LEADING OFF: Angels welcome ESPN'S SUNDAY NIGHT BASEBALL... Halos play the third contest (1-1) of a six-game home stand against Dodgers (July 6-8; 1-1) & Mariners (July 10-12)...Angels head up the 5 freeway to Dodger Stadium (July 13-15) before reaching the All-Star Break...Angels are off tomorrow...Halos are 5-5 in rubber games...20 of next 29 games are at home (LAA is 11-5 in last 16 games at Big A)...Angels are 4-4 in last eight affairs but have dropped eight of 12 and 10 of 14 overall...Club hasn't been under .500 mark since dropping first game of season (March 29th)...LAA is in fourth place, a season-high 14.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (11.0 games behind second Wild Card spot)...Angels are 32-42 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA is 6-16 when a left-hander starts (39-29 vs. RHS).

KNOW THIS: With his 25th HR yesterday, Mike Trout has joined Frank Robinson and Eddie Mathews as the only players ever with seven seasons of 25+ HRs prior to their age-27 campaign.

SCORING CHANGE: Earlier today Major League Baseball made an official scoring change, switching a wild pitch by Andrew Heaney in the 1st inning of his last start on July 3 at Seattle to a passed ball. One of the runs in that inning is now unearned.

HELLO AND GOODBYE: Tonight's starter Andrew Heaney was briefly a member of the Dodgers organization on Dec. 10, 2014 after being traded to by Miami along with C/INF Austin Barnes, RHP Chris Hatcher and OF Enrique Hernandez in exchange for INF Dee Gordon, RHP Dan Haren, INF Miguel Rojas and cash considerations. Later that day, the Dodgers sent him to the Angels for INF Howie Kendrick.

SPEED, POWER AND PATIENCE: With his 25th HR yesterday, Mike Trout joined Jeff Bagwell (1999) as they only players in MLB history with at least 25+ HRs, 75+ BB and 10+ SB before the All-Star Break... Trout has 25 HRs, 78 BB and 13 SBs with seven games remaining before the break (Bagwell had 28 HRs, 83 BB, 17 SBs). STATS

FAST FACTS: In his last six starts at Angel Stadium, Andrew Heaney is 4-1 with a 0.88 ERA (41 IP – 4 ER) and 36 strikeouts...Angels' offense limited to two runs or less in four of six games this month (held to one run three times)...Halo relievers lead the A.L. in lowest inherited runners scoring percentage (20.5%; 31 of 151 inherited runners have scored)...Mike Trout & Jason Giambi (78 in 2000) are only A.L. players since 2000 with at least 78 walks before All-Star break...Friday's first pitch temperature of 108 degrees (7:07 pm PT) marked hottest at home in club history...Angel pitchers have 42 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 90 games...LAA pitchers have 10+ Ks in four of last five games.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: Angels' top prospect OF Jo Adell will play on the U.S. Roster in the All-Star Futures Game Sunday, July 15 at Nationals Park. Adell, selected in the first round of the 2017 amateur draft, has a combined slash line of .319/.369/.607 between Burlington (A) and Inland Empire (A+). In 66 combined games, he has 21 doubles, 3 triples, 17 HRs, 61 RBI & 11 SBs.

PRIZED TROUT: Later this afternoon, Major League Baseball will reveal the rosters for the 2018 All-Star Game...If he is selected as a starter, Mike Trout would set Angels franchise records with seven career All-Star selections and six nominations as a starter.

TRIPLE THREATS AT 1K: June 21st marked the 1,000th career game for Trout...He joined Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez as only players in MLB history with at least a .300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases at the 1K milestone.

MAKE WAR: Trout's 6.8 WAR this season (Wins Above Replacement) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is Jose Ramirez (CLE) at 5.6...On pace for a 12.2 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his 60.9 career WAR is tops in MLB history thru 1,015 games.

SHELVED: Angels have 13 players currently on the disabled list...The average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 31 games...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...50 players have appeared for LAA this season, most in MLB (franchise record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers have played for LAA (12 starters), most in team history thru 90 games (LAA used a club-record 31 pitchers last season).

FROM THE START: Halo starters have allowed three earned runs or less in 50 of last 62 games...Starters have fashioned a 3.30 ERA (335.2 IP – 123 ER) since May 1, second in A.L. in span (3rd in MLB).

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 4 in MLB in several offensive categories, including HRs (2nd; 25), runs (4th; 68), times on base (1st; 180), total bases (3rd; 196), walks (1st; 78), IBB (1st; 15), OBP (1st; .455), SLG (3rd; .630), OPS (2nd; 1.085) & OPS+ (1st; 200.0)...Trout has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (12)...Since his call-up in 2012, Trout has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...78 walks are most in Angel history through 90 games.

GLOVE STORY: LAA is errorless in 56 of 90 games...Club has 41 errors thru 90 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .987 fielding pct...Catchers own a 47.2 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...Mike Trout and Charlie Blackmon are only CF's in MLB with 1,000 fielding pct.

PITCHING POINTS: LAA pitchers have 42 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 90 affairs (LAA ranks 4th in A.L. with 819 Ks)...310 walks are third-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has logged 335.1 IP, second in A.L. to TB...15 blown saves are third-most in A.L...Halos have allowed 118 HRs, third-most in A.L.

HOT HALOS: In his last two outings, Felix Pena has logged 10.2 innings allowing two earned runs (2.53 ERA) while striking out 13...In 16 outings since June 1, Cam Bedrosian has allowed one earned run (16 IP; 0.56 ERA) with six walks and 17 Ks...Andrelton Simmons has hit safely in 12 of his last 14 overall games batting (.333; 18/54)...Rookie David Fletcher has hit safely in seven of nine and nine of his first 12 MLB starts (4 multi-hit games).

A BIT ON ALBERT: Albert Pujols is 36 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez...Albert's double July 4th at Seattle (4th inn) marked his 1,275th career extra-base hit, tying Alex Rodriguez for sixth all-time...Next up is Willie Mays at 1,323 XBH (5th).

NOT A FAN: Andrelton Simmons has struck out just seven times since May 1 (219 PA)...He went 90 PA without fanning (May 18-June 22)...He leads MLB in PA per SO with 21.60 (324 PA/15 K) while Ian Kinsler ranks third in MLB (10.83; 325 PA/30 K)...Simmons leads MLB batting .340 (34/100) with two strikes.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols is 27th all-time with 3,049 hits...Rod Carew is 26th at 3,053...His 3,000th hit came May 4th at Seattle to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,964 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

Vs. DODGERS: Clubs split 2017 season series 2-2...Angels have won seven of last 11 matchups...Since 2005, Angels are 41-30 vs. LAD (24-13 at Angel Stadium)...All-time, Halos are 37-22 at home, 27-30 on road and 64-52 overall against LAD...Under Mike Scioscia, LAA is 59-43 vs. LAD.

MARINERS ON DECK: Angels have dropped five of last six to M's (all on road)...Mariners lead 2018 series 6-3 (all at SAFECO)...Angels are 6-3 in last nine home games vs. Seattle...LAA is 101-79 over M's since 2009...A. Simmons is batting .379 (11/29) vs. M's this season...Trout has hit safely in eight of nine games vs. M's this season, batting .514 (18/35) with 9 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 5 HRs and 9 RBI...He has an extra-base hit in each of the eight games hitting safely.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

July 8
 (2006) Rookie Jered Weaver earns the win over Oakland to start his career 6-0, only player in club history to win first six Major League starts; (2011) Mike Trout makes his MLB debut (19 years, 335 days), becoming the youngest Halo to debut since May 30, 1971 (Andy Hassler, 19 years, 224 days).

July 9
 (1971) Angels fall to Oakland, 1-0 in 20 innings, setting record for longest extra-inning game in club history; (1972) Nolan Ryan hurled a one-hitter in a 3-0 victory vs. Boston, striking out side in second on nine pitches...He logged 16 Ks in the game; (2000) Garret Anderson sets the Angels' HR record before the All-Star break with his 26th, passing Troy Glaus (2000) & Leon Wagner (1962) who each had 25; (2000) Darin Erstad reaches the All-Star break with 144 hits, third-highest total since All-Star Game began in 1933; (2007) Vlad Guerrero wins the Home Run Derby in San Francisco hitting 17 HRs and beating Toronto's Alex Rios 3-2 in the final...Guerrero's most impressive shot: a 503-footer to left that fell just short of the oversized baseball glove.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP ANDREW HEANEY

4-6, 3.84 ERA

Leads the Majors with a 0.88 home ERA (41 IP – 4 ER) since April 27

- **SCORING CHANGE:** Earlier today Major League Baseball made an official scoring change, switching Heaney's wild pitch in the 1st inning of last start on July 3 at Seattle to a passed ball. One of the runs in that inning is now unearned
- **BACK ON THE MOUND:** Making 16th start of the season and eighth at home...First start of 2018 vs. Dodgers...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **HOT AT HOME:** In last six starts at Angel Stadium, is 4-1 with a 0.88 ERA (41 IP – 4 ER) and 36 strikeouts...His home ERA leads the Majors (min. 40 IP) in that span (since April 27).
- **MONTH OF JULY:** In six career starts in the month of July, is 4-1 with a 3.08 ERA (38 IP – 13 ER)...In last five July starts, is pitching to a 2.10 ERA (34.1 IP – 8 ER) in those games.
- **RECENT QUALITY:** Has been charged with two-or-fewer earned runs in nine of last 13 starts, while pitching to a 3.16 ERA (79.2 IP – 28 ER) in that span...Had streak of five consecutive quality starts snapped on May 31 at Detroit...During eight game stretch from April 27 – June 5, pitched to a 1.93 ERA (51.1 IP – 11 ER).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Tuesday at Seattle after allowing three runs (two earned) (all in 1st inning) on five hits with two walks and matched his season-high with 10 strikeouts (3rd time)...Dropped road record to 0-4 with a 5.56 ERA (43.2 IP – 27 ER) this season.
- **BIRTHDAY SHUTOUT:** Tossed a one-hit shutout on June 5 (his 27th birthday) vs. Kansas City...Marked first complete game and shutout of career...First shutout by an Angel since **Ricky Nolasco** on July 1, 2017 vs. Seattle...It was the first CG one-hitter for Angels since **Ervin Santana** on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since **Chuck Finley** on May 26, 1989 at Boston...Became first Major Leaguer to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' **Vicente Palacios** on July 19, 1994 at Houston...First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since **Andy Messersmith** on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.
- **FIRST PITCH SWINGING:** Opponents have swung at the first pitch 33.2% of the time vs. Heaney, which is the seventh highest rate in the American League (min. 60 IP).
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Allowed just one home run during an eight start span from April 27 – June 5 (51.1 IP), but has allowed seven home runs across five starts since...10 starts of 5+ innings and zero HR allowed this season are tied for second most among all Major League lefties.
- **VS. DODGERS:** Tonight marks first start vs. Dodgers since Sept. 8, 2015 at Dodger Stadium...In two career starts vs. Dodgers (both in 2015), is 0-2 with a 6.10 ERA (10.1 IP – 7 ER)...Was briefly a member of Dodgers organization on Dec. 10, 2014 after being traded to Miami along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations; Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.
- **INTERLEAGUE:** Third interleague start of season...In seven career starts in interleague play is 1-6 with a 5.85 ERA (40 IP – 26 ER)...**Only interleague victory came on July 7, 2015 at Colorado**...In two interleague starts this season, is 0-2 with a 7.84 ERA (10.1 IP – 9 ER)...On April 5, 2016 vs. Cubs, suffered left flexor muscle strain which would ultimately lead to Tommy John surgery...In 12 career games (10 starts) against National League opponents is 1-7 with a 5.81 ERA (57.1 IP – 37 ER).
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 20 career starts at Angel Stadium, is 8-5 with a 3.47 ERA (119.1 IP – 46 ER)...This season, is 4-2 with a 2.18 ERA (45.1 IP – 11 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 13 of the 20 starts...Angels won each of his first six starts at The Big A, but have lost eight of last 14.
- **9 K's IN 5 IP:** On April 27 vs. New York (A.L), became first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since **Hector Santiago** on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- **STARTING NINE:** With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- **2017 RECAP:** Missed majority of season on disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (July 1, 2016)...Following six rehab starts, made return to Angels on Aug. 18 at Baltimore...Made five total starts for Angels, going 1-2 with a 7.06 ERA (21.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS:** Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.
