RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered a 9-2 loss to the Indians on Sunday afternoon at Comerica Park. Leonys Martin hit a solo home run, his ninth of the season, and drove in two runs, while John Hicks had a pair of hits and scored a run. Artie Lewicki started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing three runs on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings. The Tigers continue their six-game homestand tonight as they begin a three-game series against the Minnesota Twins. Following the series against Minnesota, the Tigers embark on an eight-game road trip, which includes three games at Chicago (AL) (June 15-17), two games at Cincinnati (June 19-20) and three games at Cleveland (June 22-24).

ROSTER MOVES: Following Sunday's game, the Tigers optioned RHP Zac Reininger to Triple A Toledo. Detroit today has recalled C Grayson Greiner from Triple A Toledo.

TIGERS SIGN SIX SELECTIONS FROM 2018 DRAFT: The Tigers today announced the club has agreed to terms with six selections from the 2018 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. The list of signed players includes CF Kingston Liniak from Mission Hills HS (CA) (4th round), CF Eric De La Rosa from Grossmont College (CA) (7th round), CF Brock Deatherage from North Carolina State University (10th round), SS Kelvin Smith from Redan HS (GA) (20th round), 3B John Valente from St. John's University (21st round) and RHP Chavez Fernander from Polk State College (FL) (35th round).

RUN AT YOUR OWN RISK: Leonys Martin had a pair of outfield assists on Sunday and now has six on the season, which ranks tied for third in the American League. Since the 2013 season, Martin has recorded 56 outfield assists, which is tied with Starling Marte for the third most among active players, trailing only Yoenis Céspedes and Gerardo Parra, who have 58 outfield assists over that span.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: JaCoby Jones hit a double off Corey Kluber in Sunday's game. Detroit has recorded at least one double in 62-of-67 games this season and has 148 doubles, which is tied with Boston for the Major League lead.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING: Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game with 2,676 hits in his Major League career. He is one hit shy of tying Luis Aparicio for 72nd in MLB history (see chart below).

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 1-2 on their current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (1-2) and three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14). Detroit is wrapping up a stretch that will see them play 18-of-21 games at home. The Tigers are 21-16 at Comerica Park this season, and have won 20 of their last 31 home games. The Tigers are hitting .262 (333x1270) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.16 ERA (344.0IP/159ER).

TIGERS AND TWINS: Detroit is 1-2 against the Twins this season after losing two-of-three games at Target Field from May 21-23. The Tigers went 8-11 against the Twins last season, including a 3-7 record at Comerica Park. The Tigers have won the season series over the Twins in five of the last seven seasons.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 13-16 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 5-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 3-7 vs. Cleveland, 1-2 vs. Minnesota and 4-6 vs. Kansas City. Detroit

has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 31-36 (.463) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,099-1,075 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

TURNBULL NAMED EASTERN LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK

On Monday, RHP Spencer Turnbull was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week. Turnbull made two starts during the week, posting a 1-0 record with a 2.13 ERA (12.2IP/3ER) and 14 strikeouts. He threw his first career shutout on Sunday vs. Reading, striking out a season-high 11 batters. Turnbull is ranked as the 29th-best prospect in the Tigers organization by MLB Pipeline.

ZIMMERMANN INJURY REHAB UPDATE

RHP Jordan Zimmermann made an injury rehabilitation start with Single A West Michigan last night vs. South Bend, tossing 5.1 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with no walks and six strikeouts. The start was Zimmermann's third injury rehab start after making two appearances with Triple A Toledo. Zimmermann has been sidelined since May 8 (retroactive to May 6) with a right shoulder impingement.

ABOUT BLAINE: Hardy will make his 10th appearance and sixth start of the season tonight in the series opener vs. Minnesota.

LAST TIME OUT: Hardy suffered his first loss of the season on Wednesday at Boston, allowing five runs on eight hits with two strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. MINNESOTA: Hardy has made 18 career appearances, including one start, against the Twins, compiling a 1-0 record with a 3.74 ERA (21.2IP/9ER) and 13 strikeouts. He started against Minnesota earlier this season on May 21 at Target Field and received a no decision, throwing 5.0 innings and allowing two runs on seven hits with four strikeouts.

AT COMERICA PARK: Hardy has made 90 career outings, including three starts, at Comerica Park, compiling an 8-1 record with a 3.10 ERA (104.2IP/36ER) and 77 strikeouts. In three home starts this season, Hardy is 2-0 with a 2.60 ERA (17.1IP/5ER) and 12 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JUNE: Hardy has appeared in 30 games, including two starts, during the month of June in his career, posting a 3-3 record with a 4.54 ERA (39.2IP/20ER) and 25 strikeouts. In two June starts this season, Hardy is 1-1 with a 5.25 ERA (12.0IP/7ER) and five strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Hardy has pitched in 85 games, including two as a starter, in his career against American League Central opponents, compiling a 5-2 record with a 4.53 ERA (91.1IP/46ER) and 62 strikeouts. In three outings, including two starts, vs. AL Central teams this season, Hardy is 1-0 with a 2.77 ERA (13.0IP/4ER) and 10 strikeouts.

FOR STARTERS: Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in four of his five starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 2-1 record with a 3.81 ERA (28.1IP/12ER) and 18 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Hardy has held lefthanded batters to a .232 (69x297) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .290 (127x438) against him. In nine appearances, including five starts this season, lefties are hitting .235 (8x34) vs. Hardy, while righthanded hitters are batting .259 (22x85).

AT TOLEDO: Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.

FIRST WIN AS A STARTER: Hardy earned his first win as a starter on May 27 vs. Chicago (AL), throwing a career-high 7.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and a career-best six strikeouts. Hardy finished the outing by retiring the final 14 White Sox batters he faced.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Hardy was originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 22nd round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was signed by the Tigers as a Minor League free agent on April 2, 2013.

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his 13th start of the season tomorrow night vs. Minnesota.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd earned his fourth win of the season on Thursday at Boston, allowing two runs on four hits with four walks and six strikeouts in 6.1 innings.

VS. MINNESOTA/AT COMERICA PARK: Boyd has faced the Twins 12 times in his career, posting a 5-3 record with a 4.01 ERA (67.1IP/30ER) and 60 strikeouts. He started against Minnesota earlier this season on May 22 at Target Field and took the loss after giving up two runs on one hit with four walks and no strikeouts in 4.0 innings. Boyd has made 34 appearances, including 32 starts, in his career at Comerica Park, compiling a 10-9 record with a 4.01 ERA (184.0IP/82ER) and 137 strikeouts. In six home starts this season, Boyd is 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1IP/10ER) and 27 strikeouts.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Boyd currently ranks ninth in the American League with a .205 (51x249) opponents batting average.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: After finishing the 2017 season on a strong note, Boyd has allowed three runs-or-less in nine of his first 12 starts this season. Over his last 16 starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 3.00 ERA (96.0IP/32ER) and 75 strikeouts. Among American League pitchers with at least 90.0 innings pitched during that time span, Boyd ranks fifth with a .201 (69x344) opponents batting average and eighth with a 3.00 ERA.
