LEADING OFF: Happy Birthday to Hitting Coach Eric Hinske!...Halos play the final contest of a six-game trip (1-4) to Tampa Bay (0-3) & Cleveland (1-1)...**Angels are 16-11 vs. A.L. Central foes**...Halos have **dropped five of last six**...LAA shutout last night for seventh time this season (2nd time on road)...**Club looking to avoid falling three games under .500 for first time since Sept. 30, 2017 (79-82)**...After starting 18-8 on the road (*tops in MLB*), Angels are 8-21 since...**LAA is 6-9 since the break, 12-16 since July 1st & 14-17 across last 31 games**...Angels are in fourth place, -16.0 in A.L. West (-11.0 for 2nd wild card)...Halos have spent last 38 days in 4th place...**LAA is 10-21 when lefty starts (45-36 vs. RHS)**...Tomorrow, Angels open a six-game home stand with Detroit (8/6-8) & Oakland (8/10-12).

KNOW THIS: Albert Pujols is four hits shy of becoming one of nine players all-time with 1,000 hits in each league (2,073 hits with St. Louis; 996 with LAA)...Ironically, four former Angels are on the list - Dave Winfield, Frank Robinson, Vladimir Guerrero & Orlando Cabrera.

FAST FACTS: Angels limited to two runs-or-less three times last four games...**A. Simmons** is batting .323 (20/62) in 17 career games vs. Cleveland, including a .357 (10/28) clip at Progressive Field...**Eric Young Jr.** has seven hits in 15 career AB (.467) at Progressive Field...**LAA batting .309 (34/110)** with RISP last 13 contests

TWO FOR THE SHO: On Friday, Shohei Ohtani had best offensive performance of his career (4/5; 3 R, 2 HR, 3 RBI)...**Marked first career four-hit game, multi-HR game and first two career HR on the road**...**Batting .500 (9/18, 6 R, 4 HR, 8 RBI)** in four games vs. Tribe in 2018.

SAY WHAT? Ohtani is the first player in MLB history to hit 10+ HR & tally 50+ pitching strikeouts in same season (*STATS*)...**He is just the second player since 1900 with 10+ HR & 4+ wins in a season – Babe Ruth is only other (1918-19).**

TROUT OUT: Mike Trout has missed last three games with a right wrist contusion (day-to-day)...Thursday marked first time he did not appear in a game since Sept. 28, 2017 at White Sox...He suffered the injury on a head-first slide into third Wednesday at Tampa Bay.

DAILY DISH OF TROUT: With his next walk, Trout will reach 100 BB, 25 HR & 20 SB for third time in career (2013 & 2016)...No other American Leaguer has ever accomplished the feat more than once: **Toby Harrah (1977) & Carl Yastrzemski (1970)**...**If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be his third campaign doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other in MLB to accomplish).**

THE NEW ME: Kole Calhoun has four HRs his last nine games & nine HRs last 20 affairs...In those 20 games, hitting .320 (24/75) with 18 runs, six doubles, nine HR & 21 RBI...**In 39 games since returning from D.L., batting .281 (39/139) with 28 runs, nine doubles, 13 HR & 30 RBI** to raise season average from .145 to .206 (1 HR & 11 RBI over previous 50 G)...**His 13 HR since June 18th lead A.L.**

AWAY WITH YOU! Andrelton Simmons (.342; 63/184, 2nd in A.L.) & Mike Trout (.326; 63/193, 5th in A.L.) are LAA's top road hitters this season...**Justin Anderson** (2.14 ERA in 20 G), **Jose Alvarez** (2.31 ERA in 28 G) & **Felix Pena** (1.84 ERA; 14.2 IP – 3 ER) are Halos' top pitching performers in away games this season.

LOOKING AHEAD: 36 of 49 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 at home, 7 on road), 10 against Houston (3 at home, 7 on road), nine against Oakland (6 at home, 3 on road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...**17 of 28 games this month on road**...LAA plays seven interleague games in August (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI and 8/27-28 vs. COL).

#27 TURNS 27: Mike Trout turns 27 on Tuesday (8/7/91)...**He and Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign-or-younger (first in A.L. history)**...1 of 4 players with 1,100 hits & 600 walks before turning 27, joining Jimmie Foxx, Mel Ott, & Mickey Mantle...Also joins Mantle, Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 BB & 225 HR prior to 27th birthday...**Of the other 15 players with 200+ HR at 26-or-younger, none had more stolen bases than Trout (186) and only three had a higher on-base percentage (.415) at that point in their career (ELIAS).**

WORTH THE WAIT: After toiling for 12 years in the minors, Catcher Francisco Arcia posted 10 RBI thru his first two career games (4 RBI in MLB debut, 6 RBI in 2nd game) to set an MLB record, passing Joe Cunningham (9 in 1954 with St. Louis)...Also tied MLB record (6th player) with four XBH thru first two games.

SHELVED: 22 players were placed on the disabled list in the first half (*most in MLB*)...Angels have 12 players currently on DL...**Average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 33 games**...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (*STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987*)...**52 players used for LAA this season, most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)**...29 pitchers have played (12 starters), most in team history thru 112 games (LAA record 31 pitchers in '17).

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in **Top 5 in MLB in several offensive categories**, including HR (3rd; 30), runs (3rd; 82), runs created (1st; 119), times on base (1st; 221), walks (1st; 99), IBB (1st; 20), OBP (1st; .459), SLG (4th; .624), OPS (1st; 1.083), OPS+ (1st; 197.0) and offensive WAR (7.3; 1st).

WALK TALK: Trout's 99 walks are most in club history through 111 games (**club record is 116 walks in 2016 by Trout**)...**First MLB player with at least 99 walks thru 111 games since Barry Bonds (145) in 2004**...First Angel with three 4+ walk games in a season...4th player in A.L. history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB, joining Ichiro (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) & Reggie Jackson (1974)...**Since 2012, he leads A.L. in multi-walk games (143) and has 25 such games in 2018**...**On pace for 144 walks which would be the most since Bonds' 232 BB in 2004 and most in A.L. since Eddie Yost's 151 in 1956.**

GLOVE STORY: Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .986 fielding pct...**Halos lead MLB turning 119 double plays**...Catchers own a 40.4 caught stealing pct. (21 of 52), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...**A. Simmons** leads MLB shortstops with 157 putouts and is T3rd for fewest errors (7; min. 90 GS)...**Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct.**

PITCHING POINTS: Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 21.2 % to score (40 of 189)...**LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 111 affairs (5th in A.L. with 976 K)**...Bullpen has logged 415.1 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Halos have allowed 146 HRs, third-most in A.L...**Since 2017, Jose Alvarez and Blake Parker have each pitched in 120 games, each tied for second-most in A.L. in span.**

THIS N' THAT: A. Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 18.82 (414 PA/22 K)...**He also leads MLB batting .305 (39/128)** with two strikeouts...**Angels' 151 HRs hit rank third in A.L. (Trout's 7.9 WAR leads MLB)**...Justin Upton is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013...**Mike Scioscia** (1,625 wins) is in sole possession of 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...**Shohei Ohtani** is first Angel with first nine career HRs came at home (all against RHP)...**Just second rookie in A.L. history with each of first nine HR at home (Bill Akers, 1930 w/ Det.)**...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: Albert Pujols is batting .308 (20/65) his last 15 games (9 R, 5 2B, 5 HR, 9 RBI)...**David Fletcher** has hit in 10 of 14 (five multi-hit games) batting .321 (17/53) with 11 runs, five doubles & five RBI...**Trout has four HR his last seven games & five HR his last 10 affairs**...Cam Bedrosian has a 1.78 ERA (25.1 IP - 5 ER) since June 1.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,069 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...**Pujols ranks sixth all-time with 631 HR (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)**...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...**AP is seventh all-time with 1,973 RBI (BBREF)**...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...**Albert's 1,285 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mays is 5th w/ 1,323 XBH)**...Only two players have logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 27 RBI shy).

@ CLEVELAND: Indians (152 HR) & Angels (151 HR) rank second and third respectively in A.L. HRs (NYY; 175)...**A win tonight would secure first season series over Cleveland since 2014 (5-2)**...Angels lead 2018 season series 3-2...**Friday's win snapped a 10-game losing streak at Progressive Field (3-13 last 16 games here)**...**First win here since June 17, 2014**...Angels' 13-2 win on April 3rd snapped a 12-game skid to Cleveland (matched longest in Club history vs. one team)...LAA has dropped 17 of last 21 overall to the Tribe.

TIGERS ON DECK: Detroit leads 2018 season series 3-1 (clubs met May 28-31 at Comerica Park)...**Angels are 19-5 in last 24 home games vs. Tigers (26-9 in last 35 overall meetings at Big A)**...Albert Pujols owns a .333 (67/205) career clip against the Tigers with 13 home runs & 38 RBI in 56 games...**His .327 average is second highest (Toronto, .337) against any A.L. opponent...Justin Upton hit .260 (268/1029) with 59 HR & 181 RBI in 278 games as a Tiger (2016-17).**

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 5

(1964) Dean Chance pitched the Angels to a 1-0 win vs. Baltimore...**Chance** had six 1-0 wins to lead the Angels' pitching staff which posted a club-best 28 shutouts that year; (2011) Jered Weaver logged a club record 15th consecutive quality start (passing Frank Tanana with 14 in 1977) and his 1.78 ERA was lowest in club history after 24 starts.

August 6

(1961) In a pinch-hit role, Tom Satriano recorded his first MLB hit, a HR at Baltimore, only to see the feat washed away with rain...**Satriano** had to wait six more days before he was able to record his first big league hit, a home run vs. Minnesota; (1989) Chili Davis earned A.L. Player of the Week honors after hitting .448 (13/29) with three doubles, three home runs and nine RBI from July 31-Aug. 6...**Davis** collected 25 total bases in the span; (2012) Jered Weaver earns his major league-leading 15th win with a four-hit shutout (4-0 win vs. OAK)...**Win** was his 10th straight (10 starts), tying a club record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP DECK MCGUIRE

First career appearance vs. Cleveland

- **BACK TO STARTING:** Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to today's game for fourth stint of season with Angels...Making 11th appearance (fourth start of the season); Eighth appearance (fourth start for Angels)...First six outings of the year came in relief (four with Blue Jays and two with Angels).
- **AS A STARTER:** In five career starts, is 1-2 with a 6.23 ERA (17.1 IP – 12 ER)...Start on July 1 at Baltimore was his first Major League start since Oct. 1, 2017 for Cincinnati at Chicago (N.L.) when he earned his first Major League win (W; 5 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 2 SO).
- **WITH THE BEES:** In two games (both starts) for Triple-A Salt Lake, went 0-1 with a 15.00 ERA (3 IP – 5 ER)...All five runs allowed came across two innings of work in Bees debut on July 26 vs. Memphis...Did not appear in a game for Salt Lake during his first three stints with the club.
- **VS. CLEVELAND:** Today marks first career appearance vs. Indians.
- **AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD:** Today marks first career appearance at Progressive Field.
- **A NEW HALO:** Acquired from Texas on June 19 in exchange for cash considerations or a player to be named later...He was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake immediately after the trade and recalled from Salt Lake the following day (did not appear in a game for Bees)...Made one appearance for Triple-A Round Rock during four day stint in Rangers organization after being acquired by Texas on June 15
- **FAMILIAR FOES:** Made Angels debut on June 24 vs. Toronto after having previous Major League appearance come on May 24 for Blue Jays vs. Angels...**He became the first pitcher to have consecutive appearances come in this fashion since Francisco Liriano in 2012** (pitched for Twins at White Sox on July 23 and then pitched for White Sox at Twins on July 31)...Additionally, the last pitcher to appear for and against the Blue Jays in the same season also happens to be Francisco Liriano in 2017. (STATS LLC)...The last pitcher to appear for and against the Angels in the same season was Fernando Salas last year.
- **STARTER #12:** On July 1, became 12th different starting pitcher for Angels this season, which is tied for second most in the Majors (behind Tampa Bay – 14).
- **LAST TIME OUT (with Salt Lake):** Pitched one scoreless inning in start for Triple-A Salt Lake on Thursday at Iowa...Allowed one hit and one walk with one strikeout.
- **LAST TIME OUT (with Angels):** Worked 1.1 shutout innings in relief in last appearance for Angels on July 22 vs. Houston.
- **LONG RELIEF:** Pitched four innings in relief appearance on June 26 at Boston, marking longest relief appearance of career and longest relief outing by any Angels pitcher this season...Allowed three HR in the game after having allowed three HR total in his previous 11 Major League appearances.
- **2010 DRAFT, ROUND 1:** Was selected 11th overall by Toronto in the first round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...Is one of three players from that round to appear for Angels this year (**Kaleb Cowart** – 18th overall and **Cam Bedrosian** – 29th overall).
- **WITH THE JAYS:** Appeared in four games (all in relief) for Toronto earlier this season...Did not record a decision and pitched to a 6.48 ERA (8.1 IP – 6 ER) with five walks and seven strikeouts...Two of four outings were scoreless...Was designated for assignment by Blue Jays on June 9.
- **WITH BUFFALO:** Appeared in eight games (all starts) for Triple-A Buffalo this season, going 4-2 with a 3.22 ERA (44.2 IP – 16 ER) and 40 strikeouts...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in six of eight starts and tossed eight innings in back-to-back starts on May 4 vs. Syracuse and May 9 vs. Rochester.
- **2017 WITH THE REDS:** Made Major League debut on Sept. 12, 2017 for Cincinnati vs. St. Louis (1.2 IP, 1 H, 1 SO)...In six total games for the Reds (two starts), went 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (13.2 IP – 4 ER).
- **MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2011 (Florida State League) and 2017 (Southern League).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Toronto in the first round (11th overall) in the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Georgia Tech...Has played in minor with affiliates of the Blue Jays (2011-14, '18), A's (2014), Dodgers (2015), Cardinals (2016), Reds (2017), Rangers (2018 and Angels (2018).

RHP NICK TROPEANO (4-6, 4.94 ERA)

Making 14th start of the season and eighth at home...Second start of 2018 vs. Tigers...Fourth start for Angels since returning from the disabled list on July 21 (missed 31 games with right shoulder inflammation)...Charged with loss in last start on Wednesday at Tampa Bay after tossing 5.2 innings and allowing four earned runs on seven hits with four walks and four strikeouts...Earned win in only previous start of career against Detroit on May 29 at Comerica Park after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on seven hits with no walks and five strikeouts.

IN THE 'PEN

#48 JOSÉ ÁLVAREZ (LHP)

AGE: 29
