RAY MATTER—Last night the Rays were shut out for the ninth time this season, first since Aug 31 at CLE and first at home since July 24 vs. NYY... it was also the 29th time they were held to 1 run or fewer, tied for 2nd-most in the AL behind the Orioles (36)...with the loss, the Rays were officially eliminated from AL East contention, and they dropped to 8.5 GB of the A's for the AL's second Wild Card with 18 games remaining...at 79-65, they are one game shy of matching their high-water mark of the season.

- + The Rays are 8-2 since the start of September, 2nd-best winning pct. in the majors behind the Astros (9-1), and they have outscored opponents, 63-35, over that stretch...they are 17-4 since Aug 19, 25-12 (.676) since the start of August and 30-18 (.625) since the ASB.
- + Since matching the worst 17-game start in franchise history (4-13), the Rays are 75-52 (.591), 6th-best winning pct. in the majors since April 18 behind the Red Sox, Yankees, Astros, A's and Cubs.
- + The club's next win will be their 80th of the season, matching their most under fourth-year Manager **Kevin Cash** (2015, 2017)...they are three wins shy of clinching their first winning record since 2013 (92-71) and would need to go 11-7 or better in the last 18 games for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + This is the second series of a 3-series, 9-game homestand against the Orioles (3-0), Indians (1-1) and Athletics...with the Rays chasing the Athletics in the Wild Card race, fans can purchase Lower Corner tickets for the Saturday and Sunday games this weekend for only \$10...visit raysbaseball.com or call 888-FAN-RAYS.

DOME SWEET DOME—Last night's loss snapped a club-record 12-game home winning streak, which was the longest in the majors since the Indians from June 1–July 5, 2016 (13)...it was their first loss here since Aug 8 vs. BAL (5-4 defeat) and only their second loss by 2 runs or more in their last 48 games here (also July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0 loss)...since Aug 9, the Rays are 12-1 at home, matching the best 13-game home stretch in club history...they have outscored opponents, 82-33, over these 13 games.

- + The Rays are 45-25 (.643) at home this season, tied with the Cubs for 3rd in the majors behind the Red Sox (50-20, .714) and Yankees (48-24, .667)...since June 11, the Rays are 33-9 (.786) at home, best in the majors over that span ahead of the Red Sox (27-9, .750)...four of these 9 losses came over a 5-game stretch from Aug 3-8 vs. CWS/BAL...through June 10, the Rays were 12-16 (.429) at home.
- + The Rays have 45 wins at home, their most since 2013 (51)...they have clinched a winning record at home for a second consecutive season after going .500 or worse in 2014, 2015 and 2016.
- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, most in the AL and their most since 2013 (13)...they have hit five walk-off home runs, most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors.

RAYS vs. INDIANS—Today's game wraps up a stretch of 6 games between the clubs in a 13-day span...the Rays are 61-95 (.391) all-time against the Indians (34-44 at home, 27-51 on the road), their worst mark against any AL opponent...they are 3-2 this season (1-1 at home, 2-1 on the road), and a win today would clinch the season series for the first time since 2013 (4-2, excluding the AL Wild Card Game)...the Rays have been shut out in both losses this season—in fact, they haven't scored in four of their 5 losses against the Indians dating back to Aug 11, 2017 at home.

- + The Rays are 20-11 (.645) against the AL Central this season.
- + Today the Rays are facing **Carlos Carrasco**, who is 4-0 with a 1.11 ERA (32.1-IP, 4-ER) and .130 opp avg. (14-for-108) in 5 apps (4 starts) at Tropicana Field and came within a strike of a no-hitter here on July 1, 2015—broken up on a RBI single by **Joey Butler**...no other pitcher has made at least 4 starts here with a lower ERA.

UP NEXT: ATHLETICS—The Rays went 3-1 in a 4-game series at the Oakland Coliseum from May 28-31, but lost the series finale and missed a chance to sweep a road series over the A's for the first time in franchise history...two of their 3 wins were shutouts, in games started by **Ryne Stanek** (1-0 in 13 innings) and **Nathan Eovaldi** (season debut, 6-0).

- + The Rays are 8-3 over the last two seasons against the A's after going 2-5 in 2016...they have won three consecutive series over them for the first time since Aug 23, 2007–Aug 14, 2008 (four straight)...all-time, they are 71-104 (.406) and 41-46 (.471) at home.
- + Both the A's and Rays trailed the Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card at the All-Star break...the Rays have gone 30-18 (.625) since then but the A's have actually gained three games on them.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—Last night was only the second time in their last 19 games the Rays failed to score at least 3 runs and both of these games have been shutout losses to the Indians (Aug 31 at CLE)...over their last 19 games, the Rays are averaging 6.00 runs per game, and they have scored 5 runs or more 13 times and 8 runs or more six times...these two shutout losses are the only times over that span the Rays have been held to 5 hits or fewer—they have recorded double-digit hits in 13 of these 19 games.

- + The Rays rank 2nd in the AL in both avg. (.258) and on-base pct. (.331), trailing the Red Sox in both categories...last season, they finished 12th with a .245 avg. and 10th with a .317 OBP...never in franchise history have the Rays finished a season among the AL's top two teams in avg. or on-base pct.—their highest finish in avg. was 3rd in 2005 and their highest finish in OBP was 3rd in 2013.
- + The Rays have hit 10 HR in their last 6 games, including 6 HR with runner(s) on base and 4 HR with 2 runners (or more) on base...the 10 HR matches their total from the previous 14 games combined.

CHANGE IN APPROACH—The Rays have totaled 132 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors, and are on pace for 149 HR, which would be 79 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 26 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 29-6 (.823) when hitting multiple homers in a game.

- + The Rays are tied for 3rd in the majors with 106 SB behind the Indians (121) and Brewers (109), and their most since 2012 (134).
- + While the Indians offense features three players with at least 30 HR this season, the Rays have only three players with double-digit homers, fewest in the majors...the Yankees and Blue Jays lead the majors with 10 players in double digits...the Rays have never finished a season with fewer than four players with 10+ HR.

SNELL-ZILLA—Today's starter **Blake Snell** ranks 3rd in the majors with a 2.06 ERA behind NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.71) and BOS **Chris Sale** (1.96)...he has a chance to finish with the lowest ERA in club history, currently held by **David Price** in 2012 (2.56)—the year he won the AL Cy Young Award...Snell's 18 wins are tied with CLE **Corey Kluber** for most in the majors and are 3rd in franchise history behind Price in 2012 (20) and 2010 (19).

- + Snell has won six consecutive starts since Aug 10 at TOR.
- + Sale will fall off the ERA leaderboard before making his next start, as he has thrown 147 IP and the Red Sox have played 145 games...for the record, the last 10 AL pitchers to lead the league (or tie) in both wins and ERA have all won the Cy Young Award—the last AL pitcher to do this and not win was BAL **Mike Boddicker** in 1984.

STAY THIRSTY, MY FRIENDS—The Rays have not thrown a complete game since **Matt Andriese** on May 14, 2016 vs. OAK...they have played 434 games since then, the longest drought in AL history and 2nd-longest in major league history, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, behind the Marlins (480) from June 4, 2014–June 2, 2017...since then:

- + the longest outing for a Rays starting pitcher is 8 IP (eight times)
- + a Rays starter has pitched into the 9th inning only once: **Alex Cobb** on July 21, 2017 vs. TEX (double, homer and was replaced)
- + the Rays have had 10 CG thrown against them
- + the Indians have recorded a majors-most 16 CG, while six pitchers have thrown at least 5 CG, led by CLE **Corey Kluber** (9)

MINOR MATTERS—Last night Triple-A Durham lost Game 1 of the Governors' Cup Finals, 3-2, to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in a game delayed by 2 hours, 59 minutes in the 8th inn. and ending at 12:11 a.m. ET...due to the threat of Hurricane Florence, the games scheduled in Durham have been moved to Scranton...this is a rematch of last season's Governors' Cup Finals, and the Bulls are seeking to win back-to-back titles for the first time since 2002-03...Game 2 is tonight at 6:35 p.m., and Class-A Bowling Green is at Peoria in Game 1 of the Midwest League Finals tonight as well.

LAST START—On Fri vs. BAL, both runs allowed came on a 2-run homer by **Joey Rickard**, his 104th and final pitch of his outing...snapped a streak allowing 1 ER or fewer in 14 straight home starts, his most allowed here since Sep 6, 2017 vs. MIN (6)...his 104 pitches were his most since July 7 at NYM (112), making 7 starts in between...was the fourth time in his career he recorded at least 9 SO without a walk and third time this season...his line: W, 5.1 IP, 5 H, 2 R/ER, 0 BB, 9 SO, 1 HR, 104 pit, 72 str.

THE WIN COLUMN—Has won six straight decisions, longest streak of his career and tied with **Ryan Yarbrough's** current streak for the longest by a Ray since **Jake Odorizzi** (6) from July 17–Aug 25, 2016...is attempting to become the first Ray to win seven straight decisions since **Alex Cobb** (7) from June 29–Aug 21, 2014...is also attempting to set a club record by winning a seventh straight start; is currently tied with **David Price** from June 25–July 25, 2014, **Matt Moore** (June 20–July 22, 2013, Sep 29, 2012–April 27, 2013) and **Scott Kazmir** (May 10–June 6, 2008)...the only pitcher in the majors do that this season is **CHC Jon Lester** (7) from May 29–July 1.

+ His 18 wins are tied with **CLE Corey Kluber** for the major league lead and are 3rd in club history behind **Price** in 2012 (20) and 2010 (19).

HE LIKES IT HERE—Has pitched to a 1.23 ERA at home, best in the majors ahead of **NYM Jacob deGrom** (1.66)...no pitcher has finished a season with a home ERA that low since **MIA José Fernández** (1.19) in 2013, and no AL pitcher has done so since **CAL Nolan Ryan** (1.07) in 1972...in club history the lowest ERA at home over an entire season is held by **David Price** (1.81) in 2012...hasn't allowed more than 2 runs at home this season, and has yielded 1 run or fewer in 10 of his 12 home starts.

AGAINST THE BEST—Today's start will be the 12th time in 28 starts this season he will face one of the majors' top five offensive teams by runs scored...in his 11 starts against the Red Sox (4), Yankees (3), Indians (1), Astros (2) and Athletics (1), he is 8-2 with a 2.08 ERA (65-IP, 15-ER), including 7 starts allowing 1 run or fewer and four scoreless starts...he went 3-0 with a 1.08 ERA in 4 starts against the Red Sox, the majors' top-scoring team...min. 3 starts, no other pitcher this season has posted a sub-4.00 ERA against the Red Sox—the closest is **NY Yankees Luis Severino** (4.24).

CANT TOUCH THIS—In 7 starts since Aug 4, is 6-0 with a 1.42 ERA (38-IP, 6-ER) including 6 starts of 1 ER or fewer...his ERA is best in the AL and 3rd in the majors over that span...in 12 starts since June 19, is 10-1 with a 1.42 ERA (69.2-IP, 11-ER), leading the majors in wins since then despite a stint on the disabled list...in 18 starts since May 18, is 14-2 with a 1.54 ERA (105-IP, 18-ER), leading the majors in wins and ERA during that stretch.

LEADERBOARDS—His 2.06 ERA ranks 3rd in the majors behind **NYM Jacob deGrom** (1.71) and **BOS Chris Sale** (1.96)...led the AL in ERA through July 9, joining **David Price** in 2012 as the only pitchers in club history to hold the AL lead in ERA in July or later, according to Stats LLC...his 2.06 ERA would set a club record among qualifiers, ahead of **Price** (2.56) in 2012...also ranks among AL leaders in opp avg. (.188, 2nd), WHIP (1.01, 4th) SO/9 IP ratio (10.66, 8th), HR/9 IP ratio (0.86, 5th) and wild pitches (13, tied for 3rd)...min. 100 IP, leads the majors with a .091 opp avg. with RISP and a .061 opp avg. with RISP/2 outs...according to FanGraphs, is averaging 95.7 mph on his fastball, 4th in the AL, and 14.6 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 3rd in the AL.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 1 run or fewer in 17 starts this season, 2nd-most in the majors behind teammate **Ryne Stanek** (21)—who has made 25 starts this season but none longer than 2 IP...excluding openers, they are the most by an AL pitcher since **SEA Félix Hernández** (17) in 2012...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 23 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind **Stanek** (24)...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 16 of his last 18 starts dating back to May 18 at LAA.

+ Excluding openers, his 17 starts of 1 run or fewer and 23 starts of 2 runs or fewer are both single-season club records.

FIRST-TIME ALL-STAR—Replaced **CLE Corey Kluber** on the AL All-Star Team roster...was the first selection of his career, and it marked the ninth consecutive season the Rays had a pitcher named an All-Star; only the Yankees (12) have a longer streak in the AL...was the third pitcher used by the AL, and he went 1.2 IP, yielding a homer to **Willson Contreras** on the first pitch of his outing...struck out **Nolan Arenado**, **Matt Kemp** and **Bryce Harper**.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + On Tues vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
