THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

June 10

(1997) **Jim Edmonds** makes one of the most spectacular catches in Angels' history at Kansas City as he dives toward the fence in straight away center field with his back to home plate... "The Catch", as it became known, is named as baseball play of the year by several sport television stations and publications; (1992) **Luis Polonia** tied a club record by stealing four bases in a game at Chicago... Polonia was the second Angels' player to accomplish the feat (now done three times, also by **Devon White** and **Chad Curtis**).

June 11

(2012) Angels defeat the Dodgers 3-2 at Dodger Stadium to extend the road winning streak to 10 games, marking the second time in club history the team has been victorious in at least 10 straight road affairs.

LEADING OFF: Today the Angels play the third game of a nine-game (2-0) road trip to **Minnesota** (June 8-10; 2-0), **Seattle** (June 11-13) and **Oakland** (June 15-17)...Angels' **7-1 start to June is best since 2007 (also 7-1)**...Club record to open June is **8-0 in 1998 (8-1 thru 9 G in '98)**...LAA seeks **second straight series sweep and fifth of season**...Halos have won six straight and seven of last eight games...With a win today, Angels would match season-best win streak (7 G; April 8-14)...A win today would also move club to 10 games above .500 to match season-best (13-3)...LAA has outscored opponents 31-16 across last seven games...Angels are 24-25 since a club-record 13-3 start...Halos' **20-10 record thru 30 road games is best in club history**...17 of next 23 games are on the road...LAA is **12-7-2 in 21 series**.

TROPEANO TODAY: Nick Tropeano is 3-1 with a 2.55 ERA (24.2 IP – 7 ER) on the road this season (0-2 and 6.12 ERA/25 IP – 17 ER at Angel Stadium)...Is 0-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 IP – 4 ER) in three career games (two starts) vs. **Twins**...Has allowed one earned run in 6.2 career innings (1.35 ERA) at Target Field.

JUNE BOOM: **Ian Kinsler** has homered in at least three straight games for the eighth time in his career...Career-best streak is **four consecutive (May 15-18, 2016 for Detroit)**...Has six HRs his last 11 games (career-best 7 HR in 11-game span in 2011)...Fourth Angel second baseman with six HRs in 11-game span: **Bobby Grich** (twice), **Rex Hudler** and **Howie Kendrick**.

OHTANI TO D.L. On Friday, **Shohei Ohtani** was placed on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 6/7) with a grade 2 sprain of the UCL...Underwent a PRP and stem cell injection Thursday with **Dr. Steve Yoon** in LA & will be re-evaluated in three weeks.

BABY BOOMERS: Youngest players with **10+ HRs in 2018 across all minor league levels:** **JO ADELL** - (19 y, 63 d) 10 HR, levels A, A+; **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** - (19 y, 86 d) 11 HR, level AA; **Fernando Tatis Jr.** - (19 y, 159 d) 11 HR, level AA (courtesy of Alex Mayer – Louisville Bats PR).

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 32 of last 37 games...LAA starting pitchers have fashioned Major League best **2.58 ERA (216 IP – 62 ER) since May 1**...Angels are only team in MLB to boast **five starters with 3.50 ERAs or lower (min. 7 starts)**...Team ERA of 2.86 for May was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

MVP x 3? **Mike Trout** ranks second in MLB with 19 HRs...With his next HR, he will be first player in LAA history with **20+ HRs in seven straight seasons**...Can join **Alex Rodriguez** and **Mickey Mantle** as only A.L. players to amass seven seasons of 20+ HRs prior to their age-27 campaign...On pace for a career-best 47 HRs...Ranks second in MLB with **148 total bases** and leads MLB with **52 runs & .439 OBP**.

HOT HALOS: Over his last 11 games, **Ian Kinsler** is batting .356 (16/45) with 10 runs, four doubles, six home runs and 11 RBI...**Justin Upton** has opened June 11-for-26 (.423) with four home runs and five RBI (4 HR his last 6 G)...He is the first Angel with 15 home runs as a left fielder (min. 100 G in LF) in a season since **Vernon Wells** (25 HRs) in 2011...**Martin Maldonado** has hits in 12 of last 15 games...12 RBI his last 15 games...Hitting .319 (30/94) with seven doubles and three HRs since May 1.

SHO-ING OFF: **Shohei Ohtani** is the fourth Japanese-born pitcher with 60+ Ks through his first nine MLB games, joining **Hideo Nomo** (75), **Masahiro Tanaka** (73) and **Yu Darvish** (63)...**61 Ks are a club record through first nine career starts & lead 2018 A.L. rookies**...Ranks second among A.L. rookies in ERA with 3.10 mark (behind teammate **Jaime Barria's** 2.48 ERA).

ALL-STAR SIMMONS? **Andrelton Simmons** (10-day DL) has hits in 11 of 12 with an AB and 31 of his last 36 games hitting .350 (48-for-137) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span...He has struck out just twice since **May 1 (139 PA)**...Has reached base safely in 39 of last 41 games...Leads MLB in PA per SO with **24.2 (242 PA/10 K) and ranks fourth in A.L. batting .330**.

MIKE'S MILESTONE: **Mike Scioscia** posted career win #1,600 on May 29th to pass his former manager of 13 seasons **Tommy Lasorda** (1,599).

PUJOLS POINTS: **Albert Pujols** has 3,027 career hits – good for 27th all-time...**Rod Carew** is next on the hit list at 3,053...Pujols collected his 3,000th hit on May 4th at Seattle to become just fourth player to log 600 HRs and 3,000 hits (**Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** & **Alex Rodriguez**)...Pujols sits at 629 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632)...Ranks tied for seventh all-time in RBI with **Stan Musial** with 1,951...**Lou Gehrig** is sixth with 1,995 RBI (Baseball-Reference.com).

THIS N' THAT: With the Twins getting a run in the sixth inning yesterday, a streak of 22.2 consecutive scoreless innings for Angels' left-handers was snapped...**Mike Trout's** .348 (185-for-531) career batting average in the month of June is the highest average amongst active players (min. 400 PA) in any month of the season...Halo outfielders lead A.L. with 15 OF assists...Halos' average home attendance (37,074) ranks second in A.L...Club boasts nine sellouts thru 35 home games...LAA has just 25 errors thru 65 games (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank T2nd in circuit with a .989 fielding pct.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP NICK TROPEANO

3-3, 4.35 ERA

Is pitching to a 1.35 ERA (6.2 IP – 1 ER) in two career games (one start) at Target Field

- **BACK ON THE MOUND:** Making 10th start of the season for Angels and fifth on the road...Sixth start since being reinstated from disabled list on May 12 (missed nine games on disabled list with right shoulder inflammation); did not make a rehab appearance in minor leagues.
- **ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** This season, is 3-1 with a 2.55 ERA (24.2 IP – 7 ER) on the road, compared with a 0-2 record and 6.12 ERA (25 IP – 17 ER) at Angel Stadium.
- **THAT'S RIGHT:** Owns a .227 (22/97) opponent batting average against right-handed hitters this season.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Monday vs. Kansas City after tossing 4.2 innings and allowing five earned runs on nine hits with one walk and five strikeouts.
- **WIN STREAK:** A winning decision tonight would match longest streak of career (would be third time with three straight wins).
- **AT HIS BEST vs. THE WEST:** Against A.L. West foes, is 6-3 with a 3.53 ERA (74 IP – 29 ER)...Against all other teams, is 4-7 with a 4.27 ERA (103.1 IP – 49 ER).
- **RISP-Y BUSINESS:** Since 2016, has held opponents to a .220 (18/82) batting average with runners in scoring position...Opponents are also 6-for-47 (.128) with two outs and runners in scoring position against him since 2015.
- **TALE OF TWO HALVES:** Is 7-5 with a 3.47 ERA (122 IP – 47 ER) and 113 strikeouts in his career in the first half of the season compared with a 3-5 record and 5.04 ERA (55.1 IP – 31 ER) after the All-Star Break.
- **VS. MINNESOTA:** In three career games (two starts) against Minnesota is 0-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 IP – 4 ER)...Did not factor in decision in first start of 2018 vs. Twins on May 12 at Angel Stadium after allowing three earned runs in six innings pitched...Made only relief appearance of Major League career on Sept. 20, 2015 at Minnesota and worked one scoreless inning.
- **AT TARGET FIELD:** Tonight marks first appearance at the ballpark since April 17, 2016...In two career games (one start) at Target Field, is 0-0 with a 1.35 ERA (6.2 IP – 1 ER).
- **BACK WITH THE HALOS:** Made season debut with Angels on April 12 at Kansas City, marking first Major League appearance since July 18, 2016 (vs. Texas)...Was recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to the game.
- **THE INJURY:** Missed entire 2017 season recovering from Tommy John surgery, performed in August 2016.
- **WITH THE BEES:** Made one start for Triple-A Salt Lake on April 6 vs. Albuquerque and tossed 3.2 innings scoreless innings allowing three hits and three walks with seven strikeouts.
- **HALOS STARTERS:** With first start on April 12, became eighth different starting pitcher used by Angels through the first 14 games of a season, which set a new franchise record...Halos have now used nine different starters this year.
- **CAREER NOTES:** In 34 career games (33 starts), is 10-10 with a 3.96 ERA (177.1 IP – 78 ER)...In 30 games (29 starts) for Angels, is 9-7 with a 3.87 ERA (155.2 IP – 67 ER)...Native of West Islip, NY...Originally drafted by Houston in fifth round of 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Stony Brook University...Acquired by Angels on Nov. 5, 2014 with C **Carlos Perez** in exchange for C **Hank Conger**.
