TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** won the second of the series against the Reds and have snapped their eight game losing streak, their longest of the season...the eight game losing streak was the longest since losing eight straight from May 3-May 13 2016...this win also snaps a four-game streak of giving up a lead...the Twins are now 6-4 at Target Field this year and improve to 2-2 against the NL...this was the fifth time the Twins have held an opponent to one or fewer runs and the first time since April 18 vs. CLE (2-1 win)...the Twins are now 4-5 during day games, 5-9 in games when the opponent scores first and have four come from behind wins...first game since April 21 that concluded in under three hours.
- **JAKE ODORIZZI** earned his second win of the season and snapped a two-game losing skid...in 6.0 innings, allowed one run on a solo home run in the second, allowed five hits and two walks while striking out three...this is his third outing of 6.0 innings in 2018 and his third quality start, his first since April 10 vs. HOU...his third consecutive start allowing a home run and his seventh total this season...entering today, Odorizzi was tied for 11th in baseball for most home runs allowed.
- **EDUARDO ESCOBAR** (1-for-4) doubled in the fourth inning to drive in Eddie Rosario, his second extra base hit of the series...the double extends his hitting streak against NL opponents to seven games.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (2-for-4) singled in the fourth inning and scored the Twins first run of the game...now has a base hit in 10 of his last 12 games...in his last 17 games against NL opponents, is hitting .353 (24-for-68) with nine doubles.
- **BRIAN DOZIER** (0-for-4) was held hitless today, snapping his 14-game home hitting streak.
- **MITCH GARVER** (2-for-3) homered in the fifth inning, his second home run of the year...Garver also doubled in the second, his second double of the season and now has four extra base hits in 2018...this was his first multi-hit game of the season and second of his career (last August 30, 2017 vs. CWS).
- **ZACH DUKE** came on in relief of Odorizzi in the seventh and pitched a scoreless frame, his seventh consecutive outing without allowing an earned run.

CINCINNATI NOTES:

- **THE REDS** lost the second game of the three-game set to the Twins...are now 11-12 against the Twins all-time and are 1-1 at Target Field...with Scott Schebler's home run in the first, this marked the sixth straight game in which the Reds have hit a home run, their longest streak of the season...Reds are now 3-6 since Jim Riggleman was promoted to interim manager...held to one run or fewer for the seventh time in 2018...the Reds are now 1-1 in Interleague play in 2018.
- **SAL ROMANO** suffered his third loss of the season after lasting 4.2 innings, allowed three runs (2 earned) on six hits and two walks with one strikeout...second time this season striking out only one batter, tying a career-low...retired the first seven batters of the game before allowing a double to Mitch Garver in the third...was pulled from the game after allowing a walk to Joe Mauer and a single to Eddie Rosario with two.

- **JOEY VOTTO** (0-for-3) reached on a walk in the eighth, extending his on-base streak to 13 games, a season high...however, Votto's six-game hit streak was snapped, as was his four-game home run streak...over the his six game hitting streak, hit .391 (9-for-23).
- **SCOTT SHEBLER** (1-for-3) hit a solo home run in the second inning to give the Reds a 1-0 lead...the home run also extended his hitting streak to four games...during his streak is hitting .375 (6-for-16) with five RBI.
- **ADAM DUVALL** (1-for-3) doubled in the seventh inning, his second double of the series...has now reached base safely in each of his last six games.
- **SCOOTER GENNET** (1-for-4) singled in the sixth inning to extend his hitting streak to five games and is hitting .391 (9-for-23) over the streak.
