WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won five of their last eight games as they continue a seven-game, six-day trip today in Boston.
- LHP Carlos Rodón is scheduled to make his season debut for the White Sox, who recorded a 1-0 victory last night over the Red Sox.
- \bullet The Sox are 3-2 on this trip, splitting a four-game series at Minnesota prior to last night's win.
- Following this three-game series, the White Sox return home for seven games vs. Cleveland (6/11-14) and Detroit (6/15-17).
- The Sox went 2-1 on their last homestand vs. Milwaukee from 6/1-3 and 1-5 on the last trip to Detroit (1-2) and Cleveland (0-3) from 5/25-30.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- LHP Carlos Rodón is scheduled to make his first start since 9/2/17 vs. Tampa Bay ... Rodón matched his career high with 11 strikeouts in his only previous start at Fenway Park on 8/4/17.
- With a victory today, the White Sox will record their second winning road trip of the season (3-2 from 3/29-4/4).
- Sox starting pitchers own a 3.00 ERA (14 ER/42.0 IP) over the last seven games ... the bullpen owns a 2.66 ERA (24 ER/81.1 IP) over the last 25.
- The White Sox are holding the opposition to a .189 (10-53) average with RISP over eight games in June.
- The Sox have lost five of their last six games at Fenway Park after winning six of their previous seven.
- José Abreu is a career .338/.416/.632 (23-68) hitter with eight doubles, four homers and 14 RBI in 17 games at Fenway Park.

ROSTER MOVES

- Prior to today's game, the White Sox returned LHP Carlos Rodón from his injury rehab assignment at Class AAA Charlotte and reinstated him from the 60-day disabled list and designated RHP Chris Beck for assignment.
- Rodón, 25, made four rehab starts between Charlotte and Class A Kannapolis, going 1-0 with a 1.53 ERA (3 ER/17.2 IP) and 28 strikeouts ... he was placed on the disabled list on 3/28 to continue his rehab from left shoulder surgery on 9/27/17.
- The White Sox 40-man roster remains at 40.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Dylan Covey combined with three relievers on a three-hitter as the White Sox ended a five-game losing streak at Fenway Park with a 1-0 victory.
- Covey allowed three hits with one walk and seven strikeouts over 6.0 IP to lower his season ERA to 2.22 ... he retired 12 straight batters in one stretch from the first-fourth innings.
- Jace Fry, Nate Jones and Joakim Soria each threw 1.0 scoreless IP in relief of Covey, with Soria earning his seventh save of the season and third of the trip.
- Trayce Thompson drove in Kevan Smith for the game's only run with a one-out single off Chris Sale in the seventh inning ... Smith led off the seventh with a ground-rule double.
- The White Sox recorded their third shutout of the season and fifth ever 1-0 victory at Fenway Park (first since 7/21/89).

WHITE SOX CHARITIES LEND A HAND

- In conjunction with Danny Farquhar's return to Guaranteed Rate Field on 6/1, Chicago White Sox Charities raised \$10,000, with all proceeds benefitting the Joe Niekro Foundation, an organization committed to supporting patients and families, research, treatment and awareness of brain aneurysms.
- Farquhar, 31, threw out a ceremonial first pitch on 6/1, surrounded by his wife, children and the RUSH University Medical Center team who helped care for him after he suffered a brain hemorrhage from a ruptured aneurysm during a home game on 4/20 vs. Houston

SOX SERVE WEEK

- The White Sox will celebrate Sox Serve Week from 6/11-16, their 10th annual community outreach and fundraising campaign benefitting Chicago White Sox Charities (CWSC).
- Sox Serve Week engages fans and the Chicagoland community through outreach events, including a visit to LaRabida Hospital and events with Special Olympic athletes, as well as special fundraising opportunities, such as auctions, Mystery Baseball sales and more.

ON THE ROAD TO OMAHA

- Oregon State INF Nick Madrigal, the White Sox first-round pick (No. 4 overall) in the First-Year Player Draft, went 1-4 with a run scored yesterday as the No. 3 Beavers defeated Minnesota, 8-1, in an NCAA Super Regional game in Corvallis, Ore.
- Game 2 of the series is scheduled for tonight at 8:30 p.m. CT.

WHITE SOX VS. BOSTON

- The White Sox lead the season series, 1-0, after last night ending a five-game losing streak at Fenway Park.
- Chicago went 1-6 against the Red Sox in 2017, winning the opener before dropping the final six ... Boston's four-game sweep on 8/3-6/17 was its first against the White Sox at Fenway Park since 7/21-24/88.
- The White Sox batted .242/.287/.348 with a 6.13 ERA (42 ER/61.2 IP) and were outscored by the Red Sox, 43-24.
- Chicago trails in the all-time series, 940-982, going 542-417 at home (54-59 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 398-564 on the road (351-497 at Fenway Park).

SOX CONNECTIONS

- White Sox INF Yoán Moncada appeared in eight games with the Red Sox in 2016 after signing as an international free agent on 3/12/15.
- Red Sox LHP Chris Sale was selected by the White Sox in the first round of the 2010 draft and pitched for the club from 2010-17.

LOOKING FOR AN EDGE VS. THE EAST

- The White Sox are 184-225 vs. the American League East since 2007, with their only winning record during that span coming in 2016 (19-14).
- The Sox are 5-6 vs. the AL East this season (2-2 on the road) after going 13-20 in 2017.

NO REST FOR THE WEARY

• The White Sox are in the middle of a stretch from 6/5-24 where they play 21 games in 20 days from 6/5-24 (3-2 so far) ... they also are in the middle of a stretch from 5/25-6/10 where they play 13 of 16 games on the road.

ON THE FARM

- Class AAA Charlotte RHP Michael Kopech, the No. 8 prospect in baseball per MLB Pipeline, struck out 10 batters over 6.0 IP last night vs. Lehigh Valley.
- Kopech recorded his 11th career game with 10-plus strikeouts ... he is tied for the International League lead with 80 strikeouts and is averaging 12.13 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (59.1 IP).

HAWK'S FAREWELL

- Ken "Hawk" Harrelson, who is in his 33rd and final season in the White Sox television booth in 2018, will work primarily Sunday home games this season as well as select other contests.
- Harrelson played for the Red Sox from 1967-69 and worked in the their broadcast booth from 1975-81 ... he was a member of the 1967 "Impossible Dream" Red Sox team that lost to St. Louis in the World Series and was named American League Player of the Year in 1968 after leading the majors with 109 RBI and ranking third with 35 home runs.
- Harrelson will serve as a White Sox ambassador throughout the 2019 season, marking his eighth decade in baseball.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

• The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,340 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, three more than the second-place New York Mets (1,337) and 43 more than Oakland (1,295), the next-closest American League team.

STOP! THIEF!

- The White Sox lead the major leagues with 53 stolen bases this season and rank second with an 82.8 (53-64) success rate.
- The Sox are on pace to steal 141 bases, which would be seven less than their combined total of 148 from 2016-17 ... they have not led the majors in steals since 1966 (153).

TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors this season with 18 triples ... the Sox led the AL with 37 triples last season, their highest total since 1999 (also 37).
- Yolmer Sánchez is tied for the major-league lead with six triples in 2018 after ranking sixth last season with eight.

NO RISP, NO REWARD

• The White Sox rank 12th in the American League with a .234 (108-462) average with RISP in 2018 ... the Sox are hitting .205 (25-122) with RISP in their last 18 road games (since 5/1).

AT THE HELM

- Rick Renteria is in his second season after being named the 40th manager in White Sox history on 10/3/16.
- Renteria was the only Latino manager in the major leagues in 2017 but has been joined by Boston's Alex Cora and Washington's Dave Martinez in 2018.

RODÓN AT A GLANCE

- The 24-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his season debut.
- Is making his first start since 9/2/17 vs. Tampa Bay after begining the season on the disabled list to continue his rehabilitation from left shoulder surgery.
- Began the 2017 season on the disabled list with left biceps bursitis . went 2-5 with a 4.15 ERA (32 ER/ 69.1 IP) and 76 strikeouts over 12 starts before going back on the disabled list with left shoulder inflammation ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- His 383 career strikeouts are the most by a White Sox pitcher in his first 66 career games ... is averaging 9.22 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (383 SO/373.2 IP) lifetime ... has struck out 10-plus in five of his last 14 starts dating back to 2016.
- Was selected in the first round (third overall) in the June 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of North Carolina State University ... was the highest pick by the Sox since taking outfielder Harold Baines first overall in 1977.

 • Entered the 2014 draft rated by Baseball America as the No. 1 college prospect and the No. 3 prospect
- overall ... was rated by MLB.com as the No. 2 overall prospect.

LAST START

 Posted a no decision on 9/2/17 vs. Tampa Bay, allowing one run on two hits over 4.0 IP ... walked three and struck out four ... threw 69 pitches (41 strikes) before he was removed with a 3-1 lead following a rain delay of 1:18 ... Sox won. 5-4.

CARLOS ON THE MEND

 Made four rehab starts during his stint on the disabled list: one with Class A Kannapolis and three with Class AAA Charlotte ... received a no decision in his only start with Kannapolis on 5/19 vs. Hickory ... allowed one run on three hits with no walks and six strikeouts over 5.0 IP ... went 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP), five walks and 22 strikeouts over three starts with Charlotte ... opponents hit .222 (10-45).

2017 REVIEW

- Began the 2017 season on the disabled list with left biceps bursitis ... went 2-5 with a 4.15 ERA (32 ER/ 69.1 IP) and 76 strikeouts over 12 starts before going back on the disabled list with left shoulder inflammation underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- Made five straight quality starts from 7/30-8/21-1 and pitched into the eighth inning or later in three straight starts for the first time in his career from 8/4-16
- His streak of 90 consecutive batters faced without issuing a walk ended on 8/16 at Los Angeles-NL matched his career high with 8.0 IP on 8/10 vs. Houston
- Struck out 10-plus batters for the seventh time in his career and third time in 2017 on 8/4 at Boston . joined Sale (five times) and Jake Peavy (twice) as the only Sox pitchers since 2012 to record 11-plus strikeouts with zero walks in a game.
- Posted a ND on 7/30 vs. Cleveland despite allowing one run over 6.2 IP ... matched his career high with 11 strikeouts over 4.0 IP on 7/25 at the Cubs ... according to STATS, became the first pitcher since at least 1913 to work 4.0 IP or fewer in a start or relief appearance and record 11 strikeouts or more.
- Earned his first win on 7/3 at Oakland, allowing two runs on four hits over 6.1 IP ... made his season debut on 6/28 vs. the Yankees (L; 0 ER/5.0 IP; allowed three unearned runs).

- Has averaged 9.22 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (383 SO/369.2 IP) over his career, the 11th-best mark in the AL since 2015 (minimum 350.0 IP).
- Has recorded 10-plus strikeouts seven times in his career, including a career-high 11 on four occasions: 8/4/17 at Boston, 7/25/17 at the Cubs, 9/25/16 at Cleveland and 8/11/15 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

QUALITY KID

- Six of his 12 starts last season were quality, including five straight from 7/30-8/21.
- Made 17 quality starts in 2016, going 9-3 with a 2.16 ERA (26 ER/108.1 IP) in those outings ... recorded 16 quality starts in 2015, the most among American League rookies and second-most among major-league rookies behind Cincinnati's Anthony DeSclafani (17).
- Recorded 10 consecutive quality starts from 8/11/15-4/13/16 ... went 6-3 with a 1.73 ERA (13 ER/67.2 IP), 61 strikeouts and a .202 (48-236) opponents average during that span.
- Is 20-8 with a 2.38 ERA (74 ER/280.1 IP) in 43 career starts when working at least 6.0 IP (39 QS).

LOCKDOWN ON LEFTIES

- Is limiting lefties to a .226 (74-327) average with four home runs in his career ... right-handers are batting .271 (296-1,094) with 42 homers
- David Ortiz, Robinson Canó, Charlie Blackmon and Corey Seager are the only lefties to homer off Rodón.

THE BEASTS OF THE EAST

- Is 0-4 with a 3.50 ERA (18 ER/46.1 IP), 48 strikeouts and a .250 opponents average (47-182) over his last eight starts vs. the American League East ... last win came on 9/25/15 at the Yankees (2 ER/6.0 IP)
- Has gone 1-6 with a 4.77 ERA (35 ER/66.0 IP), 67 strikeouts and a .269 opponents average (70-260) in 13 career appearances (12 starts) against the division.

VS. BOSTON RED SOX

- Is scheduled to make his third career start vs. Boston ... is 0-1 with a 3.29 ERA (5 ER/13.2 IP), 17 strikeouts and a .235 opponents average (12-51) lifetime
- Posted a no decision in his last start on 8/4/17 at Fenway Park, allowing two runs on six hits with a careerhigh tying 11 strikeouts over 7.2 IP ... suffered the loss on 5/4/16 at Guaranteed Rate Field (3 ER/6.0 IP).

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER

- RHP Reynaldo López (1-4, 3.42) is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season, eighth on the road and first career against the Boston Red Sox ... marks his third consecutive start on the road (last start at home came on 5/20 vs. Texas).
- Is 0-3 with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP) and .266 (37-139) opp. average over seven road starts in 2018. Received a no decision in his last start on 6/5-1 at Minnesota, allowing one hit with four walks and four
- strikeouts over 7.0 scoreless IP ... Nate Jones surrendered four runs on three hits, including a go-ahead. three-run home run to Eduardo Escobar in the eighth inning ... the Sox lost 4-2
- Is receiving a 3.17 run support average (25 RS/71.0 IP) this season, the seventh-lowest in baseball.
- Has gone 0-2 with a 4.91 ERA (8 ER/14.2 IP). 15 strikeouts and a .246 opponents average (14-57) over three career starts (two quality) against the American League East.
