PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (47-37) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (40-46)

Friday, July 6, 2018 – PNC Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 85; Road 39
RHP Nick Pivetta (5-7, 4.66) vs RHP Trevor Williams (6-6, 4.22)

- WEDNESDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies earned their sixth sweep of the season, taking the second game of a short series with Baltimore, 4-1 to cap a nine-game homestand ... Starter Aaron Nola was exceptional, allowing 1 run on 7 hits in 7.0 innings, walking 2 and striking out 9 ... Nick Williams hit his 10th home run of the season and Victor Arano recorded his first ML save.
- TRANSACTIONS:** On Wednesday, the Phillies optioned RHP **Jake Thompson** to Lehigh Valley (AAA), and today they reinstated RHP **Edubray Ramos** from the 10-day DL (on since 6/250).
- HEATING UP:** The Phillies have won four straight games, six of seven and have posted a 15-7 record since 6/10 ... Their .682 winning percentage in that span is T-2nd in the NL with LAD, trailing only CIN (.727), and ranks T-3rd in MLB ... With a victory on Friday, Philadelphia is at its high-water mark of 10 games over .500 ... They hold the 4th-best record in the NL this season, trailing MIL (52-35), CHI (49-35) and ATL (49-37) ... Philadelphia currently sits in the second NL wild card spot, and is just 1.0 game behind ATL in the NL East.
- WHAT A RELIEF:** The Phillies bullpen has tossed 15.0 straight scoreless innings dating back to the 7th inning on 6/30 vs WSH ... **In the last four games overall, they have allowed 1 ER in 19.0 IP (0.47 ERA), held opponents to a .175 AVG (11-63) and stranded all 6 inherited runners** ... The Phillies rank 6th in the NL in save percentage (69.4 %, 25-36), doing so with eight different pitchers (Hector Neris, Seranthony Dominguez, Jake Thompson, Victor Arano, Luis Garcia, Tommy Hunter, Adam Morgan, Edubray Ramos) ... It is the first time they have had eight players with a save in a season since 2007, when they tied a franchise record with nine players recording a save ... No other team in baseball in 2018 with as high a save percentage has more than four players with a save.
- HOMER HAPPY:** The Phillies have hit at least one home run in 19 of their last 21 games (since 6/12), clubbing 31 round-trippers in that span ... Those 31 homers in that span are T-2nd in the National League in that span, trailing only LAD's 40, and rank T-5th in baseball ... The Phillies lead the NL in go-ahead homers (42, 2nd in MLB behind NY Yankees' 46) and their 61 games with a home run are tied for most in the NL with STL ... The club already has five players (Odubel Herrera, Rhys Hoskins, Carlos Santana, Maikel Franco and Nick Williams) with double-digit home runs this season, marking the first time they have accomplished that before the All-Star break since 2008 (Ryan Howard, Chase Utley, Pat Burrell, Pedro Feliz, Jayson Werth).
- WHEELS UP:** Today marks the first game of an 11-game, 10-day, four-city road trip that will take the Phillies to PIT (3 games), NYM (4 games), BAL (1 game) and MIA (3 games) leading into the All-Star break ... The trip features both a doubleheader (6/9 at NYM) and a one-game makeup (6/12 at BAL) ... It is the longest road trip of the year in terms of games, and tied for the longest in terms of days (11 day trip from 5/28-6/7) ... **Per Elias, the Phillies have not embarked on a four-city road trip since 8/22-9/4/2005, when they went 6-6 on a 12-game, four-city trip to SF, ARI, NYM and WSH** ... Their last 11-game road trip was 8/31-9/10/2017 to MIA, NYM and WSH.
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 15 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3rd, 18.2%), **Cesar Hernandez** (10th, 15.0 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (14th, 14.4%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate by a considerable margin (10.3 %, next-closest: NYY & LAD, 9.9 %) and also rank 1st in pitches per plate appearance (4.05) and are 3rd in walks (328) ... Pitch tracking data dates back to 1988 and over the last 30 years, the previous high for a Phillies team was 3.93 pitches per plate appearance in 2017 ... Philadelphia has finished a season with a walk rate greater than 10.0% only eight times in franchise history (last: 2002-05, 4 straight seasons) ... **Santana, who has at least one walk in 14 of his last 17 games (21 total BB), now is one of just four players in baseball with 65 or more walks this season, joining Mike Trout (77), Bryce Harper (70) and Joey Votto (66).**
- WALK THE PLANK:** Philadelphia has won four straight games against the Pirates after completing their first four-game sweep of the Pirates since 1994 back in April ... A won today would be their longest winning streak against Pittsburgh since winning five straight from 6/5/11-4/5/12 ... However, the Phillies have not fared well at PNC Park, going 18-35 (.340) at the venue since it opened in 2001, including an 8-20 stretch since 2009 during which they have never won consecutive games in a season at PNC Park and won only one series (7/2-4/2013).
- HOW SWEEP IT IS:** The Phillies earned their sixth series sweep of the season in their series against BAL to finish the homestand ... **The six sweeps already match their total from 2017, and the last time they had more than six in an entire season was in 2012 (7) ... 2009 was the last time they had six before the All-Star break (7), per Elias.**
- SAVE IT, SER:** Seranthony Dominguez is 8-for-9 in save opportunities since his debut, posting a 1.59 ERA (2 ER, 11.1 IP) and allowing only nine baserunners (6 H, 3 BB, 0.79 WHIP) while striking out 14 batters in those save situations ... He has pitched more than 1.0 inning in 4 of those saves and 2.0 innings in 3 three of them ... Dominguez ranks 3rd among all ML pitchers in WHIP (0.73) and 5th in OPP OPS (.425).
- BRIGHT FUTURE:** Today, MLB announced the rosters for the All Star Futures Game, which included RHP **Enyel De Los Santos** on the World Team ... The 22-year-old Dominican Republic native is 9-3 for Lehigh Valley (AAA) with an International League-leading 1.93 ERA ... Additionally, **Jorge Velandia**, Phillies Special Assistant to the GM, will be the first base coach for the World Team.
