ROYALS UP NEXT: The Reds and Royals meet Tue & Wed for their second series of the season...the Reds are 10-13 all-time vs the Royals, including a 2-game series sweep at Kaufmann Stadium earlier this season (6/12-6/13)... the 5-1 victory on 6/12 snapped a 5-game losing streak on the eighth anniversary of the Reds' last win vs KC (11-5, 6/12/10 at GABP)...Reds vs Royals information is on media guide Page 334...this season the Reds are 10-8 vs the American League, including a 6-game winning streak vs the

AL from 4/29-7/2 that ranks as their longest interleague winning streak...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 148-205 all-time vs the AL, at .419 the second-lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team (SD, 156-218, .417)... Cin hasn't produced a winning record vs the American League since 2013 (11-9)...in 5 seasons since then are 33-65 vs AL (.337)...Reds vs AL opponents information is on media guide Page 332.

SHUT OUT: The Reds have been shut out 12 times this season, their highest total since 2015 (13 SHO) and including twice in the last 4 games and 3 times in the last 6 games...last night's 4-2 win snapped a streak in which Reds batters were held to 3 runs or fewer in 8 consecutive games for the first time since an 11-game stretch from 7/18-7/29, 2014...during that 8-game stretch Reds batters hit .206 (53-257), including .064 with RISP (3-47), with 11 runs scored (1.38 r/g)...Reds pitchers during that 8-game stretch went 3-5, 3.44 (68ip, 26er)...the Reds are coming off 2 shutout losses in the series at Miller Park and were shut out 5 times overall by the Brewers this season...were shut out 5 times in a season by a single team for the first time since the 1960 Pirates shut out the Reds 5 times.

<u>APRIL 19</u>: The Reds are 63-73 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins... bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

<u>HURLING</u>: The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4** <u>position players</u> (Cliff Pennington on 4/12 vs StL; Alex Blandino on 7/11 at Cle; Dilson Herrera on 8/8 at NYM; Brandon Dixon on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and <u>7 rookies</u> (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Kevin Shackelford, RHP Keury Mella, RHP Jesús Reyes).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went 17-28-3 in their previous 48 series, including 12-12-2 in the last 26 series beginning 6/19...beginning 6/21, the Reds went 5-2-2 in their last 9 series vs teams in first place when those series began (16-15, .516, 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cle, 3-1 vs Phi, 2-1 vs Ari, 0-3 vs Cle and 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 at Chi)...the Reds' 2-1 series loss at Cubs completed on 7/8 snapped their 5-series unbeaten streak, their longest since a 6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in June (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' infield includes 3 National League All-Stars and collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (689), batting average (.285) and on-base percentage (.360)...All-Star 1B Joey Votto is on pace to lead the NL in on-base percentage for the seventh time...All-Star 2B Scooter Gennett leads the National League in 3-hit games while ranking second in hitting, T2nd in multi-hit games and third in hits...All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez is 1 of only 5 Major League players to hit at least .285 with at least 32 HR and 101 RBI...SS José Peraza leads all Major League shortstops in hits; is 1 of only 2 players in the Major Leagues with at least 175 hits, 31 doubles, 13 HR and 23 stolen bases; and among all National League players ranks fourth in hits and fifth in multi-hit games.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 11 grand slams, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and 1 shy of the National League record (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals)...the Major League record for grand slams in a season is 14 (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...produced a streak of 6 slams over a 17-game span from 6/13-7/1 and 9 grand slams in the first half...hit 5 slams in June, a new club record for grand slams in a calendar month...the Reds' 11 grand slams were hit by Adam Duvall (2), Joey Votto (2), Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Jesse Winker, pitcher Anthony DeSclafani, pitcher Michael Lorenzen (pinch-hit), José Peraza and Scott Schebler.

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP Michael Lorenzen is trying to become the first relief pitcher ever to win a Louisville Silver Slugger Award...prior to Tue's start at Mil, he was trying to become the first player in the live ball era to produce at least 4 HR in a season without starting a game...he has 4 HR, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pitcher (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off Jacob Barnes)...the franchise record for HR as a pitcher is 4 by converted outfielder Hal Jeffcoat, who hit 4 HR in 1957, all as a pitcher...Tom Parrott hit 4 HR in 1894, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...as a pinch hitter, Lorenzen is 3-for-12 (2hr, 5rbi) this season and 4-for-19 (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with home runs on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam).

Luis Castillo at just 25 years old is in his second Major League season...tonight is making his 31st start of the season and his 46th Major League appearance and start...will be his second career appearance vs his former organization...leads the staff in win, starts, quality starts (10), innings pitched and strikeouts... in his 4 September starts is 3-1, 1.46...in his 4-0 win on 9/1 at StL recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts, the second-highest total by a Reds pitcher in a game this season (Tyler Mahle, 12k, 6/30 vs Mil)...in the 4-0 win on 7/29 vs Phi made the longest scoreless start of his career (7ip)...his 3-game winning streak from 5/8-5/24 (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the first winning streak of his career...in his 7-2 win on 5/8 vs NYM, retired his first 14 batters before Amed Rosario singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...in the 10-4 win on 4/16 at Mil, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife Delores while celebrating the birth of their first child, Brittany.
