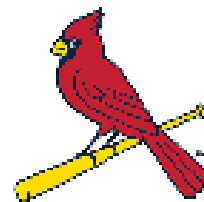

ROAD TRIPPI' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue a nine-game/10-day road trip to Arizona, San Francisco and Chicago (AL) today with the third of four games against the San Francisco Giants. Last night, the Cardinals fell to the Giants 3-2 at AT&T Park as **Andrew McCutchen** hit an RBI single off **John Brebbia** (L, 1-2) in the 7th inning to give San Francisco a 3-2 lead which they never relinquished. **Kolten Wong** was 2-for-3 with a double and a triple and **Jedd Gyorko** also had two hits including a triple. **John Gant** pitched 6.0 innings for a quality start in a no decision.

IN A FLASH: The Cardinals and Giants have played the first two games of this series under 2-hours 35-minutes. Those two games rank as two of the five fastest games the Cardinals have played this season. Twice, they came in at a season-best 2:25 vs. PIT (6/3) and vs. SD (6/12).

THREE BAG TAG: **Kolten Wong** and **Jedd Gyorko** each tripled last night giving the Cardinals their first game of the season with two triples (last: 9/26/17 vs. CHI) and five triples on the season, still their fewest through 87 games in any season. The next closest was the 2007 team which had six trifectas through 87 games (**Jim Edmonds 2**, **Scott Rolen 2**, **Adam Kennedy**, **Juan Encarnacion**).

STARTING SUCCESS: Of the Cardinals 22 road wins this season, 18 have come from the starting pitchers with **Miles Mikolas** and **Luke Weaver** leading the way with five. **Jordan Hicks** (2), **Bud Norris** (1) and **Sam Tuivailala** (1) are the only Cardinals relievers to record a win on the road this season.

DEJONG RETURNS TO ACTION: Cardinals shortstop **Paul DeJong** returned to action last night after missing 45 games on the disabled list (left hand fracture) and was 1-for-3 matching his season-high with two runs scored.

LYONS MAKES REHAB APPEARANCE; THE DUKE GETS A WIN: **Tyler Lyons** made his first rehab appearance last night and threw a scoreless innings for Memphis (AAA) vs. Iowa last night. **Luke Gregerson** continued his rehab progression as his assignment was transferred to Springfield (AA) and threw a scoreless inning earning the win vs. Frisco.

TOMORROW'S STARS TODAY: The Cardinals will have two representatives at the SiriusXM Futures Game during All-Star Week in Washington D.C. RHP **Dakota Hudson** (12-2, 2.33 ERA, 16 GS in Memphis-AAA) has been selected for the U.S. roster, while INF **Randy Arozarena** (.267, 8 HR, 33 RBI, 14 SB in 75 games at Springfield-AA/Memphis-AAA) was selected for the World roster.

YOU CAN ALWAYS GO HOME: Cardinals manager **Mike Matheny**, who finished his career with two seasons playing in San Francisco, is a career 13-8 at AT&T Park as manager of the Cardinals. The Cardinals skipper has won (4) or tied (2) every regular season series managed here since he became manager in 2012. Matheny's Cardinals have won 6 of their last 8 games at AT&T Park.

LONG TIME GONE: This is the Cardinals longest road trip of the season thus far and tied for longest of the season (9 games, Aug. 3-13 - PIT, MIA, KC). The last time the Cardinals played a nine-game road trip was September 15-24, 2017 (CHI, CIN, PIT).

SAN FRANCISCO CONNECTIONS

Manager **Mike Matheny** played his final two professional seasons with San Francisco (2005-06)...in his first year with the Giants, set the team record for fielding pct. (.998) by a catcher, came within two of the team record for doubles by a catcher (36), and was voted by his teammates as the recipient of the "Willie Mac Award" as the most inspirational player on the team.

Coach **Willie McGee** played four seasons (1991-95) with the Giants...was born in San Francisco...graduated from Harry Ells High School in Richmond, Calif...played college baseball at Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill, Calif...resides in Hercules, Calif...worked as an assistant coach for Contra Costa College in San Pablo, Calif.

Outfielder **Harrison Bader** hit his first MLB home run on Sept. 1, 2017 at San Francisco, a two-run blast off **Johnny Cueto**.

Pitcher **Bud Norris** was born in nearby Greenbrae, Calif...graduated from San Marin High School in Novato, Calif...played college baseball at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo.

Pitcher **Adam Wainwright** homered on the first pitch of his first career at-bat (May 24, 2006) at AT&T Park, a solo homer off **Noah Lowry**.

Outfielder **Dexter Fowler** made his MLB debut vs. San Francisco while with Colorado (Sept. 2, 2008) as a pinch runner (caught stealing second base).

Pitcher **Sam Tuivailala** was born in nearby San Mateo, Calif...graduated from Aragon High School in San Mateo.

Pitcher **Luke Gregerson's** first MLB win was Sept. 8, 2009 at San Francisco while with San Diego...was teammates with Giants catcher **Buster Posey**, outfielder **Andrew McCutchen** and shortstop **Brandon Crawford** on the gold-winning United States squad in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

Pitcher **Jack Flaherty** made his MLB debut (Sept. 1, 2017) at San Francisco...became the 15th youngest Cardinal to make MLB debut in a start at 21 years and 321 days old.

Giants VP of Player Development **David Bell** previously served as a Cardinals assistant hitting coach (2014) and bench coach (2015-17)...played parts of four seasons with St. Louis (1995-98)...traded by Cleveland with catcher **Pepe Meneal** and pitcher **Rick Heiser** to the Cardinals for pitcher **Ken Hill** (July 27, 1995).

Assistant hitting coach **Bill Mueller** was originally selected by the Giants in the 15th round of the 1993 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons with San Francisco (1996-2000, '02)...later traded to the Cubs for pitcher **Tim Lincecum** (Nov. 18, 2000).

Giants Coach & Video Replay Analyst **Shawn Dunston** played parts of two seasons with St. Louis (1999-2000)...signed with the Cardinals as a free agent twice, sandwiched around being traded by St. Louis to the Mets for utilityman **Craig Paquette** (July 31, 1999).

Giants Mental Performance Coach **Bob Tewksbury** pitched six seasons in a Cardinals uniform (1989-94)...represented St. Louis in the 1992 All-Star Game.

Giants Community Ambassador and Hall of Famer **Orlando Cepeda** played parts of three seasons with St. Louis (1966-68)...in 1967 with St. Louis, started at first base for the NL in the All-Star Game, recognized as the NL MVP and won the World Series...later traded by the Cardinals to Atlanta for **Joe Torre** (March 17, 1969).

Giants Special Assistant **Will Clark** played part of his final professional season with St. Louis in 2000...slashed .345/.441/.621 in eight Postseason games with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade with Baltimore with cash in exchange for infielder **José León** (July 31, 2000).

Cardinals 2018 Hall of Fame inductee and Giants Outfield & Baserunning Coordinator **Vince Coleman** played six seasons with St. Louis (1985-90)...was a two-time NL All-Star (1988-89) and the 1985 Rookie of the Year...led the NL in stolen bases in all six seasons...selected by St. Louis in the 10th round of the 1982 MLB Draft.

Arizona Giants #1 Pitching Coach **Lee Smith** pitched for the Cardinals for parts of four seasons (1990-93)...was two-time NL All-Star (1991-92) with St. Louis...became the all-time career saves leader in a Cardinals uniform (April 13, 1993)...became a Cardinal via trade with the Red Sox for outfielder **Tom Brunansky** (May 4, 1990)...later traded to the Yankees for pitcher **Rich Batchelor** (August 31, 1993).

Cardinals broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played parts of four seasons with the Giants (2007-10).

TODAY'S GAME

- Today marks his 115th career start (187th appearance) It's his 15th start of the season and his 7th since returning from the 10-day D.L. (right lat strain) on June 4.
- Seeking to win his 3rd-straight decision which would match his season high (5/8-6/21).
- Is 3-0, 1.33 ERA (20.1 IP/3 ER) in his 3 career day/road starts vs. NL West clubs & overall he's 5-0, 1.13 ERA (48.0 IP/6 ER) in 7 career day game starts vs. NL West clubs
- Prior to his win on 6/26 vs. CLE, the Cardinals had lost his previous 5 games started, including each of his first 4 starts following return from D.L.

LAST TIME OUT

- Posted his 2nd consecutive win in a 6-3 victory at Arizona on Mon. (7/2), as he fanned seven in 6.0 IP to improve to 3-1 career against the Diamondbacks & 3-0 at Chase Field.
- Has allowed a total of three 1st inning runs in his past two starts, but just one run over the final 10.0 combined innings of those two victorious outings.

- Missed 23 games while on 10-day D.L. (May 9-June 4) with a right lat strain. It was first time in his career he was on the disabled list. Was leading the N.L. with his 1.62 ERA at the time he went on the D.L.
- In six starts since coming off the D.L., he's 2-2 with a 5.97 ERA (28.2 IP/19 ER), 23 walks and 33 strikeouts.
- Has issued 45 walks, T4th-most in the NL, and he co-led (Tyler Chatwood-CHI) the NL with 21 walks in June.
- Leads the N.L. with 10 hit batsmen; hit a career-high 3 batters vs. NYM (4/26).
- Limiting opponents to a .180 average (16-89) BA with RISP, 6th-best in the N.L.
- Has allowed just 3 HR's in 76.2 IP (0.34 HR/9 IP), tops among Cardinals starters.
- His .310 Opp. SLG pct. is 3rd in NL among pitchers with min. 300 BF, trailing Aaron Nola (.296) & Jacob deGrom (.297).
- He walked five or more batters in three straight starts (June 5-16), first time by a Cardinals pitcher since 2005 (Jason Marquis).
- Has a pair of double-digit strikeout games this season, fanning 10 at Milwaukee (4/4) and 11 at Cincinnati (4/15).
- Snapped 3-game losing skid with his 50th career win on 6/26 vs. CLE. He became the 10th-youngest Cardinals pitcher to reach the 50-win milestone (since 1900).
- Made his first start/appearance since coming off the D.L. on 6/5 vs. MIA and managed to go just 4.0 innings. Walked 5 in that game, but also fanned 5 & moved past Chris Carpenter (356) for 4th all-time in career strikeouts at Busch Stadium III with 359.
