NATIONALS NEWS

WINNING WAYS

The Washington Nationals split Saturday's doubleheader with the Cincinnati Reds, dropping the first game, 7-1 before topping them in the night cap, 6-2...With yesterday's split, the Nationals have won seven of their last 10 games...Over the 10-game stretch dating to July 25, Washington has outscored its opponents 74-34... Nationals starting pitchers have worked to a 2.61 ERA (18 ER/62.0 IP) and a .216 opp. AVG over this stretch of games.

SECOND HALF STATUS CHECK

Since returning from the All-Star break, the Nationals rank among National League clubs in slugging percentage (1st, .486), OPS (1st, .853), runs scored (1st, 90), stolen bases (1st, 14), on-base percentage (2nd, .367), home runs (3rd, 20) and batting average (3rd, .279)...Washington hitters have recorded 99 strikeouts since the All-Star break, the fewest in the National League.

JUAN GOOD ROOKIE

Juan Soto recorded multi-hit games in both ends of Saturday's doubleheader, going 4-for-8 with two doubles, one walk and four runs scored...According to *Elias Sports*, Soto was the first teenager with multiple hits in both games of a doubleheader since **H.O.F. Robin Yount** (19) on Sept. 13, 1975 against Boston.

- In 10 games dating to July 25, Soto is 14-for-38 (.368) with three doubles, one triple, three homers, six RBI, nine walks and 14 runs scored...He has struck out just four times over this stretch.
- Soto leads all MLB rookies (min. 270 PA), in batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.423), slugging percentage (.561), and OPS (.984).
- Even though he was called up on May 20, he ranks among National League rookies this season in home runs (2nd, 13), walks (3rd, 44), runs (2nd, 48), doubles (T3rd, 16), RBI (5th, 37) and hits (5th, 72).
- Since May 15 (the first game in his game log, due to the suspended game vs. NYY), Soto ranks among all National League hitters in on-base percentage (3rd, .423), runs scored (5th, 48), batting average (7th, .313), walks (7th, 44), home runs (T10th, 13) and slugging percentage (10th, .561).
- Among all National League hitters (min. 270 PA) in 2018, he ranks in OPS (2nd, .984), on-base percentage (2nd, .423), batting average (5th, .313) and slugging percentage (7th, .561).

THE OPPOSITE OF A DERBY SLUMP

Bryce Harper is hitting .356 (16-for-45) with five doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, 10 walks, three stolen bases and 12 runs scored in 14 games since returning from the All-Star break...He has a .483 on-base percentage, a .667 slugging percentage and 1.172 OPS over this stretch.

- Even before the All-Star break, Harper began to heat up in the form of extra-base hits...Since June 19, he ranks fourth in the National League with 13 doubles and his 20 extra-base hits are tied for ninth.
- Harper clubbed his 26th home run of the season on Thursday night...His 26 home runs are tied for third in the National League, while his 88 walks pace the league.

MURPH IS MASHING

In 19 games dating to July 8, **Daniel Murphy** is 26-for-63 (.413) with a .472 on-base percentage (26 H, 8 BB) and a .635 slugging percentage (5 2B, 3 HR)...He has struck out just six times in 72 plate appearances over this stretch.

- Murphy has hit safely in 12 of his last 14 games, going 18-for-46 (.391) with three doubles, three homers, 13 RBI, four walks and seven runs scored.

TONY IS ON A TEAR

Anthony Rendon has hit safely in 33 of his last 39 games dating back to June 15...Over the stretch he is hitting .325 with a .368 OBP and a .613 SLG...He is tied for sixth in the National League with 25 extra-base hits (14 2B, 3B, 10 HR) and his .613 SLG is good for eighth over this stretch.

- Rendon ranks in the NL in doubles (T6th, 28) and SLG (12th, .519) this season.

BULL-PENNINGS

Since July 9, Washington's bullpen ranks second in the National League and third in Major League Baseball with a 2.76 ERA (19 ER/62.0 IP).

- On the season, Nationals relievers rank in the National League in walks per 9.0 IP (2nd, 2.95), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 2.92), WHIP (3rd, 1.20), and hits per 9.0 IP (4th, 7.86).
- Nationals relievers have allowed just 23.8 percent of inherited runners to score (31-for-130), the second-best mark in the National League and third-best mark in Major League Baseball.

NATIONALS HISTORY

August 5 (5-8 on this date)

2009 – Facing Florida at Nationals Park, **Mike MacDougal** earned his fourth save in as many days to become the first franchise closer to notch four saves in four days since the Expos' **Steve Kline** secured five saves in five days to establish a franchise record from June 1-5, 2000.

IN THE COMMUNITY

August 5: Harris Teeter Food Drive

The Nationals will collect non-perishable food items for the annual Harris Teeter Food Drive outside Center Field Gate on August 4 and 5. Fans who donate at least four items will receive two tickets to a Nationals home game (while supplies last). All items collected benefit the Capital Area Food Bank. Donation collections will begin three hours before first pitch.

OPPONENT

CINCINNATI REDS

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** spent the 1992 season with the Cincinnati Reds, hitting .254 with 20 doubles, five triples, three homers, 31 RBI and 47 runs scored in 135 games...Reds interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed the Nationals from 2009-11.

THE SERIES

The Nationals and Reds will face off seven times in 2018 (3 in CIN, 4 in D.C.)...Since June 5, 2016, Washington has won 15 of the last 17 games against the Reds, outscoring them 141-76 over this stretch.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#57 - TANNER ROARK - RHP

Right-hander is one of MLB's top unheralded pitching performers...Is 55-47 with a 3.57 ERA in 132 career starts...He has eclipsed the 13-win mark in each of his seasons as a full-time starter (2014, 2016-pres)...Since 2014, he ranks third among MLB starting pitchers in hard-hit rate (25.6%), according to FanGraphs.com...Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in 51 of his 132 starts, going 29-11 with a 1.71 ERA in those 51 starts...Helped Team USA bring home the Gold Medal in the 2017 World Baseball Classic...Is stellar with the glove, having committed just two errors in 128 games (632.0 IP) since the start of 2015 - a .984 fielding percentage.

AGAINST THE REDS: Faces the Cincinnati Reds for the eighth time...Is 2-2 with a 3.73 ERA in seven previous starts...Faced them twice in 2017, going 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER/12.0 IP)

LAST START: Continued his run of strong pitching with 7.0 innings of four-hit, one-run ball as the Nationals topped the Mets, 25-4...Relieved as many runs of support (19) as he did in his last eight starts combined...Struck out seven batters without issuing a walk...Lone run came via solo home run in the seventh inning.

2018 NOTES

- Has 23 strikeouts against just three walks in his last three starts combined (20.0 IP)...Is 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA over this stretch.
- Has allowed just one earned run in 15.0 innings spanning his last two starts (0.60 ERA).
- Tossed 17.0 scoreless innings from July 13-31, the longest streak by a National in 2018 and the seventh-longest streak among National League starters this season.
- Has surrendered just three home runs in his last six starts and nine homers in 15 starts dating to May 10...Ranks 12th in the National League with 0.95 home runs per 9.0 IP since May 10.
- Ranks tied for fifth in the National league having induced 14 double plays...His 13 quality starts are tied for sixth in the National League.
- Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in eight of his 21 starts...His eight starts of at least 7.0 IP are fourth-most in the National League.
- Received 35 total runs of support in 15 starts from May 5 to July 25 (3.27 runs of support per game)...Prior to the start on July 31 (19 runs of support), his 4.11 run support average this season was seventh lowest in the National League...Following that start, his 5.21 runs of support was the 11th-highest in the National League.
- Earned his fourth win of the season, his first since June 6 at TBR, on 7/25 at MIL...Struck out a season-high 11 batters while tossing a season-high 8.0 scoreless innings...He gave up just three hits and one walk in the 7-3 victory over MIL.
- Allowed one earned run on seven hits in 6.0 innings of work on June 28 at Philadelphia...Struck out five batters and issued three walks...Was the fewest earned runs allowed in a start since May 26 at Miami.
- He tossed 6.0 IP, giving up three runs on six hits while walking two and striking out five on June 12 at New York (AL)...He completed at least 6.0 IP for the 11th straight start dating to April 13.
- In his 12th start of the season, June 6 vs. Tampa Bay, he collected a career-high two RBI with a single in the bottom of the first inning.
- Appeared out of the bullpen in the final game of the series against Atlanta on June 3.
- Matched a season-high nine strikeouts on May 5 vs. PHI, but was saddled with the loss.
- Struck out a season-high nine batters in 5.0 innings pitched on April 8 vs. New York.
- Opened the season with 7.0 strong innings on April 2 at ATL...Allowed one earned run on four hits while striking out six and walking one as Washington topped Atlanta, 8-1...Right-handed batters went 0-for-6 with one strikeout against him.
