HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs wrapped up a 5-1 homestand with a 3-game sweep of the Marlins.
- ♦ The D-backs are 5-1 in their last 6 games and 6-3 in last 9.
- ♦ The D-backs are 4-2 in their last 6 games at AT&T Park.
- ♦ Among all teams since May 28, the D-backs rank in home runs (1st, 15), slugging pct. (1st, .563), OPS (1st, 911), runs (4th, 42), on-base pct. (7th, .348), walks (7th, 25) and average (12th, .266).
- ♦ **Zack Godley** made his first career start against the Giants on April 9 @ AT&T Park, throwing 7.0 shutout frames with 9 strikeouts (4 H, 0 BB).
 - In 6 games working 6.0+ innings, is 3-2 with a 2.11 ERA (9 ER in 38.1 IP) and .217 opponent average with 36 strikeouts.
- ♦ **David Peralta** has homered in a career-best 3 straight games (only 4 D-backs - 5 times - have homered in 4 straight games).
- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy's** 8 home runs as a catcher are tied for second in the NL with Francisco Cervelli/PIT behind Yasmani Grandal/LAD (9) and ahead of Kurt Suzuki/ATL (7).
- ♦ **Ketel Marte**, in his last 6 games, is batting .421 (8-for-19)/.450 OBP/1.555 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 6 RBI, 1 walk.
- ♦ **Jarrod Dyson**, in his last 5 games, is hitting .375 (6-for-16)/.500 OBP with 4 walks.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs swept the Marlins with a 6-1 win, their first home sweep of the Marlins since July 23-26, 2007 (4 games)
- ♦ **Matt Koch** (4-3) got the win with a career-high 7.0 shutout frames and career-high 6 strikeouts.
- ♦ **David Peralta** had a double and a homer.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** had a double, a triple and a RBI.
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** went 2-for-4 and scored 2 runs.

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ The D-backs selected INF/OF **Kristopher Negrón** from Triple-A Reno and optioned OF **Sócrates Brito** to Reno.
- ♦ Negrón, who wears No. 45, hit in 12 of his last 14 games for the Aces at a .438 clip (21-for-48) with 4 doubles, 2 triples, 5 RBI and 3 walks.

- ♦ Rounds 3-10 will be Tuesday starting at 10:05 a.m. AZT, and rounds 11-40 will be Wednesday starting at 9:05 a.m.

- ♦ 22 years ago today, the D-backs made their first-ever pick in the MLB draft, LHP **Nick Bierbrodt** from Millikan High School in Long Beach, Calif. as the 30th overall pick...other notable picks included RHP **Brad Penny** (5th round), OF **Jason Conti** (32nd round) and INF **Junior Spivey** (36th round).

- ♦ On this day in 2010, the D-backs, Rockies and Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community announced the name of the new Spring Training facility as Salt River Fields at Talking Stick...set to open in 2011, it was the first Major League Spring Training facility built on Indian land...the 140-acre site would include 12 practice fields and an 11,000-seat ballpark featuring the most lawn seating in the Cactus League.

- ### PERALTA IS GOING GOING GOING...
- ♦ **David Peralta** has homered in a career-best 3 straight games.
 - ♦ Only 4 D-backs - 5 times - have homered in 4 straight games: Mark Trumbo (April 3-6, 2014), Mark Reynolds (August 6-9, 2009), Troy Glaus (September 9-13, 2005), Troy Glaus (April 6-10, 2005) and Reggie Sanders (April 17-21, 2001).

- ### VS. GIANTS
- ♦ D-backs pitchers have a 2.15 ERA (13 ER in 54.1 IP) and .182 opponents average with 61 strikeouts vs. Giants...D-backs starters are 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (9 ER in 39.0 IP) and .170 opp. average.
 - ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .316 (71-for-225) hitter with 17 doubles, 11 homers and 46 RBI in 62 games @ AT&T Park.
 - ♦ **Jake Lamb** has hit .315 (28-for-89) with 7 doubles, 3 triples, 3 homers, 10 RBI and 16 walks in 29 games @ Giants.

- ### DOUBLE THE FIRST NAMES, DOUBLE THE POP
- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** has hit safely in 13 of 16 starts, batting .308 (20-for-65) with 4 doubles, 8 homers, 17 RBI and 3 walks.
 - ♦ His average of a home run every 10.38 at-bats (8 HR/83 AB) leads the Majors (min. 75 PA), ahead of Mookie Betts/BOS (10.82), Mike Trout/LAA (11.11), Bryce Harper/WSH (11.28), Matt Adams (11.50) and J.D. Martinez (11.53).
 - ♦ Hit safely in 7 straight starts, May 14-June 1 and had an extra-base hit (2 doubles, 5 homers) and RBI (10 total) in 6 consecutive starts May 19-June 1...homered in 3 straight games May 28-June 1 and 4 in a row as a catcher May 23-June 1, tying a club mark at that position (also: Jarrod Saltalamacchia, Sept. 8-16, 2013).

- ### TRIPLE THE FUN
- ♦ The D-backs' 20 triples are tied for the most in the Majors with the Pirates, ahead of the Cubs (19) and White Sox (18).
 - ♦ **Ketel Marte's** 6 triples are tied for the most in the Majors with Yolmer Sanchez/CWS and Chris Taylor/LAD.
 - His 6 triples are tied for the most by a D-backs through the first 58 games (Stephen Drew in 2010 and Junior Spivey in 2002).

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** has a 12-game scoreless streak (10.1 IP) since May 6 with a .171 (6-for-35) opponent average and 11 strikeouts (6 H, 2 BB-1 IBB).
 - ♦ **Fernando Salas** has held opponents scoreless in 7 of last 8 games (1 ER in 7.2 IP).
 - ♦ **Andrew Chafin** has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 15 games (1 ER in 10.0 IP).
 - ♦ **Brad Boxberger** has held the opposition scoreless in 10 of his last 11 games (0.82 ERA; 1 ER in 11.0 IP).

- ### MILLER TIME IN JACKSON
- ♦ **Shelby Miller** will make his second rehab appearance tonight for Double-A Jackson vs. Tennessee (Cubs).
 - ♦ Miller allowed 1 run on 4 hits with 8 strikeouts and 0 walks in his first rehab appearance on May 29 for Single-A Adv. Visalia.

- ### TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP PATRICK CORBIN (5-2, 2.99)
- ♦ In 5 road starts (2 quality), has allowed 1 run twice, 2 runs once and 3 runs twice...overall, is 1-0 with a 3.07 ERA (10 ER in 29.1 IP), .217 opponent average (23-for-106) and 36 strikeouts (11.05 strikeouts per 9.0 innings).
 - ♦ Threw his first career shutout (1 H, 1 BB, 8 K) in a 1-0 win @ Giants on April 17...held the Giants hitless for the first 7.2 innings (Brandon Belt check-swing, infield single).
 - ♦ In 19 career starts (11 quality) vs. Giants, is 6-7 with a 3.25 ERA.

- ♦ Acquired from the Cubs on Dec. 9, 2014, with RHP Jeferson Mejia, for C Miguel Montero.
- ♦ Cubs 10th-round pick in the 2013 draft.

- ♦ Didn't record his sixth win in 2017 until Aug. 29 vs. Dodgers (13th start).
- ♦ Has yielded 2 earned runs or fewer in 6 of his 11 starts.

- ♦ Earned the win May 29 vs. Reds, allowing 2 runs on 6 hits in 6.0 innings.

VS. GIANTS

- ♦ Is making his sixth career appearance (fourth start)...is 2-1 with a 4.67 ERA (9 ER in 17.1 IP).
- ♦ Won his first career start on Sept. 9, 2015 @ Chase Field (1 ER in 5.0 IP).
- ♦ Tossed 7.0 scoreless innings with 9 strikeouts on April 9 @ AT&T Park.

- ♦ Limiting opponents to a .258 average with RISP (16-for-62) and a .194 average with RISP/2 outs (6-for-31).
- ♦ 19 of 35 runs have come in innings No. 1-3.

- ♦ Since 2016, ranks ninth among all pitchers with a 54.5 ground ball pct. (min. 40 starts).

- ♦ Is 16-6 with a 2.64 ERA (55 ER in 187.2 IP) when throwing 6.0+ innings (D-backs are 20-9).

2018 CURVEBALL INFO

- ♦ Ranks second among Major League starters by throwing a curveball 38.7 pct. of the time, behind only Lance McCullers Jr./HOU (43.2).

PLAYER PROFILE

- ♦ As a senior at University of Tennessee, in 2013, he led the SEC in complete games (6) and innings (108.1) and has second in strikeouts (98).
- ♦ Nickname is the "Bull" because his teammates at Tennessee called him that due to his demeanor on the mound and his sprints on and off the field.
- ♦ Is an avid bass fisherman...has accidently sunk 2 boats.
- ♦ Roomed the majority of the 2017 with Andrew Chafin in his 42-foot RV.
- ♦ Was an alternate on the 2012 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, appearing in 4 games.
- ♦ Married to Autumn.

2017 CURVEBALL INFO

- ♦ Finished second in the Majors by throwing 852 curveballs in 2017, behind Rich Hill/LAD (871) and ahead of Gio Gonzalez/WSH (829) and Aaron Nola/PHI (820) [source: Baseball Prospectus].
- ♦ Opponents hit .151 with a .229 slugging pct. on the curve in 2017...threw a career-high 51 curve balls on Aug. 13, 2017 vs. Cubs.
- ♦ Changed how he threw his curveball after conversations with then teammate Jeremy Hellickson in 2015.

WHO WANTS MORE CURVEBALL INFO?

- ♦ Ranked third in the NL on "whiff rates" on curveballs in 2017 (45.74)...only Jon Lester/CHC (50.32) and Robbie Ray/ARI (47.27) were better.
- ♦ His average velocity on his curveball (83.44) in 2017 was fourth hardest in the NL, trailing Jimmy Nelson/MIL (84.87), Luis Perdomo/SD (84.80) and Alex Wood/LAD (83.78).

2017 REVIEW

- ♦ Set career highs in starts (25), wins (8), innings (155.0) and strikeouts (165) in his third season with the D-backs, going 8-9 with a 3.37 ERA, 53 walks and a .221 opponent average.
- ♦ Among NL starters (min. 20 GS), ranked ninth with a 1.14 WHIP and .657 opponent OPS and 10th with a .221 opponent average.
- ♦ Recorded 4 strikeouts in the first inning on Aug. 13, 2017 vs. Cubs, the second pitcher in team history to record 4 strikeouts in a single inning, joining Oliver Perez on Sept. 20, 2014 @ Rockies.

POSTSEASON: Threw 5.0 innings of 2-run baseball with 5 strikeouts out of the bullpen in his lone appearance in NLDS Game 1 @ Dodgers.
