RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue a three-game weekend series at division-rival Cincinnati today...in last night's series opener, **Jedd Gyorko's** RBI single was the difference as St. Louis defeated the Reds in extras after a 36-minute rain delay before the bottom of the ninth...St. Louis began the day in 3rd place in the NL Central, 3.0 games back of the 1st place Brewers...the Redbirds are 6-4 in their last 10 games and 11-9 over their previous 20.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Cardinals have played a MLB-high 10 extra inning games this season, (5-5 record). St. Louis' 10 extra inning games in their first 61 games of the season are its most since playing 12 such games during the 1986 season (5-7 record)...St. Louis' record for extra-inning affairs is 26 (1920, 1957, 1992).

RED HOT BIRDS: St. Louis has won 12 straight contests against the Reds since September 14, 2017, tied for their 2nd-longest win streak against Cincinnati in franchise history (also June 1, 1931-April 25, 1932). The Cardinals all-time best win streak against the Reds is an 18-gamer from July 4, 1930-May 23, 1931.

STREAKING: The Cardinals have won 10 straight at the Great American Ball Park, their longest win streak at the most current home of the Reds and also tied for their longest ever in Cincinnati, matching 10 straight wins from August 1, 1930-May 23, 1931 at Crosley Field. The longest road win streak by any team in Cincinnati is held by the Brooklyn Dodgers (19) from June 22, 1947-May 22, 1949. The Cardinals' longest road win streak against the same opponent is 18 against the Pittsburgh Pirates at Forbes Field from May 7, 1964-April 15, 1966.

WAKA WAKA: **Michael Wacha** ranks T3rd among active pitchers with 10 career wins against Cincinnati (**Jaime Garcia** & **Lance Lynn**, 11), while his 2.88 ERA is the 2nd-lowest mark (**Cole Hamels**, 1.93) (min. 15 car. starts). St. Louis has won Wacha's last 12 starts vs. the Reds, as he's gone 9-0 with a 2.42 ERA. The last Cardinal to win 10 straight vs. CIN was **Chris Carpenter** (8/15/06-9/5/10).

FREE PASSES: With his trio of walks last night, **Matt Carpenter** passed **Keith Hernandez** (1974-83) for 10th all-time in Cardinals history with his 106th multiple walk game...he also moved into 10th in franchise history with his 16th career three-walk effort, passing **Rogers Hornsby** (1915-26, '33), **Keith Hernandez**, and **Jack Clark** (1985-87), who each had 15 games with three walks.

CHICKS DID THE LONG BALL: The Cardinals have homered in 43 of their first 61 games, going 31-12 (.721 win pct.) in those games (3-15 when not homering)... among NL clubs, only Milwaukee (32-8; .800) has a better winning pct. when going yard...St. Louis' 74 home runs are T5th-most in the NL.

MR. CARDINAL: The St. Louis Cardinals organization, the St. Louis community and baseball fans everywhere were saddened Wednesday to learn of the passing of Hall of Famer **Albert Fred "Red" Schoendienst** at the age of 95. "Red was one of the greatest Cardinals of all time, and a beloved member of the Cardinals organization for over six decades," said Cardinals Principal Owner & Chief Executive Officer **William O. DeWitt, Jr.** "His influence on this organization cannot be overstated. Red was a great player, a great manager, and a wonderful mentor to countless players, coaches, and members of the front office. He was also a fan favorite who connected with millions of Cardinals fans across multiple generations. He will be sorely missed." Schoendienst was the oldest living member of the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Cardinals Manager **Mike Matheny** was born in Columbus, Ohio...graduated from Reynoldsburg High School (1988)...his daughter, Katie, played women's ice hockey at The Ohio State University.

Cardinals outfielder **Marcell Ozuna** and Reds pitcher **Austin Brice** were Marlins teammates in 2016.

Cardinals pitcher **Michael Wacha's** uncle, **Dusty Rogers**, was a Reds first round draft pick in 1984 and played in their minor league organization for five seasons (1984-88).

Cardinals pitcher **Mike Mayers** graduated from nearby Grove City (Ohio) High School.

Reds Executive Advisor to the CEO **Walt Jocketty** served as the Cardinals General Manager for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, the Cardinals compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06)...the Cardinals recorded seven straight winning seasons under Jocketty, including a pair of 100+ win seasons ('04-05)... named MLB Executive of the Year (2000, '04, '10).

Reds Player Performance Special Asst. **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds interim manager **Jim Riggleman** spent 18 seasons (1976-90, 2005-07) in the Cardinals system as a minor league player (1976-81), minor league coach (AA-Arkansas, 1981), minor league manager (High-A-St. Petersburg, '82-84 & AA-Arkansas, '85-88), Director of Player Development ('88-89), St. Louis First Base Coach (1989-90) and minor league fielding coordinator (2005-07).

Reds assistant pitching/bullpen coach **Ted Power** pitched in 23 games for St. Louis in 1989.

Reds catching coach **Mike Stefanski** played parts for six seasons in the Cardinals minors (1996-2001)...originally acquired by St. Louis from Milwaukee for catcher **Marc Ronan** (Nov. 19, 1995).

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis from 1986-90.

Reds Special Assistant to the General Manager, Player Personnel **Cam Bonifay** worked for the Cardinals as a special assistant, evaluating the American League East from October of 2007-08.

Reds pro scout **Bruce Manno** worked in the Cardinals front office for six seasons as Director of Player Development (2002-06) and Senior Director of Pro Scouting & Special Assistant to the General Manager (2007) before joining Atlanta.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **Marty Maier** spent 24 seasons with St. Louis as an area scout, Latin American coordinator, asst. director of scouting, scouting director and special asst. to the GM.

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds during his final professional season in 2010.

Reds broadcaster **George Grande** was a Cardinals play-by-play announcer for two seasons (1991-92).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Officer **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds, and a shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...is father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds President and Chief Executive Office **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were investors in the Cardinals from 1995-2006...their interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

Reds Media Relations Intern **Ben Barnette** was a 2015 Cardinals Spring Training Intern and 2016 Memphis Redbirds (AAA) Media Relations Intern.

- His seven-game active win streak is T2nd in the NL (Scherzer, WSH - 9).

- Beat Cincinnati in consecutive starts (4/12 & 4/20), improving to 10-1 lifetime in 16 starts against the Reds.

CAREER

- Of his 124 career starts, 77 have been at least 6.0 innings (71 quality).
- Is a lifetime 29-12 with a 3.39 ERA in 71 games (65 starts/39 quality starts) at Busch Stadium...his .707 home win pct. ranks 6th in MLB since 2013.
- His .627 winning percentage (52-31) over the past six seasons (2013-2018) ranks 10th among National League pitchers.
