RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers were unable to avoid a four-game sweep at Cleveland as they dropped the series finale to the Indians, 9-3, on Thursday night. Leonys Martin recorded his second consecutive three-hit performance, while Nicholas Castellanos added a pair of hits and two RBI. Michael Fulmer started for Detroit and suffered his first loss of the season, giving up a career-high nine runs, six earned, on eight hits with two strikeouts. Chad Bell pitched 4.0 scoreless in relief, while Joe Jiménez threw a shutout inning. The Tigers begin a 10-game homestand tonight as they open a three-game series against the New York Yankees. Following the series against the Yankees, the homestand continues with three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22).

BACK-TO-BACK THREE-HIT GAMES FOR MARTIN: Leonys Martin recorded his second consecutive three-hit performance last night as he went 3x5 with two runs scored and a double. It marked the first time in his career that Martin has recorded three hits in consecutive games. Martin is tied for the team lead and ranks tied for eighth in the American League with five multi-hit games.

DOUBLIN' DIXON: Dixon Machado notched his seventh double of the season in the eighth inning of last night's game. Machado is tied with Boston's Xander Bogaerts, San Diego's Eric Hosmer and Arizona's A.J. Pollock for the Major League lead in doubles. Machado is the first Tigers player to have seven doubles in the first 12 games of the season since Travis Fryman in 1994.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING: Miguel Cabrera singled in the seventh inning of last night's game for the 2,646th hit of his Major League career, tying him with Jimmie Foxx for 78th in MLB history. He is eight hits shy of tying Ted Williams for 77th (see chart below):

TIGERS TIDBITS: Joe Jiménez pitched a scoreless inning in last night's game and has not allowed an earned run in his first seven appearances this season... Victor Martinez has reached base safely in eight straight games and is hitting .308 (8x26) with a .406 on-base percentage during the streak.

TIGERS AND YANKEES: The Tigers and Yankees meet for the first of seven times this season tonight at Comerica Park. The two teams split six games last season, but the Yankees won two-of-three games at Comerica Park. Detroit has not won a season series against the Yankees since 2011 and have not won a home series against New York since 2014.

RECAPPING THE ROAD TRIP: The Tigers went 3-4 on their recently completed road trip, going 3-0 at Chicago (AL) and 0-4 at Cleveland. Detroit hit .193 (45x233) as a team on the trip, while the pitching staff had a 3.45 ERA (60.0IP/23ER), including a 2.60 ERA (27.2IP/8ER) from the bullpen. Leonys Martin finished the road trip hitting .370 (10x27) with six runs scored, two doubles, one home run and three RBI.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Tigers tonight begin a 10-game homestand, which is tied for their longest of the season. The homestand includes three games vs. the Yankees, three games vs. the Orioles and four games vs. the Royals, including a day-night doubleheader on April 20. Detroit went 1-4 during their first homestand this season after getting swept by the Pirates and splitting two games vs. Kansas City.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 4-8 (.333) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,072-1,047 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers enter tonight's game a perfect 5-for-5 in replay challenges this season. Among teams that have challenged three-or-more plays this season, the Tigers are one of only four clubs to have a 100% success rate, joining Chicago (AL), Kansas City and San Francisco.

LOVE YOUR MELON NIGHT: The Tigers tonight will host their first of two Love Your Melon nights at Comerica Park. While tickets for tonight's ticket package are sold out, tickets still remain for the second "Love Your Melon" night on September 10 vs. Houston. The ticket package includes a game ticket and an exclusive Detroit Tigers Love Your Melon beanie. A portion of the proceeds will benefit Love Your Melon's efforts in the fight against pediatric cancer. Founded on October 22, 2012, Love Your Melon to date has given over \$4.5 million to the fight against pediatric cancer and over 133,000 hats.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his second start of the season tonight in the series opener vs. New York (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers made his Tigers debut on Sunday at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

VS. NEW YORK (AL): Fiers has made three career starts against the Yankees and has a 0-0 record with a 5.52 ERA (14.2IP/9ER) and 17 strikeouts. In two starts vs. New York (AL) last season, Fiers went 0-0 with a 3.72 ERA (9.2IP/4ER) and 14 strikeouts.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has started two games in his career at Comerica Park, posting a 0-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (12.0IP/2ER) and nine strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Fiers has pitched in 18 games, including 16 as a starter, in his career against teams from the American League East and has compiled a 5-4 record with a 3.95 ERA (100.1IP/44ER) and 93 strikeouts. In eight starts vs. AL East opponents last season, Fiers went 1-2 with a 4.21 ERA (47.0IP/22ER) and 46 strikeouts.

RECORD IN APRIL: Fiers has pitched in 17 games, including 15 as a starter, during the month of April and has posted a 3-6 record with a 5.15 ERA (80.1IP/46ER) and 67 strikeouts. In four April starts last season, Fiers went 0-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1IP/11ER) and 16 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .249 (331x1329) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .257 (379x1477). In 29 appearances last season, lefties hit .256 (74x289) against Fiers, while righties batted .275 (83x302).

TOSSING A NO-NO: Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strassburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his third start of the season tomorrow afternoon vs. New York (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano turned in his second consecutive quality start to begin the season on Monday at Cleveland, but took the loss after giving up two runs on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. NEW YORK (AL)/AT COMERICA PARK: Liriano has made 12 appearances, including 10 starts, in his career against the Yankees and has posted a 4-4 record with a 3.34 ERA (59.1IP/22ER) and 60 strikeouts. Among active pitchers with at least 10 career starts against New York (AL), Liriano's 3.34 ERA ranks ninth. Liriano picked up the win in his only start against the Yankees last season on June 2, giving up two runs on four hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings. In 16 career outings, including 13 starts, at Comerica Park, Liriano has a 5-7 record with a 5.37 ERA (70.1IP/42ER) and 71 strikeouts.
