PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (50-39) vs. NEW YORK METS (36-52)

Tuesday, July 10, 2018 – Citi Field – 7:10pm EDT – Game 90 – Road 44

RHP Enyel De Los Santos (NR) vs RHP Drew Gagnon (NR)

- YESTERDAY'S RECAP:** In Game 1, Zach Eflin went 5.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 5 hits with 0 walks and 4 strikeouts ... Wilmore Flores hit a walk-off home run in the 10th inning ... In Game 2, Aaron Nola (W, 12-2) tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed only 1 hit with 1 walk and 10 strikeouts ... Nola also plated the only runs of the game for the Phillies on a 3-run double in the 5th inning.
- TRANSACTIONS:** Prior to tonight's game, **RHP Enyel De Los Santos** had his contract selected from Lehigh Valley (AAA) ... To make room on the 40-man roster, **INF Pedro Florimon** (right foot fracture) was transferred to the 60-day DL ... Additionally, **INF Trevor Plouffe** had his contract selected from Lehigh Valley ... To make room, **LHP Hoby Milner** was designated for assignment and **OF Dylan Cozens** was optioned to Lehigh Valley ... De Los Santos will wear #51 and Plouffe will wear #10.
- FORMULA 50:** Last night, Philadelphia secured their 50th win of the season on July 9, in their 89th game of the 2018 campaign ... That is a 44 game improvement from 2017 when the Phillies won #50 in their 133rd game of the season ... Only two other Phillies teams in the history of the franchise have a 44 game or better improvement from one season to the next at win #50 ... In 1993, the Phillies began 50-21 after going 50-68 in 1992 (+47) and in 1905, the Phillies began 50-37 after inexplicably going 50-99 the year before in 1904 (+62) ... The last major league team with a 44 game or better improvement at win #50 was the 2011 Pittsburgh Pirates (50-44) who went 50-98 the year prior in 2010 (+54) ... July 9 marks the earliest a Phillies team won #50 since the 2011 team did so on June 28 with a record of 50-30 ... Remarkably, since 2007, only one Phillies club has reached #50 faster than the 2018 team and that was the 2011 club ... Each team besides 2011, during Philadelphia's run of five straight division titles, reached #50 later than July 9 – 2007 (50-48 on July 22), 2008 (50-43 on July 10), 2009 (50-38 on July 17), 2010 (50-46 on July 23).

- A STAR IS BORN:** On Sunday, it was announced that **Aaron Nola** would represent the Phillies at this year's All-Star game, July 17 in Washington ... Nola (25 years) is the youngest Phillies pitcher selected to an All-Star game since Cole Hamels (23 years) in 2007 and he is the first Phillies pitcher to be honored with an invite to the mid-summer classic since Cliff Lee in 2013 ... Nola, 12-2 with a 2.27 ERA, has one more start remaining before the break ... As it stands now, only one other pitcher in Phillies history has as many wins and as low an ERA as Nola before the break: Hall-of-Famer **Steve Carlton** in 1980 (14-4, 2.14 ERA) ... In what is shaping up to be a three-horse race for the NL Cy Young Award, Nola's 12 wins are the most of any NL starter, his ERA is lower than **Max Scherzer** (2.33), his 123.0 IP are more than **Jacob deGrom** (115.1), his 0.98 WHIP is lower than deGrom's 0.99 mark and Nola's 5.8 bWAR (baseball reference) is second of any player in the majors to only **Mike Trout** (6.9 bWAR), ahead of both deGrom (5.4) and Scherzer (5.1).
- DEBUT SEASON:** Tonight, **RHP Enyel De Los Santos** will make his major league debut at Citi Field opposite of Mets' starter, **RHP Drew Gagnon**, also making his major league debut ... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, this marks the first time a Phillies starter has made his major league debut against another starting pitcher making his ML debut since September 25, 1944 when Charlie Ripple faced CHI's Charlie Gassaway in Game 1 of a doubleheader at Shibe Park.
- SLAMTANA:** With four more walks yesterday, **Carlos Santana** is up to 72 this season, which is the most ever by a Phillies switch-hitter before the All-Star break and tied for fifth-most by any switch-hitter in ML history with Mickey Tettleton ... Santana currently trails Mickey Mantle (91 BB, 1957), Tony Phillips (81 BB, 1993), Lance Berkman (75 BB, 2004) and Tony Phillips (74 BB, 1992) ... Santana ranks third in the majors in walks this season, trailing Mike Trout (79 BB) and Bryce Harper (76 BB) ... However, it should be noted, Santana leads the majors in unintentional walks with 68, followed by Joy Votto (66), Harper (64), Trout (63) and Aaron Judge (61).
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINGS:** The Phillies have won nine of 12 games and have posted an 18-9 record since June 10 ... Their .667 winning percentage in that span ranks 2nd in the NL to only CIN (.692) and 5th in the majors ... They are tied for the 3rd-best winning percentage in the NL this season (.562) with ATL, trailing only MIL (.593) and CHI (.580).
- WHAT A RELIEF:** In the last nine games (since 6/30), the Phillies bullpen has allowed 5 ER in 36.1 IP (1.24 ERA), held opponents to a .189 AVG (24-127) and stranded all 11 inherited runners ... The Phillies rank 4th in the NL in save percentage (71.1 %, 27-38), doing so with eight different pitchers (Hector Neris, Seranthony Dominguez, Jake Thompson, Victor Arano, Luis Garcia, Tommy Hunter, Adam Morgan, Edubray Ramos) ... It is the first time they have had eight players with a save in a season since 2007, when they tied a franchise record with nine players recording a save.
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 15 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3rd, 18.9%), **Cesar Hernandez** (11th, 14.6 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (15th, 14.0%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate (10.4 %, next-closest: NYY: 10.0 %) and also rank 1st in pitches per plate appearance (4.04) and are 2nd in walks (352) behind only CIN (353).
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 85 consecutive games (since 4/4), which is the longest extra-base hit streak in the majors this season (next: DET, 67 G, 4/10-6/22) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 8/30/2008-6/25/2009, when they did so in 97 straight games (see chart to the right).
