LEADING OFF: Angels play the fifth contest (2-2) of an 11-game home stand vs. **Minnesota** (2-2), **Houston** (May 14-16) and **Tampa Bay** (May 17-20)...**Halos are on Day #7 of 29 games in span30 days (lone off day is May 21)...**LAA is 8-4 this month to move one game behind Astros in A.L. West (after 40 games in 2017, LAA trailed Houston by eight games)...Halos are 11-13 since a club-record 13-3 start...Angels are 8-3-2 in 13 series completed...LAA holds an MLB-best 14-4 road record, best 18-game away start in Club history...Next road trip is an 11-day, 10-game swing to **Toronto** (May 22-24), **New York Yankees** (May 25-27) and **Detroit** (May 28-31).

KNOW THIS: In his last three starts, **Andrew Heaney** has a 2.12 ERA (17 IP – 4 ER)...In two career starts vs. **Houston**, fashions a 0.82 ERA (11 IP – 1 ER) with nine strikeouts and three walks.

GET THIS: Yesterday's 2-1 walk-off win marked third such victory of season – second coming off bat of **Zack Cozart** (also April 4 vs. CLE)...**Cozart** entered 2018 without a walk-off hit or RBI in his seven-year career.

SHO-K: With 11 strikeouts Sunday, **Shohei Ohtani** (43 Ks on season) passed **Bo Belinsky** (38 Ks in 1962) for most strikeouts by an Angel thru first six career games...Just fourth Angel with multiple 10+ SO games as a rookie, joining **Frank Tanana** (1974), **Belinsky** (1962) & **Ken McBride** (1961)...First A.L. player ever to have 11+ K in two of first six career games.

MUY BIEN! **Martin Maldonado** is hitting .583 (14/24) this month after a .156 clip in March/April (0-for-34 skid ended May 1)...Has three 3-hit games his last seven affairs & already has five 3-hit contests in 2018 - **first Angels' catcher with five such efforts in a season since Mike Napoli's seven in 2009.**

MOVIN' ON UP-TON: **Justin Upton** homered in a career-best four straight games (May 8-11) and has HRs in five of last eight games (six HRs last 11 contests)...Has hits in 11 of last 13 games (.309; 17/55) with 18 RBIs...**Leads MLB with 18 RBI this month.**

HERE'S WHAT'S LEFT: **Upton** is the first Angel **left fielder** with 10+ HRs since **Josh Hamilton** (21) in 2013.

MORE THAN GLOVE: **Andrelton Simmons** has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games, reaching base safely in 20 straight...Reached base safely in 37-of-last-81 PA (.458 OBP) and is hitting .397 (27/68) with two home runs, seven doubles, two triples and 15 RBIs...**Leads MLB in PA per SO with 17.2 (155/9) and ranks fifth in A.L. batting .338**

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Shohei Ohtani** has a hit in 15 of 17 of his starts at DH and is batting .471 (8 for 17) in his last six contests...His five home runs are tied for A.L. lead among rookies (**Tyler Austin**)...Has registered a quality start in four of six outings on the mound...Named A.L. Rookie of Month for April...Became just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971...Tied club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)...As a **DH**, batted .359 (14/39) with four HRs, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field May 4th at SAFECO Field, **Albert Pujols**...

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Matched **Stan Musial** and **Alex Rodriguez** as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** & **Alex Rodriguez**).

PUJOLS POINTS: **Albert Pujols** ranks ninth all-time with 1,939 career RBIs...Next up on the list is **Ty Cobb** with 1,944 RBIs (*source Baseball Reference*)...**Pujols** sits at 628 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within four of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632).

WALK IN THE PARK: **Mike Trout** logged his second career four-walk game Saturday (also May 1 vs. BAL)...Just third Angel to record multiple four-walk games in a season (**Fred Lynn** in 1984 and **Chris Iannetta** in 2013)...**Trout has 21 walks across his last 19 games**...With his 600th walk May 8, became 5th player with 600 walks/200 HRs prior to age-27 season, joining **Mickey Mantle**, **Eddie Mathews**, **Mel Ott** & **Jimmie Foxx**.

FISH FACTS: **Mike Trout** scored his 700th career run April 8th to become one of nine players with 200 HRs & 700 runs prior to age-27 season (**Albert Pujols**, **Alex Rodriguez**, **Frank Robinson**, **Hank Aaron**, **Mickey Mantle**, **Eddie Mathews**, **Mel Ott** & **Jimmie Foxx**)...**Trout** has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old season – others are **Rogers Hornsby** (4) and **Ty Cobb** (4).

THIS N' THAT: **Albert Pujols** boasts a nine-game hit streak batting .306 (11-for-36) with four doubles, one HR and seven RBIs...Yesterday he logged career hit #3,007 tying **Al Kaline** for 30th all-time (**Wade Boggs** is 29th with 3,010)...**Halos' average home attendance (38,654) leads A.L.**...Club boasts seven sellouts thru 23 home games...**LAA has just 15 errors thru 40 games (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .990 fielding pct.**...Bench Coach **Josh Paul** celebrates his 43rd birthday May 19th...**Garrett Richards**, his 30th, on May 27th.

PITCHING POINTS: **Angel pitchers have surrendered just seven HRs this month, second-fewest in MLB to Houston (5)**...LAA pitchers have 19 games this season with 10+ Ks (franchise record through first 39 games of season)...**Halo hurlers have issued 154 free passes, second-most in A.L.**...**Angels' bullpen has tossed 164 IP to rank 2nd in MLB (average 4.1 IP per game).**

(2004) **Chone Figgins** enjoyed one of the best offensive performances in Angels' history, going 5-for-6 with a triple, a grand slam (his first ML HR) and six RBIs...Figgins would also drive in the game winning run in the 10th inning in the 10-9 win at Baltimore...He is one of two Angels who's first ML HR was a grand slam (**Buck Rogers** in 1961).

(1973) **Nolan Ryan** pitched his first of four no-hitters with the Angels in a 3-0 win at Kansas City...Ryan tallied 12 strikeouts in the effort.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP ANDREW HEANEY

1-2, 4.78 ERA

Is pitching to a 0.82 ERA (11 IP – 1 ER) across two career starts vs. Astros

- **WELCOME BACK!**: Making sixth start of the season and fourth at home...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **RECENT QUALITY**: Has registered a quality start in each of last two outings...Has been charged with two-or-fewer runs in each of last three starts, while pitching to a 2.12 ERA (17 IP – 4 ER) in that span.
- **FIRST PITCH SWINGING**: Opponents have swung at the first pitch 37.2% of the time vs. Heaney, which is the fourth highest rate in the Majors among starting pitchers (min. 20 IP).
- **LAST TIME OUT**: Charged with loss in last start on Tuesday at Colorado after tossing six innings and allowing two earned runs on five hits with three walks and five strikeouts.
- **9 K's vs. NYY**: Recorded season-high nine strikeouts in five innings of work on April 27 vs. New York (A.L.)...The nine strikeouts were second-highest total of career (had 10 strikeouts on 8/28/17 vs. OAK)...Was first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since **Hector Santiago** on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- **LINEUP FAMILIARITY**: Is holding opponents to a .200 (8/40) batting average this season the first time through the order, but opponents are batting .328 (20/61) the second and third time through the order.
- **VS. HOUSTON**: Tonight marks first start vs. Astros since Sept. 13, 2015 at Angel Stadium (ND; 5 IP, 6 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 4 SO)...In two career starts vs. Houston, is 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA (11 IP – 1 ER) with nine strikeouts and three walks...Made Angels debut on June 24, 2015 against the Astros at Angel Stadium.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM**: In 16 career starts at Angel Stadium, is 5-4 with a 4.43 ERA (89.1 IP – 44 ER)...This season, is 1-1 with a 5.28 ERA (15.1 IP – 9 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 10 of the 16 starts...Angels won each of his first six starts at The Big A, but have lost seven of last 10.
- **STARTING NINE**: With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT**: Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- **2017 RECAP**: Missed majority of season on disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (July 1, 2016)...Following six rehab starts, made return to Angels on Aug. 18 at Baltimore...Made five total starts for Angels, going 1-2 with a 7.06 ERA (21.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS**: Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES**: Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.

Making fifth start of the season and third at home...First career start vs. Houston...Earned the win in last start on Wednesday at Colorado after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and allowing five hits and one walk with a career-high seven strikeouts...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in each of his four starts for the Angels this season...In two starts at Angel Stadium, is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (8 IP – 4 ER)...Is the second native of Panama in Angels history, joining Hall of Famer Rod Carew...Made Major League debut on April 11 at Texas after opening the season with Triple-A Salt Lake.

AGE: 25

- Charged with first blown save May 5 at Seattle after allowing all three batters faced to score...Yielded go-ahead HR to Mike Zunino in 8th inning.
- Opened career with 6.1 shutout frames across first six outings for Angels.
- Made Major League debut April 23 in hometown of Houston...Recorded first career strikeout vs. **Carlos Correa** with two on and two out in the 8th inning.

#32 CAM BEDROSIAN (RHP)**AGE: 26**
