METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have lost 13 of their last 15 games, including eight straight...The last time the Mets lost eight or more straight games was an 11-game skid from August 28-September 9, 2004...New York started the year 11-1 and has since gone 16-33.

AT HOME: New York has lost 10 straight home games dating to May 22...The last time the Mets lost 10 or more consecutive games at home was August 1-September 3, 2002 (a franchise-record 15 straight home losses)...The Mets are 0-8 on this homestand (0-4 vs. the Cubs, 0-2 vs. the Orioles and 0-2 vs. the Yankees)...A loss tonight would equal the worst homestand in team history (0-9, September 18-23, 1979 vs. the Cubs, Expos and Cardinals)...New York is 12-21 at home this year.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets have lost six straight to Yankees dating to August 14, 2017...This is the second-longest losing streak vs. the Yankees in franchise history (longest was seven-straight losses from June 30, 2002-June 29, 2003)...The last time the Yankees swept a three-game series from the Mets was June 8-10, 2012 at Yankee Stadium...The last time the Yankees swept the Mets in a three-game series in Queens was June 26-28, 2009...The Mets went 0-4 vs. the Yankees last year (0-2 at Citi Field and 0-2 at Yankee Stadium)...The Mets are 46-68 vs. the Bronx Bombers all-time during the regular season, including 8-17 at Citi Field and 24-34 in Queens combined (Shea/Citi Field).

QUEENS & BRONX: Todd Frazier, Anthony Swarzak and Neil Walker have played for both the Mets and Yankees...Overall, 132 players have both for the Mets and Yankees.

INTERLEAGUE: New York is 1-5 in Interleague action this year, after going 7-13 vs. the AL last year...The Mets will travel to Yankee Stadium on July 20-22...Since 1997, when Interleague play began, the Mets are 186-182...The .505 Interleague winning percentage is the second-best all-time among NL clubs, behind St. Louis (.506, 174-170).

INNINGS: The Mets have outscored the Yankees, 4-0, in the first inning during this series...The Mets have been outscored, 8-0, in innings two through nine...The Mets have allowed 40 first-inning runs, tied for the eighth-most in the majors...New York has scored 41 runs in the eighth frame this year (the club's highest total for any inning), the fourth-most in the majors.

METS OFFENSE: The Mets have scored six runs in their last 60.0 innings...The Mets have been held to one run or less 16 times this season, the third-most in the majors.

HOMERS: New York has 17 homers in its last 15 games, but, 14 have been solo blasts...The Mets had two homers last night with two strike and 26 such homers this year, tied for the second-most homers in the NL with two strikes with Washington...Milwaukee is first with 27.

TODD FRAZIER: Hit his first home run since May 4 last night...Frazier has hit safely in three of his first four games since returning from the Disabled List on June 5...He shares the team lead with eight go-ahead RBI this season.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



SETH LUGO: This is Lugo's second start this year...He tossed 4.0 shutout innings vs. the Cubs on May 31...The Mets are 17-10 (.630) in Lugo's 27-career starts...According to Elias, only two Mets pitchers had a better team record in their first 27-career starts...New York went 18-9 in Dwight Gooden's and Dillon Gee's first 27-career starts.

LUGO LEADER: Lugo ranks eighth in the majors with a 2.04 ERA (min. 38.0 innings)...He has allowed three runs in his last 25.1 innings (1.07 ERA) dating to May 1.

STARTERS: Over its last 20 games, New York starters have a 2.47 ERA (31 earned runs/113.0 innings), the lowest in the majors during that span...Overall, the Mets are 10th in the majors with a 3.79 ERA from their starters.

BULLPEN: In its last 15 games, the Mets bullpen is 1-10 with a 6.99 ERA (43 earned runs/55.1 innings)...Overall, the pen has 13 wins, tied for the sixth-most in the majors and 18 losses, the most in the majors...The pen's overall ERA is 4.53, ranking 25th in the majors.

BRANDON NIMMO: Has a career-high eight homers after hitting six combined home runs in his first two years in the majors (250 at-bats)...Nimmo has three homers in his last eight games and six home runs in his last 17 games...Nimmo has 13 extra-base hits (five doubles, two triples, six homers) and 10 RBI in his last 17 games dating to May 23...He has five triples, tied for the fourth-most in the majors...Nimmo has been hit by a pitch 10 times, tied for the most in the majors.

ON-BASE MACHINE: Nimmo has reached base safely in 26 of his 33 starts and is fifth in the majors with a .411 on-base percentage (min. 170 PA)...He owns a .972 OPS, ranking seventh in the majors and is fifth in the NL with a .560 slugging percentage (min. 170 PA).

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Last night was Cabrera's 150th career homer...He has 48 homers in 336 games with the Mets (averaging one homer every 7.0 games)...Cabrera has 102 home runs in 1,106 games with all other teams he's played with (one homer every 10.8 games).

LHP DAVID PETERSON: New York's 2017 first-round pick has been promoted to St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League...He will start Thursday...Peterson was 1-4 with 57 strikeouts a 1.82 ERA (12 ER/59.1 IP) in nine starts with Columbia (A) of the South Atlantic League...Peterson had a career-high 10 strikeouts over 8.0 innings last night vs. Augusta.

EMPIRE STATE BUILDING: The Empire State Building will be lit in Mets colors on the East and West side of the building tonight and Yankees colors on the North and South...The winner of tonight's game will have their team colors sparkle for 10 minutes.

LAST START: Lugo tonight makes his second start (23rd appearance) of the 2018 season...In his last start, May 31 vs. the Cubs, took a no-decision after tossing 4.0-shutout innings, giving up three hits with three strikeouts...Was his first start since September 30 of last season.

LAST APPEARANCE: Lugo last pitched on June 5 vs. Baltimore...Threw 3.0-scoreless innings, allowing one hit with two strikeouts...Extended his scoreless streak to 7.0 innings spanning his two most recent outings.

LUGO LATELY: Has a 1.07 ERA (three earned runs/25.1 innings) since May 1 and has been scored upon in one of his 13 outings (one start) in that span while allowing 15 hits and two walks with 26 strikeouts...His 1.07 ERA since May 1 is second in the majors (min. 25 IP) and his 0.67 WHIP leads the majors in that stretch.

AS STARTER/AS RELIEVER: In 27-career starts, Lugo is 12-6 with a 3.98 ERA (66 earned runs/149.1 innings)...Last earned a win as a starter on September 25 of last season vs. Atlanta...In 31 relief appearances, he is 1-2 with a 2.43 ERA (15 earned runs/55.2 innings)...Pitched more than 1.0 inning in 21 of his 31 relief outings.

VS. THE YANKEES: Lugo tonight faces the Yankees for the second time in his career and is making his first start in the Subway Series...Took the loss, his first-career decision, in his lone appearance against the Yankees on August 1, 2016 at Citi Field...Pitched 1.0 inning, giving up one run, earned, on one hit with one walk and one strikeout...Gave up a go-ahead sacrifice fly in the 10th inning to Starlin Castro that gave the Yankees a 6-5 lead.

SUCSETHFUL: The Mets are 17-10 (.630) in Lugo's 27-career starts...According to Elias, only two Mets pitchers had a better team record in their first 27-career starts...(New York went 18-9 in Dwight Gooden's and Dillon Gee's first 27-career starts).

THE COMFORTS OF HOME: In 27 games (11 starts) at home in his career, Lugo is 5-2 with a 2.18 ERA (23 earned runs/95.0 innings) and a .204 opponent batting average...That is the second-lowest average and ERA at Citi Field all-time among pitchers with at least 90.0 IP in Queens.

STRIVE FOR FIVE: Lugo has pitched at least 5.0 innings in 23 of his 27-career starts...The Mets are 16-7 (.696 winning percentage) when Lugo pitches at least 5.0 innings...In his 23 starts of at least 5.0 innings, he is 12-5 with a 3.68 ERA (55 earned runs/134.2 innings)...His career-opening streak of 19-consecutive starts of 5.0 innings or more is tied for the sixth-longest streak in franchise history.

LUGO WITH RISP: Has held opposing hitters to a .220 average (33-150) with runners in scoring position in his career, including a .125 (3-24) mark this season...With two outs, Lugo's opponents' average dips to .198 (16-81) in RISP situations, going 2-14 (.143) in 2018 to date... In his career, has allowed two home runs with runners in scoring position (1.1% HR rate with RISP/two homers allowed to 184 batters faced in RISP scenarios)...With the bases loaded, opposing hitters are 2-15 (.133) against Lugo since his debut, including 0-2 with two punchouts this season.

LUGO'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Lugo is in his eighth season in the Mets organization after being selected in the 34th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.
- » As of the start of the 2018 season, was one of 13 players drafted in the 34th round or later in 2011 to appear in an MLB game.
- » Made his major league debut with 2.0 scoreless innings vs. the Cubs on July 1, 2016.
- » Initially debuted as a reliever...Has a 2.56 career ERA as a relief pitcher in 30 games (15 earned runs/52.2 innings)...Opponents hit .197 (36-183) against Lugo out of the bullpen.
- » Earned the win in eight of his first 11 career starts, including four of his first five starts.
- » Pitched for Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic...Went 2-1 in three starts for Team PR with a 4.20 ERA (seven earned runs/15.0 innings)...Started the Championship Game vs. the United States...Draws Puerto Rican heritage from his paternal grandfather, who was born there.
- » Took Colorado's Chris Rusin deep for his first-career homer on July 15, 2017.
- » Had a career-best 17.0-inning scoreless streak from May 1-May 25, 2018.
