The Mariners and Royals meet for the first of 7 games this season...Seattle and KC will also meet in Seattle June 29-July 1...Seattle went 2-5 vs. Kansas City last season...dating back to 2012, Seattle is 23-19 vs. Royals, including going 12-10 at Kauffman Stadium:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue on their first road trip of the season, a 5,200-mile, 10-day, 8-game odyssey with the first of 3 games vs. the Kansas City Royals...opened the trip splitting a 2-game series with San Francisco (1-1) and played 2 of the 3 scheduled games vs. Minnesota (1-1)... after this series with the Royals will return to Seattle to begin a 7-day, 7-game homestand on Friday vs. the Oakland Athletics (3 G) and the Houston Astros (4 G)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won Saturday, snapping 2-game losing streak...won 3 of first 4 games to start the season, but 1-2 over last 3 games...team is 3-3 during the day and 1-0 at night...Seattle is 2-1 at Safeco Field and 2-2 on the road.

- AL Central the Mariners face an AL Central opponent in 12 of their first 24 games of the season (3-2)... Seattle went 18-16 vs. the Central in 2017, their first winning season since going 19-14 in 2014.

 Streaking - Robinson Canó and Dee Gordon have each hit safely in 7 straight games to open the season...
- their 7-game hitting streaks are currently the longest active hitting streak in the American League (7 players).
- Seeing Double Robinson Canó is tied for 2nd with Rogers Hornsby for most home runs by a second baseman in Major League history, trailing only Jeff Kent's 377 career home runs.

DON'T YOU KNOW...Robinson Canó has hit safely in 7 straight games to open the season, batting 440 (11x25) with 8 runs scored, 3 doubles, 3 RBI and 4 walks...he currently leads the American League in average (.440), while also ranking 2nd in on-base percentage (.517), T7th in runs scored (8), 10th in OPS (1.077) and T10th in doubles (3).

JEAN, JEAN THE HITTING MACHINE ... after going 0-for-4 in the first game of the season, Jean Segura has recorded a hit in each of the last 6 games, batting .440 (11x25) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base...overall this season he is batting .379 (11x29) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base.

NO FREE PASSES... Seattle relievers have allowed just 4 walks in 23.2 innings pitched over 7 games this season...the Mariners relievers lead the Majors in fewest walks-per-9.0-innings with a mark of 1.52 (4 BB, 23.2 IP), ranking ahead of Oakland (1.98) and and Houston (2.03).

PRODUCTIVE AT THE TOP...the Mariners 1-4 batters in the lineup have combined to hit .351 (39x111) with 23 runs scored, 6 doubles, 4 home runs, 17 RBI and 13 walks over the first 7 games of the season...the rest of the lineup is batting a combined .213 (27x127) with 9 runs scored, 7 doubles, 3 home run, 14 RBI and 9 walks.

ROAD WARRIOR...dating back to Sept. 13, 2017, Jean Segura has hit safely in his last 10 games on the road, including 4 straight road games this season...during this stretch, he is batting .442 (19x43) with 11 runs scored, 4 doubles, 2 home runs, 5 RBI, 4 walks and 3 stolen bases on the road.

HE LIKES THE FOUNTAINS...Ichiro Suzuki is a career .370 (95x257) hitter with 43 runs scored, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs and 35 RBI in 63 games at Kauffman Stadium...among all players, Ichiro ranks 1st in batting average at this venue (min. 200 PA), ahead of Adrían Beltré (.355/66x186)...Ichiro has recorded at least one hit in 49 of 63 games here (37 multi-hit), including a string of hits in 41 of last 46 games dating back to 2005 (.414/79x191).

UNEXPECTED DAY OFF...yesterday's game between the Mariners and the Minnesota Twins was postponed due to impending inclement weather...it was the first time since April 20, 1979 that the Mariners were rained out in Minneapolis...the game will be made up on Monday, May 14, beginning at 6:10 pm (CT)/4:10 pm (PT)...May 14th was a mutual off day for the Mariners and Twins...this is Seattle's first postponement since being rained out in Kansas City on August 5, 2017.

SOME LIKE IT HOT...Robinson Canó (.440/11x25, 8 R, 3 2B, 3 RBI, 4 BB) and Dee Gordon (.367/11x30, 4 R, HR, 3 RBI, 2 BB, 3 SB) have each hit safely in each of the first 7 games this season... marks the only the 2nd time in Canó's career to hit safely at least 7 straight games to open a season (10 G: 4/4-16/10)...Gordon's 7-game hitting streak to open the season is a career-high.

KKKKKKKK...Edwin Díaz has struck out 8 of the 11 batters he has faced this season (0 H, 2 HB), averaging 24.00 strikeouts per 9.0 innings over his first 3 appearances this season...in his career, Díaz has recorded a strikeout rate of 13.80 per 9.0 innings, the 5th-highest since making his debut in 2016...trails only Dellin Betances-NYY (15.32), Craig Kimbrel-BOS (15.30), Andrew Miller-CLE (14.43) and Kenley Jansen-LAD (13.85).

MILESTONE TRACKER...Kyle Seager is in his 8th season with Seattle, since making his debut in

- 2011 and is quickly moving up the Mariners all-time offensive rankings:
 Seager (214) trails Raúl Ibañez (216) by 2 doubles for 5th-most in franchise history.
 Seager (154) trails Raúl Ibañez (156) by 2 home runs for 6th-most in club history.

 - Seager (529) trails Bret Boone (535) by 6 RBI for 8th-most in franchise history.
 - Seager (363) trails Raúl Ibañez (367) by 4 walks for 8th-most in club history.

LUCKY SEVEN...due to 3 off days and 1 postponed game (inclement weather) the Mariners have appeared in only 7 games in the first 11 days since the start of the season on March 29...the 7 games are tied with Kansas City and Minnesota for the fewest games played in the Majors, while Oakland and Texas have each appeared in 11 games.

<u>SUNGLASSES AT NIGHT</u>...tonight marks only the 2nd night game for the Mariners in 2018...after opening the season with a night game on March 29 at Safeco Field, the Mariners played 6 consecutive day games: March 31 vs. CLE, April 1 vs. CLE, April 3 at SF, April 4 at SF, April 5 at MIN, April 6 at MIN...the 6 straight days games tied Mariners franchise record (also: April 23-28, 1977 & Aug. 29-Sept. 2, 1979)

AS YOU KNOW...Ichiro Suzuki's .355 (161x454) career batting average when facing Kansas City is his highest versus any opponent (min. 100 PA)...BUT, DID YOU KNOW?...that his average is also the highest by any hitter vs. the Royals (min. 200 PA), ranking ahead of Dustin Pedroia (.353/83x235), Rusty Greer (.350/86x246), Greg Walker (.345/68x197) and Rod Carew (.345/263x762)?

- ABOUT GONZALES...
 25-year-old left-hander is making his 12th Mariners appearance, 9th start, 2nd start of season...tonight is his 24th career appearance, 16th career start and his 2nd career start vs. Kansas City.
 Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league
- outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21, 2017. Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 seasons (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga
- Made his MLB debut with Cardinals June 25, 2014 at Colorado. Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).

LAST OUTING...picked up his first win of 2018 in his season debut, allowing 3 runs on 6 hits in a career-high 6.1 innings pitched at San Francisco on April 3...retired 9 of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing a solo home run by Joe Panik in the 4th inning...also allowed a two-run shot by Evan Longoria in the 7th.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 7 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (6 ER, 26.0 IP) with 21 strikeouts and 9 walks...threw 4.2 innings in his final spring start on 3/27 at COL, allowing 2 runs on 7 hits while walking 2 and striking out 3.

SPRING BREAKOUT...compiled a 2.08 ERA, the seventh best mark in the Majors (4th among AL pitchers) this spring...he trailed only Clayton Kershaw-LAD (0.00 ERA, 0 ER, 21.1 IP), Lance McCullers Jr.-HOU (1.29 ERA, 3 ER, 21.0 IP), Noah Syndergaard-NYM (1.35 ERA, 3 ER, 20.0 IP), Julio Teheran-ATL (1.40 ERA, 4 ER, 25.2 IP), José Berríos-MIN (1.42 ERA, 3 ER, 19.0 IP) and Justin Verlander-HOU (1.64, 4 ER, 22.0 IP)...led Mariners starters in Spring Training innings pitched (26.0), strikeouts (21) and WHIP (1.19).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strike-outs and 11 walks in 11 games (8 starts)...was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 10 games (7 starts) with Seattle.

AAA RECAP...combined for 13 AAA starts last season, 11 with AAA Memphis in the Cardinals organization and 2 with AAA Tacoma after being acquired by the Mariners...was 8-4 with a 3.14 ERA (28 ER, 80.1 IP) with 66 strikeouts and 22 walks in 13 combined starts...went 6-4 with a 2.90 ERA (22 ER, 68.1 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 17 walks in 11 starts with Memphis...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER, 12.0 IP) with 9 strikeouts and 5 walks in 2 starts with Tacoma.

BULLDOG ROOTS...played 3 seasons (2011-13) with the Gonzaga Bulldogs, compiling a career record of 26-7 with a 2.34 ERA while recording 9 complete games and 4 shutouts...tallied 278 strikeouts over 303.2 innings of work...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball progam when he was selected 19th overall by St. Louis in 2013...shared West Coast Conference Player of the Year honors with the Cubs' Kris Bryant (University of San Diego) as a freshman in 2011 and as a junior in 2013...in 2013, went 7-3 with a 2.80 ERA and 2 shutouts on the mound while batting .311 with 2 home runs and 26 RBI, earning John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year honors as well as WCC Co-Player of the Year for the 2nd time in his career.

POSTSEASON GLORY...added to the Cardinals roster for the 2014 National League
Division Series vs. Los Angeles-NL...made 3 appearances in the NLDS, going 2-0
with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk...picked up the wins in Game 1 and Game 4 vs. the Dodgers...became the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002)...in the
2014 NLCS vs. San Francisco, went 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (3 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk in 3 appearances.
