PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (78-78) vs COLORADO ROCKIES (86-70)

Tuesday, September 25, 2018 – 8:40 p.m. EDT – Coors Field – Game 157 – Road 79
RHP Vince Velasquez (9-11, 4.59 ERA) vs RHP Chad Bettis (5-2, 5.18)

- YESTERDAY'S RECAP:** The Phillies fell to the Colorado Rockies, 10-1, at Coors Field in Denver ... Starter Zach Eflin (L, 11-8) went 2.2 innings and allowed 5 runs on 5 hits with 3 walks and 3 strikeouts ... Philadelphia's lone run came on a Rhys Hoskins home run, a titanic 444 blast to left field.
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 156 games, the Phils are an even .500 at 78-78 and in regards to the .500 mark, have improved by 32 games from this point last year when they were 32 games under .500 at 62-94 ... As for run differential, the Phillies have improved by 82 runs from this time last year when they carried a -107 mark through 156 games ... The Phillies, who matched last year's win total of 66 on August 15, didn't notch their 66th win last year until the final day of the season, October 1 against the Mets, a difference of 47 days on the calendar.
- YOUTH GROUP:** The Phillies began the season with the youngest roster in MLB ... With under a week remaining in the season, the Phillies have collected 950.2 innings from pitchers aged 26 or younger, the second-highest total of any team in the majors (most: PIT, 1075.2 IP) ... Of note, per FanGraphs, Philadelphia has totaled 16.5 WAR from hurlers 26 or younger this season which leads the majors (next: COL, 12.1) ... Further, every Phillies pitcher, not named Jake Arrieta, who has made a start this season has been 26 or younger ... Philadelphia's 126 games started by pitchers 26 or younger lead the majors (next: PIT & STL, 118 GS) ... Offensively, Philly's 3,781 plate appearances by players 26 or younger rank 2nd in the majors to only the Cubs (3,863) and their 125 home runs are most (next: TEX, 123 HR).
- NOTHING BUT RHYS-PECT:** Wednesday night, **Rhys Hoskins** connected on his 50th career home run in his 192nd major league game ... In doing so, Hoskins became the seventh-fastest player in the history of Major League Baseball to reach his 50th home run, trailing only Ryan Howard (182 G), Aaron Judge (174 G), Ryan Braun (171 G), Gary Sanchez (161 G), Mark McGwire (161 G) and Rudy York (153 G) ... Since he burst onto the scene August 10, 2017, Hoskins' 51 home runs rank 4th in MLB, trailing only NYY's Giancarlo Stanton (56 HR), OAK's Khris Davis (58 HR) and BOS' J.D. Martinez (64 HR) for the major league lead in that stretch.
- COLD HARD FACTS:** Since the start of the 2008 season, the Phillies are 44-26 (.629) in 70 games against the Rockies which is their 2nd-best win percentage against a club they have played 15 or more times in that span (best: SD, 47-26, .644 win %) ... **Currently with an even 2-2 record** in the season series, the Phils have only had two losing seasons against the Rockies dating back to 2008 (2015: 2-5 and 2017: 2-5) ... That being said, the Phillies are looking for their first series win at Coors Field since July 13-15, 2012 (2-1) ... Philadelphia has gone 0-3-2 in their last five series at Coors dating back to the 2013 season ... In four career starts against the Rockies as a member of the Phillies, Vince Velasquez is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (7 ER, 22.2 IP) ... The Phils are 3-1 in those four games.
- ROAD WOES:** At 31-47 on the road this year, Philadelphia has assured themselves a sub-.500 record away from home, their sixth-consecutive losing season away from CBP (2013-current) ... From 2004-2012, Philadelphia finished above .500 away from South Philly in each of those nine seasons, posting a combined record of 398-328 with a .548 winning percentage that was the best in the majors (next: LAA, .543) ... However, since that run, the Phillies have gone 184-299 on the road with a .381 winning percentage that ranks 30th out of all 30 MLB teams ... Finally, despite their struggles on the road this season, the Phillies are 47-31 at home, 16 games above the .500 mark ... **Per Elias, you have to go all the way back to 1955 to find the last time the Phils finished a season at least 15 games above .500 at home and 15 games under .500 on the road (46-31 at home, 31-46 on the road)**
- WHAT IF TOLD YOU...:** Tonight, **Vince Velasquez** will make his 30th start of the season, joining **Jake Arrieta** (30 GS), **Aaron Nola** (31 GS) and **Nick Pivetta** (31 GS) in the 30-start club for the Phillies in 2018 ... This marks only the sixth time in franchise history that has occurred (others: 2008, 2003, 1987, 1982 & 1968) ... In 2008, Cole Hamels and Jamie Moyer each started 33 games and Kyle Kendrick and Brett Myers both started 30.
- MR. NO DAYS OFF:** The Phils are in the midst of 17 consecutive games without an off day to finish their season ... This marks the longest stretch this year for the club without an off day ... Per Elias, this is the first time the Phillies have finished a season with at least 17 straight games and no days off since the year 2000 when they also finished with 17 straight from 9/15-10/1.
- CLEAN BILL OF HEALTH:** Prior to last Tuesday night's game, the Phillies reinstated LHP Aaron Loup off the 10-day DL ... The Phillies are currently the only team in Major League Baseball without a player on the DL ... As it stands now, this would be the first time since at least 1994, or as far as Phillies internal records go back, that Philadelphia finished a season without a single player on the disabled list.
- THIS DATE IN PHILLIES HISTORY: September 25, 1944 –** In the first game of a double-header, Phillie hurler Charlie Ripple faces off against Chicago's Charlie Gassaway ... Both pitchers were making their major league debuts. ... Ripple lasted less than 3 innings but didn't figure in the decision in a 7-6 Phillies loss ... The Phillies would not have a starter debut against another debuting starter until this past July 10 at NYM, when Enyel De Los Santos squared off against the Mets' Drew Gagnon.

Velasquez vs Gausman ... Philadelphia was able to score three runs without the aid of a home run and had the game tied at 3-3 through six frames ... Atlanta would go ahead in the 7th and eventually added four runs of insurance in the 8th.

TONIGHT'S START:

- The Big 30: Velasquez is making his 30th start of the season tonight, making him the 4th Phillie to accomplish that this season ... Entering play today, only COL (4) had done that this season, and it marks just the 6th time in Phillies history and first since 2008
Limiting Longballs: Velasquez has allowed just 2 HR in his last 57.2 IP (0.31 HR/9.0 IP) dating back to part of his start 6/25 vs NYY ... He became the first Phillies starter to go 8 straight starts without allowing a home run (6/30-8/21) since Roy Halladay went 10 straight, 7/24-9/14/11 ... Since June 26, Velasquez owns the lowest HR/9.0 IP in baseball (0.32) among starters with at least 10 starts ... Overall, he ranks 14th among NL starters (min. 25 GS) with a 0.95 HR/9.0 IP ratio this season
Right On!: Velasquez has faced 309 right-handed hitters this season, holding them to a .204/.293/.305 slash line with just 3 home runs ... Among all NL pitchers with at least 300 RHH faced, his .204 OPP AVG ranks 8th and it is 11th among all ML pitchers ... There is no pitcher in baseball other than Velasquez who has faced over 300 right-handed hitters and allowed 3 or fewer homers ... Over his last 11 games (since 7/24), he has held RHH to a .154 AVG (13-82)
Walk Talk: Has walked 1 batter in each of his last four starts, the longest such streak of his career ... He has issued 1 or no free passes in 10 of his last 14 starts dating back to 6/30
Hit Me: Velasquez has allowed four hits or fewer in 16 of his starts this season ... Since 1908, the only other Phillies starters to accomplish that in a season are Aaron Nola this year (franchise-record 18) and Grover Cleveland Alexander in 1915 (16)
Deep Trouble: Has not recorded an out past the fifth inning in any of his last 8 starts, posting a 7.67 ERA (25 ER, 29.1 IP) in that span
vs NL West: 4-3, 3.48 ERA (16 ER, 41.1 IP) in 8 games (7 starts)

- Posted a 0.95 ERA (2 ER, 19.0 IP) in July, the lowest ERA among any NL pitcher with at least 15.0 IP, and 4th-lowest in MLB
Earned a win in relief on 7/24 vs LAD, 2 days after earning a win in a start ... It was his first game in relief since 10/2/15 at ARI and first win in relief
Was on the 10-day DL, 7/1-10, with a right forearm contusion
Thrice this season has carried a no-hitter through at least 5.0 innings (7/22 vs SD, 5/28 at LAD and 6/14 vs COL)
Went 3-1 with a 2.30 ERA (7 ER, 27.1 IP) with 36 strikeouts in 5 May starts ... It was the lowest ERA of any month of his career (min. 5 starts)
Tied a career-high three-game win streak, 5/5-17
On 5/10 vs SF Became the first Phillies pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts and multiple hits at the plate since 9/16/13 (Cliff Lee, 14 SO, 3 H), per Elias ... His 12 strikeouts were his 2nd-most ever in a start
On 5/5 at WSH made the first start of his career of at least 5.0 IP and 1 or 0 hits
Made a career-best 7 straight starts (8/10/17-4/29/18) issuing 2 or fewer walks
Had 282 SO through his first 50 career starts, which when achieved was the 7th-most by any ML starter through his first 50 career starts since 2015
Did not allow a home run in his first 16.2 IP this season
Made his 3rd consecutive Opening Day roster
