Tonight is Game 13 (7-5) of a 14-game stretch against NL West opponents....the team is 19-9 against the NL West this season, going 5-1 vs. Arizona, 5-2 vs. Colorado, 3-4 vs. Los Angeles, 3-1 vs. San Diego and 3-1 vs. San Francisco.

There's No Place Like Home

After a 2-6 start, the Brewers have gone 33-17 (.660) over their last 50 home games, which is tied with the Phillies for the best home record in the National League and trails only the Yankees (34-13, .723) and Red Sox (34-14, .708) in the Major Leagues during this stretch (since 4/17).

AT HOME: The Brewers are 35-23 at home, going 10-5-3 in series play....after a 2-6 start, the team is 33-17 over its last 50 home games....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 4/17-4/22 and a season-high 3-game home losing streak from 4/7-4/16....the team went 46-38 at home last season, going 14-9-4 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 30-28 on the road, going 9-6-3 in series play....had a season-high 5-game road winning streak from 4/30-5/11 and a season-high 6-game road losing streak from 7/11-7/15....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (285-292) and third full season....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 21 replay challenges, going 4-17....their last challenge (lost) came on 8/5 vs. Colorado as a safe call at second base involving David Dahl stood....went 17-27 in 44 replay challenges last season.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #45 - RHP JHOULYS CHACÍN (24gs, 10-4, 3.89)

CHACIN AT A GLANCE: Jhoulys Chacin, 30, will be making his team-leading 25th start of the season and second against the Padres....Chacin last started last Thursday at Los Angeles and took a 21-5 loss (4.1ip, 5h, 9r, 8er, 4bb, 3k, 3hr, 1hbp)....his 9 runs allowed tied a career high (also 4/3/17 at LA)....the team is 16-8 in his starts....he has 7 quality starts....opponents are batting .226 (109-for-483, 13hr)....Chacin signed as a free agent on 12/21/17....he is signed through the 2019 season....his name is pronounced "yo-LEASE sha-SEEN"....bio is on p. 81 of the media guide.

LAST SEASON: Chacin went 13-10 with a 3.89 ERA in a career-high 32 starts with San Diego....his 13 wins and career-high 153 strikeouts led the team....he held opponents to a .235 batting average (157-for-667, 19hr), which ranked ninth in the National League....the Padres went 18-14 in his starts....he had 16 quality starts, tying Luis Perdomo for the team lead....Chacin went 9-5 with a 2.93 ERA over his last 20 starts (116.2ip, 38er).

CAREER: Is 69-71 with a 3.93 ERA in 219 games / 191 starts (1155ip, 504er)....is in his 10th Major League season....has pitched for Colorado (2009-14), Arizona (2015), Atlanta (2016), LA of Anaheim (2016), San Diego (2017) and Milwaukee (2018).

CAREER AT MILLER PARK: Is 4-3 with a 3.91 ERA in 12 starts (71.1ip, 31er)....prior to this season had not pitched at Miller Park since 2014....is 4-2 with a 3.46 ERA in 9 starts this season (52ip, 20er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 29-40 with a 4.25 ERA in 110 games / 93 starts (546ip, 258er)....is 6-2 with a 4.16 ERA in 15 starts this season (80ip, 37er).

CAREER vs. PADRES: Is 6-2 with a 3.44 ERA in 15 games / 11 starts (70.2ip, 27er), including a no-decision this season on 3/30 at Petco Park (3.1ip, 7h, 4r, 4er, 2bb, 1k, 2hr, 1hbp)....Brewers won, 8-6....was his debut with Milwaukee.

CAREER AT THE PLATE: Is a .195 (61-for-313) hitter with 1 HR....homered on 9/20/13 vs. Arizona (2-run off Randal Delgado)....has 10 walks and 69 strikeouts....**THIS SEASON:** Is batting .211 (8-for-38) with 1 RBI....has 3 walks and 10 strikeouts....has 5 sacrifice bunts.
