LEADING OFF: Happy Fourth of July! Angels are 28-31 all-time on Independence Day (13-14 at home, 15-17 on road)...Shohei Ohtani celebrates his 24th birthday tomorrow...Halos play the ninth contest (2-6) of a four-city, 10-game trip to Kansas City (makeup; 0-1), Boston (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) & Seattle (July 3-5; 0-1)...Angels have dropped eight of last 10 games...At 43-43, LAA in jeopardy of falling below .500 for first time since dropping initial game of season (March 29)...Club is in fourth place, 12.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (12.0 games behind pace of second Wild Card spot)...Angels are 30-40 since a club-record 13-3 start...Halos went 13-14 in June to finish with a sub-.500 month for second straight month and in four of last six months spanning to 2017...LAA is 6-15 when a left-hander starts (37-28 vs. RHS)...Halos are 12-21 on road since a club-record 11-1 start...16 of 24 games in July are at home...Following this series, Angels host the Dodgers (July 6-8) & Mariners (July 10-12) before reaching the All-Star Break.

DID YOU KNOW? Today's starter Garrett Richards has allowed three earned runs or less in 12 of his last 13 starts and owns a 2.43 ERA across his last eight outings (40.2 – 11 ER).

INJURY BUG: With today's transactions, Halos have 14 players on the D.L...The average D.L. stint for the Angels this season has been 31 games.

EMERALD MIKE: Mike Trout has hit safely in six of seven games at Safeco Field this season (all multi-hit games, four 3-hit efforts)...In the seven contests, he is batting .571 (16/28) with eight runs, four doubles, one triple, five HRs and nine RBI (1.321 slugging pct.)...Has four HRs his last four games here.

DOUBLE DUTY: With his game-tying RBI double in the 8th inning Saturday, Albert Pujols moved into a tie with David Ortiz for 10th on the all-time doubles list with 632...He is the only MLB player in all-time top 10 in HRs (626) and doubles.

SIMBA SIZZLIN' Andrelton Simmons has hit safely in nine of last 10 games (.385; 15/39)...His .356 (52/146) road clip is second-best in MLB.

SCIOSCIA 3K: June 30th marked the 3,000th career game for Mike Scioscia as manager of the Angels...He's the 21st manager to reach the plateau and the sixth to have at least 3,000 games with one team (Connie Mack, John McGraw, Bobby Cox, Walter Alston and Tommy Lasorda).

MEDICAL UPDATES: LHP John Lamb underwent an MRI on his left elbow revealing a torn ulnar collateral ligament. He will undergo UCL reconstruction surgery with Dr. Neal ElAttrache in Los Angeles in the coming days...RHP Jake Jewell underwent successful right ankle surgery June 29th. A typical return to play from this procedure is approximately six months...INF Zack Cozart underwent successful repair of the labrum in his left shoulder June 29th. A typical return to play from this procedure is 6-8 months.

OHTANI UPDATE: Shohei Ohtani (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7th. On June 28th, an MRI revealed improvements to the UCL in the elbow. Yesterday, he was reinstated from the 10-day DL in a return to the team as a designated hitter. In approximately two weeks he will be re-assessed to see if he can pitch this season.

FROM THE START: Halo starters have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 46 of last 58 games...Starters have fashioned a 3.33 ERA (316.2 IP – 117 ER) since May 1, second in A.L. in span (4th in MLB).

MAKE WAR: Trout's 6.7 WAR this season (Wins Above Replacement) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is Jose Ramirez (CLE) at 5.6...On pace for a 13.0 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his 60.9 career WAR is tops in MLB history thru 1,011 games.

SHELVED: Angels have 14 players currently on the disabled list...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...49 players have appeared for Angels this season, most in MLB (club record is 55 in 2017)...28 pitchers have played for LAA (12 starters), most in team history thru 86 games (LAA used club-record 31 pitchers last season).

ALWAYS ON: Since his call-up in 2012, Mike Trout has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...His 75 walks are most in Angels' history through 86 games.

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 3 in MLB in several offensive categories, including HRs (T2nd; 24), runs (T2nd; 66), times on base (1st; 172), walks (1st; 75), IBB (1st; 12), OBP (1st; .454), SLG (3rd; .626), OPS (2nd; 1.080) & OPS+ (1st; 199.0)...Trout has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (12).

GLOVE STORY: LAA has gone errorless in 55 of 86 games...Club has 39 errors thru 86 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .988 fielding pct...Catchers own a 46.0 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...Trout is one of four MLB CFs with a 1.000 fielding pct.

PITCHING POINTS: LAA pitchers have 39 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 86 affairs (LAA ranks 4th in A.L. with 773 Ks)...294 walks are third-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has logged 319.1 IP, second in A.L. to TB...15 blown saves are third-most in A.L...Halos have allowed 114 HRs, second-most in A.L.

HOT HALOS: Rookie David Fletcher has hit safely in five straight (.333; 6/18) and in eight of his first 10 MLB starts (4 multi-hit games)...Jose Briceño has opened his big league career batting .300 (9/30) in 10 games with an AB...Luis Valbuena has three home runs and seven RBI his last eight starts...Martin Maldonado has 12 RBI his last 12 games...Tyler Skaggs went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP – 3 ER) in June (5 GS)...His 0.84 ERA led all MLB starters last month...Has allowed two earned runs or less in 13 of his 16 starts...His 2.64 ERA ranks ninth in A.L...Andrew Heaney matched a career best with 10 Ks last night (2nd time).

A BIT ON ALBERT: Albert Pujols is 37 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two other players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez.

NOT A FAN: Andrelton Simmons has struck out just six times since May 1 (203 PA)...He went 90 PA without fanning (May 18-June 22)...He leads MLB in PA per SO with 22.00 (308 PA/14 K) while teammate Ian Kinsler ranks third in MLB in PA per SO (10.46)...Simmons also leads the Majors batting .351 (33/94) with two strikes.

TRIPLE THREATS at 1K: June 21st marked the 1,000th career game for Mike Trout...He joins Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez as only players in MLB history with at least a .300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases at the 1K milestone.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols is 27th all-time with 3,046 hits...Rod Carew is 26th at 3,053...His 3,000th hit came May 4th at Seattle to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,963 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

AT SEATTLE: Angels have dropped last four games to M's...Mariners lead 2018 series 5-2, sweeping Angels in last trip to Safeco (June 11-13)...Halos took two of three at Seattle in first meeting (May 4-6)...LAA is 10-9 in last 19 games at Safeco...Angels are 100-78 over M's since 2009...Trout's 20 HRs at Safeco are his most in career at any road ballpark, and most ever by a visiting player at Safeco...A.Simmons is batting .450 (9/20) vs. M's this season.

DODGERS ON DECK: Clubs split 2017 season series 2-2...Angels have won six of last nine games vs. LAD...Since 2005, Angels are 40-29 vs. LAD (23-12 at Angel Stadium)...All-time, Halos are 36-21 at home, 27-30 on road and 63-51 overall against LAD...Under Mike Scioscia, LAA is 58-42 vs. LAD.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP GARRETT RICHARDS

4-4, 3.42 ERA

Making return from disabled list today (left hamstring strain)

- **BACK WITH THE HALOS:** Reinstated from disabled list prior to today's game; missed 17 games with a left hamstring strain...Making 15th start of the season today and ninth on the road...Third start of 2018 vs. Seattle (second consecutive Major League start vs. Mariners).
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Is pitching to a 2.43 ERA (40.2 IP – 11 ER) across last eight starts...His ERA ranks fifth in the American League (min. 40 IP) in that span (since May 4)...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 12 of last 13 games.
- **LOW AVERAGE:** Ranks third in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .219 (410/1873) batting average against since the start of 2014 behind **Chris Sale** and **Corey Kluber**.
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** In 15 road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 2-3 record and 2.84 ERA (69.2 IP – 22 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in 12 of the 15 starts.
- **LAST TIME OUT (with Inland Empire):** Charged with loss in rehab assignment with Adv.-A Inland Empire on June 29 at Rancho Cucamonga after tossing 3.1 innings and allowing five earned runs on seven hits with no walks and four strikeouts...Four of the five runs came in his fourth innings of work.
- **DIVISIONAL PLAY:** Since 2013, owns a 20-17 record and 3.18 ERA (325 IP – 115 ER) in 61 games (52 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 20 wins are ninth most in the Majors in that span.
- **GROUNDED:** This season, has a ground ball rate of 51.7%, which ranks fifth in the A.L. (min. 50 IP).
- **UNEARNED:** Leads the American League with 11 unearned runs this season...His 11 UER are the most by any Angels pitcher before the All-Star Break since **Kelvim Escobar** matched **Chuck Finley's** club record of 16 in 2006.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** According to *Fangraphs*, ranks second among A.L. players currently on active rosters with an average fastball velocity of 95.9 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP)...This season (min. 50 IP), ranks fourth in the A.L. with a 95.9 MPH average, behind **Luis Severino**, NYY (97.8 MPH), **Gerrit Cole**, HOU (96.3 MPH) and **Charlie Morton**, HOU (96.0 MPH).
- **VS. SEATTLE:** In 20 career games (12 starts) against the Mariners, is 6-4 with a 3.05 ERA (88.2 IP – 30 ER) and 82 strikeouts...In two starts this season, is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (8.2 IP – 2 ER)...Earned the win in start vs. Seattle on May 4 at Safeco Field after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings...Exited last start vs. Seattle after two innings pitched with a left hamstring strain...As a starter, is 6-3 with a 2.69 ERA (77 IP – 23 ER)...**Has allowed two runs-or-fewer in eight of 12 starts.**
- **SCORELESS START:** Tossed 6.2 shutout innings on May 4 at Seattle, marking 15th career scoreless start (first of 2018); 11th scoreless start of at least 6.2 IP.
- **AT SAFECO FIELD:** In 10 career games (seven starts) in Seattle, is 3-3 with a 3.38 ERA (45.1 IP – 17 ER)...As a starter, is 3-3 with a 3.35 ERA (40.1 IP – 15 ER).
- **CAREER-HIGH K'S:** Matched career-high (fourth time) with 11 strikeouts on April 21 vs. San Francisco...Became first Angels pitcher with 11+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings pitched since **Zack Greinke** on Sept. 25, 2012 vs. Seattle.
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- **STREAK SNAPPED:** Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- **CAREER TOTALS:** In 168 career games (113 starts), is 44-38 with a 3.52 ERA (736.2 IP – 288 ER) and 636 strikeouts across eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 33-25 with a 3.11 ERA (506.2 IP – 175 ER).
