TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Dodgers continue their National League Division Series tonight with Game 2 at Dodger Stadium...The clubs met seven times in the regular season, with the Dodgers winning five of the games, and outscoring the Braves by a combined score of 35-18...The Dodgers beat the Braves, 3-games-to-1, in the 2013 NLDS, the last time Atlanta was in the postseason.

A The teams' first series came June 8-10 here in Los Angeles, with the Dodgers winning two of three... The clubs met again, July 25-29 at SunTrust Park, and the Dodgers won the first three before Sean Newcomb carried a no-hitter for 8.2 innings in the final game to help the Braves win, 4-1.

A Since the beginning of 2013, the Braves are 6-17 (.261) here at Dodger Stadium, including losing Game 3 and 4 of the NLDS in 2013, and last night's series opener

A RHP Anibal Sánchez beat the Dodgers here in Los Angeles earlier this season on June 9, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs, earned, in a 5-3 win...The Dodgers then beat him, 8-2, on July 26 at SunTrust Park after the righty allowed five runs, four earned, over 6.1 innings...For his career, Sánchez is 1-2 with a 3.63 ERA (16 ER/39.2 IP) in seven career appearances, all starts, against the Dodgers.

A LHP Clayton Kershaw has never lost to Atlanta, and earned the win in his lone start against them this season, a 4-1 win on July 27 here in Los Angeles...The lefty has faced the Braves twice in the playoffs, including starting the clinching game of the 2013 NLDS...Kershaw took a no-decision in that game, and over his two postseason starts against the Braves, has allowed three runs, one earned (0.69 ERA), with 18 strikeouts in 13 innings.

LOSS: The Braves lost their eighth consecutive postseason series opener last night, dropping a 6-0 decision to Los Angeles...They last won a Game 1 in 2001, when they swept Houston in the NLDS.

A That win over Houston was the last time the Braves won a playoff round.

A The Braves have lost eight consecutive playoff rounds (including the 2012 Wild Card game), dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona..That streak is the second longest in MLB history...Only Chicago (NL) owns a longer such skid, losing 10 consecutive rounds from 1910 through 1998...Credit to Elias for the research.

A The Braves are 3-15 in postseason play when they drop Game 1...They last won a series when dropping Game 1 in 1999, when they lost 6-1 vs. Houston in the NLDS before going on to win the next three games.

A The also won the 1991 LCS over Pittsburgh after losing Game 1 and the 1957 World Series.

GAME 2: The Braves are set to play their 34th Game 2 of a playoff round tonight, and they are 24-9 (.727) in these games...They have won eight consecutive such games, with the last seven of those wins following a Game 1 loss.

A Overall, the Braves are 12-6 (.667) in Game 2 when dropping Game 1.

A The Braves 1-8 in series when they drop Game 2... Their only victory came in the 1996 LCS, when they lost to St. Louis and rebounded to win the series in seven games.

THE POSTSEASON: This series will be the Braves' 35th postseason matchup in franchise history, and their first since losing 3-1 in 2013 Division Series to the Los Angeles Dodgers...They are 78-87 (.473) all-time in the postseason, despite having outscored the opposition 657-631 (+26 run differential).

A Prior to this season, the Braves played in 13 division series (6-7), 11 league championship series (5-6), nine World Series (3-6) and one wild card game (0-1).

WITH TWO OUTS: The Braves' six hits last night were all two-out singles, as they advanced only two runners as far as second base.

A The Braves scored 290 two-out runs this season, the third most in the N.L., and trailing only Milwaukee (316) and Washington (313) for the league lead.

A The Braves hit .254 and compiled a .340 on-base percentage in these situations, both second best in the league.

SIX STRAIGHT: 1B Freddie Freeman singled in the first inning last night, and has now hit in all six of his postseason games (9-for-24, .375).

A The last Braves player to open his postseason career with a longer hitting streak was C Brian McCann, who hit in his first seven from 2005-2010.

A The franchise record is 15 games by Marquis Grissom, from 1995-1996...The outfielder hit .377 (26-for-69) over the stretch.

A Grissom's run is also the longest hitting streak of any kind in Braves postseason history.

VS. LHP: The Braves went 21-26 (.447) against left-handed starters in the regular season this year...They were 69-46 (.600) in games started by a right-hander.

A Despite the losing record against left-handed starters, the Braves hit .269 (426-for-1582) overall against lefties, the third-best mark in baseball...Their .336 on-base percentage was also third best, while their .444 slugging percentage was fourth.

A 1B Freddie Freeman hit .309 (63-for-204) against lefties this season, the second-best mark among left-handed hitters...Only Christian Yelich was better.

Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his 25th start of the season (26th appearance) and the 287th (310th appearance) of his career.
- A* Set for the eighth game and seventh start of his postseason career...Is 2-4 with a 2.79 ERA (12 ER/38.2 IP) and 43 strikeouts in his first seven games.
 - A* Last pitched in the postseason in the 2014 American League Division Series while with Detroit, and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in relief at Baltimore.
 - A* Last started a playoff game in 2013, when he pitched Game 5 of the ALCS vs. Boston, also with the Tigers...Allowed nine hits and four runs (three earned) over 6.0 innings to take the loss.
- A* Signed by the Braves to a minor-league contract on March 16 before having his contract selected from Triple-A Gwinnett on April 2...Spent the remainder of the season in Atlanta.
 - A* Went 7-6 with a 2.83 ERA (43 ER/136.2 IP) in 25 games, including 24 starts.
- A* Pitched to a 2.83 ERA but earned just seven wins...Was one of two pitchers in the majors this season with at least 20 starts, an ERA under 3.00 and seven or fewer wins...Tampa Bay opener Ryne Stanek did so, but pitched just 66.1 innings.
 - A* Only one other Braves pitcher in franchise history has compiled an ERA under 3.00 over at least 20 starts and won no more than seven games...Hall-of-Famer Old Hoss Raddbourn went 7-16 with a 2.87 ERA (66 ER/207.0 IP) for the 1888 Boston Beaneaters.
- A* Received just 3.36 average runs of support while on the mound this season, third fewest in the N.L. among pitchers with 20 or more starts.
 - A* Was supported with no more than two runs in 18 of his appearances this season, including 10 of his final 12 starts.
- A* Set for his eighth career start against Los Angeles, and his third this season...Is 1-2 with a 3.63 ERA (16 ER/39.2 IP) over his first seven turns.
 - A* Went 1-1 with a 4.63 ERA (6 ER/11.2 IP) in two starts against them this season...Earned the win at Dodger Stadium, June 9, after allowing three hits and two runs over 5.1 innings.
 - A* The win was the first of his career against the Dodgers, and he defeated San Diego in his next start, also his first... Entered the stretch winless against just three major league teams, all three of which played in California...Was winless against the Dodgers, Padres and Los Angeles Angels (0-4) before defeating Los Angeles-NL and San Diego in consecutive turns this season.
 - A* Has made three career starts at Dodger Stadium, and is 1-0 with a 1.65 ERA (3 ER/16.1 IP) and a .207 opponents' average.

2018 Recap

- A* Missed 37 games with a right hamstring strain, 4/18-5/29...Also left his starts on 8/25 at MIA (right hamstring tightness) and 6/26 vs. CIN (cramping in his right calf).
- A* Fanned six batters, 8/14 vs. MIA, including Brian Anderson in the first inning...The strikeout of Anderson was the 1,500th of his major league career.
 - A* Nineteen players currently on a 40-man roster have reached the 1,500-strikeout plateau, paced by CC Sabathia (2,952 in 18 major league seasons).
- A* Defeated Washington, 8-5, on 7/20 at Nationals Park...Allowed six hits and three runs over 6.0 innings.
 - A* His 2.08 career ERA (36 ER/155.2 IP) against the Nationals/Expos is the lowest all-time mark by a qualifying pitcher against the franchise.
 - A* His .909 (10-1) winning percentage is also the best mark all-time against the Nationals/Expos (minimum 10 decisions).
- A* Took his first loss of the season, 6/20 at TOR...Allowed five hits and a season-high tying four runs over 5.0 innings...Set season highs in walks (4) and strikeouts (7).
 - A* The loss snapped a streak of three straight wins to open the season...Opened a season 3-0 for the second time in his career...Won the first four decisions of his major league career to open his rookie campaign 4-0 in 2006.
- A* Won two consecutive starts, 6/9 at LAD (5.1 IP, 2 R) and 6/14 vs. SD (7.0 IP, 0 R)...The wins were the first of his career against each team.
 - A* Entered the stretch winless against just three major league teams, all three of which played in California...Was winless against the Dodgers, Padres and Angels (0-4) before defeating Los Angeles-NL and San Diego in his last two turns.
- A* Made his Braves debut with 3.0 innings of scoreless relief on 4/2 vs. WSH...Allowed one hit and three walks after having his contract selected from Triple-A Gwinnett that afternoon.
 - A* Signed by Atlanta to a minor-league contract on 3/16 after spending the bulk of spring training in camp with the Twins...Signed a one-year major league contract with Minnesota on 2/22 before the club granted him his unconditional release on 3/13.

Career Recap

- A* 2018 marks his 13th major league campaign...Played the first six-and-a-half seasons (2006-12) of his career with the Marlins, before spending the last five-and-a-half seasons (2012-17) with Detroit.
- A* Led the American League with a 2.57 ERA in 2013.

- In his first postseason...Made his MLB debut this season on 4/25 at CIN and finished hitting .293 (127-for-433) with a team-high 26 home runs and a .917 OPS in 111 games...Became the first rookie to lead a Braves team in home runs since 1943, when OF Chuck Workman hit 10 of the Boston Braves' 39 home runs.
- Joined two Hall of Famers last night as the only players in baseball history to lead off in a postseason game prior to his 21st birthday...Freddie Lindstrom did it seven times as a 18-year-old in the 1924 World Series for the New York Giants, while Mickey Mantle led off as a 19-year-old for the Yankees in the first two games of the 1951 World Series.
- After moving to the leadoff role in the first game out of the All-Star break on 7/20 at WSH, hit .322 (85-for-264) with 19 home runs, 46 RBI, 54 runs scored, 14 stolen bases, a .403 on-base percentage and a .625 slugging percentage in 68 games.
- His 85 hits were the second most in the majors post-break, while his 54 runs tied for the second most and his 19 home runs were tied for fourth most...His 1.028 OPS was the third highest.
- Hit eight leadoff home runs this season to set the franchise single-season record and pass the previous mark of seven, set by Marquis Grissom in 1996.
- Is one of five players in baseball history to reach 26 home runs in a season prior to his 21st birthday...Became the 10th player in history to have 25 home runs and 15 steals in his rookie season and the first since Mike Trout in 2012.
- Made starts at all three outfield positions (13 games, 8 starts in center field; 101 games, 96 starts in left field; 3 games, 3 starts in right field).
- Homered in five straight games, 8/11-8/14, to tie the franchise modern-era record for most consecutive games with a homer...Prior to Acuña Jr., the last Braves player to homer in five straight was Brian McCann in 2006...Acuña Jr. became the youngest player in baseball history to homer in four straight games.
- Went to the DL on 5/28 and missed 28 games with a left knee mild ACL sprain, left knee contusion and lower back contusion...Reinstated from the 10-day DL on 6/28.
