did it...only four teams since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) did that more frequently within their first 12 games of a season: 1998 Phillies (5-4), 1986 Padres (7-3) 1986 Dodgers (3-7) and 1960 Washington Senators (4-6)...if tonight's game is decided by a 1-run margin, the Rays will be the first team with 9 one-run games in their first 13 contests since those 1998 Phillies.

- + Similarly, the Rays are the only team in the majors with 6 one-run losses...only one other team has more than 3 losses in 1-run games: the Indians (4)...the Rays are the first team with 6 one-run losses within their first 12 games of the season since the 2008 Braves (6).
- + Since 2016, the Rays are 36-57 (.387) in 1-run games, worst winning pct. in the majors.

**GUT CHECK**—The 3-9 record is the worst 12-game start in franchise history...the offense's 6 HR and .320 SLG are both the 2nd-worst marks in club history through 12 games to 2013 (5 HR, .288 SLG), while the 39 runs and 13 2B are 3rd-fewest...the pitching staff has recorded 98 SO, 2nd-most through 12 games behind 2016 (113).

**YONNY NUT CHIRINOS**—On Wed at CWS, **Yonny Chirinos** made the 3rd app (2nd start) of his career and extended his scoreless streak to 14.1 IP—the longest scoreless streak ever for a Rays pitcher to begin his career, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, passing **Doug Waechter** (11.1 IP) in 2003...Elias also notes it's the longest scoreless streak to begin a career since BOS **Austin Maddox** (16.1 IP) from June 17–Sep 28 last season.

**SEEKING LENGTH**—Only twice this season has a Rays starter gone 6 IP or more: **Chris Archer** on Opening Day vs. BOS (6 IP) and **Blake Snell** on Tues at CWS (6 IP)...the Rays, Rangers and Athletics are tied for the fewest number of starts of 6 IP, while the Rays are one of six teams without a start of at least 7 IP...last season, Rays starters went at least 6 IP in 88 of 162 games (54.3 pct.), tied for the 3rd-highest rate in the AL...Snell's start is the only "quality start" (6 IP or more, 3 ER or fewer) thrown by the Rays this season, fewest in the majors.

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—Through 12 games, a Rays reliever has thrown at least 50 pitches six times...the other 29 teams have combined to do it 17 times, and only the Tigers (3), Dodgers (2), Marlins (2) and Rangers (2) have done it more than once...Rays relievers combined to make 6 apps of 50-plus pitches all of last season...Rays relievers have totaled a 4 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (Marlins, 2), and 9 apps of at least 2 IP, 4th-most in the majors and 2nd-most in the AL.

**LA PANTERA**—Shortstop **Adeiny Hechavarria** has not committed an error since last July 30 at NYY, a streak of 62 games and 208 chances without an error...it is the longest streak by games and 3rd-longest by chances for a shortstop in club history...since last Aug 1, he is the only shortstop in the majors to appear in at least 20 games without committing an error...since being acquired by the Rays on June 26, 2017, he has a .988 fielding pct. in 88 games (85 starts)...prior to his arrival last season, Rays shortstops ranked 14th of 15 AL teams with a .959 fielding pct.

**WHAT'S NEW AT TROPICANA FIELD**—The Rays invested \$7 million in capital improvements to Tropicana Field over the offseason, with an aim to dramatically overhaul the food, beverage and retail experience...this project brings the total investment in Tropicana Field to more than \$37 million since 2005, under the current ownership group led by **Stuart Sternberg**...central to these offseason improvements was the Rays partnership with Levy and its retail division, Rank + Rally...the Rays and Levy have renovated amenities, updated culinary equipment and invested in new technologies...the changes include modernized "food halls" in the first- and third-base concourses and major updates to the center field experience, including the Porch and the Rays Republic Team Store.

**THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY**—On April 13, 2014, **Ben Zobrist** homered from both sides of the plate, which remains one of three such occurrences in club history, joining **Willy Aybar** on Aug 3, 2009 vs. KC and **Geoff Blum** on May 4, 2004 at TEX...this game also marked the first time a first baseman hit 9th in the starting lineup in a game without the designated hitter since May 28, 1926, when Phillies Manager **Art Fletcher** hit 1B **Wally Kimmick** 9th and LH **Jack Bentley** batted 5th.

**LAST START**—On Sat at BOS, went a career-low 1.2 IP while allowing a career-high 8 runs and career-high-tying 5 BB (also July 30, 2017 at NYY)...was the first Ray to allow 8 ER in a start of 2 IP or fewer since **Jae Weong Seo** on Sep 25, 2006 vs. NYY...he was the first starter to throw at least 73 pitches without completing the 2nd inning since NYM **Mike Pelfrey** on July 19, 2010 at ARI (74 pitches, 1.1 IP)...yielded 4 runs on 4 hits and 1 BB in the 1st inning, and 4 BB plus a grand slam to **Xander Bogaerts** in the 2nd inning, the first allowed in his career...also marked his first career app without a strikeout...his line: L, 1.2 IP, 5 H, 8 R, 5 BB, 0 SO, 1 HR, 73 pit, 34 str.

**WINLESS STREAK**—Is seeking his first win since July 25, 2017 vs. BAL...has gone 0-4 with a 6.43 ERA (35-IP, 25-ER) in his 9 apps (7 starts) since his last win, after going 5-1 with a 2.67 ERA (57.1-IP, 17-ER) in 9 starts to begin his career...this is his second major league season after making his major league debut last June 7 vs. CWS.

- + Originally was tabbed on March 15 by Manager **Kevin Cash** to start the fifth game of the season, but moved up following the injury to **Nathan Eovaldi**.
- + Despite this winless streak, has yielded more than 3 runs only three times in 16 career starts.

**INTERLEAGUE**—In the only interleague start of his career, last Aug 4 vs. MIL, he took the loss despite allowing only 1 R/ER in 6 IP of a 2-0 Rays loss...his 9 SO that game remain tied for his career high (also June 18, 2017 at DET).

**SPRING THINGS**—Went 1-2 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1-IP, 11-ER) in 6 starts during Grapefruit League action, in addition to pitching in an intrasquad game on March 6...did not record a strikeout in his first 3 starts spanning 4.1 IP and 29 BF...pitched in the Rays spring finale on March 27 vs. DET at Tropicana Field, and threw 6 innings of no-hit ball in a no-decision...that start brought his spring ERA down from 7.43 to 5.12.

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS**—Last season he was named the club's Outstanding Rookie by the Tampa Bay Chapter of the BBWAA...min. 75 IP, he led AL rookies with a 3.43 ERA, .225 opp avg., .387 opp SLG, 8.72 SO/9 IP and 1.18 WHIP...ranked 4th among AL rookies with 84 SO, and ranked 2nd to NYY **Jordan Montgomery** (91) after his June 7 recall...achieved this despite spending 25 games on the disabled list from Aug 17–Sep 14.

**REDEFINING QUALITY**—He was the first pitcher to begin his career with 7 consecutive quality starts since NYY **Masahiro Tanaka** (16) in 2014, and one of only nine pitchers since 1913 to begin his career in this fashion...he became the fifth pitcher since 1913 to go 6 IP or more, allow 1 run or fewer and earn the win in his first 3 apps, joining STL **Andy Rincon** (1980), CIN **Wayne Simpson** (1970), STL **Stu Miller** (1952) and DET **Alex Main** (1914)...he also became the second pitcher since 1913 with at least 35 SO and 5 BB or fewer in his first 5 starts, with no relief apps in between, joining SEA **Félix Hernández** in 2005...was the second Ray to win his first 4 decisions, all as a starter, joining **James Shields** in 2006.

**LUCKY DUCK**—While playing scout ball in 2010, he was turned away by an overlooked hotel...to apologize, the hotel provided a gift bag with treats and a rubber duck...the duck found its way to his equipment bag, where it was forgotten...after a strong first season as a professional, he was frustrated by a poor 2012 campaign...the next spring began poorly as well, until Jake realized a new equipment bag had separated him from the duck...when his father shipped Jake's car, he placed the duck inside...an outstanding 2013 campaign followed and the duck has traveled with him to the ballpark ever since.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH CHRIS ARCHER (1-0, 5.94 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Mon at CWS, wore short sleeves with a first-pitch temperature of 35°F and recorded his first win of the season...allowed 4 runs, including a 2-run homer to **Nick Delmonico** in the 5th inning and RBI double to **Omar Narváez** in the 6th (unearned)...replaced with a 5-4 lead and 2-on, 2-out in the 6th and **Chaz Roe** induced a force out to end the inning...his line: W, 5.2 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 3 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 102 pit, 68 str.

**MARQUEE MATCHUP**—Will be facing 2015 NL Cy Young Award winner **Jake Arrieta**, who will make his second start with the Phillies...is 3-3 with a 3.22 ERA (81-IP, 29-ER) in 13 career starts against former Cy Young

winners, most recently a no-decision last July 27 against **CC Sabathia**.

**vs. PHILADELPHIA**—The Phillies are one of three opposing teams he has never faced, along with the Braves and Reds...has gone 6-8 with a 2.79 ERA (116-IP, 36-ER) in 19 career interleague starts, yielding 3 ER or fewer in 17 of those 19 starts, including 14 in a row...only one pitcher has a longer active streak allowing 3 ER or less in interleague games: LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (18)...no other pitcher in major league history has made at least 10 IL starts with as low an ERA and a losing record in IL play.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Acquired by the Rays from the Angels on Feb 17 for a player to be named (infielder Luis Rengifo)...played parts of four seasons with the Angels, and has hit double-digit homers in each of his first four major league seasons, including a career-high-tying 16 HR last season.

- + Selected from Triple-A Durham today, taking the roster spot of right-handed pitcher Ryan Weber...will be making his major league debut.
- + Was a non-roster invite to Rays spring training for a third straight year...hit .261/.303/.425 (116-for-445) with 35 2B, 1 3B, 12 HR, 57 RBI and 12 SB in 111 games with Durham last season...ranked 2nd in the International League and tied for 3rd among Rays minor leaguers with 35 2B, one shy of tying his career high (2014)...marked his fourth consecutive season with at least 12 HR and his fifth straight year with double-digit stolen bases.
