STREAKING

At 22-43 through games of 6/9 the Reds were 21 games under .500 and 17.5 games out of first place, both season highs...since then are 13-5, including 10-3 in their last 13 games, and have pulled to within 4.5 games of the fourth-place Pirates...the Reds have been in fifth place since the fourth day of the season...are 32-33 under interim manager Jim Riggelman.

ABOUT THE NUMBERS

During this 13-5 streak, the Redlegs are hitting .274 (170-620) with 108 runs scored (6.00 r/g) and a 3.39 ERA (162ip, 61er), including a 3.47 ERA by starters (103.2ip, 40er, 7qs)...from 6/17-6/23, Reds starting pitchers earned the victory in 6 straight team games for the first time since 9/20-9/26, 2009.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES

The Redlegs are trying to put together their first 4-series unbeaten streak since they ended the first half of last season by going 3-0-1 vs Mil (2-1), vs Chi (2-1), at Col (2-2) and at Ari (2-1)...are playing their third consecutive series vs a first-place team (opponent was in first place when the series began).

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 4 (1-2) of a 4-game series vs Jeff Shaw's first-place Brewers and Game 4 (1-2) of a 7-game homestand that beginning tomorrow night features a 3-game Fourth of July holiday set vs the White Sox...is the Reds' last homestand prior to the All-Star break...following this homestand, the Redlegs will finish the first half of the season with a 10-day, 9-game road trip to Chi's Wrigley Field (3g), Cle's Progressive Field (3g) and StL's Busch Stadium (off day, 3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Brewers are 7-2 vs the Reds this season, including a 7-game winning streak snapped by yesterday's 12-3 Reds win...the 7-game losing streak is the Reds' longest ever vs the Brewers...Reds vs Brewers information is on media guide Page 324.

LONG BALLS: Brewers batters homered in each of their last 18 games at GABP (40hr), the longest home run streak by a Reds opponent here and tied for the longest streak overall...Reds batters homered in a ballpark record 18 straight games from 4/25-5/29, 2010...Mil's Eric Thames has produced 14 HR vs Cin over the last 2 seasons, including 4 homers this year...in 2017, his 10 HR vs Cin tied for the second-most ever in a single season by an opposing player vs Reds pitchers, behind only Mil's Eddie Mathews (11hr in 1953) and Bos' Earl Torgeson (11hr in 1950)...Kris Bryant of the Cubs hit 10 HR vs Cin in 2016.

WHITE SOX UP NEXT: Beginning tomorrow night the Redlegs and White Sox will meet during the regular season for the first time since 2015 at U.S. Cellular Field and for the first time at Great American Ball Park since 2009, a span of 3,297 days between visits...the White Sox won 6 of the 7 season series (1-1 split in 1998) and 16 of the 20 games, including 10 of the 12 games here in Cincinnati...the Reds never won more than 1 game in any of the previous 7 season series, and the Sox swept 3 of the 7 series...Reds vs White Sox information is on media guide Page 333...1919 World Series information is on media guide Pages 438-439...the Reds won that World Series, 5 games to 3.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: This season the Reds are 6-1 vs the American League (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det), including 5 consecutive wins...have won 5 straight interleague games for the first time since a 5-game winning streak from 8/6-9/18, 2013 (2-0 at Oak, 3-0 at Hou)...ties their longest winning streak ever vs the AL (5th time)...their 2-1 series win at Min's Target Field in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a 3-0 series sweep at Hou's Minute Maid Park in September 2013...between those series wins the Reds went 0-9 in interleague road series of at least 3 games and 4-23 in games in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the White Sox (3g, Mon-Wed), Indians (3g, 8/13-8/15) and Royals (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at Cle's Jacobs Field (3g, 7/9-7/11) and at Det's Comerica Park (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 144-198 all-time vs the AL, at .421 the second-lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team (SD, 151-211, .417)...Reds vs AL opponents information is on media guide Page 332.

ROOKIES OF THE MONTH: In 6 starts in June, rookie Tyler Mahle went 3-0, 2.18...for the season, he leads National League rookie pitchers in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts while ranking fifth in ERA...among all NL batters for June, Jesse Winker (.308, 5hr, 20rbi, .432obp) ranks third in on-base percentage, 9th in RBI and 20th in hitting.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' infield collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (378), batting average (.289) and on-base percentage (.367)...1B Joey Votto leads the National League in on-base percentage...2B Scooter Gennett leads the league in hitting and hitting on the road...3B Eugenio Suárez leads the NL in RBI and leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI...SS José Peraza ranks second in the league in most plate apps per strikeout.

DOT...DOT...DOT: The Reds are 32-33 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...in yesterday's 12-3 win Reds pitchers recorded 18 strikeouts, a new franchise record for a 9-inning game...the previous record of 17 strikeouts in a 9-inning game was accomplished 4 times, most recently on 6/18/2013 vs Pit...the Reds trailed in 6 of their last 8 victories...haven't lost a game when leading after 8 innings since 4/21/17 vs Chi, an active streak of 85 consecutive wins when leading after the eighth (31-0 this season)...in the last 8 days, Reds pitchers have produced 4 HR (Lorenzen 3, DeSclafani 1), 2 grand slams (Lorenzen, DeSclafani), 2 pinch-hit HR (Lorenzen 2) and a pinch-hit grand slam (Lorenzen).

RUTHIAN: In his last 5 plate apps RHP Michael Lorenzen has singled, homered (pinch hit), walked, homered and homered (pinch-hit grand slam)...is the first Major League pitcher to homer in 3 consecutive at bats since Col's Mike Hampton in 2001...his 3 HR are the most by a Reds batter whose primary position is pitcher since Micah Owings had 3 homers in 2009...in his career as a pinch hitter Lorenzen is 4-for-11 with 3 HR (4/6/17 off Pit's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery, grand slam on 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes), including 3-for-4 this season (2hr, 5rbi)...5 times Lorenzen has come off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games...on 6/7 vs Col Lorenzen pinch hit and produced a 116.5-mile-per-hour single off Tyler Anderson, the hardest-hit ball in the Statcast era by any Reds batter or by any Major League pitcher.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 8 grand slams, including 5 slams in the last 16 games...hit 5 in June, a new club record for grand slams in a calendar month...joined the 1996 Expos, 1997 Braves and 2006 Mets as the only teams in National League history to have produced at least 6 grand slams over a 31-day span...the Reds' 8 grand slams were hit by Adam Duvall (2), Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Joey Votto, Winker and pitchers Anthony DeSclafani and Michael Lorenzen (pinch-hit)...on 6/23 vs Chi (off Brian Duensing), DeSclafani became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a grand slam (Bob Purkey 1959, Al Hollingsworth 1936, Ice Box Chamberlain 1892)...Lorenzen on 6/30 (off Mil's Jacob Barnes) became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit grand slam since Tommy Byrne of the White Sox did it on 5/16/1953 at NYY.

Matt Harvey this afternoon is making his 10th appearance and start for the Reds...will be his **fourth career** appearance and **start** vs the **Brewers**, his second of the season but his first while pitching for the **Reds**...in his **last 3 starts** is **2-1, 3.06** and in his **last 2 starts** is **2-0, 2.13**...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00** in **4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on **5/5**...on **5/8** was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...from **2012-2018** for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66** in **104 starts** and **5 relief apps**...in **5 career starts** at **Great American Ball Park** is **4-0, 3.06** (32.1ip, 25h, 11er, 7bb, 30k, 4hr).

- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/24/17 is hitting .316 with 32 doubles, 1 3b, 30 HR and 113 RBI (.521slg, .360obp, .881ops).
- Has followed an 0-for-10 skid by reaching base safely in each of his last 4 plate apps (2 singles, 1 double, 1 walk).
- Hit .298 in April (2hr, 14rbi), .398 in May (8hr, 24rbi) and .309 in June (3hr, 16rbi)...hit safely in 21 of his 25 apps in June, including a pair of 10-game hitting streaks.
- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.

- Has a 5-game hitting streak, including three 2-hit games (8-21, .381, 2 3b, 2 solo HR, 1sb)...Wed and Thu homered in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- In his last 28 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .327 (36-110, 4 2b, 2 3b, 2hr, 11rbi, .378obp), raising BA from .243 and including a 12-game hitting streak (5/26-6/9) that fell 1 shy of his career high.

- Beginning 5/28 has reached base safely in 24 of his last 26 apps (32-100, .320, 9 2b, 5hr, 13rbi, .560slg, .400obp), including a career-high 17-game on-base streak snapped on 6/19 vs Det when he pinch hit and finished 0-for-2.
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi) and .330 in June (4hr, 11rbi, .560slg, .392obp).
- The lefthanded batter is hitting .364 vs LHP (24-66, 3 2b, 2hr, 4rbi, .417obp).
- Has made 22 career starts batting leadoff, including 17 times this year (24-75, .320) and each of his last 16 starts (22-70, .314)...in his 22 career starts batting leadoff hit .320 (31-97), including .323 (30-93) in his 21 starts batting leadoff for the Reds...his career on-base percentage while batting first is .368.
- Has made a team-high 41 starts in RF, 13 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Last 18 Reds Games: 18g, .328 (22-67), 4 hr, 13rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb leads the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI (4.1) while ranking second in the National League in slugging percentage (.569, Col's Nolan Arenado .585).
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/11/17 is hitting .272 with 26 doubles, 2 triples, 32 HR and 106 RBI (.493slg, .377obp).
- In his last 35 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .333, raising his season BA from .274 (45-135, 5 2b, 1 3b, 9hr, 28rbi, .585slg, .420obp).
- Has a 4-game hitting streak (6-17, .353, 2 2b, 2rbi)...his 13-game hitting streak from 6/8-6/23 was the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- The Reds are 31-35 when he plays and 4-13 when he does not play.
- In May led the Major Leagues in RBI (29) while ranking T3rd in both extra-base hits (15) and HR (8)...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds third baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 29 RBI in a calendar month.
- Tied the franchise record for most RBI by a Reds player in his first 20 games of a season (25)...played in his 20th game on 5/8 vs NYM and produced 4 RBI to give him 25 on the season...George Crowe (1958), Vada Pinson (1962) and Ken Griffey Jr. (2006) each produced 25 RBI in his first 20 games of those respective seasons.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Last 18 Reds Games: .241 (14-58, .443obp), 2hr, 15rbi

- Leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking second in walks and 11th in batting average...is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time.
- Has 2 hits in his last 17 at bats, including a season-high 0-for-12 snapped on Fri.
- Reached base safely in 71 of his 82 apps...his season-high 20-game on-base streak was snapped on 6/13 at KC (0-4).
- Through his third plate appearance on 6/6 was hitting .311 (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history...Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

33 JESSE WINKER, of Last 18 Reds Games: 17g, .260 (13-50), 3hr, 14rbi

- Ranks 10th in the National League in on-base percentage...leads NL rookies in walks while ranking second in hits, on-base percentage and multi-hit games (17).
- In his last 11 apps beginning 6/20 is hitting .379 (11-29, 3hr, 13rbi, 10bb, .690slg, .538obp).
- Hit .305 through April (0hr, 9rbi, .414obp), .174 in May (1hr, 3rbi) and .308 in June (5hr, 20rbi, .432obp)...among National League leaders in June ranked third in on-base percentage, T9th in RBI and 20th in hitting.
- Has made 34 starts in RF, 24 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
