AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees play the final game of their rain-shortened, three-game series at Camden Yards after Thursday's game was postponed...are 2-0 so far...is the first stop of a now-10-game, four-city road trip, which will include a split doubleheader in Detroit tomorrow (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15), two games in Toronto from Tuesday-Wednesday, an off day on Thursday and a three-game Subway Series at the Mets from 6/8-10...went 4-2 on their recent homestand (2-1 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 2-1 vs. Houston).

- ▶ At 37-17 (.685), have the Majors' best winning pct....is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 23-17, the Yankees are 28-8).
- ▶ Are a season-high 20G over .500...did not reach 20G over .500 in 2017 until their 158th game (89-69)...reached a season-best 21G over .500 just once last season (91-70 after their 161st game on 9/30/17)...never reached 20G over at any point from 2013-16.
- ▶ Is the 11th season in franchise history and the second season over the last 60 years (since 1959) that they have reached 20G over within their first 54 decisions of a season (first went 20G over in 1998 after 38G, starting 29-9)...made the World Series in all 10 previous instances, winning seven times (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '58, '98; lost: 1926, '42, '55).
- ▶ Marks the 10th time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 37 wins over their first 54 results...each of the other nine Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42, '55)...joins the 1998 team (41-13) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 54G start over the last 63 seasons (since 1956).
- ▶ Have won 11 of their last 12 completed series since 4/19.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 65 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 6-2 so far.
- ▶ Are 13-9 vs. the AL East and 24-8 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 25-2 (.926) when their starters toss at least 6.0 innings this season.

ROWING ALONG: C Austin Romine is batting .483 (14-for-29) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR and 10RBI during his career-high 10-game hitting streak (since 4/30), tied for the AL's second-longest active hitting streak...is the second-longest hitting streak by a Yankee this season (Judge, 12G from 4/1-16)...is one of four players with a double-digit hitting streak at catcher in 2018 (also the Rays' Wilson Ramos-17G, the Marlins' J.T. Realmuto-11G and the Dodgers' Yasmani Grandal-11G).

▶ Has reached in 12-of-20PA w/ RISP this season (.600 OBP), batting 8-for-16 (.500) with 2 doubles, 11RBI and 4BB...his 3.50 AB/RBI ratio (56AB/16RBI) leads the Majors (min. 50AB).

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge hit his 72nd career home run on Friday at Baltimore (in his 236th career game)...is the second-fastest player in Baseball history to reach the mark (in terms of games played), behind only Ryan Howard (235G).

- ▶ Is a career .337 (35-for-104) hitter with 37R, 8 doubles, 13HR and 29RBI in 31 games vs. Baltimore, his most runs, doubles, HR and RBI against any team.
- ▶ Through 55G this season, has 42R, 29XBH (13 doubles, 16HR), 41RBI and 43BB...through his first 55G of his AL "Rookie of the Year" campaign in 2017, had 46R, 29XBH (9 doubles, 2 triples, 18HR), 41RBI and 35BB).

GARDY PARTY: LF Brett Gardner has hit safely in 10 of 11G (since 5/18), batting .375 (18-for-48) w/ 5 doubles, 3HR and 5RBI.

- ▶ Is hitting .354 (29-for-82) with 15R, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 11RBI, 11BB and 4SB in his last 21G (since 5/4)...since 5/4, has raised his season BA 69 points (.194 to .263)

JUST FOR HICKS: Since 5/18, **OF Aaron Hicks** is batting .340 (17-for-50) with 9H, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 8RBI and 6BB over his last 13 games, raising his season slash lines from .208/.319/.365/.684 to .253/.353/.432/.784.

- ▶ Has played in 499 career games...his next will be his 500th.

THE GLEY-HEY KID: On Saturday, **2B Gleyber Torres** was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for May...in 24G, hit .317/.374/.659 (26-for-82) with 13R, 1 double, 9HR and 24RBI, leading all MLB rookies in batting average, HR and RBI during the month (min. 75AB)...is the fifth Yankee (eighth time) to win AL "Rookie of the Month" and the third current Yankee to do so, joining Gary Sánchez (Aug. 2016) and Aaron Judge (four times in 2017)...is the second Yankee to win a monthly award this season (Didi Gregorius, AL "Player of the Month" in April).

- ▶ Since his debut on 4/22, leads MLB rookies with a .317 BA (38-for-120) and 27RBI and is tied for the lead with 9HR...is one of nine players in franchise history with at least 27RBI through his first 35 career games and the third to do so prior to turning 22 (Joe DiMaggio-37RBI at age 21 and Mickey Mantle-31RBI at age 19).

YOUTH BEING SERVED: Yankees rookie batters lead the Majors in runs scored (60), hits (116), doubles (29) and RBI (71)...are one of two teams with more than 10HR from rookies (SD-28, NYY-23)...also rank third with a .282 batting average (116-for-412)...rookies across the Majors are hitting .234.

- ▶ **3B Miguel Andújar** leads all rookies with 18 doubles and is tied for seventh among all Major Leaguers...has 20 doubles through his first 51 career games, the second-highest such total in franchise history (DiMaggio-24) and tied for the fourth-highest total among all Major Leaguers since at least 1908 (Roy Weatherly-25, DiMaggio-24, Roy Johnson-22, Gibby Brack-20, Jorge Cantu-20).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have homered in 43 of their 55 games, tied with Texas (43) for most in the Majors.

- ▶ Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs per game (5.65), HR (90), HR per game (1.64), SLG (.470) and OPS (.808), are tied for first with Boston in runs (311), and rank second in walks (219), OBP (.338), XBHs (212) and total bases (889).

K/9 UNIT: Yankees relievers lead the Majors with 264K and a 12.16 K/9.0IP ratio (195.1IP)...are on pace to record 778K, which would be the most strikeouts by a bullpen in MLB history (Houston, 662K in 2017)...their 12.16K/9.0IP ratio would also be the best single-season mark all time...rank third with 3.30K/BB (80BB) this season (Houston-4.23, Seattle-3.45).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 3, 2003: Derek Jeter is named the 11th captain in club history.

June 3, 1933: Jumbo Brown strikes out a team-record 12 batters in relief (6.1IP) in a 17-11 win vs. Philadelphia.

June 3, 1932: Lou Gehrig hits four consecutive HRs and narrowly misses a fifth, and Tony Lazzeri hits for the cycle as the Yanks win 20-13 at Philadelphia. The Yankees tally 50 total bases, while the 33 combined runs ties for the most in a single game in franchise history.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 4, 2007: Former Yankees 3B Cleto Boyer passes away at the age of 70. A member of the Yankees from 1959 through 1966, Boyer won World Series titles with the club in 1961 and 1962.

June 4, 1933: Yankees starter Johnny Allen allows a first-inning single to Philadelphia's Ed Coleman, then holds the A's hitless the rest of the way, notching a one-hit shutout in a 6-0 Yankees victory.

YANKEES at BALTIMORE ORIOLES

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 3-3 vs. the Orioles in 2018...will meet 19 times in 2018 (9G in the Bronx, 10G in Baltimore)...won three straight series between the clubs from 6/9-9/17/17...was their longest streak of series won against the O's since winning three in a row from 7/5-9/12/13...are 218-140-2 vs. Baltimore since 1998, the club's most wins over any opponent in that span (next: 210-143 vs. Tampa Bay)...**AT CAMDEN YARDS:** Are 2-0 at Camden Yards this year...were 4-5 at Baltimore in 2017, their fifth consecutive season with a losing record there (2013-17)...are 17-31 in 48 games there since the beginning of 2013...won 2-of-3 games at Camden Yards from 9/4-7/17 to end a streak of 11 consecutive series losses there, the second-longest series losing streak at a venue in franchise history, per *Elias* (lost 12 straight series at Oakland from 1985-91)...was their first series win at Baltimore since 9/9-12/13...last won consecutive series at Camden Yards from 4/23-24/11 (2-0) and 5/18-19/11 (2-0)...have won just 3-of-15 series openers there since 6/28/13...are 89-69-1 at Camden Yards since 2001 and 123-89-1 since the venue opened in 1992, marking the second-highest win total by any visitor in the ballpark's history (Boston, 124-88).
