EARLY LEAD EVAPORATES

--Kansas City lost the series opener, 10-6, here last night, despite sending 11 men to the plate in a six-run top of the third...Heath Fillmyer allowed a career high-tying six runs in just 2.1 innings, but got the no-decision, leaving with the game tied at 6-6...it took five Royals relievers to complete the remaining 5.1 innings, including 1.1 innings of three-run (2 ER) ball from Glenn Sparkman, who took his third loss...Salvador Perez—making his first start in 10 days due to a sprained thumb—drove in half the Royals' runs on a three-run homer in the third, and Jorge Bonifacio reached safely four times, including three hits...Alex Gordon also drove in a pair of runs in the third inning with a double, his third-straight game with an extra-bas hit...the Royals have lost three straight on the heels of a season-high six-game win streak.

MORE ABOUT LAST NIGHT'S BIG INNING

--The Royals sent 11 men to the plate in last night's six-run third inning, marking the fourth time they've scored at least six runs in a single frame this season...eight consecutive batters reached for the first time since May 8 in Baltimore, when the game's first eight batters reached in the Royals' 10-run first inning...the offensive explosion forced Twins starter Stephen Gonsalves from the game after 2.1 innings, but Minnesota's four-run bottom half ended Fillmyer's night after 2.1 innings as well...last night marked just the fourth Major League game this season in which both starting pitchers lasted no longer than 2.1 innings...it happened just three times last year, with the most two recent involving Kansas City on June 4, 2017 vs. Cleveland and Sept. 5, 2017 at Detroit, meaning

three of the last six such games in the Majors dating back to last season have included the Royals.

GOOD EYE, BLUE!

--After setting a club record with 41 strikeouts during the three-game series in Cleveland earlier this week, Royals batters struck out just six times last night and coaxed seven walks, one more than they had in their previous four games combined...last night was the third time this season the offense tallied more walks than strikeouts in a game, also doing it on July 21 vs. Minnesota (9 walks, 7 strikeouts) and April 22 at Detroit (8 walks, 7 strikeouts)...despite the high strikeout totals in Cleveland earlier this week, only six teams have fewer strikeouts than the Royals this season, but only two teams—the Tigers and Mariners—have fewer walks.

SALVY ON TARGET

--Making his first start in 10 days last night due to a sprained thumb, Salvador Perez returned to the lineup and drove in half of the Royals' runs on one swing, a three-run homer in their six-run third inning...the roundtripper was the 20th of his career vs. Minnesota—his most vs. any opponent—and his 17th HR in 62 career games at Target Field, most among visiting players ahead of Edwin Encarnacion (15 HR), Carlos Santana (14 HR) and Jose Bautista (14 HR).

TWO-WEEK TREND CONTINUES

--Including last night's 10-hit performance, Kansas City leads the Majors with a .291 batting average and .535 slugging percentage since Aug. 24, a stretch in which it's gone 8-4...the Royals' 21 homers in 12 games rank third in the American League during that stretch, trailing only the Yankees' 28 and Oakland's 22...they've scored 5.8 runs per game during this time, and in their eight wins, have outscored opponents 55-17, an average difference of 4.8 runs per game.

ROOKIE RUNDOWN

--Four of the six Royals pitchers last night were rookies, accounting for 6.1 of 8.0 innings...Royals rookies have accounted for 463.1 of the club's 1231.1 innings this season (37.6%), ranking them third in the Majors, trailing only Tampa Bay (497.2 IP) and Miami (495.2 IP).

JORGE LÓPEZ makes his fifth start with the Royals and 15th Major League appearance of the season, the first 10 of which came with Milwaukee...it's his seventh career start (18th appearance)...he's facing Minnesota for the first time...he was acquired by the Royals on July 28, along with outfielder Brett Phillips, from Milwaukee for infielder Mike Moustakas...López was originally selected by Milwaukee in the second round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

CAREER DAY VS. BALTIMORE

--Jorge earned his first win in 1,069 days—since his Major League debut on Sept. 29, 2015 with Milwaukee—with a 9-1 victory vs. Baltimore last Sunday...he held the Orioles to one run on five hits and no walks in a career-high 7.0 innings, with a career-high eight strikeouts...he surrendered a two-out HR to former teammate, Jonathan Villar, in the first, but scattered four hits over the next 6.0 innings...the win clinched the Royals' third sweep of at least two games this season and was the fifth of a season-high six-game winning streak.

REMARKABLE ROOKIES

--López's start on Sunday was the third straight game in which a Royals rookie pitched at least 7.0 innings and allowed two runs or fewer, joining Brad Keller (Aug. 31) and Heath Fillmyer (Sept. 1)...according to Elias, this was the first time in Royals history that rookie teammates did that in three consecutive games, and was the first time it's been done in the Majors since Oakland's Tommy Milone, Travis Blackley and Jarrod Parker turned the trick from June 25-27, 2012...Royals rookies have accounted for 463.1 of the club's 1231.1 innings this season (37.6%), most in the American League and third in the Majors, trailing only Tampa Bay (497.2 IP) and Miami (495.2 IP).

WITH MILWAUKEE

--Jorge was recalled by Milwaukee seven times this season before being acquired by Kansas City on July 28...he made 10 relief appearances over those big league stints, eight of which were at least 2.0 innings...after posting a 5.14 ERA (4 ER in 7.0 IP) in his first three outings, he pitched to a 1.42 ERA (2 ER in 12.2 IP) over his last seven, including 3.0 perfect innings on just 21 pitches in his last appearance with the Brewers on July 25 vs. Washington.

WITH OMAHA

--After being acquired by Kansas City on July 28, López made a pair starts with Triple-A Omaha before his recall on August 15...his first start with the Storm Chasers, Aug. 1 vs. Las Vegas, was his first since June 17, 2017 (Game 2) with Double-A Biloxi...in his Omaha debut, he allowed four runs on five hits and four strikeouts in 3.1 innings in a no-decision...on Aug. 7, he earned a 5-0 win over Salt Lake, tossing 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing three hits and one walk, with seven strikeouts...he was 3-3 with five saves and a 5.65 ERA (18 ER in 28.2 IP) in 24 relief outings with Colorado Springs before the trade.

ON THE ROAD

--Only four of his 14 Major League appearances this season have come on the road, where he's 0-2 despite a 2.08 ERA (2 ER in 8.2 IP)...in his only road outing with Kansas City on Aug. 20 in St. Petersburg, Jorge suffered a 1-0 loss after holding the Rays to one run on five hits and three walks over 5.0 innings...his only career road win came on Sept. 29, 2015 at San Diego (with Milwaukee), where he allowed three runs over 5.0 innings in his Major League debut.

Hitting Notes

- Jorge Bonifacio** *This Series: 3-for-4, run, RBI, BB* *This Trip: 4-for-14 (.286), 2 runs, HR, 3 RBI, BB* *Hit Streak: 1 g (3-4)*
 ● Jorge matched a season-high with three hits last night, giving KC a temporary lead with an RBI single in the third...it marked his second three-hit game of the season, also doing it on Aug. 19 at guaranteed Rate Field...it was also his sixth multi-hit effort in his last 15 games, in which he's slashing .346/.407/.462 (18-for-52).
 ● Boni hit his second home run of the season Monday in Cleveland, a solo shot off Adam Plutko...it was his first roundtripper since July 14 in Chicago.
 ● He was reinstated on June 28 after missing the first 80 games for violating MLB's Drug Prevention and Treatment policy, and has started 48 of 60 games since.
- Hunter Dozier** *This Series: 1-for-4, run, BB* *This Trip: 5-for-16 (.313), 3 runs, 2 2B, HR, 2 RBI, BB* *Hit Streak: 1 g (1-4)*
 ● Hunter went 1-for-4 last night and also drew a walk and scored as part of KC's six-run third inning...he's hit in eight of his last nine games, while he has 11 extra-base hits in his last 14 contests, in which he has a .722 slugging percentage...ranks ninth among AL rookies with 27 extra-base hits this season.
 ● Since Aug. 1, Dozier is slashing .290/.327/.510 (29-for-100), after batting .207/.268/.342 (40-for-193) through his first 57 contests (through July 31).
 ● Hit his first career walk-off homer vs. Indians on Aug. 24...it was the second of back-to-back solo shots (Ryan O'Hearn), becoming the first rookie duo to hit back-to-back HR in the ninth or later to win a game (*Elias*)...he's the first KC rookie to hit a walk-off HR since Paulo Orlando on July 7, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay (Game 1).
 ● Dozier has started in 78 of the Royals' 100 games since his May 14 recall, including starts at: first base (44), third base (25), designated hitter (7) and right field (2)...after starting at first, DH or right in each of his first 39 starts, 25 of his last 39 have come at third, where he made 308 starts during his minor league career.
- Alcides Escobar** *This Series: 1-for-3, sac* *This Trip: 4-for-14 (.286), SB, sac* *Hit Streak: 1 g (1-3)*
 ● Esky collected an infield single in the third and also recorded a sacrifice in the fifth last night...he's batting .353/.382/.451 (18-for-51) over his last 15 contests (since Aug. 14)...recorded his seventh sacrifice last night, tying him for third most in the AL...his 78 sacrifices since 2011 are the most in the Major Leagues.
 ● He's a career .299/.330/.391 hitter (85-for-284) here at Target Field...that includes hitting .308 (52-for-169) with 12 doubles and three triples here since 2014.
 ● Alcides started a club-record 421 consecutive games from Sept. 26, 2015 to July 7, 2018, the longest streak in the Majors, according to *Elias*, since Miguel Tejada (558) from 2004-07...the first 407 of those 421 were at shortstop, the longest streak since Cal Ripken Jr. started in 2,216 straight at shortstop from 1982-96...he's started in 38 of 52 team games since the streak was snapped on July 9, including starts at shortstop (23), third base (12), center field (2) and second base (1).
- Cam Gallagher** *This Series: 0-for-1* *This Trip: 1-for-9* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-8)*
 ● Cam made his second start as the designated hitter last night, but flew out in his only plate appearance...clubbed the second homer of his career on Aug. 31, a solo shot off Baltimore's Andrew Cashner, after being recalled earlier in the day...it marked his first homer since his grand slam in Oakland on Aug. 14, 2017.
 ● Gallagher hit .265/.334/.358 (71-for-268) with a career-high 42 RBI in 77 games with Omaha, after batting .208 (5-for-24) in eight games in April with the Royals.
- Brian Goodwin** *This Series: Has not played* *This Trip: 1-for-9, run, BB, HBP* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-7)*
 ● Brian didn't play in last night's series opener, after starting all three games in Cleveland...he's slashing .353/.405/.500 (12-for-34) in 10 games with KC.
 ● He was reinstated from the 10-day DL (left groin strain) a week ago, and collected a season-high three hits last Saturday vs. the O's, going 3-for-4.
 ● Goodwin was acquired from Washington on July 22 for RHP Jacob Condra-Bogan...overall this season, he's hitting .333 (9-for-27) with RISP.
 ● He played in 48 games with the Nats but made just nine starts, and none since June 17...he missed 38 games from April 17-May 30 with a left wrist contusion.
- Alex Gordon** *This Series: 1-for-4, run, 2B, 2 RBI, BB* *This Trip: 3-for-17 (.176), 3 runs, 2 2B, HR, 3 RBI, BB* *Hit Streak: 3 g (3-12)*
 ● Alex tied the game in the third inning last night with a two-run double in the third, going 1-for-4...he's collected an extra-base hit in each of his last three games and has nine XBH since Aug. 18 (.500 SLG)...his 30 extra-base hits (19 doubles, 11 homers) this season are one fewer than he had in 148 games last season.
 ● Gordon is batting .407/.484/.593 (11-for-27) in seven games at Target Field this year...he's a career .310/.399/.472 hitter (77-for-248) at this park.
 ● Gordo's 171 career homers are fourth-most in franchise history, behind George Brett (317), Mike Sweeney (197) and Amos Otis (193).
 ● He has nine outfield assists, his most since recording 17 in 2013...he's two behind Boston's Andrew Benintendi (11) for the AL lead...while his 91 career outfield assists are the most in the Majors since becoming a full-time outfielder in 2010, two more than Gerardo Parra (89), who ranks second.
 ● He's been hit-by-pitch seven times this season (none since July 4), extending his Royals record to 96, which also ranks 12th among active Major Leaguers.
- Rosell Herrera** *This Series: 1-for-3, 2B, 2 BB* *This Trip: 1-for-6, 2B, 2 BB* *Hit Streak: 1 g (1-3)*
 ● Rosell doubled and drew a pair of walks last night...his fifth-inning double was just his second extra-base hit in his last 26 games (since Aug. 2).
 ● He's started 54 of the Royals' 70 games since his June 17 recall, including starts in: right field (25), center field (11), at second base (9), third base (5) and DH (4).
 ● Herrera was claimed off waivers from Cincinnati on June 2...made his big league debut with the Reds on April 26 and played in 11 games with the Reds.
- Whit Merrifield** *This Series: 1-for-5, run* *This Trip: 1-for-18 (.056), run* *Hit Streak: 1 g (1-5)*
 ● Whit snapped an 0-for-16 drought, starting the third inning with a one-out single last night...he's reached base in 17 of 18 career games at Target Field, slashing .351/.407/.473 (26-for-74) here 14 runs scored...that includes reaching in all seven games here this season, in which he's batting .414 (12-for-29).
 ● He's tied for the American League lead with 30 steals this season, after leading the league with 34 a year ago...he's recorded 13 thefts since the All-Star break, which are tied for most in the Majors in that span...swiped third base a MLB-best 11 times this season, while his 20 career steals of third are second in MLB since 2016.
 ● Became the fourth Royal with consecutive 10-HR, 30-SB seasons, joining Johnny Damon (1999-2000), Carlos Beltran (2001-03) and Amos Otis (twice).
 ● Ranks fourth in the Junior Circuit in hits (163), tied for fifth in multi-hit games (47), sixth in batting average (.303) and tied for 10th doubles (36).
 ● Since June 27, Merrifield has collected the second-most hits in the Majors, one behind Christian Yelich (83)...ranked third in MLB with 94 hits after the break a year ago...he's the only player with at least 60 doubles (68) and 60 stolen bases (64, most in the American League) over the last two seasons.
 ● His .325 average (37-for-114) in the first inning ranks fifth in the AL (min. 100 plate appearances), while his .389 on-base percentage is sixth...however, he hasn't recorded a first-inning hit since last Saturday, when he led off the bottom of the first with a single off Dylan Bundy.
 ● He has started 135 of the Royals' 140 games, including starts at: second base (93), center field (21), right field (7), DH (8), first base (5) and left field (1).
- Adalberto Mondesi** *This Series: 1-for-4, run, BB* *This Trip: 3-for-11, 2 runs, 2B, BB, HBP* *Hit Streak: 1 g (1-4)*
 ● Adalberto reached in his first two plate appearances last night, singling in the first and drawing a walk in the third...he's slashing .367/.424/.667 (11-for-30) with seven runs scored in his last eight games, which includes five multi-hit contests...he's also batting .326/.356/.581 (14-for-43) when leading off an inning.
 ● He's recorded 18 steals in just 53 games, after being recalled on June 17...his 13 thefts since the All-Star break are tied for most in the Majors.

 ● In his last 14 games, he's batting .327/.411/.755 (16-for-49) with 10 extra-base hits and 13 RBI...that includes a career-high four RBI vs. the O's on Aug. 31.
 ● Ryan is the first player in club history with 9+ homers and 20+ RBI within his first 24 games, after hitting No. 8 and No. 9 on Monday in Cleveland.
 ● Hit first of back-to-back homers with Hunter Dozier to walk off the Tribe on Aug. 24, becoming the first rookie duo in MLB history with back-to-back, game-ending HR...also homered in his first big league game on July 31, becoming the third Royal to do so, joining Clint Hurdle (1977) & Mark Quinn (1999).

 ● Salvy highlighted KC's six-run third inning last night, connecting for a three-run shot to cap the scoring...it marked his 24th home run of the season—three shy of his career-best total (27) from last year...he's hit 13 roundtrippers since July 11, ranking him third in the AL in that span, behind Khris Davis (19) and Joey Gallo (14).
 ● Last night marked Perez's first start since Aug. 28, after missing seven games with a sprained left thumb.
 ● He's hit 17 homers in his career at Target Field, tops among visiting players...he's clubbed 20 career homers vs. the Twins, his tops against any opponent...among players with at least 200 plate appearances here, Salvy's .338 career average (81-for-240) is third-highest, behind Victor Martinez (.356) and Miguel Cabrera (.340).
 ● He's thrown out 22 of 45 would-be base stealers (48.9%)—including 11 of 18 since the All-Star break—ranking second in the Majors to Jonathan Lucroy (23).
 ● Salvy is the fifth Royal with at least four straight 20-HR seasons, joining: John Mayberry (1972-75), Steve Balboni (1984-87), Bo Jackson (1987-90) and Mike Sweeney (1999-2002)...he's the ninth catcher all-time—six of which are in the Hall of Fame—with four 20-HR seasons (consecutive or not) before turning 29, joining: Johnny Bench (7), Brian McCann (6), Yogi Berra (5), Gary Carter (5), Mike Piazza (5), Lance Parrish (4), Iván Rodríguez (4) & Joe Torre (4).

This & That

ROAD MAP--This weekend's series marks the end of Kansas City's penultimate road trip of 2018...following Sunday's finale, it will host Chicago for three games starting Monday, then welcome these Twins to town for a four-game set...the final trip of 2018, a nine-game, 10-day journey, will see Interleague visits to Pittsburgh (3 games) and Cincinnati (2), sandwiched around a four-game set with Detroit...the Royals are 21-49 (.300) away from home, including 2-13 in their last 15.

LEXINGTON ADVANCES TO CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES--The Lexington Legends, Kansas City's Class-A affiliate, won Game 2 of the South Atlantic League best-of-three semifinals last night 6-0 in Rome, to clinch the Southern Division championship and advance to the Championship Series for the first time since 2001...Daniel Lynch, the Royals' third pick (34th overall) in June's First-Year Player Draft, recorded 4.0 scoreless innings, ahead of 5.0 scoreless innings from three Lexington relievers, which was more than enough to support the nine-hit offensive attack, led by multi-hit efforts from Brewer Hicklen, Kyle Isbel and Manny Olloque...Lexington will host Game 1 of a best-of-five Championship Series starting Monday night vs. Philadelphia's affiliate, the Lakewood BlueClaws.

CLONEY EARNS PIONEER LEAGUE HONORS--Right-handed pitcher J.C. Cloney was named the Pioneer League Pitcher of the Year on Wednesday, becoming the first Royals prospect to earn the honor since Sam Selman in 2012...Cloney, 24, won each of his starts with Idaho Falls, going 9-0 with a 1.93 ERA (12 ER in 56 IP), 50 strikeouts (8.0 K/9) and just 10 walks (1.6 K/9)...four of his nine starts were scoreless, including a career-high-tying 7.0 innings on June 27 vs. Grand Junction...Cloney was promoted to Lexington last month, and went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA (9 ER in 29.2 IP) in five starts, helping the Legends clinch the second half South Atlantic League Southern Division title...Cloney, a ninth-round pick in 2017, is now 15-2 in 26 career appearances (21 starts).

YOUNG GUNS--Heath Fillmyer last night extended the Royals' streak of starting pitchers under 30 to 49 consecutive games, the club's longest such streak since May 27-Aug. 23, 2008, when they went 78 straight games...the Royals haven't started a pitcher over 30 since July 10, when Ian Kennedy worked 3.0 innings here, before being placed on the 10-day DL the following day...this run includes 10 starts by Brad Keller (23), nine by Danny Duffy (29), Jakob Junis (25) and Fillmyer (24), six by Burch Smith (28), four by Jorge López (25) and two by Glenn Sparkman (26).

RARE MISS FOR DUPER--Kansas City's replay guru, Bill Duplissee, suffered a rare miss last night when he challenged the safe call at first base on Ehire Adriana in the seventh inning...the call stood, meaning Kansas City is still the only club not to have a challenge come back "confirmed" this season, with all 37 challenged either being overturned or coming back as stands...still the best in the business, Duplissee has a Major League-best 29 overturned calls this year based on numbers released by Major League baseball yesterday, two more than Philadelphia's 27...Duper has overturned 78.4% of the plays he's asked to be reviewed this year (29-for-37), which leads the Majors, just ahead of the second-place Giants, who are 22-for-29 (75.9%)...Dupe has made good on 68.1% of his challenges in his career (128-for-188), including a Major League best 72.3% success rate over the last three seasons (81-for-112).

GORDO AMONG THE ASSIST LEADERS--Alex Gordon hasn't been tested since Aug. 13, when he proved once again why he's a five-time Rawlings Gold Glove winner, throwing out Toronto's Russell Martin at the plate...it was Alex's ninth outfield assist of the season, two behind Andrew Benintendi for the American League lead, and his most since 2013, when his 17 assists matched Gerardo Parra for most among Major League outfielders...since becoming a full-time outfielder in 2010, Gordo's 91 assists are the most in baseball, two ahead of Parra (89), who ranks second in that span...his career total is the second-highest in franchise history, trailing only Amos Otis, who had 116 between 1970-83.

MLB TO OBSERVE SEPTEMBER 11--Major League Baseball and all 30 Clubs will conduct 9/11 commemorations throughout the league on Tuesday, Sept. 11 as part of Baseball's ongoing effort to honor and remember those whose lives were affected or lost on that tragic day...home Clubs will recognize the day with a moment of silence and pregame ceremonies with many teams honoring first responders and public service personnel...a "We Shall Not Forget" silhouetted batter ribbon will be displayed throughout ballparks and on special line-up cards and base jewels...on-field personnel including players, coaches and umpires will wear caps with a side patch of the ribbon during games...Major League Baseball will donate all of its royalties from the sales of the caps to the National Sept. 11 Memorial & Museum, the Pentagon Memorial Fund and the Flight 93 National Memorial.

DUFFY IS KANSAS CITY'S CLEMENTE NOMINEE--The 30 Club nominees for the 2018 Roberto Clemente Award were announced on Tuesday by Major League Baseball, and Kansas City's nominee is left-handed pitcher Danny Duffy...the Roberto Clemente Award is the annual recognition of a player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field...in 2018, the 29-year old Duffy has donated \$1,000 per strikeout to Noah's Bandage Project, a local foundation that provides fun bandages to kids and raises money to fight childhood cancer...from 2016-17, he pledged \$159,000 (\$500 per strikeout), before upping the ante this season, which has reached \$141,000 through 28 starts...the foundation is named for Noah Wilson, who lost a battle with bone cancer in 2015.

ROYALS GREATS TO PARTICIPATE IN USO TOUR--Royals greats George Brett, Mike Sweeney, Bret Saberhagen and Reggie Sanders will visit American troops at four locations in the Middle East next week in partnership with USO and FSKC...the USO trip will coincide with the Royals' annual Armed Forces Night at Kauffman Stadium and FSKC's *This One's For You* telecast on Tuesday, Sept. 11 vs. the White Sox...the Royals greats will watch the Sept. 11 telecast on the Armed Forces Network alongside members of the Missouri National Guard's 35th Combat Aviation Brigade, which is headquartered in Sedalia, Mo...FSKC host/reporter Joel Goldberg will be part of the trip and anchor coverage of FSKC's annual *This One's For You* telecast that night, which will connect live with troops and Royals greats.

KC'S TOP SKIPPER--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost recorded his 1,100th career win on May 18 vs. the Yankees and has since upped that career total to 1,132, which is good for seventh among active skippers, while Detroit's Ron Gardenhire is next in the eighth spot with 1,126 career wins...Yost is 675-726 in the regular season with the Royals, blowing past Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...he's the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and is sixth among active managers in games (2,360), which ranks 42nd all-time and just three behind Mike Hargrove's 2,363 for 41st...Yost's postseason winning percentage of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons.
