ONE TIME: The Colorado Rockies face the Cleveland Indians this afternoon at Salt River Fields, their first and only match up of the Spring ... right-handed pitcher Jon Gray will make his third start of the Spring, and will be opposed by right-hander Corey Kluber.

REDLEGS: The Rockies beat the Reds 3-2 yesterday at Salt River Fields after a Sam Hilliard walk-off RBI single ... Kyle Freeland pitched three innings, allowing one run on three hits with two walks and three strikeouts ... infielder Brendan Rodgers went 2-for-4 with one run and one RBI and Rockies reliever Bryan Shaw pitched one scoreless inning.

BREW CREW: Colorado will travel to Maryvale on Saturday to face Milwaukee for their second of four games this Spring ... left-hander Tyler Anderson will make his third start of Spring ...

he will be opposed by left-hander Brent Suter.

SOUND FAMILIAR?: The Rockies have played six consecutive one-run games, going 3-3 over that span ... they have played seven one-run games this Spring and have had 11 games decided by three runs or less, including one tie ... in 2017, the Rockies went 21-14 in one-run games, the second-best record in MLB.

CARRY A BIG STICK: Through 14 games so far this Spring, the Rockies are batting .291 (146-for-502) the third-highest batting average in MLB this Spring ... the Rockies 17 stolen bases are the most in the Cactus League ... Trevor Story is batting .467 (7-for-15) with four doubles, two triples, one home run, three walks and four strikeouts ... DJ LeMahieu is batting .444 (8-for-18) with two doubles ... Ryan McMahon leads the club with 12 hits, including three doubles and one home run ... seven different players lead the club with two home runs.

THE PEN IS MIGHTY: Both Jairo Díaz (3.0 IP, 0 H, 1 BB, 4 SO) and Adam Ottavino (4.0 IP, 2 H, 3 BB, 3 SO) have yet to allow a run this Spring.

TRAINING ROOM: Outfielder Gerardo Parra, who underwent surgery prior to camp to remove the broken hook of the hamate bone in his right hand, has been taking live batting practice this week ... infielder Shawn O'Malley fractured a metacarpal in his left hand last Friday while making a diving play at second base ... infielder Pat Valaika and right-hander Carlos Estévez each have a left oblique strain.

TV ON THE RADIO: AT&T SportsNet will broadcast its next game this Sunday vs. the Dodgers ... KOA NewsRadio 850 AM/94.1 FM returns to the air tomorrow at Milwaukee.

BACKFIELDS: Minor League games will begin on March 15, with Triple-A and Double-A players traveling to Oakland ... the Triple-A and Double-A squads will host Oakland on the Salt River Fields backfields on March 16.

IS IT OPENING DAY YET?: The Rockies will open the regular season March 29 with the first game of a three-game series at Arizona with first pitch set for 7:10 p.m. MT ... the Rockies will play their home opener on Friday, April 6 against the Atlanta Braves to begin a three-game series ... tickets to the home opener are available by purchasing a mini-plan or season ticket package ... for ticket information, call (303) 762-5437 or visit www.rockies.com/tickets.

ON THE BACKFIELD: The Rockies played their first B-game on March 7 and beat the Los Angeles Angels 11-4 ... outfielder Yonathan Daza went 3-for-5 ... catcher Tony Wolters went 2-for-2 with two doubles and two RBI ... outfielder David Dahl went 2-for-4 ... infielder Brian Mundell went 2-for-3 with a home run ... pitcher's lines:

NETTING: The Rockies have begun installation of protective netting behind home plate, replacing the current netting with an upgraded material and extending it at the same height to the end of each dugout ... along with the new netting and scoreboard, the Rockies will also be renovating the stadium speakers, the Wells Fargo Club Level and the home clubhouse.

TODAY'S SCHEDULED ROCKIES PITCHERS

Jon Gray, RHP - #55: Was the Rockies' Opening Day starter in 2017, his first career Opening Day start ... per Fangraphs, ranked fifth in the National League with a 3.18 FIP (Fielding Independent Pitching) ... made three starts to begin the season before being placed on the disabled list on April 14 with a broken bone in his left foot ... allowed three or fewer earned runs in 13 straight starts to end the season, the second-longest single-season streak by a Rockies starter in franchise history ... started the NL Wild Card Game in Arizona ... his 185 strikeouts in 2016 were the most by a rookie in Rockies franchise history ... set a Rockies and Coors Field record with 16 strikeouts in his first career complete-game shutout, Sept. 17, 2016 vs. San Diego ... Colorado's first-round pick (third overall) in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft.

Harrison Musgrave, LHP - #59: Attending his second Major League Spring Training in 2018 ... made a career-low 12 starts in 2017 with two stints on the disabled list with right hip inflammation and a fractured finger on his left hand that ended his season ... his 153.1 innings pitched between Double-A Hartford and Triple-A Albuquerque in 2016 were a career high ... selected in the eighth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.
