LEADING OFF: *Happy Labor Day!* Angels are 23-23 all-time on the holiday (have won five of last six games on Labor Day)...Angels play the fifth contest (2-2) of a 10-game, 11-day trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (Sept. 3-5) & Chicago White Sox (Sept. 7-9)...LAA has dropped nine of 12 and are 17-23 since the break...Angels are a season-high 18.0 games back in West...Halos have spent last 67 days in fourth place...Club is 17-25 when lefty starts (49-46 vs. RHS)...21 of 24 remaining games are with divisional foes: eight with Texas (6 home, 2 road), six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), four vs. Seattle (all at home) & three at Houston.

DID YOU KNOW? RHP Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Shohei Ohtani)...He is also the 58th player (35th pitcher) to appear for the Angels this season, extending the franchise record.

FAST FACTS: Shohei Ohtani has recorded 63 strikeouts this season, an Angels' record through a pitcher's first 10 career starts (previous was 56 by Bo Belinsky in 1962)...Ohtani is the first player since Babe Ruth in 1919 with 50 IP and 15 HR in a single season

ALBERT UNDERGOES SURGERY: On Thursday Albert Pujols underwent an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee. The surgery was performed by Dr. Neal ElAttrache in Los Angeles. A general timetable to return to playing following this procedure is 6-8 weeks. Updates will be provided when appropriate...Pujols ranks 23rd all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22nd with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez) and 18 RBI shy of becoming one of just three players with 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (Aaron & Rodriguez).

MINOR MENTION: Salt Lake shortstop Luis Rengifro, acquired Feb. 17, 2018 from Tampa Bay (PTBNL) by C.J. Cron, has split time on three minor league levels this season (A+ Inland Empire – 41 G, AA Mobile – 40 G & AAA Salt Lake – 45 G). The Venezuelan prospect has combined to hit .299 (149/498) with 109 runs, 29 doubles, 13 triples, seven home runs, 63 RBI and 41 stolen bases in 126 games played. Rengifro, who bats leadoff for the Bees, boasts a .399 on-base percentage this season.

YOUTH SERVED: In his last seven games, rookie Jaime Barria is 4-1 with a 2.78 ERA (35.2 IP – 11 ER) after going 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP – 20 ER) in previous seven starts...Barria leads MLB rookies with nine wins (min. 10 GS).

SHO OFF: Shohei Ohtani is the 12th rookie in franchise history with 15 HRs, first since Mike Trout in 2012...The 15 HRs are three shy of matching the MLB rookie record by a Japanese native set by Kenji Johjima in 2006 with Seattle (144 games)...In the month of August, he is batting .328 (20/61) with three doubles, six home runs and 18 RBI (1.095 OPS)...Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (STATS)...Just third player in history with 15 HR & four wins in a season joining Jimmy Ryan (1888 White Stockings) & Babe Ruth (1919 Red Sox).

2019 SCHEDULE: MLB announced the 2019 season schedule this week with Angels' highlights including a two-game series (May 4-5) against Houston at Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. Arizona in Hermosillo, Mexico...Angels previously played internationally in San Juan, Puerto Rico for a three-game series with Montreal in 2003...Matching up against the N.L. Central for interleague play, LAA faces St. Louis at Busch Stadium (June 21-23), Albert Pujols' first visit to St. Louis as an opponent.

LOCAL PROSPECT DONE GOOD: LHP Patrick Sandoval (Mission Viejo HS), acquired July 26th in Martin Maldonado trade with Houston, has made six combined starts in Angels' system at Mobile (AA) & Inland Empire (A+) allowing just two earned runs in 29.1 IP (2 R, 2 ER, 14 H, 12 BB, 42 K)...All told, he is 11-1 with two saves and a 2.07 ERA (117.1 IP – 27 ER; 27 BB, 139 K) in 25 games (19 starts) this season.

THE NEW ME: In 64 games in return from D.L., Kole Calhoun is batting .285 (67/235) with 48 runs, 14 doubles, a triple, 17 home runs and 43 RBI (hit .145 with 1 HR and 11 RBI over first 50 games)...Calhoun's 17 HRs since June 18th rank tied for second in A.L.

HI, MY NAME IS... 58 players (35 pitchers, 14 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...14 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

TROUT TRIFECTA: With an MLB-leading 107 walks, Trout is the first player in MLB history with three seasons of 25 home runs, 20 stolen bases and 100 walks by age-26 season-or-younger...Joins Jeff Bagwell (3), Bobby Abreu (3) & Barry Bonds (7) as only players with at least three such seasons in career.

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons is tied for MLB lead among shortstops with 199 putouts and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 92 defensive runs saved (DFS) also lead MLB...Thru 905 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 24.7 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.

GLOVE STORY: With 67 errors committed this season, Angels are on pace to break the club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .986 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 147 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 41.2 caught stealing pct. (28 of 65), tops in A.L. (STATS)...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.

BULLPEN BITS: 3.74 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.0% to score (49 of 223)...Bullpen has logged 522 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 195 games pitched lead A.L. (162.1 IP)...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez and Blake Parker are tied for A.L. lead with 131 games pitched apiece.

THIS N' THAT: Andrelton Simmons celebrates his 29th birthday tomorrow (9/4)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Shohei Ohtani is batting .316 (6/19) with four runs, a double, two home runs and four RBI as a pinch hitter this season - tied for A.L. lead among pinch hitters with 13 total bases (D. Palka, CWS)...Halos are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+23)...Angels' 177 HRs hit rank sixth in A.L...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.09 (513 PA/34 K) - also ranks second in MLB batting .292 (47/161) with two strikes...Francisco Arcia's 13 RBI thru his first four career home starts (July 26-Aug. 12) set an MLB record...Mike Scioscia (1,636 wins) ranks 18th on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769).

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout & Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 season-or-younger (Trout is only player in A.L. history)...Trout turned age 27 on August 7th...His 62.1 career WAR is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (Ty Cobb, 63.4).

HOT HALOS: Over his last four starts, Felix Pena has posted a 2.88 ERA (25 IP – 8 ER)...In his last five games, Andrelton Simmons is 8 for 21 with a double, HR and five RBI...He logged 18 RBI in 26 games in August...David Fletcher has a hit in 15 of last 19 games (seven multi-hit efforts) and is batting .312 (24/77) with four doubles and nine runs scored in span...Jose Alvarez has not been scored upon in 15 of last 17 outings (1.17 ERA; 15.1 IP – 2 ER)...Mike Trout has successfully reached base in 19 of his last 20 games with 17 runs, six home runs, 13 RBI and 23 walks in that span.

@ TEXAS: Halos have eight games remaining with Texas (six at home road)...Angels are 27-18 in Arlington since 2014...Halos lead 2018 series 6-4 (4-3 on road)...Calhoun is batting .319 (59/185) with 8 HR & 34 RBI in 46 career games at Globe Life.

WHITE SOX ON DECK: 2018 season series is tied at 2-2...LAA has won 16 of last 19 meetings at home but have dropped nine of last 12 in Chicago...Angels are 34-20 overall vs. CWS since 2011.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP MATT SHOEMAKER

1-0, 4.76 ERA

First start for Angels since March 31 at Oakland

- **WELCOME BACK SHOE:** Reinstated from disabled list prior to tonight's game...Making second start of the season (both on the road)...First start for Angels since March 31 at Oakland.
- **INJURY WOES:** Was placed on disabled list after season debut (March 31 at OAK) with a right forearm strain (missed 134 games)...Last season, exited start vs. Yankees on June 14, 2017 with a right forearm strain and missed remainder of year on DL...In 2016, missed final month of the season after being struck on right side of head by a line drive off bat of Seattle's **Kyle Seager** on Sept. 4 at Safeco Field.
- **LAST TIME OUT (for Angels):** Did not factor in decision in season debut on March 31 at Oakland...Carried a shutout into the sixth inning before yielding three runs in the 6th frame...Was placed on DL following the start.
- **REHAB START:** Made one rehab appearance with Adv.-A Inland Empire on Wednesday vs. Lake Elsinore and pitched 4+ no-hit innings, allowing one run (unearned) with two walks and six strikeouts.
- **GOOD NIGHT SHOE:** Has a career record of 34-19 with a 3.71 ERA (412 IP – 170 ER) in night games, compared with a 5-11 record and 4.51 ERA (107.2 IP – 54 ER) in day games...Last season, was 6-0 with a 3.56 ERA (55.2 IP – 22 ER) in night games, compared with a 0-3 record and 6.95 ERA (22 IP – 17 ER) in day games.
- **TALE OF TWO HALVES:** Owns a 4.57 career ERA (335 IP – 170 ER) in the first half of the season, compared with a 2.63 ERA (184.2 IP – 54 ER) after the All-Star Break...Tonight marks his first start after the All-Star Brea since Sept. 4, 2016 in Seattle.
- **VS. TEXAS:** Tonight marks first start vs. Texas since April 30, 2016...In six career games (all starts) against the Rangers, is 4-2 with a 5.68 ERA (31.2 IP – 13 ER)...Has recorded 24 strikeouts while walking seven batters...Earned wins in each of first four starts vs. Rangers, but has taken the loss in his last two contests...Joined **Tom Murphy** (1968-69) are only Angels to win each of first four career starts vs. Rangers.
- **AT GLOBE LIFE PARK:** In four career starts at Globe Life Park, is 3-1 with a 5.57 ERA (21 IP – 7 ER)...Has recorded 16 strikeouts while walking two...Won his first three starts at the ballpark, but took loss in last appearance on April 30, 2016 after allowing seven earned runs in 2.1 innings pitched.
- **2017 RECAP:** In 14 starts for the Angels last season, went 6-3 with a 4.52 ERA (77.2 IP – 39 ER)...Led Angels pitching staff with 69 strikeouts at the time of season ending injury (June 14)...In last seven starts, was 5-1 with a 3.86 ERA (39.2 IP – 17 ER), before suffering the right forearm strain in final start against the Yankees...Yielded 15 home runs last year across his 14 starts...24 of 41 runs allowed scored via HR.
- **HOME COOKING:** In last 16 home starts, is 9-2 with a 2.78 ERA (103.2 IP – 32 ER) with 111 strikeouts...In that span (since May 21, 2016), ranks third in A.L. in home ERA (min. 15 GS) behind **Corey Kluber** (2.18) and **Blake Snell** (2.41).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Owns a 38-30 record and 3.88 ERA (519.2 IP – 224 ER) with 461 strikeouts in 95 games (87 starts) across parts of six seasons for Angels...Has made Angels Opening Day roster each of last five years.

LHP ANDREW HEANEY (8-8, 4.09 ERA)

Making 26th start of the season and 14th on the road...Second start of 2018 vs. Texas...Earned the win in last start on Thursday at Houston after tossing six scoreless innings and allowing five hits and one walk with six strikeouts...In five career starts vs. Rangers, is 1-2 with a 7.88 ERA (24 IP – 21 ER)...Did not factor in decision in first start of year vs. Rangers on Aug. 18 at Globe Life Park, after pitching 5.1 innings and allowing six earned runs on a season-high 10 hits with two walks and five strikeouts...Is seeking first winning decision vs. Texas since July 26, 2015...In three starts at Globe Life Park, is 0-3 with a 10.38 ERA (13 IP – 15 ER); highest ERA of any ballpark (min. 2 GS).

#49 MIGUEL ALMONTE (RHP) AGE: 25

- Pitched one perfect inning last night in first appearance since being recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on Saturday for second stint of season with Angels...Appeared in one game during first stint with the club.
- Made Angels debut on July 5 at SEA (1 IP, 2 H, 2 ER, 1 SO).
- Began season on minor league disabled list (shoulder)...Made one rehab appearance with AZL Angels on June 18 (one scoreless inning).
- In 25 games for Triple-A Salt Lake this season, was 1-1 with a 10.18 ERA (20.1 IP – 23 ER) and 22 strikeouts...In 19 games during last stint with Bees, was 0-1 with a 12.50 ERA (15 IP – 21 ER).
- Made Major League debut with Royals on Sept. 1, 2015 vs. DET...Has appeared in 11 total Major League games in career – all with KC (Nine games in 2015 and two games in 2017)...With Royals, went 0-2 with a 7.59 ERA (10.2 IP – 9 ER).
- Acquired by Angels on April 4, 2018 for cash considerations.

#48 JOSÉ ÁLVAREZ (LHP) AGE: 29

- Did not pitch during last series at Houston...Currently on five days of rest, which matches longest span without pitching all season.
- Earned fifth win of season on Aug. 15 at San Diego; sets new career-high in wins
- **67 appearances are tied for second most in Major Leagues this season.**
- Has stranded 39 of 45 inherited runners this season...45 IR are the most in the Majors...86.7% stranded rate is third best in Majors.
- Retired first batter faced in 53 of 67 outings the year.
- Has allowed seven ER against the Astros this year (5 games; 2 IP) and 10 ER against all other opponents (54.1 IP).
- 48 appearances before the All-Star Break are an Angels record.
- Matched season high with three strikeouts on May 27 at Yankee Stadium.

#38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP) AGE: 25

- Has not allowed a run in 10 of last 12 outings.
- Charged with loss Aug. 16, at TEX after allowing season-high four earned runs.
- Struck out all four batters faced on 8/10 vs. OAK...First Angels pitcher to do so (min. 4 BF) since Cory Rasmus (4 BF – 4 SO) on Oct. 4, 2015 at TEX.
- Earned third win of season Aug. 3 at Cleveland after working one perfect inning.
- Matched season-high with 1.2 scoreless innings on July 29 vs. Mariners.
- Stranded 19 of 22 inherited runners this season.
- Made 34 first half appearances, going 2-2 with four saves, a 3.38 ERA (34.2 IP – 13 ER) and 45 strikeouts.
- Had streak of nine straight scoreless outings (9.1 IP) snapped June 6 vs. KC.

#32 CAM BEDROSIAN (RHP) AGE: 26

- Charged with loss and blown save Saturday night in first appearance of road trip.
- Recorded fifth win of the season on Aug. 18 at Texas
- In 18 games from June 1 – July 11, pitched to a 0.49 ERA (18.1 IP – 1 ER).
- *Has not been charged with an earned run in 39 of last 48 appearances.*
- Has stranded 18 of 24 inherited runners this season.
- 46 pre-All-Star Break games are an Angels record for a righty.
- Had streak of 12 straight appearances without allowing an earned run from June 15 – July 11.
- Earned wins in consecutive appearances June 4 & 6 vs. Royals.
- Earned first save of the season on April 24 at HOU with 1.1 scoreless innings... Third career 4+ out save.
- Pitched season-high 1.2 scoreless on April 20 vs. Giants.
