PITTSBURGH PIRATES (71-71) vs. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (79-64)

September 10, 2018 at Busch Stadium, St. Louis, MO --- GAME #143/ROAD #69

RHP TREVOR WILLIAMS (12-9, 3.15 ERA) vs. RHP ADAM WAINWRIGHT (1-3, 4.00 ERA)

THE PIRATES...were rained out yesterday in Pittsburgh...Have won five straight games and have gone 7-3 in their last 10...Have gone 18-22 in their last 40 games after winning 11 in a row between 7/11-24...Have produced a 31-24 record since July 7 and have gone 35-30 in their last 65 games, dating back to 6/25...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 67-75 after 142 games in 2017 (67-76 after 143).

HITTIN' THE ROAD: Tonight the Pirates begin a six-game road trip with the first of three games against the Redbirds...Following a day off Thursday in Milwaukee, the trip concludes with three games against the Brewers at Miller Park beginning Friday night.

IT'S TREVOR TIME: Trevor Williams takes the mound tonight having allowed just four runs in his last nine starts (54.2ip) and posting the lowest ERA in the Majors (0.66) since July 11 (minimum 53.0ip)...He currently has a streak of 17.2 consecutive scoreless innings pitched; the longest current streak in the National League and his second-longest of the season behind his 21.0 consecutive scoreless innings between July 11 and August 5...Williams has been the starting pitcher in eight of Pittsburgh's 14 shutouts this season.

GIVE HIM A BREAK: Over the last two seasons, Trevor Williams ranks second among Major League pitchers with a 2.30 ERA (125.0ip/32er) in 21 starts following the All-Star break (minimum: 100.0ip)...The only pitcher in MLB to post a better ERA after the break in that time is Cleveland's Corey Kluber (2.12)...So far this season, Williams' 0.72 ERA (49.2ip/4er) following the break is the lowest in Major League Baseball among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings of work.

THIS AND THAT: Trevor Williams is the only pitcher in Major League Baseball this season to make nine starts of at least 5.0 innings without allowing a run...In his last outing on September 3 vs. Cincinnati, he tossed 6.2 scoreless innings and won a 5-1 decision against Matt Harvey.

CLUTCH PERFORMER: Starling Marte is hitting .343 (34-for-99) with runners in scoring position; good for the fifth-best mark in the National League...Marte has 17 hits in his last 38 at bats with RISP, good for a .447 batting average and a 1.291 OPS, dating back to July 11.

SAVING THE DAY: All-Star closer Felipe Vázquez has converted each of his last 21 save opportunities, which is tied with Kenley Jansen for the longest streak in the National League this season...Vázquez is one of eight pitchers - and the only lefthander - to earn 31 or more saves in a single season with the Pirates...His 52 saves in a Pittsburgh uniform rank 10th all time (since saves became official in 1969); Bill Landrum is ninth on the list with 56.

SELECT COMPANY: With 18 home runs and 30 stolen bases, Starling Marte is two homers shy of becoming just the third player in team history to produce at least 20 home runs and 30 steals in the same season...Barry Bonds accomplished the feat four times (1987, 1990-92) and Andy Van Slyke did it twice (1987-88).

CAPTAIN RED BEARD: Colin Moran enters today's action one of seven rookies in MLB with at least 100 hits...Moran is hitting .308 (36-for-117) over his last 40 games (dating back to July 15) and ranks fourth among National League rookies with 50 RBI (Miami's Brian Anderson leads with 58).

HERE'S THE PITCH: Dating back to July 8, the Pirates own the best team ERA (3.15) among all Major League teams...The Dodgers rank second in that time in MLB with a 3.25 ERA.

FRAZIER EN FUEGO: Adam Frazier is hitting .347 (41-for-118) with 15 doubles, five home runs and 20 RBI in 37 games since being recalled on July 25...In his last game Saturday afternoon against the Marlins, he went 2-for-4 with a double and run scored.

STRIKING NUMBERS: Pittsburgh's bullpen has recorded 516 strikeouts, surpassing its total from the 2017 campaign (495)...The 516 strikeouts by the bullpen rank fourth among all National League teams, trailing only San Diego (625), Milwaukee (593) and Los Angeles (545)...The club record for most strikeouts in a season by the bullpen is 536, which was established in 2016.

ROOKIE ROLLING: Richard Rodríguez leads all National League rookie relief pitchers in strikeouts (74)...He has whiffed 17 batters in his last 10.1 innings of work and is averaging 11.1 Ks per 9.0ip this season.

PROCEED WITH CAUTION: Francisco Cervelli has thrown out 19 runners attempting to steal against him while teammate Elias Diaz has thrown out 11...The last season in which the Pirates had at least 11 caught stealings by two different catchers was 2009 (Ryan Doumit and Jason Jaramillo had 11 apiece)...Pittsburgh ranks fourth in all of MLB with 30 caught stealings by its catchers, trailing only Baltimore (37), Oakland (36) and Washington (31).

GREGORY POLANCO IN 2018: Gregory Polanco sustained injuries to both his left knee and his left shoulder during the game Friday night that will cause him to miss the remainder of the 2018 season...He sustained a significant bone bruise in his left knee that will require approximately six-to-eight weeks of rest and rehabilitation...Polanco also injured his left shoulder on the same play...The Pirates are in the process of coordinating a second opinion to help determine the best course of treatment...The team will provide additional information as appropriate.

JOE MUSGROVE: The 25-year-old righthander will be making his 18th start of the season tomorrow night... His last start was a 7-3 win over the Reds at PNC Park Tuesday (6.1ip/5h/2r/2er/0bb/8so)...Has been charged with a total of 19 earned runs in 50.1ip in his eight starts since the break (3.40 ERA)...Has pitched at least 7.0 innings in five of his last nine starts and in six of his last 11...Has issued just two walks in his last six starts (36.1ip)...Has made a career-high 17 starts; he made 15 with the Astros last year...Began this season on the D.L. due to a right shoulder muscle strain.

vs. ST. LOUIS: 1-1 in two career starts...Won an 8-1 decision (7.0ip/0r) over John Gant in his Pirates debut this year on 5/25 at PNC Park; also singled off Gant in the sixth inning for his first career hit...Also lost a 5-0 decision (6.0ip/5r) to Gant on 8/30 at Busch Stadium; the first two runs he allowed came on back-to-back home runs by Harrison Bader and Gant in the fourth inning.
