### PREGAME FESTIVITIES

**First Responders Recognition:** The Tigers, in partnership with BELFOR Property Restoration, celebrate the men and women of our local fire, police and emergency medical service forces and their dedication to our community through public service while also honoring the men and women who lost their lives during the attacks on September 11 and local first responders who have lost their lives in the line of duty. Nearly 400 firefighters, police officers and EMS officials will be invited on the field at Comerica Park to be recognized for their service to our local communities prior to the national anthem.

**Ceremonial First Pitches:** The ceremonial first pitches will be thrown by Sgt. Scott Smith of the Troy police department and Fire Marshal Kevin Sehlmeyer, representing first responders.

**National Anthem & God Bless America:** The national anthem and God Bless America will be performed by Martin Rucker and the nation's colors will be presented by the Farmington fire and police departments. Additionally, there will be a 500-foot American flag displayed on field during the national anthem.

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers dropped the series opener to the Astros, 3-2, on Monday night at Comerica Park. Francisco Liriano turned in a quality start for Detroit, but took the loss, allowing three unearned runs on four hits with four walks and seven strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Offensively, Nicholas Castellanos had two hits, including a double, and drove in a run, while Dawel Lugo added a hit and a RBI. The Tigers and Astros continue their three-game series tonight. Following the three-game set vs. the Astros and an off day on Thursday, Detroit heads to Cleveland for a three-game series against the Indians.

**ROSTER MOVES:** The Tigers today announced the following roster moves:

\* Recalled RHP Spencer Turnbull from Triple A Toledo. Turnbull will wear #56.

\* Selected LHP Matt Hall from Triple A Toledo. Hall will wear #64.

\* To create room for Hall on the 40-man roster, RHP Johnny Barbato has been designated for assignment.

**IN THE NICK OF TIME:** Nicholas Castellanos had two hits, including his 40th double of the season, in last night's game to post his 49th multi-hit game of the season, which is tied for the fourth-most in the American League. Castellanos, who also has 20 homers this season, is just the eighth player in franchise history to have a 40-double, 20-homer season, joining Dale Alexander, Miguel Cabrera, Hank Greenberg, Bobby Higginson, Magglio Ordoñez, Lance Parrish and Rudy York. Castellanos has hit safely in 13 of his last 18 games, including nine multi-hit efforts, and is batting .357/.425/.529 with nine runs scored, six doubles, two home runs and nine RBI during that stretch.

**START ME UP:** Detroit starting pitchers have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 10 straight games, dating back to August 31. During that stretch, Tigers starters have posted a 2.56 ERA (56.1IP/16ER) with a .169 (34x201) opponents batting average and 62 strikeouts. Detroit's .169 opponent batting average during that time period is the lowest among all Major League starting staffs, while they rank second in ERA, trailing only the Pittsburgh Pirates (2.38 ERA).

**TIGERS TIDBITS:** Christin Stewart recorded the first hit of his Major League career in last night's game, singling in the sixth inning...Drew VerHagen pitched a scoreless inning in last night's game and has not allowed a run in 10 of his last 11 games. During that stretch, VerHagen has a 0.71 ERA (12.2IP/1ER) with a .213 (10x47) opponents batting average and 10 strikeouts.

**CLOSE ENCOUNTERS:** The Tigers played their 44th one-run game of the season last night, falling to 20-24 in those contests with a 3-2 win. Detroit's 44 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay and Seattle, 53). In addition to the 44 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 28 games that have been decided by two runs.

**LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY:** Tonight's game marks the 37th time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 18-18 (.500) against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .263/.319/.406 as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers rank second in the American League with a .263 batting average vs. lefties. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .398 (53x133) batting average vs. lefties, while he is seventh with a .448 on-base percentage and ninth with a .609 slugging percentage vs. southpaws.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Detroit is 2-2 on its current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (2-1) and three games vs. Houston (0-1). The Tigers are currently in a stretch that will see them play 13-of-16 games at home. Detroit is 36-36 at Comerica Park this season, where the team is hitting .251/.309/.393 as a team, and the pitching staff has posted a 3.99 ERA (659.0IP/292ER).

**TIGERS AND ASTROS:** The Astros enters tonight's game with a 3-1 lead in the season series against the Tigers.

Houston won the season series in 2017, 4-3, but the Tigers took two-of-three games at Comerica Park, where they have an overall record of 17-7 vs. Houston. Detroit has won the overall season series in three of the last five years.

**WILD, WILD WEST:** Detroit is 10-22 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16), and they are 37 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (47-84, .359).

**MLB AND CLUBS TO OBSERVE SEPTEMBER 11 WITH TRIBUTES ACROSS THE LEAGUE:** MLB and all 30 clubs will conduct 9/11 commemorations throughout the league tonight as part of baseball's ongoing effort to honor and remember those whose lives were affected or lost on that tragic day.

Home clubs will recognize the day with a moment of silence and pregame ceremonies with many teams honoring first responders and public service personnel. A "We Shall Not Forget" silhouetted batter ribbon will be displayed throughout ballparks and on special line-up cards and base jewels.

On-field personnel including players, coaches and umpires will wear caps with a side patch of the ribbon during games. MLB will donate all of its royalties from the sales of the caps to the National September 11 Memorial & Museum, the Pentagon Memorial Fund and the Flight 93 National Memorial.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 59-85 (.410) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,127-1,124 (.501) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history...is two victories away from tying Art Howe for 52nd.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

## TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - JORDAN ZIMMERMANN

**ABOUT JORDAN:** In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his 22nd start of 2018 tonight vs. Houston.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Zimmermann earned his seventh win of the season on Wednesday at Chicago (AL), throwing 5.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and three strikeouts.

**VS. HOUSTON:** Zimmermann has faced the Astros seven times in his career, posting a 2-3 record with a 3.09 ERA (43.2IP/15ER) and 37 strikeouts. He has allowed three earned runs-or-less in six of his seven career starts vs. the Astros. Zimmermann made two starts vs. Houston last season and went 0-1 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0IP/5ER) and five strikeouts.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Zimmermann has appeared in 35 games, including 34 starts, at Comerica Park, posting a 14-15 record with a 5.96 ERA (188.2IP/125ER) and 130 strikeouts. In 10 home starts this season, Zimmermann is 4-3 with a 4.06 ERA (57.2IP/26ER) and 51 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL WEST:** Zimmermann has made 14 starts in his career against teams from the American League West and has a 5-5 record with a 2.97 ERA (91.0IP/30ER) and 61 strikeouts. In three starts vs. AL West teams this season, Zimmermann is 1-1 with a 1.40 ERA (19.1IP/3ER) and 20 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN SEPTEMBER:** Zimmermann has made 32 appearances, including 31 starts, in his career during the month of September, posting a 15-8 record with a 4.01 ERA (177.1IP/79ER) and 155 strikeouts. In three September starts last season, Zimmermann went 0-2 with a 6.00 ERA (15.0IP/10ER) and nine strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .256 (721x2811) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .267 (764x2861) against him. In 21 starts this season, righties are hitting .269 (58x216), while lefthanded batters are hitting .256 (58x227).

**KEEPIN' IT 1,000:** Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 46 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

**STREAK SNAPPED:** Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13, 2017 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann leads all active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.90 walks per nine innings.

**SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016:** Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

**ALL-STAR SELECTION:** Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

**TOSSING A NO-HITTER:** Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.

**VS. HOUSTON/AT COMERICA PARK:** Norris' only career start against the Astros came on May 24, 2017 at Houston and he received a no decision after giving up two runs, one earned, on four hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 6.1 innings. Norris has made 22 appearances, including 20 starts, in his career at Comerica Park, posting a 3-9 record with a 5.42 ERA (104.2IP/63ER) and 103 strikeouts. In two home starts this season, Norris has a 0-0 record with a 3.72 ERA (9.2IP/4ER) and 12 strikeouts.
