RAY MATTER—The Rays are 8-1 in their last 9 games, improving from 6 games under .500 (34-40) to a game over, one shy of tying their high-water mark of the season (28-26)...this is only the fifth time this season the Rays have been over .500 (1-0, 27-26, 28-26, 28-27)...the Rays are 13-6 in their last 19 games, 26-19 in their last 45 games and 38-28 in their last 66 games after a 4-13 start to the season, which tied for the worst 17-game start in franchise history...since April 18, they have been the 5th-best team in the AL by winning pct. behind the only four teams in the majors on pace to win 100 games: the Yankees, Astros, Mariners and Red Sox.

- + Seven of the club's last 11 wins, since June 13, have come when scoring 3 runs or fewer, while only three of their first 31 wins of the season came in this fashion...their 10 wins this season when scoring 3 runs or fewer are tied for 3rd-most in the AL.
- + The Rays are in 3rd place in the AL East and have been alone or tied for 3rd in the division for 42 of the last 45 days since May 18.

PITCHING PROPERLY—Rays pitching has allowed 2 runs or fewer in six consecutive games, the longest such streak in franchise history...previous long was 5 games from May 12-16, 2008...it is tied for the 3rd-longest such streak in the majors this season (see chart)...over this 6-game span, the Rays have pitched to a 1.00 ERA (54-IP, 7-R/6-ER), and the 7 runs allowed are tied for the 2nd-fewest in franchise history over a 6-game span, behind July 28-Aug 3, 2012 (5)...the Rays haven't allowed a hit with runners in scoring position since **Daniel Murphy's** bloop single to load the bases on Tues vs. WAS—batters are 0-for-16 with RISP since then...the last 8 runs allowed by the Rays, starting with **Giancarlo Stanton's** 8th-inning homer on June 24 vs. NYY, have scored via the home run (4 solo, two 2-run).

- + The Rays held the Astros to 7 runs in the 4-game series, their fewest allowed in a 4-game series since June 4-7, 2015 at SEA (4).
- + In their last 9 games, the Rays have pitched to a 1.39 ERA (84-IP, 14-R/13-ER)...since the debut of the "opener" on May 19 vs. LAA, Rays pitchers lead the majors with a 2.73 ERA (359.1-IP, 109-ER), ahead of the Yankees (3.08)...prior to this, they ranked 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL with a 4.43 ERA (382.1-IP, 188-ER).
- + The Rays have 6 shutouts this season, all since May 28—tied with the Giants for most in the majors since then...half of them were on the last homestand (June 23 vs. NYY, June 25-26 vs. WAS).

START ME UP—In their last 14 games since June 16 at NYY, Rays starters have pitched to a 1.70 ERA (58.1-IP, 11-ER) and have allowed 1 run or fewer in 12 of the 14 games, including the last six in a row...nine of the 11 runs over this stretch have scored via home run (6 solo, one 3-run)...the only starts of 2 runs or more over this span are **Nathan Eovaldi** on June 20 at HOU (4) and **Matt Andriese** on June 24 vs. NYY (3)...this also comes with the caveat that five of the 14 games over this span were started by "opener" **Ryne Stanek** and were starts of 1.2 IP or shorter...the 4 hits allowed by **Blake Snell** yesterday vs. HOU actually snapped a streak of five consecutive games where the Rays starter allowed 1 hit or fewer.

HOME COOKIN'—The Rays are coming off an 8-1 homestand against the Yankees (3-0), Nationals (2-0) and Astros (3-1), the 2nd-best three-series homestand in club history, behind July 5-14, 2013 vs. CWS/MIN/HOU (9-1)...it was the first time in club history the Rays won three consecutive series all over teams who made the postseason the year prior...in addition, the sweeps of the Yankees and Nationals marked the first time in club history they swept consecutive series over postseason teams from the year before...the sweep of the Yankees was the second time in club history they swept a series of 3 games (or more) against the team with the best record in the majors, following June 17-19, 2008 vs. CHC (3-0).

- + Astros starters **Gerrit Cole**, **Justin Verlander** and **Charlie Morton** were a combined 28-5 (8.48) before going 0-3 this weekend.

ROAD TRIPPIN'—Tonight the Rays begin a 6-game road trip against a pair of NL East opponents, the Marlins (July 2-4) and Mets (July 5-7)...the Rays went 2-5 on their last road trip to the Yankees (1-3) and Astros (1-2), and they are 2-11 in their last 13 road games since May 31, having been

outscored, 56-26 in these games...prior to this stretch, they were 17-13 on the road to start the season, including 9-1 from May 14-30...the Rays have played 43 games on the road, tied for 4th-most in the AL...they will reach the All-Star break having completed 65.4 pct. of their road schedule.

RAYS vs. MARLINS—The Rays are 55-52 (.514) all-time in the "Citrus Series" (29-23 at home, 26-29 on the road), including 34-18 (.654) in the "Rays" era...last season, they went 3-1 against the Marlins, winning both games at Marlins Park and splitting at Tropicana Field...the Rays are 2-7 in interleague play this season (2-5 at home, 0-2 on the road), but most recently swept a 2-game series against the Nationals...the Rays are 112-87 (.563) in interleague play since 2008—5th-best in the majors—and 186-191 all-time...in the last 10 seasons (2008-17), they have only one losing interleague record (7-11 in 2010)...the NL is 74-64 (.536) in interleague play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

- + Only two players on the Rays roster previously played for the Marlins...tonight's starter **Nathan Eovaldi** pitched for parts of three seasons here and will be making his second career start against Miami...shortstop **Adeiny Hechavarria** was acquired by the Rays via trade in June 2017 and on Sat vs. HOU snapped errorless streaks at 94 games and 319 chances, both club records for a shortstop.

LIGHTEN UP—Tonight's game is the first of 16 in a row through July 22 against teams currently under .500, as well as 29 of 35 games through Aug 12...yesterday the Rays completed a stretch of 16 consecutive games against the Yankees, Nationals, and Astros—all postseason teams from a year ago—and they went 10-6 over that span, including 10-3 in their last 13 games...it also ended a stretch of 29 of 32 games from May 28-July 1 against teams currently .500 or better, and they went 17-15 over that span...so far this season, the Rays are 21-32 (.396) against teams currently .500 or better and 21-9 (.700) against teams currently below .500.

CLOSE SHAVES—43.4 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.8 pct. of games in the majors...the Rays are 16-20 (.444) in 1-run games, including 6-1 in their last seven 1-run games...the 36 1-run games are 2nd in the majors to the Mariners (37) and the 20 1-run losses are most in the majors, ahead of the White Sox (17)...74.7 pct. of Rays games have either been wins or 1-run losses...48.8 pct. of their losses have come by a 1-run margin, 2nd-highest rate in the majors (Astros, 51.6 pct.).

- + The Rays are on pace for 39 1-run losses, which hasn't been done since the 1992 Dodgers (40) or by an AL club since the 1968 White Sox (44)...the club record for 1-run losses in a season is 30 (2015).
- + The Rays have played six 1-0 games this season, most in the majors and already tied for their 2nd-most in a single season (2014, 10).

WHAT ZILLA DID—Yesterday vs. HOU, **Blake Snell** went 7.1 IP to match the longest start of his career...he reached double-digit strikeouts for a second straight start, and recorded his 11th win, tied for 3rd in club history before the All-Star break behind **Matt Moore** (13) in 2013 and **David Price** (12) in 2010...his only run allowed was a solo homer to **Evan Gattis** in the 7th inning, snapping his scoreless streak at 17 IP, the longest by a Ray this season...it was his 11th consecutive home start allowing 1 ER or fewer, tied for the longest such streak in the AL (and tied for the 2nd-longest such streak in the majors) since 1913—when earned runs were officially kept in both leagues—according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

CONSIDER THIS—Tonight the Rays have an opportunity to match their high-water mark of the season, as they would return to 2 games over .500 with a win...they have a chance to achieve this despite:

- + using a major-league-most 13 different starting pitchers;
- + using 15 different rookies, tied for 2nd-most in the majors;
- + an 8-game losing streak to fall from 28-26 to 28-34;
- + playing 43.4 pct. of their games against the Yankees, Astros, Mariners and Red Sox, the four teams who have reached 50 wins

LAST START—On Tues vs. WAS, retired his first 9 BF until a hit batter and walk leading off the 4th inning, and had his no-hit bid broken up after 5.2 IP on **Bryce Harper's** double...was one out shy of matching the longest no-hit bid of his career...outdueled **Max Scherzer** in a 1-0 win, the fourth time in his career he started in a 1-0 win and his first winning decision in those games...snapped a 3-game losing streak spanning 4 starts, his first win since May 30 at OAK...was the fourth time in his career he went at least 6 IP and yielded 1 hit or fewer, and the third time in his career he did that in a scoreless start, following May 30 at OAK and Aug 10, 2013 at ATL (with MIA)...recorded 9 SO, the third time in his career he reached that mark and one shy of tying his career high...his line: W, 6 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 9 SO, 1 HBP, 100 pit, 64 str.

HARD TO HIT—Has made 2 starts this season of 6 IP (or more) and 1 hit (or fewer), tied for most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind PIT **Trevor Williams** (3)...for context, has done that twice in 6 starts with the Rays, compared to twice in 127 starts from 2011-16 with the Dodgers, Marlins and Yankees...his .189 opp avg. (24-for-127) would rank 5th in the AL if he qualified, and his 0.82 WHIP is better than any qualifying pitcher in the majors, ahead of WAS **Max Scherzer** (0.85).

- + Is the fourth Rays pitcher to make multiple *scoreless* starts of 6 IP (or more) and 1 hit (or fewer) in the same season, following **Chris Archer** (2) in 2015, **Jake Odorizzi** (3) in 2014 and **Matt Garza** (2) in 2010...is one of three pitchers in the AL with multiple starts of that type this season, along with BOS **Chris Sale** (2) and MIN **Kyle Gibson** (2), who have made 18 and 16 total starts, respectively.

IN COMMAND—Yielded a season-high 2 BB in his last start on Tues vs. WAS...his 1.27 BB/9 IP would be the lowest in the AL and 3rd-lowest in the majors if he qualified...excluding "openers", his 5 starts of 1 BB or fewer are tied for 2nd on the team behind **Blake Snell** (6) and his 2 starts of 0 BB are 2nd behind Snell (3)—and he has achieved this despite starting the season on the 60-day DL...has allowed 2 BB or fewer in 11 consecutive starts since July 19, 2016, the 2nd-longest streak of his career.

THE LONG BALL—Seven of his 8 HR allowed this season have come with the bases empty; the only one with runner(s) on base was on June 10 vs. SEA (**Mike Zunino**, 2-run)...nine of his 16 runs allowed (56.3 pct.) have scored via the home run...min. 30 IP, his 2.04 HR/9 IP ratio is 7th-highest in the AL...his last start snapped a streak of yielding at least 1 HR in four consecutive starts...has allowed multiple homers in 2 starts this season, including back-to-back homers on June 20 at HOU, when he became the first Ray to allow three consecutive homers since **Matt Garza** on July 20, 2010 at BAL.

vs. MIAMI—His only start against the Marlins came on June 16, 2015 at MIA (with NYY), and he allowed 9 hits and 8 R/ER in 0.2 IP...it remains one of four times since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) that a starter has gone less than 1 IP and yielded 9 hits (or more) and 8 runs (or more)—and no one has done it since then...spent parts of three seasons with the Marlins, going 13-27 with a 4.10 ERA (369-IP, 168-ER) in 63 starts for them.

- + Is 4-9 with a 5.59 ERA (112.2-IP, 70-ER) in 21 career interleague starts...is a career .078 hitter (11-for-141) with 1 RBI and 14 sacrifice bunts.
- + Is 6-15 with a 4.48 ERA (193-IP, 96-ER) in 33 career starts at Marlins Park.

NASTY FACTOR—Has averaged 96.9 mph on his 224 fastballs thrown, according to StatCast...has hit at least 98.0 mph 37 times this season, and his max velocity is 99.2 mph (three times in his start on June 10 vs. SEA)...in 2016, he averaged 97.1 mph on his fastball, the 2nd-hardest in the majors (min. 100 IP) behind NYM **Noah Syndergaard** (98.0)...in 2015, he was clocked as high as 102.4 mph, a mark reached by only CIN **Aroldis Chapman** that season.

THE COMEBACK—His season debut was his first game in the majors since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS (with NYY), which he exited due to right elbow discomfort after 1 IP...among his teammates who played in that game were since-retired **Mark Teixeira** and **Alex Rodriguez**...became the 35th player to pitch in the majors after multiple Tommy John surgeries, and the 12th pitcher *at the time* to start in the majors after doing so (see chart above)—on June 6 at WAS, **Jonny Venters** became the 13th pitcher to start in the majors after multiple Tommy John surgeries (and the first to start in the majors after three Tommy John surgeries)...among the pitchers to start in the majors after multiple Tommy John surgeries, he is only the seventh to make at least 5 starts.

- + He became the fourth to pitch for the Rays after multiple Tommy John surgeries, following **Lance Carter** (two), **Al Reyes** (two) and **Jonny Venters** (three), and was the first of two to start a game for them...he was the fourth pitcher to return to the majors this season after multiple Tommy John surgeries, following Venters, WAS **Tim Collins** and CWS **Jace Fry**...he underwent Tommy John surgeries on Aug 19, 2016 (**Dr. Christopher Ahmad**) and as a high school junior on May 27, 2007 (**Dr. David Lintner**).

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
