TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final homestand of the season with the final of 3 games vs. the Oakland Athletics (1-1)...on this homestand, will also host the Texas Rangers for 4 games beginning Thursday...went 6-4 on the final road trip of the season, going 3-1 at Los Angeles-AL, 2-1 at Houston and 1-2 at Texas...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night and have won 7 of their last 12 and 8 of their last 15...are 21-21 in their last 42 games since Aug. 9...are 31-40 in their last 71 games since July 4 after winning a season-high 8 straight games, spanning June 25 - July 3...the Mariners are 46-47 in their last 93 games since June 10...Seattle is 72-60 in its last 132 games (4/28-c) and 77-63 over its last 140 games (4/20-c)...Seattle is 24-27 during the day and 62-44 at night...Seattle is 42-34 at Safeco Field, 44-37 on the road.

- **Electric Eddie** - last night, **Edwin Díaz** made his 40th appearance at Safeco Field this season...becomes the 4th pitcher in club history (done 5x) with at least 40 appearances at home in a single season, joining David Aardsma (42, 2009), J.J. Putz (42, 2007; and 41, 2006) and Sean Green (40, 2008).
- **Pitching In** - the Mariners are the only club in the Majors to have 5 pitchers make at least 25 starts apiece (**Mike Leake**, 31; **Marco Gonzales**, 28; **Félix Hernández**, 27; **James Paxton**, 27; **Wade LeBlanc**-26)...four clubs (Cleveland, Colorado, Houston & Philadelphia) have 4 pitchers with 25+ starts each.
- **Ring 'Em Up** - the Mariners pitching staff has recorded 1,279 strikeouts this season, 5th-most in franchise history...trails the Mariners clubs of 2016 (1,318), 2014 (1,317), 2013 (1,297) and 2015 (1,283).
- **Exist to Assist** - **Mitch Haniger** has 12 outfield assists this season, tied with Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN for the Major League lead...each of Haniger's 12 outfield assists came as a right fielder, tops by any right fielder in the Majors...Haniger's 12 outfield assists are the most by a Mariners player since **Ichiro Suzuki** also had 12 outfield assists in 2004.
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 63-19 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 23-52 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are the only Major League club with a 1.000 winning percentage (74-0) when leading after 8 innings this season.
- **Division Rivals** - the Mariners are in the midst of playing their final 17 games (7-5) vs. AL West foes...Seattle is 37-32 (.536) vs. the AL West this season (**10-8 vs. OAK**, 10-9 vs. HOU, 11-8 vs. LAA and 7-8 vs. TEX).

MITCH-A-PALOOZA...**Mitch Haniger** ranks 8th among American League position players with a WAR of 6.1 (*Baseball-Reference*); see chart at left...Haniger's 6.1 bWAR is the highest of any Mariners outfielder since Franklin Gutierrez in 2009 (6.6)...Haniger is only the 4th Mariners outfielder in club history (done 10x) with a bWAR of at least 6.1; Ken Griffey Jr. had 6 seasons of 6.1+ bWAR, followed by Ichiro Suzuki (2), Gutierrez (1) and Haniger (1)...at 27 years of age, Haniger is the 5th Mariners position player with a bWAR of at least 6.1 in his age-27 season or younger (last: Gutierrez, 6.6 bWAR, 26, 2009); Griffey Jr. had 5 such seasons, followed by Alex Rodriguez (3), Gutierrez (1), Haniger (1) and Suzuki (1).

EXTRA, EXTRA...with last night's 10-8 win in 11 innings, the Mariners improved to 14-1 in extra-inning games this season...the Mariners lead the Major Leagues in extra-inning wins this season, ahead of Oakland (13), San Francisco (11), Toronto (10) and Chicago-NL (10)...the Mariners 14 extra-inning wins this season are also a club record (previous: 12, 1984).

CLIMBING THE RANKS...**Félix Hernández** enters tonight's start with 2,463 career strikeouts, 2 punchouts shy of surpassing Mark Langston (2,464) for 37th-most career strikeouts in Major League history...since the beginning of the season, Hernández has climbed from 48th on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard to 38th entering tonight, surpassing Hall of Famer Robin Roberts, Charlie Hough, Hall of Famer Sandy Koufax, Kevin Brown, Hall of Famer Dennis Eckersley, Luis Tiant, Jamie Moyer, Andy Pettitte, Sam McDowell and Jim Kaat.

COMING IN HOT...**Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 43 of his last 50 games, dating back to July 31...during that span, he's batting .330 (69x209) with 36 runs, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 23 RBI, 2 HBP, 17 walks, a .383 on-base percentage and a .560 slugging percentage (.942 OPS)...**Haniger ranks 2nd the Major Leagues in hits since July 31**, while also ranking T3rd in doubles, 5th in extra-base hits, 9th in batting, 12th in OPS and T13th in runs...Mitch has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games (9/11-c), batting .382 (21x55) with 13 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 6 RBI and 4 walks.

THE CANÓ SHOW...**Robinson Canó** has an active 7-game hitting streak (9/18-c), matching his season-high (also: 3/29-4/7 and 8/18-25)...his 7-game hitting streak includes 5 multi-hit contests...during the streak, he is batting .517 (15x29) with 4 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs and 8 RBI...since Sept. 4, Canó is batting .370 (27x73) with 10 runs, 7 doubles, 4 home runs, 17 RBI, 1 HBP, 6 walks, a .425 on-base percentage and a .630 slugging percentage (1.055 OPS) in 19 games.

90/90...**Mitch Haniger** has scored 88 runs and recorded 91 RBI this season...with 2 more runs scored, Haniger would become only the 13th player (done previously 28x) in club history to score at least 90 runs and record at least 90 RBI in a single season...he would join Bret Boone (2x, 2001 & 2003), Jay Buhner (3x, 1993, 1996 1997), Mike Cameron (2001), **Robinson Canó** (2016), **Nelson Cruz** (3x, 2015, 2016, 2017), Ken Griffey Jr. (6x, 1993, 1994, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (2006) Edgar Martinez (4x, 1995, 1996, 1997 & 2000), Tino Martinez (1995), John Olerud (2001), Álex Rodríguez (4x, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000) and Richie Sexson (2005).

SAVE ME...**Edwin Díaz** has recorded 56 of 58 (96.6%) of Seattle's team saves this season...his 96.6% of team saves is currently the highest mark ever by a closer since saves became an official stat in 1969 (min. 50 team saves in season)...he ranks ahead of John Smoltz-ATL in 2002 (96.5%, 55 of 57), Fernando Rodney-TB in 2012 (96.0%, 48 of 50), Rod Beck-SF in 1993 (96.0%, 48 of 50) and Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (94.8%, 55 of 58).

AS YOU KNOW...**Kyle Seager** had a pinch-hit, game-tying, RBI-single in the 9th inning last night before **Chris Herrmann** delivered a pinch-hit, walk-off, 2-run home run in the 11th inning of the Mariners 10-8 win...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners became the first team to have a pinch-hit, game-tying hit in the 9th and a pinch-hit, game-winning hit in extra innings since 2007?...the Milwaukee Brewers accomplished this feat on Sept. 29, 2007 vs. San Diego; Tony Gwynn Jr. had a pinch-hit, game-tying, RBI-triple off Trevor Hoffman in the 9th inning and Vinny Rottino had a pinch-hit, walk-off, RBI-single off Joe Thatcher in the 11th inning of the Brewers 4-3 victory...research via **STATS LLC**.

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 404th career appearance (403rd start), his 28th start of the season and his 52nd career appearance (51st start) vs. Oakland tonight.
- Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts (see more in "He's Our Leader").
- Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
- In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes... joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitchers to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014.
- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005.
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days, 7/6/84 at MIN).
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
- A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9,0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
- Is 24-23 with a 3.42 ERA (158 ER, 416.0 IP) in 65 career starts in September.

LAST OUTING...did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 2-4 Mariners loss to the Yankees on Sept. 8...tossed 4+ innings before exiting in the top of the 5th with hamstring tightness...allowed 2 runs (1 earned) on 6 hits with 2 strikeouts...sole earned run came on a leadoff home run by Andrew McCutchen.

HE'S BACK...is making his first start since Sept. 8 due to a sore right hamstring...was previously placed on the 10-day disabled list with lower back stiffness on July 10 (retro to July 8)...was activated prior to the game on July 21.

ATHLETICS TALENT...Félix's 2.73 career ERA vs. Oakland ranks 2nd among qualifying active pitchers (Ervin Santana, 1.95/45 ER, 208.0 IP)...leads the Majors in wins (26) and strikeouts (309) vs. the A's since his debut in 2005.

NOW THAT'S QUALITY...of Félix's 50 career starts against the Athletics, 38 are quality starts, including his starts on April 15 (6.1,5,2,2,0,7,HR-1) and May 1 (6.0,3,3,3,4,7,HR-1) this season at Safeco Field...since the Athletics moved to Oakland in 1968, no pitcher has recorded more quality starts vs. the Athletics than Hernández...he ranks ahead of Frank Tanana (34), Bert Blyleven (31), Tommy John (29), Ervin Santana (27) and Roger Clemens (27).

CLIMBING THE RANKS...has 2,463 career strikeouts, 38th-most in Major League history...with 2 more strikeouts, Félix will pass Mark Langston (2,464 K) for 37th-most strikeouts in ML history with 2,465...he is averaging 7.18 K's per 9.0 innings this year.

IMPRESSIVE START...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (64)...the next closest pitchers are Justin Verlander and Jon Lester with 54...during this stretch Félix has recorded 255 quality starts, the T2nd-most in the Major Leagues (also: Cole Hamels), behind only Verlander (278).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

HE'S OUR LEADER...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chicago-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

CAREER...has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner...is 168-127 with a 3.33 ERA (982 ER, 2654.0 IP) in 403 career appearances (402 starts) with 25 CG, 11 Sho, and 1 Perfect Game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins, starts, quality starts (255), innings pitched and strikeouts (2,463).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP MARCO GONZALES (13-9, 4.12 ERA)

26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 29th start of the 2018 season tomorrow vs. Texas...club-leading W#13 in his last start, a 13-0 Mariners win at TEX on 9/22 (6.0,1,0,0,1,3)...was on the 10-day disabled list with a cervical (neck) muscle strain 8/27 (retro to 8/24) to 9/10...won 5 straight starts, 6/29-7/29, allowing just 6 earned runs across 34.1 IP (1.57 ERA) over that span...W#8 was the 1st complete game of his career, a 4-1 Mariners win on 6/29 vs. KC (9.0,6,1,1,0,7)...2017: Went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 11 walks in 11 games (8 starts)...was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 10 games (7 starts) with Seattle. CAREER: Drafted by St. Louis with 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...made MLB debut with the Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado...is 18-12 with a 4.56 ERA (121 ER, 239.0 IP) with 203 strikeouts in 50 games (42 starts) in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...missed the 2016 season while recovering from ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow...vs. OAK: Will be making his 5th career appearance (4th start) against the Athletics...is 1-1 with a 3.72 ERA (8 ER, 19.1 IP) in 4 career games (3 GS) vs. the A's...in 2018, has made 3 starts against Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings on 5/23 (7.0,2,0,0,2,6), but has allowed 4 earned runs in each of his other 2 outings against the Athletics this season.

ALL HANDS ON DECK...the Mariners have used a total of 53 different players this season...that's the 3rd-most players used in a single season in franchise history, trailing only the 61 players used in 2017 and the 54 used in 2016...Seattle has used 32 different pitchers (including 2 position players: **Andrew Romine**, 3 games, and Taylor Motter) this season; that's tied for second-most ever (1. 40 in 2017; T2. 32 in 2016)...all 38 players on the Mariners current active roster have already appeared in a game this season.

NEED TO GET TO 4...Seattle lost 7-3 vs. the A's on Monday night...was the 75th time this season the Mariners had scored 3 or fewer runs in a game, and Seattle fell to 23-52 in those games...75 team games with 3 or fewer runs is the 5th-most in the AL, trailing only BAL (89), DET (80), LAA (79) and KC (76) and ranks 9th in MLB...Seattle's 23 wins when scoring 3 or fewer leads the Majors, ahead of the Cubs (22-51), Giants (21-66), Rockies (21-42) & A's (21-40).

OUR LEADERS...Mariners leadoff hitters this season – **Dee Gordon** (99 games), **Mitch Haniger** (41 games), **Jean Segura** (14 games), **Guillermo Heredia** (2 games) and **Denard Span** (1 game) – have combined to hit .358 leading off a game this year, going 54-for-151 with 9 extra-base hits, including 2 home runs...the .358 average leads MLB.

IN THE BLACK...at 86-71, the Mariners have clinched a winning season...2018 is just the third time in franchise history that Seattle never took the field with a record under .500...the Mariners were exactly .500 3 times this year (at 1-1, 3-3 & 4-4) but never fell under .500...the only other seasons the Mariners have been .500 or better on every day of the season were 1996 and 2001.

FOR STARTERS...**Matt Festa** (1.0 IP on Sept. 19) was the 11th different starting pitcher used by the Mariners this season...the 11 starters used by the Mariners this season is tied (w/7 other teams) for 14th-most starters used this season...for Seattle, 5 guys (**Mike Leake**, **Marco Gonzales**, **Félix Hernández**, **James Paxton**, **Wade LeBlanc**) have combined for 138 starts, with each making at least 26, and **Erasmó Ramírez** has chipped in 10, with five other pitchers combining for 8 starts (Eliás, 3; Bergman, 2; Festa, Miranda, Vincent, 1)...Seattle used a club-record tying 17 starters in 2017.

THE ROTATION...**Mike Leake** (31 GS), **Marco Gonzales** (28 GS), **Félix Hernández** (27 GS), **James Paxton** (27 GS) and **Wade LeBlanc** (26 GS) have all made 25+ starts this season...2018 is just the fourth time in Seattle franchise history that the club has had five pitchers make at least 25 starts...this year joins 2006 (**Hernández**, Meche, Moyer, Piñeiro & Washburn), 2003 (Franklin, García, Meche, Moyer & Pineiro) and 1991 (DeLucia, Hanson, Holman, R. Johnson & Krueger).

DON'T WALK...Mariners pitchers did not walk a Padres batter Sept. 11, marking the 22nd game this season in which Seattle hurlers did not issue a free pass...the Mariners 22 games issuing 0 walks are tops in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors this season...they trail only the Dodgers (28), while ranking ahead of Washington (16), Oakland (15) and San Diego (14)...the 22 games with 0 walks issued by Mariners pitchers are the most in single-season club history, surpassing the previous mark of 17 such games set by the 2002 Mariners.

GOOD TO BE HOME...**Nelson Cruz** has hit 21 home runs at Safeco Field this season, which is tied for the most all-time at Safeco Field, along with Richie Sexson's 21 home runs at Safeco Field in 2005...Cruz, who hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in 2017, is joined by Bret Boone (2001) and Edgar Martínez (2000) as the only other players to hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in a single season...overall this season, Cruz's 21 home runs at home are 5th-most in the American League, trailing only J.D. Martínez-BOS (24), Khris Davis-OAK (23) and Joey Gallo-TEX (23).

40/100...**Nelson Cruz** has 37 home runs and 92 RBI this season in 157 team games; that puts him on pace for 38 home runs and 98 RBI...Cruz is the only player in baseball to have averaged more than 40 homers and 100 RBI over the past five seasons...since the start of the 2014 campaign, Cruz leads the Majors with 203 home runs (40.6 per year) and is 3rd (trailing Nolan Arenado, 559, & Edwin Encarnación, 544) with 520 RBI (104.0 per year)...he had at least 39 homers and 93 RBI in every season from 2014-2017.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME...the Mariners finished their road slate at 44-37 (.543), and are currently tied for the 4th-most road wins in the Majors...the Mariners are tied with Chicago-NL (44-37/.543), Colorado (44-37/.543), Oakland (44-31/.587) and St. Louis (44-34/.564), while trailing Houston (52/22/.703), Boston (51-30/.630) and Atlanta (45-30/.600)...in Mariners club history, the 2018 club is also tied for the 5th-most road wins in a single season (also: 2000, 44-37/.543), trailing 2001 (59-22/.728), 2014 (46-35/.568), 2002 (45-36/.556) and 1997 (45-36/.556).

HOME ON THE ROAD...Seattle finished its road schedule at 44-37 (see above)...Mariners have had a winning road record just 9 times in franchise history, last turning the trick in 2016 (also: 2014, 2003, 2002, 2001, 2000, 1997, 1996).

MR. CONSISTENT...**Mike Leake** has made 31 starts this season, his 7th consecutive season of 30 or more starts...Leake should become just the second pitcher in the live ball era with at least 7 straight seasons of 30+ starts and 50 or fewer walks...Leake enters play tonight with 34 walks this year...only Greg Maddux (13 straight, 1996-2008) had more than 7 consecutive 30+ GS/50 or fewer walk seasons...Roy Halladay (2006-11) and Fritz Peterson (1969-74) each had 6 such seasons.

THE OCHO...**Edwin Díaz** notched his 8th save vs. Houston this season on Sept 17; that matches the Mariners club record for most saves by a Mariners pitcher vs. any single opponent in a single season...**Edwin also has 8 vs. Oakland this year** (3 games remaining)...**Fernando Rodney** (8 vs. OAK in 2014) is the only other Mariners pitcher to record 8 saves vs. 1 opponent in a single season...the AL record is 10, shared by Neftalí Feliz-TEX vs. LAA (2010), Mariano Rivera-NYY vs. BAL (2004) and José Valverde-DET vs. KC (2011).
