MISC HONORS/FEATS:

INDIANAPOLIS: **Tyler Glasnow** was named the MLB Pipeline.com Pitcher-of-the-Year for the second time in three years (also 2014).

ALTOONA: **Austin Meadows** established an Altoona record by hitting safely in 24 consecutive games before being promoted to Indianapolis on June 18...**Jared Lakind** set an Altoona club record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched in a single season with 25.1 frames between May 5-June 23...**Barrett Barnes** was named the Eastern League Player-of-the-Month for August.

BRADENTON: **Brandon Waddell** was named the Florida State League Player-of-the-Month for April after going 4-0 with a 0.93 ERA in five starts. He allowed just 13 hits and two walks while striking out 26 batters over 29.0 innings and did not allow more than three hits in any of his five starts.

WEST VIRGINIA POWER: **Mitch Keller** was named the South Atlantic League Player-of-the-Month for April after going 2-1 with a 0.86 ERA in four April starts. He allowed just 12 hits, walked one and struck out 28 while holding opponents to a .167 batting average and one extra-base hit over 21.0 innings...**Carlos Munoz** knocked in seven runs in West Virginia's 19-7 win on 6/1 (the 19 runs were the most for the Power since their affiliation with the Pirates began in 2009)...**Mitch Keller** was the starter and winner for the North Division in the South Atlantic League All-Star Game on June 21. Keller was also named the South Atlantic League's "Most Outstanding Pitcher" and "Best Right-handed Pitcher" at the conclusion of the season...**Danny Arribas** started at first base in the All-Star Game and went 2-for-3.

WEST VIRGINIA BLACK BEARS: Pittsburgh's 2016 first round pick **Will Craig** produced the New York-Penn League's longest hitting streak (17 games) and on-base streak (36 games).

DSL PIRATES: **Leandro Pina** started for the National League All-Stars in the DSL All-Star Game.

2016 INDIANAPOLIS INDIANS

Indianapolis finished the season with a 70-74 record and a third-place finish in the International League West Division under manager **Dean Treanor**, who finished the season with 976 career wins and 471 victories with Indianapolis (third all-time). The 2016 campaign was highlighted by 12 Indians players who advanced from Triple-A to the big leagues, with seven pitchers and five position players making their Major League debuts throughout the season.

Josh Bell was named the Pirates Minor League Player-of-the-Year after hitting .295 with 14 home runs and 60 RBI at Triple-A. Bell became the first player to take home Player-of-the-Year honors twice (also 2014) for the Pirates organization since the award was created in 2000. Bell's 14 homers were a single-season career high and also ranked fifth among all Pirates minor leaguers. **Adam Frazier** hit .333 with 22 RBI and 17 stolen bases - which was second on the team - helping himself to a Major League promotion. **Alen Hanson** was second in the International League with 36 steals and **Max Moroff** led the league with 90 walks.

Tyler Glasnow made his Major League debut and earned MiLB Pipeline.com Pitcher-of-the-Year honors for the second time in three years. He finished the year with an 8-3 record and 1.87 ERA, helping the Indians to the third-best ERA in the International League. **Jameson Taillon's** 2.04 ERA was second on the team, as he went 4-2 in 10 starts before receiving a promotion to the Major League. **Chad Kuhl** and **Steven Brault** also made their way into the Pirates pitching rotation during 2016. **Trevor Williams** and **Frank Duncan** each had nine wins to lead the team. **Drew Hutchison**, who also ranked among the International League leaders in ERA and strikeouts, also earned a September promotion to the big leagues after being acquired by the Pirates at the trade deadline.

2016 ALTOONA CURVE

The Curve finished the season with a 76-64 record under first-year manager **Joey Cora** and reached the postseason for the second straight year and the seventh time in team history. The Curve then faced eventual league champion Akron in the first round of the playoffs and lost the best-of-five series three-games-to-one. Altoona's lineup featured some of Pittsburgh's best prospects from previous drafts in former first-round picks **Reese McGuire**, **Kevin Newman** and **Austin Meadows**, along with non-drafted free agent **Harold Ramirez**, who spent his first big league spring training camp with the Pirates.

Austin Meadows, who entered the season tabbed by *Baseball America* as Pittsburgh's second-best prospect, established an Altoona record by hitting safely in 24 consecutive games before being promoted to Triple-A Indianapolis on June 18. Meadows was hitting .311 at the time of his promotion, which ranked second in the league. **Barrett Barnes** finished the season with a .306 batting average, good for sixth in the Eastern League, and an on-base percentage of .377, which ranked fifth. Barnes, who was Pittsburgh's supplemental first round selection in 2012, continued to come into his own later in the season after leading the league with a .378 average over his last 54 games that helped him earn Player-of-the-Month honors in August and eventually Curve Most Valuable Player accolades. Second baseman **Erich Weiss** recorded 126 hits and 65 RBI, leading Altoona in both categories. Weiss was also selected as an Eastern League post-season All-Star at second base. **Eric Wood** recorded a career-high 16 home runs and was named as *Baseball America's* "Top Defensive Third Baseman" in the Eastern League. **Kevin Newman** also made a smooth transition to Double-A, hitting safely in a career-best 17 games from June 21 to July 9.

Clay Holmes and **Cody Dickson** shared the team lead with 10 wins apiece, which was also tied for the fifth-most in the Eastern League. Holmes also set career highs in innings pitched, strikeouts and wins two years after missing the entire 2014 season due to "Tommy John" surgery. **Frank Duncan**' impressive numbers in the starting rotation and in relief led to his promotion to Triple-A. In the bullpen, the Curve were anchored by **Montana DuRapau**, who finished second in the league with 22 saves, which were also the fourth-most in a single season in team history. **Dovydas Neverauskas** also posted strong numbers in relief while also receiving the honor of representing the Pirates organization at the All-Star Futures Game in San Diego. **Edgar Santana** did not allow a run in his last seven games with Altoona before being promoted to Triple-A.

2016 BRADENTON MARAUDERS

Bradenton assured itself of a postseason berth after winning the Florida State League's South Division in the first half of the season under the direction of manager **Michael Ryan**. The Marauders posted a 38-30 record in the first half and an overall mark of 70-66. The Marauders then went on to claim their first ever Florida State League championship in the club's seventh season as a Pirates affiliate after sweeping St. Lucie in a best-of-three series in the semifinals and beating Tampa in four games in the best-of-five championship series.

The Marauders were led early in the season by 2015 first round selection **Kevin Newman**, who was named to the league's mid-season All-Star team before being promoted to Altoona in mid-June. **Connor Joe**, who was also tabbed as a mid-season All-Star, hit .316 following the All-Star break before going 8-for-24 with three home runs and seven RBI during the postseason. **Jordan Luplow** hit a team-high 10 home runs during the regular season before going 6-for-17 (.353) with three home runs and seven RBI during the team's postseason run. **Cole Tucker**, Pittsburgh's 2014 first-round selection, was promoted to Bradenton in late May and hit .238 in 65 games. **Kevin Kramer**, who was selected by the Bucs in the second round of the 2015 draft, finished the season tied for the Florida State League lead with 29 doubles and finished ninth in the league with 123 hits.

Bradenton's pitching staff was anchored early in the season by **Brandon Waddell**, who was named the Florida State League's Player-of-the-Month for April after going 4-0 with a 0.93 ERA in five starts. Pittsburgh's 2015 Minor League Pitcher-of-the-Year **Yeudy Garcia** spent the entire season with Bradenton and ended the season fifth in the league in ERA and second in strikeouts. **Austin Coley** finished tied for second in the league with 12 wins, which was also tied for the most among all Pirates farmhands along with **Frank Duncan**. In the bullpen, **Luis Heredia** made the transition to a full-time reliever and responded with 12 saves while being named a mid-season All-Star after posting a 0.67 ERA before the break.

2016 WEST VIRGINIA POWER

One year after producing a club-record 87 wins and the best record in the South Atlantic League, the West Virginia Power recorded another winning season while featuring the organization's Minor League Pitcher-of-the-Year for the second straight season. The Power finished with an overall record of 71-68 after going 35-34 in the first half of the season and 36-34 in the second half under manager **Brian Esposito**.

Twenty-year-old **Mitch Keller** emerged as one of the top stories in Pittsburgh's minor league system after a dominating season at West Virginia that eventually led to a late season promotion to Bradenton. Keller took home South Atlantic League Player-of-the-Month honors for the month of April that proved to be the first of several accolades Pittsburgh's 2016 second-round selection would earn in 2016. Keller also garnered Minor League Pitcher-of-the-Year honors, started the South Atlantic League's mid-season All-Star game, was tabbed as the league's "Best Right-handed Pitcher" and "Most Outstanding Pitcher" and was selected to the league's post-season All-Star team. Keller ended the season ranked second in the league in ERA, first in WHIP (.092), second in batting average against (.211) and third in West Virginia single-season history with 131 strikeouts, trailing only **Tyler Glasnow** (164) from 2013 and **Will Inman** (134) from 2006. Hard-throwing lefthander **Taylor Hearn**, who was acquired from Washington at the trade deadline, posted strong numbers both out of the bullpen and in the starting rotation during the final month of the season.

West Virginia's roster also included two of the organization's top 10 prospects entering the season on the left side of the infield in shortstop **Cole Tucker** and third baseman **Ke'Bryan Hayes**. Tucker returned to action in early May after recovering from shoulder surgery in late 2015. The former first-round pick played in 15 games for the Power before being promoted to the eventual Florida State League champion Bradenton Marauders for the remainder of the season. Hayes was one of four members of the Power named to the South Atlantic League's mid-season All-Star team, but had his season cut short to 65 games because of a back injury. Mid-season All-Star **Tito Polo** led the team in home runs for the season despite being promoted to Bradenton in late June. Mid-season All-Star **Danny Arribas** finished tied for second on the team in home runs while also collecting 49 RBI, which ranked second on the team behind **Carlos Munoz**, who finished 10th in the league with 67 RBI. **Mitchell Tolman**, who ranked third on the team in RBI, matched Robbie Grossman's 2009 Power record after reaching base safely in 28 straight games from May 19 to June 24, which was also the second-longest streak by a South Atlantic League player on the season.

West Virginia also produced a league-leading .979 fielding percentage for the season after committing a total of 111 errors, which were the fewest in club history.

2016 WEST VIRGINIA BLACK BEARS

The West Virginia Black Bears posted a 38-38 record and a third-place finish in the Pinckney Division of the New York-Penn League in the team's second season as an affiliate of the Pirates. Second-year manager **Wyatt Toregas** oversaw a roster that included 2016 first-round selection **Will Craig**, along with a total of six players (**Hunter Owen**, **Kevin Mahala**, **Kevin Krause**, **Sandy Santos**, **Danny Beddes** and **Brandon Bingle**) who were named to the New York-Penn League mid-season All-Star team. Beddes, who was selected by the Pirates in the draft earlier in the summer, received the starting nod in the All-Star Game on August 16 at Hudson Valley in the South Division's 9-5 win.

Will Craig spent his first professional season with the Black Bears after the Pirates tabbed him as the 22nd overall selection in the draft earlier in the summer. After hitting .158 in 11 games during the month of June, Craig went on to hit .306 (55-for-180) over the remainder of the season. The 21-year-old infielder also ended the season with a .412 on-base percentage, which ranked second among all players in the New York-Penn League. Craig also boasted the longest hitting streak (17 games) by a NYP League player in 2016. In addition, Craig reached base safely in a league-best 36 straight games from July 22 to September 4, where he hit .349 and posted a .460 OBP during his impressive run.

Albert Baur led the team with 40 RBI, which was tied for sixth in the league, and ranked ninth on the circuit with 99 total bases. **Ty Moore** finished eighth in the league with a .288 average, which included a .326 clip (30-for-92) over his final 26 games. All-Star **Hunter Owen** paced the team with five home runs while finishing tied for second on the team in RBI along with fellow All-Star **Sandy Santos**, who hit .390 (16-for-41) in 11 games during the month of June. All-Star **Kevin Mahala** hit .285 prior to the break while providing solid defense up the middle all season. **Kevin Krause** split time behind the plate and in the outfield and his .290 average prior to the All-Star break helped earn him a spot on the All-Star team.

Beddes began his All-Star campaign by making his first two appearances out of the bullpen before transitioning to a starting role. The 22-year-old righthander ended the season ranked fourth among New York-Penn League pitchers in ERA while also finishing second in the league in WHIP (1.01) and first in batting average against (.195). **Luis Escobar** finished tied for the team lead with Beddes with six wins while also finishing fourth in the league overall with a .208 batting average against. **Brandon Bingle**, who also earned mid-season All-Star accolades, began his professional career by allowing just one earned run in his first 13 appearances (19.0ip) before being charged with six earned runs in his final three appearances over 2.2 innings.

2016 BRISTOL PIRATES

Bristol got off to a fast start in 2016 after winning five of its first six games before going on to post a 25-43 record and a fifth-place finish in the West Division of the Appalachian League under first-year manager **Kory DeHaan**.

Bristol's pitching staff was anchored by righthander **Matt Eckelman**, who was selected by the Pirates in the 21st round of the draft earlier in the summer. Eckelman posted a team-high five wins while also finishing first among all Appalachian League pitchers in WHIP (0.97) and fewest baserunners per 9.0 innings (8.84), second in ERA (2.76) and walks per 9.0 innings (1.29). He also ranked third overall in batting average against (.223), second among starting pitchers in the league. **Jordan Jess**, who was selected by Pittsburgh in the 31st round of the 2016 draft, finished tied for second in the league with seven saves while being charged with an earned run in just three of his 17 outings. **Nicholas Economos**, who finished tied for the league lead in starts, ended the season on a good note after taking home Pitcher-of-the-Week honors in the final week of the season after tossing a combined 11.0 scoreless innings in his two starts.

Victor Fernandez led the way offensively with a .314 average, which ranked eighth among all Appalachian League hitters. Fernandez was also one of three players to record double-digit stolen base totals, which helped the Pirates finish third in the league in stolen bases (78) behind Bluefield (118) and Burlington (82). **Adrian Valerio** led the team with 29 RBI while playing in 64 of the team's 68 games, which paced the Appalachian League.

2016 DOMINICAN SUMMER LEAGUE PIRATES

The Dominican Summer League Pirates finished the season with a 27-42 record while finishing in fifth place in the North Division under third-year manager **Mendy Lopez**.

Leandro Pina finished eighth in the league with a 1.46 ERA while being charged with more than two earned runs in just one of his 13 starting assignments for the season. The 17-year-old Pina also got the starting nod for the National League All-Stars in the DSL All-Star Game on July 17, where he worked 1.0 scoreless inning. **Roger Santana** also posted impressive numbers in his second season as a member of the DSL Pirates. Santana, who paced the staff with 55 strikeouts, recorded a 1.98 overall ERA in his 15 appearances, which included a 1.66 ERA (65.0ip/12er) in his 14 starting assignments. **Wilmer Contreras** led the club with six wins while making 14 of his 15 appearances in relief. **Ramon Garcia** recorded a team-high nine saves.

Seventeen-year-old shortstop **Rodolfo Castro** excelled in his first professional season after hitting .271 and leading the team in hits, total bases, doubles and RBI. Castro also represented the team at the Dominican Summer League All-Star Game, along with **Leandro Pina**. **Ramy Perez** finished second on the team with 22 RBI, which included 10 in 17 games during the final month of the season. **Christopher Perez** spent his second season with the team and batted .391 (18-for-46) during the first month of the season. **Rudy Guzman** led the team with 16 stolen bases while hitting .289 with a .917 OPS in 17 games during the month of August.
