THE TWINS: After completing their nine-game roadtrip with a record of 1-8 (1-2 vs. White Sox, 0-3 vs. Cubs, and 0-3 vs. Brewers), the Twins began their 11-game homestand with a win over the Orioles last night...tonight they will play the second of four with Baltimore...after Sunday afternoon's series finale with the O's, the Twins will host Kansas City for three from Monday-Wednesday, followed by four against Tampa Bay from Thursday-Sunday, leading up to the break...the Twins have gone 21-20 at home this season and are 5-3 in their last eight.

SLEGERS DROPS THE HAMMER: The Twins beat the Orioles last night by a score of 5-2, snapping their six-game losing streak...Aaron Slegers (1-0) earned his first major league win, allowing one run on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded nine hits, three coming from Jake Cave, who doubled twice, walked once, scored once and drove in a run.

MAUER DOUBLES UP: Joe Mauer hit his 414th career on Wednesday, and now needs just one to pass Kirby Puckett and move into first place on the Twins all-time list (since 1961):

TWINS AND BIRDS: Since 2017, the Twins are 8-3 vs. the O's, their best vs. any AL opponent in that span...the Twins are 3-1 vs. the Orioles this season and 17-8 in their last 25.

☞ Max Kepler has hit safely in 10 of 11 career games against the Orioles, hitting .405 (17-for-42) with six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 13 RBI, six walks, a .479 OBP and a 1.289 OPS.

☞ Joe Mauer is a career .337 (96-for-285) hitter against the Orioles, with 20 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 43 RBI, 46 runs scored and a .402 on-base percentage in 75 games.

☞ Robbie Grossman is hitting .358 (19-for-53) with six doubles, nine RBI, six walks and a .424 on-base percentage in 16 career games against the Orioles.

☞ Individual notables vs. Bundy: Logan Morrison is 5-for-15 (.333) with two home runs... Max Kepler is 3-for-8 (.375)...Eduardo Escobar is 3-for-6 (.500).

RODNEY CATCHES AGGIE: Fernando Rodney saved his 318th career game last night, tying former Twin Rick Aguilera for 20th on baseball's all-time list and moving within one of tying former Twin Todd Jones (319) for 19th...next would be Jose Mesa with 321...in fact, among Dominican-born pitchers, he ranks third all-time in saves, trailing only Francisco Cordero (329) and Mesa.

WELCOME LARNACH! Yesterday afternoon the Twins signed their first round pick, outfielder Trevor Larnach (pronounced LAR-nick) from Oregon State University, whom they selected with the 20th overall pick in the First-Year Player Draft...the 21-year-old just completed his junior season at Oregon State University...at 6-foot-4, 210-pounds, Larnach hit .327 (70-for-214) with 13 doubles, 17 home runs and 65 RBI in 58 games for the Beavers this season...in three seasons at OSU he combined to hit .298 (138-for-463) with 30 doubles, 20 home runs and 116 RBI in 146 games...he went on to hit .417 (15-for-36) with five doubles, one triple, one home run, nine RBI and 10 runs scored in eight games during the 2018 College World Series, leading the Beavers to the title...he will report to Rookie-Level Elizabethton of the Appalachian League.

☞ The Twins have also signed fifth round pick RHP Cole Sands, sixth round pick 3B Charlie Mack, and 11th round pick RHP Michael Helman...the Twins have now signed 32 of their 39 drafted players.

FUTURES GAME: Earlier today Major League Baseball announced US and World rosters for the 2018 SiriusXM Futures Game to be played at 3 pm (CT) on Sunday, July 15 at Nationals Park...two minor leaguers will represent the Twins: Single-A Ft. Myers outfielder Alex Kirilloff for Team USA and Double-A Chattanooga left-handed pitcher Lewis Thorpe (Australia) for the World Team...Kirilloff, who was drafted by the Twins 15th overall in the 2016 MLB Draft, has combined to hit .332 (103-for-310) with 22 doubles, six triples, 14 home runs, and 68 RBI in 79 games between Ft. Myers and Low-A Cedar Rapids...Thorpe, who is on the 40-man roster and was originally signed out of Melbourne (AUS) in 2012, has gone 4-4, 5.54 ERA (78.0 IP, 35 ER) with 24 walks and 96 strikeouts in 16 games (15 starts) for the Lookouts.

☞ Other Twins ties at the Futures Game: Torii Hunter will manage the US Team, David Ortiz will manage the World Team, LaTroy Hawkins will serve as pitching coach for the US, Matt LeCroy will serve as bench coach for the US, and former Twins minor leaguer and current Ft. Myers hitting coach Steve Singleton will serve as the US hitting coach.

☞ 12 Twins on the 40-man roster (or disabled list) have played in the Future's Game: Joe Mauer (2003), Zach Duke (2005 - PIT DNP), Jason Castro (2009 - HOU), Logan Morrison (2010 - FLA), Kyle Gibson (2011), Jake Odorizzi (2012 - KC), Miguel Sanó (2013), Byron Buxton (2013), Trevor May (2014 DNP), José Berrios (2014 & '15), Max Kepler (2015), and Adalberto Mejía (2016 - SF).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2014, Glen Perkins and Kurt Suzuki were named to the American League All-Star team as they combined to pitch/catch the ninth inning and secure the 5-3 AL victory...in 2007, Ron Gardenhire earned his 500th career managerial victory with a 20-14 win at Chicago-AL; Torii Hunter had three hits in that game and Joe Mauer had four.
