AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 1-4 so far on their seven-game road trip...won the opener of their 3G at Chicago-AL after being swept in 4G at Boston...return to New York on Thursday to begin a season-long 11-game homestand, with 4G vs. Texas (Thurs.-Sun.), 1G vs. the Mets (Mon.), 3G vs. Tampa Bay (8/14-16) and 3G vs. Toronto (8/17-19).

- ▶ Snapped their season-high five-game losing streak on Monday...was just their second losing streak of more than four games since the start of 2017 (lost seven straight from 6/13-20/17)...prior to this streak, had been one of two teams that had not lost more than three consecutive games in 2018 (also Boston).
- ▶ At 69-42 (.622), have the Majors' third-most wins and third-best record behind Boston (79-34, .699) and Houston (72-42, .632)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 84 of the last 96 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 27G over .500...are 1-5 since reaching their season high watermark of 31G over at the end of play on 7/31...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are 9.0G behind first-place Boston in the AL East.
- ▶ Have lost just five of their last 32 series, going 21-5-6 since 4/19...are 60-33 in their last 93G...are 7-10 in their last 17 games.
- ▶ Are 51-9 (.850) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 43-6 (.878) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 2-5 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees snapped a five-game losing streak with a 7-0 win on Monday at Chicago-AL...**RHP Lance Lynn** allowed just 2H and 1BB over 7.1 scoreless innings, tying his season high with 9K and earning the win in his first start as a Yankee...retired 19 consecutive batters from the first inning to the seventh...**RHP A.J. Cole** (1.2IP, 1H, 1BB, 2K) completed the combined three-hitter...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-5, 1R, 2RBI) and **3B Neil Walker** (2-for-4, 1R, 2RBI) both homered...**SS Didi Gregorius** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1RBI, 1BB) and **CF Aaron Hicks** (2-for-5, 1RBI) also had multi-hit efforts.

- ▶ Marked their ninth shutout of the season, tied for seventh-most in the Majors (7-of-9 have been on the road).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters hit 2HR in Monday's win, just their fourth multi-HR effort in 16 games since the All-Star break (16HR in that span)...**Didi Gregorius'** fourth-inning double snapped the team's string of 58 plate appearances without an extra-base hit (since Gregorius' ninth-inning double on Sat. at Boston).

- ▶ Have hit a Major League-leading 177HR...are on pace to hit 258HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Rank second in the Majors in runs (571), runs per game (5.14), SLG (.454), OPS (.784) and XBH (392).

50/50: The Yankees are one of four Major League clubs that have five-or-more hitters with at least 50RBI this season: Giancarlo Stanton (67), Didi Gregorius (66), Aaron Judge (61), Gleyber Torres (52), Aaron Hicks (50)...the others: Boston (6), Cleveland (5), Seattle (5).

- ▶ Despite the Yankees ranking second in the Majors in runs scored, Stanton's 67RBI are tied for just the 14th-most among players who lead their team...just one Yankee has reached the 100RBI mark in a season since 2014 (Judge-114 in 2017) after the team had at least one 100RBI player in 18 consecutive seasons from 1996-2013.

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 17-5 (.773) vs. the AL Central this season, the second-highest winning percentage of any AL team against an AL division this season (Oakland, 21-6, .778 vs. AL Central)...are 21-5 in their last 26G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...are 43-18 (.705) outside the AL East and 26-24 (.520) vs. the AL East.

- ▶ Are 76-44 (.633) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015, the highest winning pct. by an AL team against any AL division in that span...are 22-8-5 in 35 completed series over the span (min. 2G).

LYNN-SANITY: RHP Lance Lynn allowed just 2H and 1BB over 7.1 scoreless innings on Monday at Chicago-AL, tying his season high with 9K and earning the win in his first start as a Yankee.

- ▶ Was his ninth career start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings and 3H-or-fewer, the fourth such start by a Yankee in 2018.
- ▶ Was the first Yankees starter in six games this month to complete 6.0IP and just the second to complete 7.0IP in the team's last 32 games (since 6/30).
- ▶ In two appearances (one start) with the Yankees, has tossed 11.2 scoreless innings (7H, 1BB, 14K)...is the longest scoreless streak to begin a Yankees tenure since Andrew Miller's club-record 17.2 innings in 2015.
- ▶ Has walked just 1-of-42 batters with the Yankees (2.4%) after walking 13.2% of batters faced as a Twin.
- ▶ Is 3-1 with a 2.15 ERA (37.2IP, 9ER) and 50K in six career starts against the White Sox.

STARTING XI: With RHP Lance Lynn's start on Monday, the Yankees have used 11 different starting pitchers this season...have used seven different starters in their last 8G, eight different starters in their last 12G, and nine starters in 16G since the All-Star break.

- ▶ The 11 starting pitchers are tied for their highest single-season total in the last four years (also had 11 in 2017).

GLEYSER DAY: 2B Gleyber Torres went 2-for-5 with a solo HR and 2RBI on Mon. at Chicago-AL...marked his 18th HR, most among AL rookies and tied for the eighth-highest total by a rookie in Yankees history...has 3RBI in his last 2G and 10RBI in 12G since returning from the D.L. on 7/25...is second among MLB rookies with 52RBI in 75G this season (Miami's Brian Anderson-53).

- ▶ Has collected all 52RBI while playing either 2B or SS...are the fifth-most RBI as a middle infielder through 75 career games in Major League history, behind Yankees Tony Lazzeri (65) and Joe Gordon (65), Pittsburgh's Glenn Wright (56) and Colorado's Juan Uribe (54).
- ▶ Was the seventh-fastest Yankee to reach 50 career RBI, doing it in his 74th game on Sun. at Boston.

PICKING UP HICKS: CF Aaron Hicks has reached safely in 23-of-46 plate appearances in his last 11G, batting .333/.500/.545 (11-for-33) with 10R, 1 double, 2HR, 6RBI and 12BB.

- ▶ Has drawn at least 1BB in 12 of his last 14 starts (16BB total)...had a streak of 10 consecutive starts with at least 1BB from 7/15-8/2, the second-longest streak in the Majors this season (Joey Votto-11 starts from 6/15-26).
- ▶ Ranks ninth among Major League outfielders (and third among CF) with a career-high-tying 3.3 WAR (FanGraphs).

THE WALK SHOW: INF Neil Walker is batting .357/.415/.536 (20-for-56) with 9R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 12RBI and 6BB in his last 19G (since 7/9) to raise his season BA by 42 points.

- ▶ In eight career games vs. the White Sox, is hitting .344 (11-for-32) with 7R, 1 double, 4HR, 6RBI and 3BB...Monday was his first career game at Guaranteed Rate Field.

IN THE ZONE: Monday was the Yankees' first game outside the Eastern Time Zone since 5/23 at Texas, ending a stretch of 63 consecutive games in the E.T.Z. (went 37-26 in that span).

- ▶ Are 10-4 in 14 games outside the Eastern Time Zone in 2018.

PERFECTLY IMPERFECT: In his second start with Single-A Tampa, 19-year-old RHP Deivi Garcia retired all 21BF over 7.0 perfect innings with 12K in a scheduled seven-inning game on Monday vs. Clearwater...the Tarpons lost the game, 1-0, in eight innings, as RHP Christian Morris finished the eight-inning no-hitter but allowed the run to score on an error (Minor League Baseball's new rule requires teams to start with a runner on second base in each extra inning)...the two Tarpons pitchers combined to not allow a hit, walk or hit batsman in 8.0IP.

- ▶ Marked the second time in Garcia's last three starts that he recorded 12K (also 7/25 w/ Single-A Charleston vs. Augusta)...his 14.10 K/9.0IP ratio (82K/52.1IP) is fifth-highest among minor league pitchers with at least 50.0IP.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 7, 1962: In his first game back after serving in the military, Tony Kubek hits a three-run home run in his first at-bat, leading the Yankees to a 14-1 win vs. Minnesota.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 8, 1972: The Yankees sign a 30-year lease to play in the remodeled Yankee Stadium, with completion scheduled in 1976.

Aug. 8, 1958: A Jehovah's Witnesses convention draws a single-day Yankee Stadium-record 123,707 people.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CC SABATHIA (6-4, 3.59 ERA)

LHP CC Sabathia will make his 21st start of the season tonight at Chicago-AL...the 38-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...took a no-decision in his last start in the Yankees' 15-7 loss at Boston on Thursday (3.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 4BB, 2K, 1HR)...was just his 15th career start tossing 3.0 innings-or-fewer and first since 8/8/17 at Toronto (also 3.0IP)...is seeking his third straight season with a sub-4.00 ERA after recording at least a 4.50 ERA in all three seasons from 2013-15...was on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain...has 243 career wins, **tied with Juan Marichal (243) for 53rd place on Baseball's all-time wins list** (next up is Jack Powell-244)...leads active Major League pitchers in career strikeouts (2,933), complete games (38) and quality starts (309)...ranks second in wins (243), innings pitched (3,424.2) and starts (529) to Bartolo Colon (245 wins, 3,438.2IP, 548 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,933), third all-time among left-handers...his 2,805K in the AL are sixth-most in AL history (most among left-handers)...is one of eight pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to earn at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...originally signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08 and re-signed as a free agent to a one-year contract for the 2018 season on 12/26/17...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher (10 seasons since 2009), as only OF Brett Gardner (11 seasons since 2008) has played for the team longer...is one of four players currently on a 40-man roster who were active in 2001 (Adrián Beltré, Bartolo Colon, Albert Pujols)...has earned wins against 29 Major League teams (has not defeated the Marlins)...is in his 18th Major League season, second-most among active pitchers (Colon, 21).

LAST START: Took a no-decision in the Yankees' 15-7 loss at Boston on Thursday (3.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 4BB, 2K, 1HR)...was just his 15th career start tossing 3.0 innings-or-fewer and first since 8/8/17 at Toronto (also 3.0IP)...allowed a bases-loaded walk to Mookie Betts in the second and a solo HR to Steve Pearce in the third...threw 77 pitches.
 ✦ Marked his 275th start as a Yankee, surpassing Bob Shawkey for sole possession of eighth place on the club's all-time starts list.

KEEPIN' IT 🔥: Reached 100.0 innings for the season on 7/14 at Cleveland...marks his 17th season with at least 100.0IP (2001-13, '15-18), the most by any pitcher since Tim Wakefield did it in 18 seasons (1993, '95-2011).

CC THE STOPPER: Since the start of 2017, is 12-0 with a 2.80 ERA (119.0IP, 37ER) in 21 regular season starts following a Yankees loss.

2018: Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in seven of his last 10 starts (since 6/5)...has held lefties to a .173 BA (13-for-75) with 3HR, 10BB and 21K this season...his .165 opp. BA (16-for-97) with RISP is tied for the third-lowest in the AL and tied for sixth-lowest in the Majors...has retired 87-of-113 batters leading off innings (.239 opp. OBP).

- ✦ Opponents are hitting .226 (37-for-164) the first time through the lineup, .208 (33-for-159) the second time and .376 (35-for-93) the third time.
- ✦ In a loss on 6/17 vs. Tampa Bay, recorded 10K, his 38th career double-digit-strikeout game and just his second since the start of 2014 (also 8/17/16 vs. Toronto-12K)...also allowed 10H for the first time since 5/4/14 vs. Tampa Bay.
- ✦ Had a three-start streak with at least 6.0IP and 1R-or-fewer from 4/24-5/4, his second-longest as a Yankee (had at least 7.0IP and 1R-or-fewer in five straight starts from 6/25-7/16/11).

CENTRAL PERK: In five starts against AL Central opponents this season, has gone 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (27.1IP, 8ER)...since the start of 2017, is 4-2 with a 2.94 ERA (52.0IP, 17ER) in nine starts vs. the AL Central...in his career, has gone 85-44 with a 3.54 ERA (1,102.0IP, 433ER) in 168 starts against the AL Central, the second-most wins by any pitcher against the division in Baseball history (Mark Buehrle, 92-61).

VS. CHICAGO-AL: Is 19-6 with a 3.78 ERA (228.1IP, 96ER) in 35 career starts vs. the White Sox, tied for his fourth-highest win total against any opponent (21-Detroit and Kansas City; 20-Minnesota; 19-Baltimore).

- ✦ His .760 winning pct. is the fourth-highest (min. 15 decisions) by any opposing pitcher in White Sox history, trailing only Dave Stieb's .808 winning percentage (21-5 from 1979-98), Milt Pappas' .773 mark (17-5 from 1958-65) and Dick Fowler's .765 win. pct. (13-4 from 1941-52)...is tied for the seventh-highest by an active pitcher vs. any opponent (min. 15 decisions).
- ✦ Is 5-2 with a 4.12 ERA (63.1IP, 29ER) in nine starts as a Yankee, completing at least 7.0IP in seven of the nine.

ROAD WARRIOR: Has suffered three of his four losses on the road this season...is 2-3 with a 4.75 ERA (47.1IP, 25ER) in nine road turns...has permitted 9HR in his last seven starts away from Yankee Stadium...has lost just four of his last 19 road starts (8-4 since 5/16/17).

ACTIVE LEADERBOARD/CAREER MILESTONES: Ranks 17th on the all-time strikeout list with 2,933K, trailing 16th-place John Smoltz (3,084) by 151K...is third all-time among left-handers (4,875-Randy Johnson; 4,136-Steve Carlton)...ranks fourth in franchise history with 1,540K; surpassed Red Ruffing (1,527) on 7/9-G1 at Baltimore...collected his 1,500th strikeout as a Yankee on 6/12 vs. Washington, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to reach the mark...his 2,805K in the AL are sixth-most in AL history and the most by an AL left-hander; trails Mike Mussina (2,813) by 8K.

- ✦ With his 243rd win on 7/4 vs. Atlanta, tied Juan Marichal (243) for 53rd place on Baseball's all-time wins list...needs one win to match Jack Powell (244) for 52nd place...is 12th on the Yankees' all-time wins list with 126, two behind Jack Chesbro (128).
- ✦ With 529 career starts, is tied with Eddie Plank and Rick Reuschel for 34th place on the all-time list.
- ✦ His 275 starts as a Yankee are one behind Waite Hoyt (276) for eighth on the franchise's all-time list.
