THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY

1973 - Brothers Gaylord Perry (Indians) and Jim Perry (Tigers) pitch against each other for the only time in their careers. Neither finishes the game, but Gaylord is charged with the 5-4 loss. Norm Cash hits a pair of home runs for the Tigers.

1993 - Cecil Fielder becomes the third player in history to homer onto the left field roof at Tiger Stadium in the Tigers 11-5 loss to the Rangers. Harmon Killebrew and Frank Howard are the only other players to accomplish the feat.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers salvaged a series split against the Blue Jays with a 3-2 win in 10 innings on Monday afternoon at Rogers Centre. With the game tied 2-2 in the 10th inning, Niko Goodrum hit a one-out triple and came home to score the winning run on a sacrifice fly by José Iglesias. Blaine Hardy pitched a scoreless ninth to pick up the first save of his Major League career. Jeimer Candelario had three hits in the win, while John Hicks and Victor Martinez each had a hit and a RBI. Mike Fiers started for Detroit and received a no decision after giving up just one run on three hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 8.0 innings. Joe Jiménez was credited with the win after allowing a run on one hit with three walks and one strikeout in 1.0 inning. The Tigers continue their six-game road trip today as they begin a two-game Interleague series against the Chicago Cubs. Following the two games in Chicago, Detroit returns home for a four-game series vs. Texas (July 5-8).

ROSTER MOVES: Following yesterday's game, the Tigers announced the following roster moves:

- * Optioned C Grayson Greiner to Triple A Toledo
- * Selected the contract of OF Jim Adduci from Triple A Toledo. Adduci will wear #37.

- * To create room for Adduci on the 40-man roster, the Tigers have transferred INF Miguel Cabrera to the 60-day disabled list.

THEY CALL ME THE FIERMAN: Mike Fiers turned in his best outing of the season yesterday at Toronto, throwing 8.0 innings and allowing just one run on three hits with one walk and five strikeouts. The outing was the longest for Fiers since he threw a no-hitter on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). Fiers has allowed three runs-or-less in six of his last seven starts, posting a 2.68 ERA (43.2IP/13ER) and 36 strikeouts during that span.

START ME UP: Fiers' start yesterday continued an impressive string of starts for Detroit. Tigers starting pitchers have now thrown 6.0-or-more innings in six consecutive games, which is their longest streak since July 28-August 2, 2017, when they also had six straight starts of at least 6.0 innings. Over their last eight games, Tigers starters have compiled a 2.82 ERA (51.0IP/16ER) and 39 strikeouts. Detroit ranks third in the American League with a 2.82 ERA during that time span.

THE CANDY MAN CAN: Jeimer Candelario had three hits in yesterday's win, recording his fourth game of three-or-more hits this season (last, April 25 at Pittsburgh) and the sixth of his career. Candelario finished the four-game series in Toronto hitting .313 (5x16) with a double, a home run and a RBI. In his previous seven games prior to the series against the Blue Jays, Candelario had hit .087 (2x23).

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 27th one-run game of the season yesterday, improving to 14-13 in those contests with a 3-2 victory in 10 innings. Detroit's 27 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Seattle, 37 and Tampa Bay, 37), while their 14 one-run wins are tied for the third-most in the league. In addition to the 27 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 18 games that have been decided by two runs.

TIGERS AND CUBS: The Tigers and Cubs begin their four-game season series this afternoon at Wrigley Field. Along with the two games in Chicago this week, the two teams will also play twice in Detroit on August 21-22. The Tigers and Cubs last met in 2015, when Detroit won three-of-four games. All time, Detroit is 16-5 against Chicago (NL), including winning nine-of-11 games at Wrigley Field.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: The Tigers are 1-7 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 207-184 (.529) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Only eight other Major League teams have at least 200 wins in Interleague history (New York (AL), Boston, Los Angeles (AL), Texas, Oakland, Chicago (AL), Minnesota, Seattle). Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 136-98 (.581) in IL play, which is tied with Texas for the third-best record among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only the Boston Red Sox (155-77, .668) and New York Yankees (140-99, .586).

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 2-2 on their current six-game road trip, which includes four games at Toronto (2-2) and two games at Chicago (NL) (July 3-4). Detroit is currently in a stretch that will see them play 20-of-28 games away from Comerica Park leading up to the All-Star break. The Tigers are 15-27 on the road this season. As a team, Detroit is hitting .236 (342x1449) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.65 ERA (356.1IP/184ER).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

- * Enters today's game with a 38-48 (.442) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,106-1,087 (.504) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

- * Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

- * Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

- * Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

- * Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

- * Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

SPENSER WATKINS NAMED FLORIDA STATE LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK: RHP Spenser Watkins was named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week on Monday. Watkins started the second game of the doubleheader on June 27 vs. Charlotte and came within two outs of a no-hitter before allowing a one-out single in the seventh inning. Watkins finished the shutout with one hit allowed, one walk and seven strikeouts.

VERHAGEN INJURY REHAB UPDATE: RHP Drew VerHagen made an injury rehab appearance with Triple A Toledo last night vs. Columbus, throwing 1.1 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, two walks and three strikeouts. In two injury rehab outings with the Mud Hens, VerHagen has not allowed a run in 2.1 innings, while striking out four. VerHagen has been sidelined since June 20 with a nasal fracture.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his 17th start of 2018 this afternoon in the series opener at Chicago (NL).

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer tied his longest outing of the season on Thursday vs. Oakland, but took the loss after giving up four runs on nine hits with five strikeouts in 8.0 innings.

VS. CHICAGO (NL): Fulmer will be making his first career appearance against the Cubs this afternoon.

ON THE ROAD: Fulmer has made 35 road starts in his career and has compiled a 14-15 record with a 3.68 ERA (212.2IP/87ER) and 182 strikeouts. In seven road starts this season, Fulmer is 2-2 with a 4.30 ERA (37.2IP/18ER) and 43 strikeouts.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Fulmer has made eight career starts in Interleague play and has a 2-5 record with a 2.72 ERA (53.0IP/16ER) and 49 strikeouts. In three starts vs. National League teams this season, Fulmer is 0-2 with a 1.83 ERA (19.2IP/4ER) and 21 strikeouts.

DOMINANT IN THE DAY TIME: Fulmer has pitched well in day games this season, posting a 3-4 record with a 2.51 ERA (64.2IP/18ER) and 51 strikeouts. He enters today's game ranked eighth in the American League in ERA during day games. In 29 career starts in the day time, Fulmer is 12-8 with a 2.64 ERA (194.0IP/57ER) and 148 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Fulmer has started 11 games in his career during the month of July, compiling a 5-3 record with a 3.73 ERA (72.1IP/30ER) and 46 strikeouts. In six July starts last season, Fulmer went 3-3 with a 4.66 ERA (38.2IP/20ER) and 22 strikeouts.

LOOKING BACK AT FULMER'S JUNE: Fulmer made five starts in June, posting a 1-3 record with a 3.48 ERA (33.2IP/13ER) and 28 strikeouts.

TURNING IT AROUND: Michael Fulmer has allowed three runs-or-less in three of his last four starts. After posting a 6.89 ERA (31.1IP/24ER) in six starts from May 7-June 3, Fulmer has a 2.93 ERA (27.2IP/9ER) with 25 strikeouts over his last four starts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .240 (186x776) batting average in his career, while lefties have hit .239 (188x787) against him. In 16 starts this season, righties are hitting .270 (43x159), while lefthanded batters are hitting .228 (45x197).

AMONG THE BEST SINCE HIS DEBUT: Fulmer has been among the best pitchers in the American League since making his debut on April 29, 2016. Among active American League pitchers with at least 400.0 innings pitched since April 29, 2016, Fulmer ranks sixth with a 3.62 ERA, trailing only Corey Kluber (2.59 ERA), Justin Verlander (2.82 ERA), Chris Sale (3.07 ERA), Carlos Carrasco (3.55 ERA) and J.A. Happ (3.56 ERA).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.
